Roe v. Wade Anniversary Memorial

January 22, 2022, from 2:00p.m. to 3:30p.m.



Pro-lifers are invited to help restore the right to life for preborn children by joining the Long Island Coalition for Life for the Roe v. Wade Anniversary. Memorial Face the Truth pro-life event.

This peaceful public witness will be held on the sidewalk in front of Nassau University Medical Center (2201 Hempstead Tpke., E Meadow). Rain or shine.

January 22, 1973: Roe v Wade decision of the Supreme Court ushered in the era of abortion on demand in the United States. 2018: Mississippi passed a law protecting unborn children after 15 weeks of gestation, when the baby has a heartbeat, eyes that open, ears that hear, and can move and kick. The law was challenged and the case, known as Dobbs v Jackson Women's Health Organization, is being heard by the Supreme Court. Dobbs v Jackson is a landmark case that could potentially overturn the decision of Roe v Wade. The possibility for future laws protecting the unborn hangs in the balance. December 1, 2021 oral arguments for the case were heard. A decision is expected in June 2022.

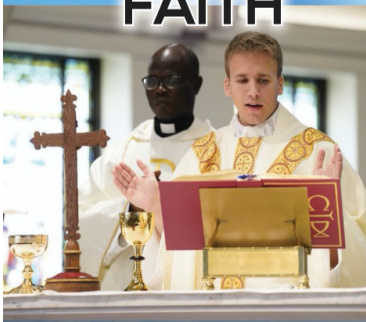
People of every faith are coming together in a united effort to pray and fast for this intention in the coming months (www.prayfordobbs.com). For the past 49 years, the infamous date of January 22 has been one of solemn prayer and remembrance for the tragedy of legalized abortion in this country. In these next crucial 6 months, from January until June let us make the 22nd of each month a special day of prayer and fasting for the Dobbs case, in the hopes that on its 50th anniversary (Jan 22, 2023) Roe v Wade will have been finally overturned.

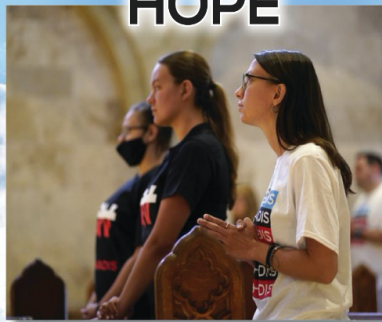

III DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 1, 1-4; 4m 14-21

Muchos han tratado de escribir la historia de las cosas que pasaron entre nosotros, tal y como nos las transmitieron los que las vieron desde el principio y que ayudaron en la predicación. Yo también, ilustre Teófilo, después de haberme informado minuciosamente de todo, desde sus principios, pensé escribirlos por orden, para que veas la verdad de lo que se te ha enseñado. Después de que Jesús fue tentado por el demonio en el desierto, impulsado por el Espíritu, volvió a Galilea. Iba enseñando en las sinagogas; todos lo alababan y su fama se extendió por toda la región. Fue también a Nazaret, donde se había criado. Entró en la sinagoga, como era su costumbre hacerlo los sábados, y se levanto para hacer la lectura. Se le dio el volumen del profeta Isaías. Lo desenrolló y encontró el pasaje en que estaba escrito: *“El espíritu del Señor está sobre mí, porque me ha ungido para llevar a los pobres la buena nueva, para anunciar la liberación a los cautivos y la curación a los ciegos, para dar libertad a los oprimidos y proclamar el año de gracia del Señor”*. Enrolló el volumen, lo devolvió al encargado y se sentó. Los ojos de todos los asistentes a la sinagoga estaban fijos en él. Entonces comenzó a hablar, diciendo: *“Hoy mismo se ha cumplido este pasaje de la Escritura que acaban de oír”*.

Estamos en la década de 80 cuando, desaparecidos ya los testigos oculares de Cristo, el cristianismo comienza a enfrentar-se con una seria de herejías y de desvios doctrinales que ponen en peligro la causa de la identidad cristiana. Era pues, necesario, recordar a los creyentes sus raíces y la solidez de esa doctrina recibida de Jesús, a través del testimonio legítimo que es la tradición transmitida por los apóstoles. En este texto en concreto, Lucas va a presentar el programa que Jesús se propone realizar en medio de los hombres, como una propuesta de liberación dirigida a todos los oprimidos. El proyecto libertador de Dios va dirigido a los hombres prisioneros del egoísmo, de la injusticia y del pecado. Comienza, por tanto, y se realiza a través de la acción de Jesús. Lucas va a describir la actividad de Jesús en Galilea como el anuncio de la buena nueva dirigida preferentemente a los pobres y marginalizados, anunciándoles que ha llegado el fin de todas las esclavitudes y un tiempo nuevo de vida y de libertad para todos.



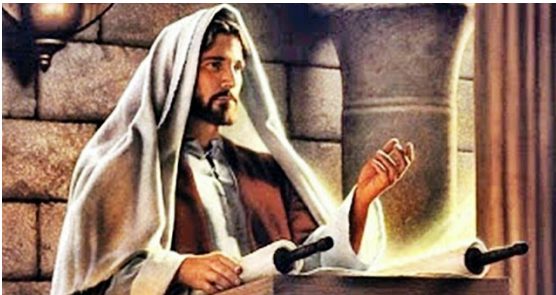
La liturgia de este domingo sitúa en el centro de nuestra reflexión la Palabra de Dios: ella es, verdaderamente, el centro alrededor del cual se construye la experiencia Cristiana. En la primera lectura, se ejemplifica como la Palabra debe estar en el centro de la vida comunitaria y como ella, una vez proclamada, es generadora de alegría y de fiesta.



La segunda lectura, de la I carta de Pablo a los corintios, presenta a la comunidad generada y alimentada por la Palabra libertadora de Dios: es una familia de hermanos, en la que los dones de Dios son repartidos y puestos al servicio del bien común.

DOMINGO III DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO DE SÃO LUCAS, 1, 1-4:4. 14-16

Já que muitos empreenderam narrar os factos que se realizaram entre nós, como no-los transmitiram os que, desde o início foram testemunhas oculares e ministros da palavra, também eu resolvi, depois de ter investigado cuidadosamente tudo desde as origens, escrevê-las para ti, ilustre Teófilo, para que tenhas conhecimento seguro do que te foi ensinado. Naquele tempo, Jesus voltou da Galileia com a força do Espírito. Ensinava nas sinagogas e era elogiado por todos. Foi então a Nazaré, onde se tinha criado. Segundo o seu costume, entrou na sinagoga a um sábado e levantou-se para fazer a leitura. Entregaram-lhe o livro do profeta Isaías e, ao abrir o livro, encontrou a passagem em que estava escrito: *“O Espírito do Senhor está sobre mim, porque ele me ungiu para anunciar a boa nova aos pobres. Ele me enviou a proclamar a redenção aos cativos e a vista aos cegos, a restituir a liberdade aos oprimidos e a proclamar o ano da graça do Senhor”*. Depois enrolou o livro, entregou-o ao ajudante e sentou-se. Estavam fixos em Jesus os olhos de toda a sinagoga. Começou então a dizer-lhes: *“Cumpriu-se hoje mesmo esta passagem da Escritura que acabais de ouvir”*.



Durante este ano litúrgico seremos acompanhados pelo Evangelho de Lucas. É portanto natural que, na abertura do Tempo Comum nos seja proposto a introdução a este Evangelho. Lucas escreve cerca de cinquenta anos depois de ocorridos os fatos, e,

dentre os evangelistas, é o único a afirmar expressamente que não pertence ao grupo daqueles que conheceram pessoalmente o Senhor. Muitos já se deram ao trabalho de registrar os acontecimentos da vida de Jesus e sua doutrina. Também Lucas decide escrever sobre este mesmo assunto, não para desacreditar o trabalho dos que o precederam, mas para apresentar uma narrativa organizada da qual as suas comunidades precisam. Ele verifica a veracidade dos fatos, procurando os primeiros testemunhos. O objetivo da sua obra é dar bases sólidas à fé dos cristãos das suas comunidades. Jesus resume o seu projeto em poucas palavras: libertação do homem de qualquer escravidão.



A Primeira Leitura deste domingo nos apresenta o sacerdote Esdras trazendo para o povo de Israel a Lei do Senhor. A proclamação da Palavra de Deus é um motivo de alegria para todo o povo, é um dia de festa. A homilia de Esdras consegue bons resultados. O povo faz um sério exame de consciência, convencem-se de que não foi fiel à lei de Deus e, derramando lágrimas, manifesta o seu arrependimento.



Na Segunda Leitura da Primeira Carta de Paulo aos coríntios, ele mostra aos coríntios que os dons do Espírito não devem conduzir à competição e à rivalidade, e sim à unidade. Todos nós somos membros do Corpo de Cristo; todos nós somos importantes. Cada membro deve estar no seu lugar e desenvolver bem sua função.
