I trust that you and your family survived the winter season's first blizzard (and hopefully the last!). Most people are grateful when these storms hit us on the weekend rather than week days. But as pastors, we lament the loss of many good folks who can't come to Mass, and thus we lose out in the offertory collection baskets. Thanks to the 432 of you who walked/drove through the snow drifts, and all of you who mail in your donations, or put in a little extra this Sunday. As you see in the photo below, we had 12 wonderful workers cleaning the mountains of white-stuff: led by our maintenance supervisor Ken Stein, our deacon-candidate Mario Arevalo, and 10 young volunteer Spanish men, some of whom had never seen snow! Jesus had His 12 Apostles; but I have my 12 "elves"!



2022 marks a special anniversary year here at Corpus Christi. It was 100 years ago that our beautiful Sisters of St. Dominic of Amityville founded our historic parish school. Formerly called the "Old Graves Estate" on Searing Avenue, it became known as "The Mansion" (pictured below), with four classrooms and 125 children. By 1927 we had our first 8th grade graduation, with the school growing rapidly. The present building was dedicated in 1954, and the second building now gone was constructed in 1963. Sadly, 12 years ago our school closed because of changing demographics and financial struggles.

But we can never stop giving gratitude to God for the 88 years of dedicated service from the Dominican Sisters, and all of you who gave so much for great Catholic education in Mineola. Later this year in the Fall, we will have a special Mass of Thanksgiving for the gift that still is Corpus Christi School!



Now that the Christmas season is well behind us, with all the wreaths and poinsettias gone, I once again wanted to give praise for our parish, and your generosity at the end of 2021 (nearly \$55,000 in the Christmas collection!), (nearly \$66,000 in the Catholic Ministries Appeal!), February is a month of “Ordinary time” in the Church, leading us to the Lenten season and Ash Wednesday beginning on March 2nd. As the pandemic seems to be receding at the moment, it is our hope that we might return to some sense of “normalcy” this spring here in the Church; continuing to build up the Body of Christ. Please keep up the triple-disciplines of distancing, purifying and masking, in order to insure the safety and protection of all celebrating Mass!

Monday is the Feast Day of Blessed Rosalie Rendu (1786-1856) founder of the Daughters of Charity.

On April 23, 1833, Frederic Ozanam started the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. He resolved to respond to Christ's call by dedicating himself to the poor after the example of St. Vincent de Paul. He asked Sister Rosalie Rendu, a Daughter of Charity, for the names families in need. Sr. Rosalie was known as "The Mother of the Poor" in the poorest section of Paris. She taught Frederic much about the poor and how to minister to them with love and respect. The first members of the Society were determined not only to bring bread, but, above all, friendship to the poor. Everyday she prayed for and fed the poor in the Mouffetard district from a basket of bread. She saw the face of Christ in those she visited. Sr. Rosalie recounted a dream she once had:

"Last night I dreamed that I stood at the judgment seat of God. God received me with great severity and was about to pronounce my sentence when, suddenly, I was surrounded by an immense crowd of people carrying old boots, shoes, and hats. They presented all these things to God saying: 'She was the one who gave us all these things.' Then Jesus looked at me and said, 'Because you gave all these old clothes in my Name, I open heaven to you. Enter, for all eternity.'"

DOMINGO V DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE LUCAS 5, 1-11

En aquel tiempo, Jesús estaba a orilla del lago de Genesaret y la gente se agolpaba en torno suyo para oír la palabra de Dios. Jesús vio dos barcos que estaban junto a la orilla. Los pescadores habían desembarcado y estaban lavando las redes. Subió Jesús a una de las barcas, la de Simón, le pidió que la alejara un poco de tierra, y sentado en la barca, enseñaba a la multitud. Cuando acabó de hablar, dijo a Simón: *“Lleva la barca adentro y echen sus redes para pescar”*. Simón replicó: *“Maestro, hemos trabajado toda la noche y no hemos pescado nada; pero, confiado en tu palabra, echaré las redes”*. Así lo hizo y cogieron tal cantidad de pescados, que las redes se rompían. Entonces hicieron señas a sus compañeros que estaban en la otra barca, para que vinieran a ayudarlos. Vinieron ellos y llenaron tanto las dos barcas, que casi se hundían. Al ver esto, Simón Pedro se arrojó a los pies de Jesús y le dijo: *“Apártate de mí, Señor, porque soy un pecador”*. Porque tanto él como sus compañeros estaban llenos de asombro al ver la pesca que había conseguido. Lo mismo les pasaba a Santiago y a Juan, hijos de Zebedeo, que eran compañeros de Simón. Entonces Jesús le dijo a Simón: *“No temas; desde ahora serás pescador de hombres”*. Luego llevaron las barcas a tierra, y dejándolo todo, lo siguieron.



En el centro de las lecturas de este domingo aparece como mensaje fundamental la fuerza de la Palabra de Dios para cambiar la vida de aquellos que la escuchan, la oyen y la siguen. El relato de la pesca milagrosa en el lago de Galilea fue muy popular entre los primeros cristianos. Varios evangelistas recogen el episodio, pero solo Lucas culmina la narración con una escena conmovedora que tiene por protagonista a Simón Pedro, discípulo creyente y pecador al mismo tiempo. Pedro es un hombre de fe, seducido por Jesús. Sus palabras tienen para él más fuerza que su propia experiencia. Pedro sabe que nadie se pone a pescar al mediodía en el lago, sobre todo si no ha capturado nada por la noche. Pero se lo ha dicho Jesús y Pedro confía totalmente en él. El evangelista nos recuerda que rememos mar adentro y echemos las redes para pescar y, aunque las redes salgan vacías, no nos desanimemos sino que lo intentemos una y otra vez. Para echar las redes tenemos que tener dos actitudes fundamentales: fe y constancia. Debemos aprender a nadar a contracorriente y no desanimarnos porque nuestra pesca es la pesca de hermanos para el Reino de Dios.



La primera lectura se nos describe la experiencia de Isaías en el templo de Jerusalén cuando es llamado para ser enviado y hablar al Pueblo en nombre de Dios. El profeta se siente indigno.



Pablo se lo recuerda a los Corintios, es la gracia la que actúa en nosotros si ponemos la verdadera enseñanza de Dios y de la Iglesia en el centro de nuestra vocación: que Jesucristo murió por nosotros y resucitó.

V DOMINGO DO TEMPO COMUM

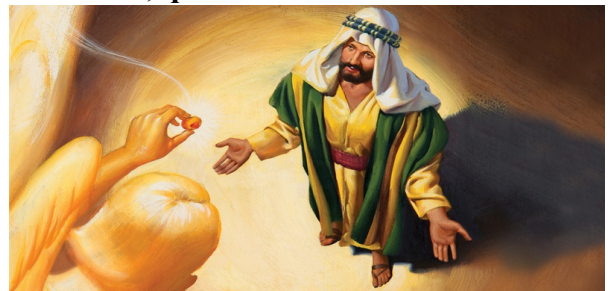


EVANGELHO DE SÃO LUCAS 5, 1-11

Naquele tempo, estava a multidão aglomerada em volta de Jesus, para ouvir a palavra de Deus. Ele encontrava-se na margem do lago. Os pescadores tinham deixado os barcos e estavam a lavar as redes. Jesus subiu para um barco, que era de Simão, e pediu-lhe que se afastasse um pouco da terra. Depois sentou-se e do barco pôs-se a ensinar a multidão. Quando acabou de falar, disse a Simão: *“Faz-te ao largo e lançaí as redes para a pesca”*. Respondeu-lhe Simão: *“Mestre, andámos na faina toda a noite e não apanhamos nada. Mas, já que o dizes, lançarei as redes”*. Eles assim fizeram e apanharam tão grande quantidade de peixes que as redes começavam a romper-se. Fizeram sinal aos companheiros que estavam no outro barco, para virem ajudar; eles vieram e encheram ambos os barcos de tal modo que quase se afundavam. Ao ver o sucedido, Simão Pedro lançou-se aos pés de Jesus e disse-lhe: *“Senhor, afasta-te de mim, que sou um homem pecador”*. Na verdade, o temor tinha-se apoderado dele e de todos os seus companheiros, por causa da pesca realizada. Isso mesmo sucedeu a Tiago e a João, filhos de Zebedeu, que eram companheiros de Simão. Jesus disse a Simão: *“Não temas. Daqui em diante serás pescador de homens”*. Tendo conduzido os barcos para terra, eles deixaram tudo e seguiram Jesus.



Jesus comanda a pesca quando todos os sinais externos são negativos. Os Apóstolos voltam a lançar as redes quando tudo poderia dar errado novamente. Mas esta história acaba com uma pesca muito abundante. Se nos perguntamos pela diferença entre a eficácia dessa pesca e o fracasso noturno, a resposta é imediata: a presença de Jesus Cristo. O Senhor serve-se de tudo isso para lhes dar - e para nos dar - um ensinamento espiritual muito importante: sem Cristo não fazemos nada. Sem Cristo, o fruto da luta será cansaço, tensão, desânimo e vontade de desistir. Em troca, com ele, a pesca é abundante. Deixemos que Jesus que suba à nossa barca, que entre na nossa vida.



A liturgia deste domingo leva-nos a refletir sobre a nossa vocação: somos todos chamados por Deus e dele recebemos uma missão para o mundo. Na primeira leitura, encontramos a descrição do chamamento de Isaías. O profeta desenha a grandeza, a onipotência e a magnificência de Deus. Ao contemplar a Glória de Deus, Isaías é profundamente constrangido por uma consciência de pecado. Seus lábios impuros são purificados por um carvão ardente levados por um Serafim, anjos que servem diante do trono de Deus.



Na segunda leitura da primeira carta de Paulo aos Coríntios, ele fala da ressurreição de Jesus. Paulo cita as manifestações de Jesus ressuscitado: a Pedro, aos Apóstolos, a mais de quinhentos irmãos, e, finalmente, ao próprio Paulo. A RESSURREIÇÃO de Jesus é o centro da nossa fé.
