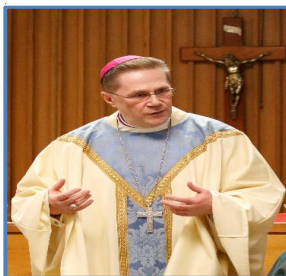

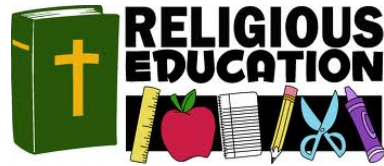

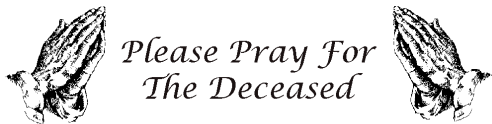

Today's Gospel story begins with a deathly accusation and ends with divine mercy. Where the community's condemnation would have led the adulterous woman to death, Jesus' mercy leads her to new life. A story that begins with exposing the sin of an individual ends with exposing the sinfulness of all. The community is transformed through encountering Jesus into the awareness of their own sinfulness. Jesus' desire for us is not death but new life.

God's loving presence is cleansing, as baptism and penance remind us. God's love labors to break down the resistance that it finds within us. It is a creative love that works toward change, transformation, new beginnings. The recurring Lenten season nudges us each year toward self-denial. The real point of self-discipline and abstention practices is not merely to "give up" objects, but to reconstruct one's deepest self so that God might take fuller possession of our life. Jesus asks that the same energy we might have used in accumulating riches, consolidating power, or pursuing personal pleasure be channeled toward the building up of a "new person" as a dwelling place for God.

Jesus' response to those who accuse the woman is more than a caution to us about making judgment of others. It is a profound lesson in divine mercy and forgiveness. As sinners, we are all unworthy to judge the sins of others and we would stand convicted by God for our transgressions. Yet Jesus, the one without sin and thus our judge, offers us who are sinners his mercy and forgiveness. Redeemed by Jesus' compassion, we are sent to sin no more and to live in God's love and peace.

DOMINGO V DE QUARESMA



EVANGELIO SEGÚN SAN JUAN 8, 1-11

En aquel tiempo; Jesús se retiró al monte de los Olivos y al amanecer se presentó de nuevo en el templo, donde la multitud se le acercaba; y él, sentado entre ellos, les enseñaba. Entonces los escribas y fariseos le llevaron a una mujer sorprendida en adulterio, y poniéndola frente a él, le dijeron: *“Maestro, esta mujer ha sido sorprendida en flagrante adulterio. Moisés nos manda en la ley apedrear a estas mujeres. Tú qué dices?”* Le preguntaban esto para ponerlo una trampa y poder acusarlo. Pero Jesús se agachó y se puso a escribir en el suelo con el dedo. Pero como insistían en su pregunta, se incorporó y les dijo: *“Aquel de ustedes que no tenga pecado, que le tire la primera piedra”*. Se volvió a agachar y siguió escribiendo en el suelo. Al oír aquellas palabras, los acusadores comenzaron a escabullirse uno tras otro, empezando por los más viejos, hasta que dejaron solos a Jesús y a la mujer, que estaba de pie, junto a él. Entonces Jesús se enderezó y le preguntó: *“Mujer, dónde están los que te acusaban? Nadie te ha condenado?”* Ella le contestó: *“Nadie, Señor”*. Y Jesús le dijo: *“Tampoco yo te condeno. Vete y ya no vuelvas a pecar”*.



La Ley de Moisés decía: Si fuere sorprendido alguno acostado con una mujer casada con marido, ambos morirán, el hombre que se acostó con la mujer, y la mujer también; así quitarás el mal de Israel. (Libro del Deuteronomio 22, 22). Exigían a Jesús que dictara una sentencia. Lo que los fariseos y los escribas buscaban era obligarle a decir algo que pudiera utilizar para desacreditarlo ante el Pueblo o para acusarle ante las autoridades. En realidad estaban obligando a Jesús a elegir entre la misericordia y la justicia. La trampa que le presentaron tenía que ser contestada. Si condenaba a la mujer e incitaba a los judíos a apedrearla tal como la ley judía indicaba, esto le crearía problemas con las autoridades romanas que no permitía a los judíos ejecutar a nadie. De forma magistral, el Señor cambió la atención de la mujer tirada en el suelo a los acusadores. El que de vosotros esté sin pecado sea el primero en arrojar la piedra contra ella. Con mucha frecuencia la sociedad ha aplicado distintos niveles de severidad o tolerancia dependiendo de quién comete el pecado. En esta historia, donde está el hombre adúltero?

EL MAYOR DESAFÍO



Filipenses 3:7-14

⁷ Pero las cosas que para mí eran ganancias, las he apreciado pérdidas por Cristo.

La segunda lectura de este domingo nos presenta uno de los pasajes más íntimos y personales del apóstol Pablo. Él nos habla de lo que supo para él haber conocido a Cristo. Por Cristo todo le parece pérdida, por Él todo lo que en este mundo es relumbrón, le parece una nadería. Conocer a Cristo, su evangelio, vivir en el horizonte de la fe pascual es haber encontrado el sentido de su vida y de la felicidad por la que luchó Pablo en el judaísmo. Ahora, disse Pablo, todo es distinto, no tiene que aparentar, ni justificarse. Eso era lo que vivía antes de su conversión. *“Hermanos: Todo lo que era valioso para mí, lo consideré sin valor por causa de Cristo. Olvido lo que he dejado atrás, y me lanzo hacia adelante, en busca de la meta y del trofeo al que Dios, por medio de Cristo Jesús, nos llama desde el cielo”*.

DOMINGO V DA QUARESMA



EVANGELHO DE SÃO JOÃO 8, 1-11

Naquele tempo, Jesus foi para o monte das Oliveiras. Mas de manhã cedo, apareceu outra vez no templo e todo o povo se aproximou-se dele. Então sentou-se e começou a ensinar. Os escribas e os fariseus apresentaram a Jesus uma mulher surpreendida em adultério, colocaram-na no meio dos presente e disseram a Jesus. *“Mestre, esta mulher foi surpreendida em flagrante adultério. Na Lei, Moisés mandou-nos apedrejar tais mulheres. Tu que dizes?”* Falavam assim para lhe armarem uma cilada e terem pretexto para o acusar. Mas Jesus inclinou-se e começou a escrever com o dedo no chão. Como persistiam em interroga-lo, ergueu-se e disse-lhes: *“Quem de entre vós estiver sem pecado atire a primeira pedra”*. Inclinou-se novamente e continuou a escrever no chão. Eles, porém, quando ouviram tais palavras, foram saindo um após outro, a começar pelos mais velhos, e ficou só Jesus e a mulher, que estava no meio. Jesus ergueu-se e disse-lhe: *“Mulher, onde estão eles? Ninguém te condenou?”* Ela respondeu: *“Ninguém, Senhor”*. Disse então Jesus: *“Nem eu te condeno. Vai e não tornes a pecar”*.



Este Evangelho da pecadora adúltera retoma o tema da misericórdia de Deus, tão próprio da Quaresma. *“Nem eu te condeno. Vai e não peques mais”*. Com esta atitude, Jesus nos revela os traços de sua misericórdia. Pressionado pelos escribas e fariseus, que exigiam dele o cumprimento da lei de Moisés com relação à adúltera, Jesus não desautoriza a lei, mas supera-a com um gesto de misericórdia. Neste Evangelho, Jesus reprova a atitude condenatória e estritamente legalista dos escribas e fariseus, por lhes faltar misericórdia. Pela sua hipocrisia. Pois a falta de misericórdia para com o outro é hipocrisia. Aqueles homens eram tão pecadores quanto a adúltera, ou mais; no entanto se julgavam no direito de julgá-la. A misericórdia de Jesus não a condena; sabe esperar, acreditar, até o fim, na possibilidade de mudança e de conversão.



A segunda leitura deste domingo, da carta de Paulo aos Filipenses, é um desafio a libertar-nos do lixo que impede a descoberta de Cristo, a identificação com Cristo, princípio da nossa ressurreição. *“Considero todas as coisas como prejuízo, comparando-as com o bem supremo, que é conhecer Jesus Cristo, meu Senhor”*. Que palavras tão maravilhosas do apóstolo Paulo!

Não relembreis coisas passadas, não olheis para fatos antigos. Eis que eu farei coisas novas, e que já estão surgindo.

A primeira leitura do livro do profeta Isaías, apresenta-nos o Deus libertador, que acompanha com solicitude e amor a caminhada do seu Povo para a liberdade.
