My Dear Friends of Corpus Christi,

"On entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, clothed in a white robe, and they were utterly amazed! He said to them 'Do not be amazed! You seek Jesus of Nazareth, the crucified one! He has been raised. He is not here. Behold the place where they laid Him' " (Gospel of Mark 16:5-6). The sight of the empty tomb on that first Easter Sunday morning, truly filled Mary Magdalene and the other women with profound amazement. Pastors receive six-year assignments from the Bishop, with the possibility of renewing for another six years. By the time Easter arrives, I should know whether I am staying or going. Whatever is best for the future of this great family of faith, I will abide by as a priest of Jesus Christ.

I am grateful to God for the multitude of blessings bestowed upon our parish staff members, all the ministers and volunteers, and everyone who has their place in the pews each and every week. Your sacrificial giving embodies the heavy Cross of Christ, and your generous hearts fill the empty tomb of Jesus with love. May the Resurrected Lord and our Mother Mary together bless you and your family this glorious Easter season!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Christ is Risen, Alleluia!

Every Easter, as we celebrate our Lord's victory over death, we delight in the consolation that all is restored through the Resurrection, and we ponder God's relentless invitation to live the divine life given at baptism.

This is the good news of our faith: Christ has conquered death and we are invited to life. This good news needs to be heard time and again. Even when things are bleak, we remember Christ is victorious and that we have been invited to witness to his victory. As Pope Francis says:

“Where all seems to be dead, signs of the resurrection suddenly spring up. It is an irresistible force. Often it seems that God does not exist: all around us we see persistent injustice, evil, indifference and cruelty. But it is also true that in the midst of darkness something new always springs to life and sooner or later produces fruit. On razed land life breaks through, stubbornly yet invincibly. However dark things are, goodness always re-emerges and spreads. Each day in our world beauty is born anew, it rises transformed through the storms of history. Values always tend to reappear under new guises, and human beings have arisen time after time from situations that seemed doomed. Such is the power of the resurrection, and all who evangelize are instruments of that power.”¹

We know well the bleakness that can overwhelms us. How good it is to recall God's goodness! The Risen Lord moves through the locked doors of fear to lead us, to lead our families and to lead the world to peace. May we never forget God's triumph over death and our baptismal call to be an instrument of that power. May we show the Risen Lord to all we meet.

This Easter, as we rejoice in Christ's Resurrection, let us remember especially those who suffer in Ukraine and the millions who have been displaced by that tragic war. Together, we pray that the Risen Christ bring light to their darkness and give them peace.

Be assured of my prayers for you in these holy and joyful weeks.

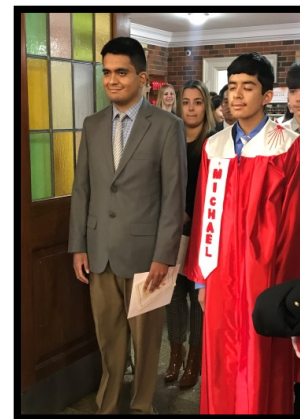

Today's gospel account is filled with the completely human circumstances in which Christ died. Take for example the behavior of His friends. Judas, one of the specially chosen twelve. One can feel the hurt in Christ's gentle words, "Friend, why are you here? Judas would you betray the Son of Man with a kiss?" One could almost stomach the betrayal of Judas had the other eleven remained faithful. "And they all forsook him and fled." Surely, not Peter, he had boasted, "Even though all abandon you, I will follow you to prison and to death." but when he was cornered by a servant girl, Peter the Rock disintegrated. He denied knowing Christ." "And Jesus turning; looked at Peter and Peter went out and wept bitterly." And these were his friends. The people he lived with and loved, and the people he showered his miracles on. And not one of them lifted a finger for him. The Passion story is the story of our salvation. But it is much more. It is the story of our lives. There isn't a part in the whole sordid script that we, you and I, wouldn't play to perfection. Peter in his pride and Peter in his fall and, hopefully, Peter in his repentance too. We'd fit in perfectly with the disciples who fled at the first sign of danger, or with Caiaphas and the high priests, with their self-righteousness and eagerness to reform others while ignoring themselves, or with Pilate in his abuse of authority, or with the mob with its thirst for excitement and blood. And Judas? Let's face it, there's a little Judas (and Peter) in all of us. There are times and situations in all our lives when Jesus could easily say to us as he said to Judas, "Friend, why are you here?"

DOMINGO DE RAMOS



EVANGELIO SEGÚN SAN LUCAS 19. 28-40

En aquel tiempo, Jesús, acompañado de sus discípulos, iba a camino de Jerusalén, y al acercarse a Betfagé, junto al monte llamado de los OLIVOS, envió a dos de sus discípulos, diciéndoles: Vayan al caseiro que está frente a ustedes. Al entrar, encontrarán atado un burrito que nadie ha montado todavía. Desátelo y tráyanlo aquí. Si alguien les pregunta por qué lo desatan, díganle: El Señor lo necesita. Fueron y encontraron todo como el Señor les había dicho. Mientras destaban el burro, los dueños les preguntaron: Por qué lo desamarran? Ellos contestaron: El Señor lo necesita. Se llevaron, pues, el burro, le echaron encima los mantos e hicieron que Jesús montara en él. Conforme iba avanzando, la gente tapizaba el camino con sus mantos, y cuando ya estaba cerca la bajada del mote de los Olivos, la multitud de discípulos, entusiasmados, se pusieron a alabar a Dios a gritos por todos los prodigios que había visto, diciendo: Bendito el rey que viene en nombre del Señor! Paz en el cielo y gloria en las alturas! Algunos fariseos que iban entre la gente, le dijeron: Maestro, reprende a tus discípulos. Él les replicó: Les aseguro que si ellos se callan, gritarán las piedras.



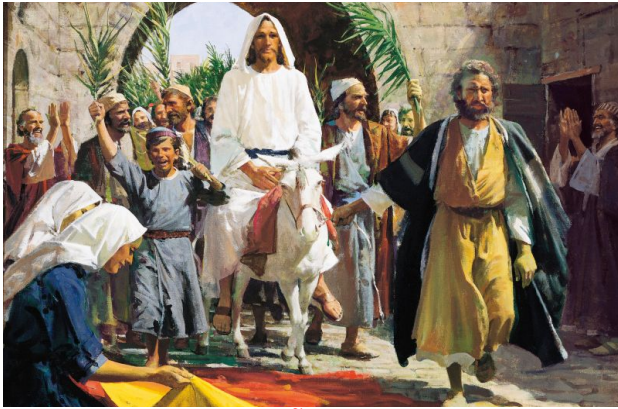
La puerta de entrada a la gran semana de los cristianos es el Domingo de Ramos. En el Domingo de Ramos, la liturgia nos propone dos momentos importantes: al inicio de la Eucaristía en la que se revive la entrada bulliciosa, con cantos, con alegría, con fiestas, con vivas y oles de Jesús en Jerusalén. Durante toda la semana santa se leerá lo que hizo Jesús en Jerusalén desde que llegó hasta que murió. Por ello, la semana santa se abre y se cierra con la lectura del relato de la pasión. Es interesante el comparar las actitudes de quienes acompañan a Jesús en cada acontecimiento. En el primer momento, reciben a Jesús llenos de júbilo y con mucho entusiasmo, en ese momento, Jesús es la persona de mayor importancia entre los que van entrando a Jerusalén, todos le aclaman y se desviven por estar a su lado. En cambio, cuando escuchamos el relato de la Pasión de Jesús, cambia el panorama. En este acontecimiento vemos a Jesús rechazado, lo han dejado solo, sus amigos le han traicionado e incluso le han negado, la muchedumbre grita pero no de júbilo, sino para pedir que le crucifiquen. De muchas formas esta podría ser la historia de nuestra vida, de nuestras relaciones con Jesús. Un día estamos gozosos, llenos de buenas intenciones para seguir a Jesús, le aclamamos pensando que Él es nuestro Rey, nuestro Salvador, pero cuando las cosas se nos ponen difíciles, cuando nos encontramos ante algunas exigencias de cambio en nuestras vidas, tendemos a imitar a aquellos que le acompañaron en el relato de la Pasión.



Dios todo-poderoso y eterno, que quisiste que nuestro Salvador se hiciera hombre y padeciera en la cruz para dar al género humano ejemplo de humildad, concédenos, benigno, seguir las enseñanzas de su pasión y que merezcamos participar de su gloriosa resurrección.

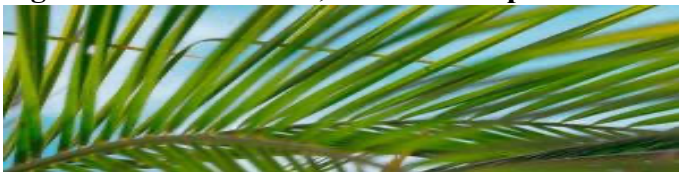

DOMINGO DE RAMOS



EVANGELHO DE SÃO LUCCAS 19, 28-40

Naquele tempo, Jesus seguia à frente dos seus discípulos subindo para Jerusalém. Quando se aproximou de Betfagé e de Betânia, perto do monte das Oliveiras, enviou dois discípulos e disse-lhes: Ide à povoação que está em frente e, ao entrardes nela, encontrareis um jumentinho preso, que ainda ninguém montou. Soltai-o e trazei-o. Se alguém perguntar porque o soltais, respondereis: O Senhor precisa dele. Os enviados partiram e encontraram tudo como Jesus lhes tinha dito. Quando estavam a soltar o jumentinho, os donos perguntaram: Porque soltais o jumentinho? Eles responderam: O Senhor precisa dele. Então levaram-no a Jesus e, lançando as capas sobre o jumentinho, fizeram montar Jesus. Enquanto Jesus caminhava, o povo estendia as suas capas no caminho. Estando já próximo da descida do monte das Oliveiras, toda a multidão dos discípulos começou a louvar alegremente a Deus em alta voz por todos os milagres que tinham visto, dizendo: Bendito o Rei que vem em nome do Senhor. Paz no Céu e glória nas alturas! Alguns fariseus disseram a Jesus, do meio da multidão: Mestre, repreende os teus discípulos. Mas Jesus respondeu: Eu vos digo: se eles se calarem, clamarão as pedras.



Iniciamos a celebração da Semana Santa com a entrada de Jesus na Cidade Santa. Jesus entra em triunfo, mas dias depois ele é rejeitado pelo mesmo

povo que o acolhera e é condenado à morte. O Evangelho deste domingo, a Paixão de Nosso Senhor segundo Lucas, mostra como os grandes, Herodes e Pilatos (rivais e inimigos), tornam-se amigos às custas de Jesus, mandando-o de um para o outro como objeto de diversão. Conta também como um dos malfeitores crucificados com Jesus escarnece do sofrimento do justo. Por outro lado, vemos Simão de Cirene, ajudando Jesus a levar a cruz; as mulheres chorando o seu sofrimento; o bom ladrão solicitando a misericórdia de Jesus. O oficial romano ao pé da cruz exclamou: Realmente, este homem era um justo! E por que o justo sofre? A primeira e a segunda leitura deste domingo no-lo dizem: por obediência a Deus. Deus não manda sofrer o justo, seu filho. Só manda amar. Amar até o fim. Mas quem ama, sofre! O justo que ama, sofre. Diante da cruz do justo que morre, temos que escolher: ou pelo lado dos que dão sua vida para viver e fazer viver o amor de Deus, ou pelo lado dos que se dão as mãos para suprimir a justiça; lado de quem carrega a cruz, ou de quem a impõe.



A cruz é o símbolo da nossa salvação. O justo que se entrega nas mãos dos pecadores para nos salvar. Durante a paixão, os discípulos não fazem uma grande figura: Judas traiçoa. Pedro renega, todos fogem. Os evangelistas sublinham este comportamento vil. Apenas Lucas procura atenuar as responsabilidades dos apóstolos: não se refere à sua fuga, e diz que, no Calvário, todos os seus conhecidos e as mulheres que o tinham acompanhado desde a Galiléia mantinham-se à distância, observando as coisas; não se refere à censura de Jesus a Pedro: Simão, dormes? Nem uma hora pudeste vigiar? Encontra uma desculpa para explicar até o sono deles: Encontrando-os a dormir, devido à tristeza. Lucas é o exemplo do pastor de almas que, mesmo sem justificar o pecado, sabe entendê-lo, atribui à ignorância, à miséria humana comum a todos nós.
