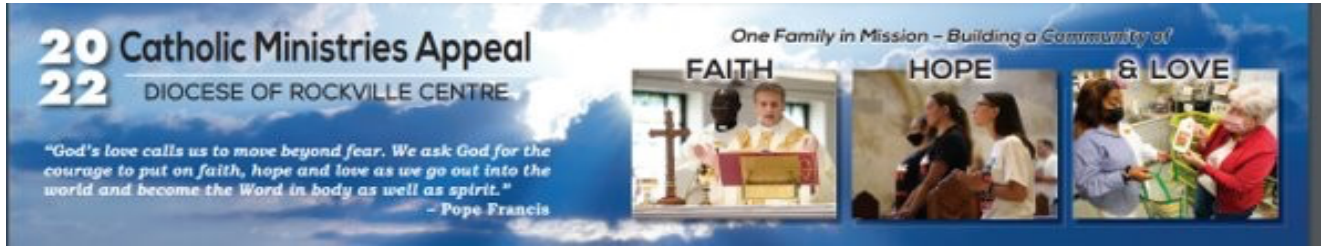


Our Lady of Fatima

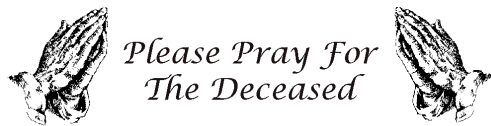

Could we imagine ourselves as among the fish that Jesus sent Peter out to catch? Like them, we are immersed in a sea of troubles and distractions, moved by every ripple of excitement, shaken by the level of doubt and disbelief that marks our world today. We spend so much energy on what are ultimately trivialities. We dally with temptation, and let ourselves be hooked by unhealthy lures, from money to gambling to drugs to mindless celebrity. It is little wonder that Christ chose simple fishermen when he chose his first apostles.

Today's story reflects the miracle of salvation as an offer. Through his church, Christ has thrown over us his net of salvation, a net of grace. He says: "The kingdom of heaven is like a net that was thrown into the sea and caught fish of every kind." Though it remains unseen beneath the surface, we are drawn into it, if we let that happen. We can make our own the prayer "may we be caught in God's net"...The miraculous catch of fish is really about the grace of God. There is no telling what size the catch will be until the net is finally drawn in at the end of time. Who knows what kind of strange fish will be caught there, spluttering and gasping at the wonder of God's mercy? The "big catch" is Christ's answer to those prophets of gloom who imagine that most people are outside his reach.

Then after this catch, Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." And the Lord. Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

III DOMINGO DE PASCUA



EVANGELIO SEGÚN SAN JUAN 20, 19-31

En aquel tempo, Jesús se apareció otra vez a los discípulos junto al lago de Tiberíades. Y se apareció de esta manera: Estaban juntos Simón Pedro, Tomás apodado el Mellizo, Natanael el de Caná de Galilea, los Zebedeos y otros dos discípulos suyos. Simón Pedro les disse: *“Me voy a pescar”*. Ellos contestan: *“Vamos también nosotros contigo”*. Salieron y se embarcaron; aquella noche no cogieron nada. Estaba ya amaneciendo, cuando Jesús se presentó en la orilla; pero los discípulos no sabían que era” Jesús. Jesús les disse: *“Muchachos, tenéis pescado”*? Ellos contestaron: *“No”*. Él les disse: *“Echad la red a la derecha de la barca y encontraréis”*. La echaron, y no tenían fuerzas para sacarla, por la multitud de peces. Y aquel discípulo que Jesús tanto quería le disse a Pedro: *“Es el Señor”*. Al oír que era el Señor, Simón Pedro, que estaba desnudo, se ató la túnica y se echó al agua. Los demás discípulo se acercaron en la barca, porque no distaban de tierra más que unos cien metros, remolcando la red con los peces. Al saltar a tierra, ven unas brasas con un pescado puesto encima y pan. Jesús les disse: *“Traed de los peces que acabáis de coger”*. Simón Pedro subió a la barca y arrastró la orilla la red repleta de peces grandes: ciento e cincuenta y tres. Y aunque eran tantos, no se rompió la red. Jesús le disse: *“Vamos almorzad”*. Ninguno de los discípulos se atrevía a preguntarle quién era, porque sabían bien que era el Señor. Jesús se acerca, toma el pan y se lo da, y lo mismo el pescado. Ésta fu ela terceira vez que Jesús se apareció a los discípulos, después de resucitar de entre los muertos.



El Libro de los Hechos de los Apóstoles presenta el camino que la Iglesia de Jesús recorrió, desde Jerusalén hasta Roma, el corazón del império. Sin embargo, fue en Jerusalén, el lugar donde irrumpió la salvación, esto es, donde Jesús sufrió, murió, resucitó y subió al cielo, donde todo empezó. Fue allí donde nació la primera comunidade Cristiana y donde esa comunidade, por primera vez, se manifesto como testigo de Jesús ante el mundo.



Estamos al final del mandato del emperador Domiciano (cerca del año 95). Los cristianos eran perseguidos de forma violenta y parecia que todos los poderes del mundo se volvían contra los seguidores de Cristo. Muchos cristianos, llenos de miedo, abandonan el Evangelio. En este contexto de persecución, de miedo y de martírio se escribió el Apocalipsis. A Juan, Cristo resucitado le confia la misión de ser testigo. El profeta Juan es, pues, enviado a las iglesias; su misión es la de anunciar un mensaje de esperanza que permita enfrentarse al miedo y a la persecución. Sobre todo, es llamado a anunciar a todos los cristianos que Jesús resucitado está vivo, que camina en medio de su Iglesia y que, con él, ningún mal les sucederá pues él es el que preside la historia.

DOMINGO III DA PÁSCOA



EVANGELHO DE SÃO JOÃO 21, 1-14

Naquele tempo, Jesus manifestou-se outra vez aos seus discípulos, junto ao mar de Tiberíades. Manifestou-se deste modo. Estavam juntos Simão Pedro e Tomé, chamado Dídimo, Natanael, que era de Caná de Galiléia, os filhos de Zebedeu e mais dois discípulos de Jesus. Disse-lhes Simão Pedro: *“Vou pescar”*. Eles responderam-lhe: *“Nós vamos contigo. Saíram de casa e subiram para o barco, mas naquela noite não apanharam nada. Ao romper da manhã, Jesus apresentou-se na margem, mas os discípulos não sabiam que era ele. Disse-lhes Jesus: *“Rapazes, tendes alguma coisa de comer”*? Eles responderam: *“Não”*. Disse-lhes Jesus: *“Lançai a rede para a direita do barco e encontrareis”*. Eles lançaram a rede e já mal podiam arrastar por causa da abundância de peixes. O discípulo predilecto de Jesus disse à Pedro: *“É o Senhor”*. Simão Pedro, quando ouviu dizer que era o Senhor, vestiu a túnica que tinha tirado, e lançou-se ao mar. Os outros discípulos, que estava apenas a uns duzentos côvados da margem, vieram no barco, puxando a rede com os peixes. Quando saltaram em terra, viram brasas acesas com peixe em cima, e pão. Disse-lhes Jesus: *“Trazei alguns dos peixes que apanhastes agora”*. Simão Pedro subiu ao barco e puxou a rede para terra cheia de cento e cinquenta e três grandes peixes; e, apesar de serem tantos, não se rompeu a rede. Disse-lhes Jesus: *“Vinde comer”*. Nenhum dos discípulos se atrevia a perguntar: *“Quem és tu”*?, porque bem sabiam que era o Senhor. Jesus*

aproximou-se, tomou o pão e deu-lho, fazendo o mesmo com os peixes. Esta foi a terceira vez que Jesus se manifestou aos seus discípulos depois de ter ressuscitado dos mortos.



Hoje, um outro relato de aparição de Jesus, desta vez na Galileia, para onde os discípulos retornaram após a morte do Mestre. O capítulo 21 de João, considerado um acréscimo ao evangelho original, é uma belíssima e profunda reflexão do que significa o encontro da comunidade com o Ressuscitado. Trata-se, sem dúvida, de um discípulo do evangelista que quis reconciliar os cristãos que reconheciam Pedro como chefe da Igreja. Jesus se apresenta aos seus apóstolos em um contexto de vida normal, quando eles estão ocupados em sua tarefa quotidiana.



A comunidade cristã, desde os seus primeiros anos de vida, teve que enfrentar a oposição dos guias espirituais dos judeus que condenaram Jesus de Nazaré como blasfemo. Depois da sua morte infame, para Anás e Caifás, sumo sacerdotes, o caso estava definitivamente encerrado. Mas, pelo contrário, pouco tempo depois eis que estes discípulos se tornam impávidos, e desafiam as autoridades religiosas dos chefes do povo. Nesta primeira leitura, vemos como os apóstolos, sem medo das autoridades, ousam a proclamar a ressurreição de Jesus e afirmam: *“Deve-se obedecer-se antes a Deus do que aos homens”*.
