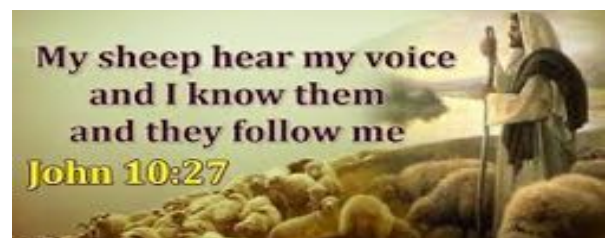

Pastor's Notes

The fourth Sunday of the Easter Season is always referred to as ‘Shepherd Sunday’, because each year the Gospel at Mass comes from John 10:1-18. Jesus identifies Himself as the Good Shepherd, who willingly lays down His life for His sheep. This biblical image is a prefigurement of Christ’s ultimate act of crucifixion on the cross; the supreme sacrifice of offering His life and death for the salvation of our souls. The Lord’s love as a shepherd is our model for the priesthood in the Church. And even though I realize that I fail each day in living up to the call of Christ, I still strive to become the priest/pastor whom God has created me to be. Believe and trust in more vocations to the priesthood of Jesus Christ, in these challenging times for the Church.

This weekend we continue to celebrate our First Holy Communion Masses for the children of our parish family. What a joy it is for me as a priest, to see the excitement, innocence and beauty of these youngsters, receiving the Body of Jesus Christ for the first time in the Holy Eucharist. Please pray for these boys and girls to come every Sunday with their families, in thanksgiving to God for Corpus Christi.

Friday 13 May is always a special day in Mineola, to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary as our Lady of Fatima. Our Portuguese brothers and sisters are so proud of their heritage, and bring that deep devotion for Fatima, especially to our hometown. 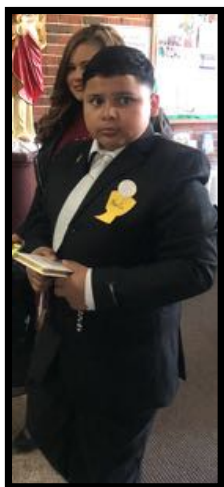

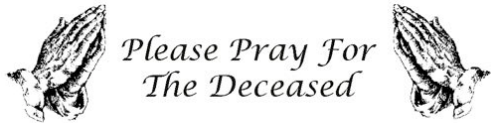

IV DOMINGO DE PASCUA



EVANGELIO DE SEGÚN SAN JUAN 10, 27-30

En aquel tiempo, dijo Jesús: *“Mis ovejas escuchan mi voz, y yo las conosco, y ellas me siguen, y yo les doy la vida eterna; no perecerán para siempre, y nadie las arrebatará de mi mano. Mi Padre, que me las ha dado, supera a todos, y nadie puede arrebagarlas de la mano del Padre. Yo y el Padre somos uno”*.



La tierra de Israel e en gran parte montañosa y se utiliza para el pastoreo de ovejas. Guardianes de rebaños eran Abel, Abahán, Jacob, Moisés, David. No debe, por tanto, causar consternación que se utilicen imágenes de la vida pastoral en la Biblia. Dios es llamado pastor de Israel: que conduce a su Pueblo como ovejas, los trata con amor y cuidado, los guía hacia abundantes pastos y manantiales de agua fresca. Incluso el Mesías es anunciado por los profetas como un pastor para guiar a Israel. En el Evangelio de Juan, Jesús se presenta como el pastor esperado, como el que va a conducir a la gente a lo largo del camino de la rectitud y fidelidad al Señor. El cuarto domingo de Pascua se llama el domingo del Buen Pastor. Jesús es el buen pastor porque él no tiene miedo de luchar hasta dar su vida por las ovejas que él ama. La imagen del pastor y de las ovejas indica la estrecha relación que Jesús quiere establecer con cada uno de nosotros. Él es nuestro guía, nuestro maestro, nuestro amigo, nuestro salvador. Por eso no tenemos más miedo.



La primera lectura de hoy se abre con un extracto de la historia del primer viaje misionero de Pablo y Bernabé. Estos dos apóstoles llegan a Antioquía de Pisidia un sábado, entran en la sinagoga de los judíos y comienzan a anunciar la Buena Nueva de Jesús. Su mensaje impresiona, sorprende, o más bien, sacude a sus oyentes, judíos fervorosos, educados en las tradiciones de sus padres y fieles observadores de la ley. Ellos conocen las palabras de los profetas y viven en la espera del Mesías. Sin embargo, quedan desconcertados y sorprendidos cuando, viniendo de la boca de Pablo y Bernabé, escuchan este mensaje escandaloso: Jesús, condenado por las autoridades religiosas y ejecutado con un vergueonzoso castigo, es el salvador del mundo.

Cuánto sufrimiento, cuántas tribulaciones, qué cantidad de amargura existe en la vida del hombre. El libro de Apocalipsis dedica cuatro capítulos a este problema angustiante. EVANGELHO DE SÃO JOÃO 10, 27-30

Naquele tempo, disse Jesus: As minhas ovelhas escutam a minha voz. Eu conheço as minhas ovelhas e elas seguem-me. Eu dou-lhes a vida eterna e nunca hão de perecer e ninguém as arrebatará da minha mão. Meu Pai, que mas deu, é mais do que todos e ninguém pode arrebatá-las da mão do Pai. Eu e o Pai somos um só.



Neste domingo do Bom Pastor, olhamos para Jesus com toda a confiança, pois ele promete cuidar das ovelhas do seu rebanho, não deixando que ninguém as arranque da sua mão. Ele não quer que nenhuma ovelha se perca e pede que todas o sigam de perto. Assim estarão seguras. Jesus atribui-se as qualidades do bom pastor, pois veio ao mundo em nome de Deus para dar vida às ovelhas, mesmo que ao preço da própria vida. O Bom Pastor Jesus continua a agir na Igreja por meio daqueles que ele escolheu e estabeleceu como pastores para que, em seu nome, cuidem das ovelhas do seu rebanho. Neste domingo rezemos muito especialmente pelo Papa, pelos sacerdotes e bispos, para que progridam na imitação do exemplo de Jesus, Bom Pastor. E rezemos pelas vocações sacerdotais.



A segunda leitura deste domingo, do Livro do Apocalipse, foi escrita para estimular os cristãos perseguidos a perseverar com paciência. O trecho da leitura deste domingo nos revela o que acontecerá com a ruptura do sexto selo: surge uma imensa multidão que ninguém consegue contar, pessoas de todas as raças, línguas, povos e nações. Todos estão de pé diante do trono do Cordeiro, revestidos de vestes brancas e com palmas nas mãos. Essas são as pessoas que neste mundo suportaram tribulações e perseguições e deram a própria vida pelos irmãos.



A Primeira Leitura deste domingo, dos Actos dos Apóstolos, nos apresenta a pregação de Paulo e Barnabé na cidade de Antioquia da Síria. A questão gira à volta da reação de judeus e pagãos ao anúncio de salvação apresentado por Paulo e Barnabé. Enquanto os judeus enchem-se de inveja ao verem a multidão ouvir a Pedro e Barnabé, os pagãos se alegram e aceitam o Evangelho de Jesus Cristo.
