Corpus Christi's 2022 **"Continuing the Educational Mission"** **Scholarship Award**



We are pleased to announce again this year the Corpus Christi "***Continuing the Educational Mission***" ***Scholarship*** award. Even though our beloved parish school has closed, the mission of educating the young people of our parish continues. It is in this spirit that the scholarship award has been established.

A committee of educators from grammar school, middle school, high school and college as well as members from the financial community was formed and worked on this program for several months and developed this scholarship.

Based upon the success from past years, we will continue to offer three scholarships this year:

- One for a student parishioner attending a Catholic grammar or middle school.
- One for a student parishioner attending a Catholic High School
- One for a student parishioner attending, full time, a college or university.

Now three young people from our parish will each be awarded a scholarship toward their education.

A scholarship award of \$4,000 will be given to a student in grades 6, 7 or 8 who will be attending starting September 2022 a local Catholic school for the academic school year 2022/2023.

A scholarship award of \$5,000 will be given to a student who will be attending a local Catholic High School starting September 2022 for the academic school year 2022/2023.

A scholarship award of \$6,000 will be given to a matriculated college student carrying a full time course load of a minimum 12 credits/semester who will be attending starting September 2022, a 2-4-year college or university for the academic school year 2022/2023.

The scholarship will be paid directly to the school, college or university in two equal payments, one half for the fall semester and the second half for the spring semester or if the academic year is divided into trimesters, half will be paid in the first trimester and the second half paid in the third trimester.

The funding for these scholarships will come directly from the investment income earned from the proceeds of the sale of the Searing Avenue properties and **not** from any weekly or special parish collections. The announcement of the scholarship recipients will be made later this summer on or around July 31. The scholarship is for one year. Applications must be submitted to the rectory by July 1, 2022.

V DOMINGO DE PASCUA



EVANGELIO SEGÚN SAN JUAN 13, 31-35

Cuando salió Judas del cenáculo, dijo Jesús: *“Ahora es glorificado el Hijo del hombre, y Dios es glorificado en él, también Dios lo glorificará en sí mismo: pronto lo glorificará. Hijos míos, me queda poco de estar con vosotros. Os doy un mandamiento nuevo, que os améis unos a otros; como yo os he amado, amaos también entre vosotros. La señal por la que conocerán todos que sois discípulos míos será que os améis unos a otros”.*



Estamos en la fase final del caminar histórico del Mesías. Se aproxima la Hora, el momento en el que va a nacer, a partir del testimonio del amor total cumplido en la cruz, el HOMBRE NUEVO y la nueva comunidad. El contexto en que este texto nos sitúa es el de una cena, en la cual Jesús se despide de los discípulos y les deja las últimas recomendaciones. Jesús acaba de lavar los pies a los discípulos y de anunciar, a la comunidad desconcertada, la traición de uno del grupo. En esas escenas está presente su amor, que se manifiesta en el episodio del lavatorio de los pies. En seguida, Jesús, va a dirigir a los discípulos palabras de despedida; esas palabras suyas, resumen coherente de una vida hecha de amor, son el testimonio final. Se trata de un momento muy solemne. En la primera parte, Jesús explica la salida de Judas, que acaba de dejar la sala donde el grupo está reunido, para ir a entregar al maestro

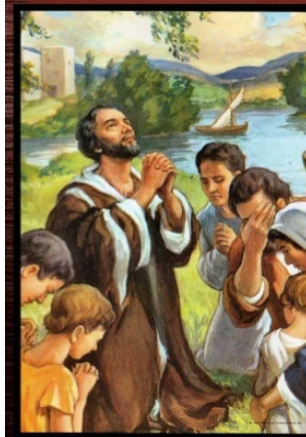
a sus enemigos. En la segunda parte tenemos la presentación del mandamiento nuevo. Comienza con la expresión *hijos míos*, lo que nos sitúa en un cuadro de solemne emoción y nos traslada al testamento de un padre que, próximo a la muerte, transmite a sus hijos su sabiduría de vida y aquello que es lo verdaderamente fundamental. El amor que los discípulos manifiestan entre sí será visible para todos los hombres. Ese será el distintivo de la comunidad de Jesús.



En la segunda lectura de hoy es de San Juan en el libro de la Revelación o Apocalipsis. Después de describir la confrontación entre Dios y las fuerzas del mal y la victoria final de Dios, el autor del Apocalipsis presenta el punto de llegada de la historia humana: la tierra nueva y el cielo nuevo; ahí, los que se mantengan fieles al cordero (Jesús) encontrarán la vida en plenitud. Es el culminar del camino de la humanidad, la meta última de nuestra historia.

Hechos 14:21-28

CONSOLIDANDO IGLESIAS



“Y después de anunciar el evangelio a aquella ciudad y de hacer muchos discípulos, volvieron a Listra, a Iconio y a Antioquía” (Hechos 14:21)

Dando por finalizado su viaje, volvieron sobre sus pasos hacia su lugar de origen.

¿Por qué no volvieron directamente a Antioquía?

Deseaban consolidar las iglesias recién creadas, animando y fortaleciendo a los nuevos conversos.

1. Les avisaron que vendrían dificultades.
2. Constituyeron ancianos.
3. Oraron y ayunaron con ellos.
4. Les encomendaron al Señor.

Una vez de vuelta en Antioquía, relataron su viaje a los creyentes. Esto fue una ocasión de gran gozo para toda la iglesia.

La primera lectura de hoy nos presenta la conclusión del primer viaje misionero de Pablo y de Bernabé: después de llegar hasta Derbe, volvieron hacia atrás, visitaron a las comunidades ya fundadas y embarcaron de regreso a la ciudad de donde habían salido para la misión. Estos sucesos se desarrollaron entre los años 46 y 49.

EVANGELHO SEGUNDO SÃO JOÃO 13, 31-35

Quando Judas saiu do Cenáculo, disse Jesus aos seus discípulos: *“Agora foi glorificado o Filho do homem e Deus foi glorificado nele. Se Deus foi glorificado nele, Deus também o glorificará em si mesmo e glorificá-lo-á sem demora. Meus filhos, é por pouco tempo que ainda estou convosco. Dou-vos um mandamento novo: que vos ameis uns aos outros. Como eu vos amei, amai-vos também uns aos outros. Nisto conhecerão todos que sois meus discípulos: se vos amardes uns aos outros”*.



Estamos na última Ceia; Jesus sabe que lhe restam poucas horas de vida e sente-se na obrigação de deixar o seu testamento. Da mesma forma que os filhos consideram sagradas as palavras que o pai lhes diz no leito antes da morte, também Jesus quer que os seus discípulos não esqueçam nunca as palavras que está para lhes dirigir. Eis o seu testamento: Dou-vos um novo mandamento: amai-vos uns aos outros como eu vos tenho amado. Jesus afirma que o seu mandamento é novo. Em que sentido? Já não está escrito no Antigo Testamento: Ama o próximo como a ti mesmo? Onde está a novidade então? Nova é, com certeza, a segunda parte: como eu vos tenho amado, assim também

amai-vos uns aos outros. E o amor de Jesus é total, ao ponto de dar a sua vida por nós. Esse é o ideal do amor que Jesus nos propõe. Entre os santos da Igreja, há aqueles que tiveram a coragem de dar a sua própria vida pelos outros. Talvez nunca poderemos chegar a esse nível do amor, mas não deixa de ser o ideal que Jesus nos propõe.



A segunda leitura deste domingo nos transmite uma mensagem de alegria e de esperança. Descreve o encerramento da história da humanidade. A Igreja de Deus se tornará esplendorosa como uma esposa ornada para o esposo; todos os males do mundo desaparecerão: um novo céu e uma nova terra serão criados. As últimas imagens da leitura retomam as do domingo passado: Deus habitará para sempre com o seu povo e enxugará toda lágrima de seus olhos e já não haverá morte, nem luto, nem grito, nem dor, porque passou a primeira condição.



A primeira leitura deste domingo nos apresenta a conclusão da primeira viagem missionária de Paulo e Barnabé. Eles atravessaram muitas regiões, anunciaram a Boa Nova do Evangelho em várias cidades e, antes de voltar para a comunidade de Antioquia, pela qual tinham sido enviados e à qual devem prestar contas das próprias atividades, decidem rever as novas comunidades que tinham surgido nos lugares onde eles tinham pregado a Palavra de Deus. Eles nomeiam em cada uma delas um grupo de anciãos
