Memorial Day

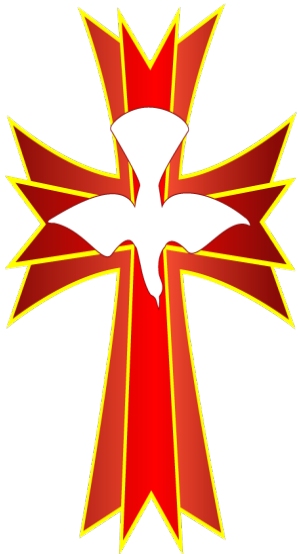

Corpus Christi's 2022 **"Continuing the Educational Mission"** **Scholarship Award**



We are pleased to announce again this year the Corpus Christi "***Continuing the Educational Mission***" ***Scholarship*** award. Even though our beloved parish school has closed, the mission of educating the young people of our parish continues. It is in this spirit that the scholarship award has been established.

A committee of educators from grammar school, middle school, high school and college as well as members from the financial community was formed and worked on this program for several months and developed this scholarship.

Based upon the success from past years, we will continue to offer three scholarships this year:

- One for a student parishioner attending a Catholic grammar or middle school.
- One for a student parishioner attending a Catholic High School
- One for a student parishioner attending, full time, a college or university.

Now three young people from our parish will each be awarded a scholarship toward their education.

A scholarship award of \$4,000 will be given to a student in grades 6, 7 or 8 who will be attending starting September 2022 a local Catholic school for the academic school year 2022/2023.

A scholarship award of \$5,000 will be given to a student who will be attending a local Catholic High School starting September 2022 for the academic school year 2022/2023.

A scholarship award of \$6,000 will be given to a matriculated college student carrying a full time course load of a minimum 12 credits/semester who will be attending starting September 2022, a 2-4-year college or university for the academic school year 2022/2023.

The scholarship will be paid directly to the school, college or university in two equal payments, one half for the fall semester and the second half for the spring semester or if the academic year is divided into trimesters, half will be paid in the first trimester and the second half paid in the third trimester.

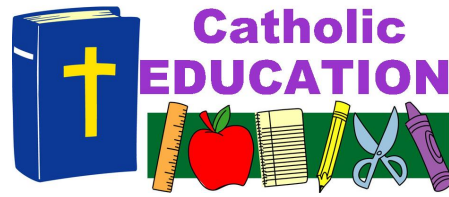
The funding for these scholarships will come directly from the investment income earned from the proceeds of the sale of the Searing Avenue properties and **not** from any weekly or special parish collections. The announcement of the scholarship recipients will be made later this summer on or around July 31. The scholarship is for one year. Applications must be submitted to the rectory by July 1, 2022.

Re: Memorial Day Moments of Remembrance



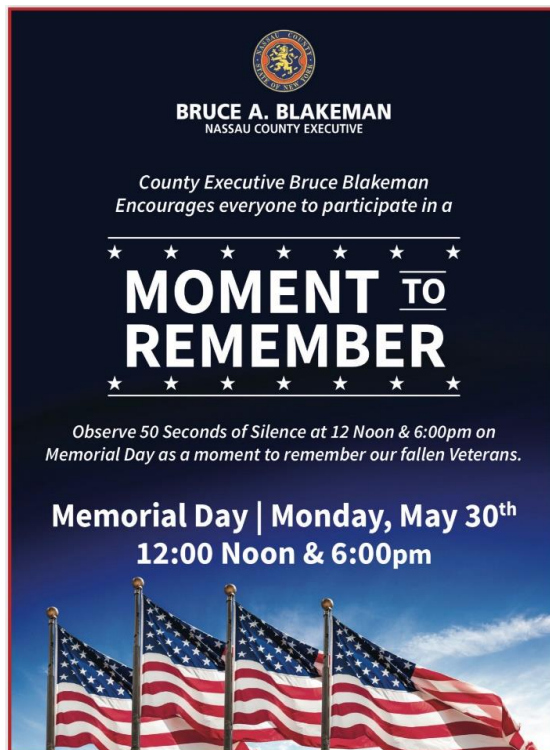
Nassau County has announced two County-wide 50-second moments of silence on Memorial Day, May 30th to honor the men and women who laid down their lives in service to our nation. The first moment of silence will be at 12 Noon, followed by the second at 6:00 pm. During those 50 seconds at 12 Noon and 6:00 pm on May 30th, Fire Departments, Police Cars, and Volunteer Ambulance Corps will sound their sirens and horns to remind residents to pause and remember our nation’s fallen heroes.

All parishes in Nassau and Suffolk are encouraged to publicize this initiative and perhaps dedicate the Angelus bells at 12 Noon and 6:00 pm on May 30th to the prayerful memory of our deceased servicemen and women, especially in gratitude for their defense of our religious liberties.

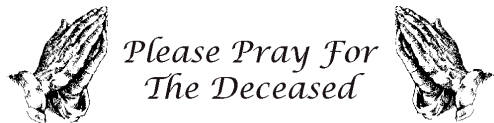

The only way God dwells among us is to let go of ourselves and hand ourselves over to Jesus. On our own we would not be able to succeed; the good news is that we are not alone, but God dwells within us and gives us all we need to be faithful. These Sundays before Pentecost remind us that as disciples, we never have to feel like the whole task of living the gospel falls on our shoulders alone. God is always present, dwelling within us, to give us the strength we need to be faithful to Jesus' commands. Only in this way can our everyday lives be fruitful.

St. Vincent was interested in feeding the hungry, visiting the prisoners, caring for the sick, educating the poor. But he was also intensely interested in helping people, particularly the poor, to be reconciled with God, to cherish their faith, and to be loyal to the Church. In one word, St. Vincent was interested not only in the bodies of those in need but in their souls also. There are some people who are only interested in improving the material conditions of those in need. That is important, certainly, but that is only half the work. Every person has a soul. Every person has a responsibility to save his soul. Every person has need of help in that task. It was St. Vincent's great achievement that he worked to save both the bodies and souls of those in need. He worked to save the whole person.

As our celebration of the Easter season is coming to an end, the liturgy reminds us that Jesus remains with us through the Holy Spirit, who teaches us everything we need to know, reminds us of all that Jesus taught, and brings us peace.

VI DOMINGO DE PASCUA



EVANGELIO SEGÚN SAN JUAN 14, 23-29

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: *“El que me ama, cumplirá mi palabra y mi Padre lo amará y haremos en él nuestra morada. El que no me ama no cumplirá mis palabras. La palabra que están oyendo no es mía, sino del Padre, que me envió. Les he hablado de esto ahora que estoy con ustedes; pero el Paráclito, el Espíritu Santo que mi Padre les enviará en mi nombre, les enseñará todas las cosas y les recordará todo cuanto yo les he dicho. La paz les dejo, mi paz les doy. No se la doy como la da el mundo. No pierdan la paz ni se acobarden. Me han oído decir: Me voy, pero volveré a su lado. Si me amaran, se alegrarían de que me vaya al Padre, porque el Padre es más que yo. Se lo he dicho ahora, antes de que suceda, para que cuando suceda, crean”*.



En su discurso de despedida Jesús anuncia a sus discípulos que Él, su Maestro, va a desaparecer de entre ellos; se va al Padre, allí de donde procede. De esta forma les está enseñando que su vida terrena no es eterna: su nacimiento y su muerte marcarán el tiempo de su misión en la tierra. Ahora que Cristo vuelve al Padre comienza una nueva fase de nuestra relación con Dios. Cristo lo dice claramente a sus discípulos: *“me voy al Padre y no debéis estar tristes, porque no me tenéis como hasta ahora a vuestro lado. Yo volveré a vuestro lado”*, disse Jesús a los suyos; pero su presencia

será ese memorial sagrado que el Espíritu Santo hará vivo en nuestros oraciones. No olvidemos las palabras de Jesús: Que no tiemble vuestro oración, ni se acobarde. Cristo nos promete y garantiza la paz, si cultivamos los dones del Espíritu Santo.



La segunda lectura de este domingo habla de la Nueva Jerusalén. La nueva Jerusalén que describe el Apocalipsis, resalta el carácter definitivo de la nueva alianza, que aparece en sus principales notas. La nueva alianza se realiza en el nuevo Pueblo de Dios que es la Iglesia y cuyo fundamento humano son los apóstoles, representados por las doce puertas; su destino, tal como indica la imagen de la Jerusalén celeste, es garantizar la participación plena en el nuevo estilo de vida, que ha iluminado con su victoria el Cordero.



Ya en los comienzos del cristianismo las dificultades se hicieron presentes y hasta provocaron altercados y discusiones violentas entre los contrarios y otros partidarios de la circuncisión. Es lo que nos habla la primera lectura de este domingo. La decisión de los apóstoles iluminada por el Espíritu Santo no es de defender la ley sino ordenar aquellas cosas que procuran paz y bienestar a los miembros de la comunidad. Transmitir este mensaje de paz es la tarea principal del cristiano, del que gobierna y del que obedece, del que es consciente de la acción del Espíritu Santo.

DOMINGO VI DA PÁSCOA



EVANGELHO DE SÃO JOÃO 14, 23-29

Naquele tempo, disse Jesus aos seus discípulos: *“Quem me ama guardará a minha palavra e meu Pai o amará; Nós viremos a ele e faremos nele a nossa morada. Quem me não ama não guarda a minha palavra. Ora a palavra que ouvís não é minha, mas do Pai que me enviou. Disse-vos essas coisas, estando ainda convosco. Mas o Paráclito, o Espírito Santo, que o Pai enviará em meu nome, vos ensinará toas as coisas e vos recordará tudo o que eu vos disse. Deixo-vos a paz, dou-vos a minha paz Não vo-la dou como a dá o mundo. Não se perturbe nem se intimide o vosso coração. Ouvistes que eu vos disse: Vou partir, mas voltarei para junto de vós. Se me amásseis ficaríeis contentes por eu ir para o Pai , porque o Pai é maior do que eu. Disse-vo-lo agora, ante de acontecer, para que, quando acontecer, acrediteis”.*

Deixo-vos a paz, a minha paz vos dou;
não vo-la dou como o mundo a dá.
Não se turbe o vosso coração, nem se atemorize.

O maior dos dons pascais é o Espírito Santo. Jesus o anunciou neste Evangelho, enquanto preparava os discípulos para a sua partida. Na verdade as duas coisas estão ligadas no discurso do Senhor. Era preciso que Jesus morresse, ressuscitasse e subisse ao céu, que sua presença fosse subtraída aos cristãos, para que ele nos enviasse o Espírito Santo. Isto nos faz ver a enorme importância do

Espírito Santo para o cristianismo e para a história humana. Pois o Espírito Santo *“renova a face da terra”*...fazendo com que todas as coisas sejam recriadas. Ele é o grande animador, não só da Igreja, como também da História. Pois o Pai é também autor da criação; ele colocou Cristo como Senhor da História, e Cristo age sobre a História e a sociedade através do Espírito Santo.



O livro do Apocalipse é dirigido a cristãos em dificuldade devido às perseguições. Para lhes infundir coragem, o autor conta-lhes a visão que teve São João relativa ao fim dos tempos. No trecho do domingo passado ele imaginava o povo de Deus como uma belíssima noiva. Neste domingo ele compara o povo de Deus a uma esplêndida cidade, Jerusalém da qual descreve todos os pormenores: as muralhas, os alicerces, as doze portas, distribuídas pelos quatro lados. O valor da imagem é claro: o povo de Deus está aberto para todo o mundo, acolhe todos, rejeita tudo aquilo que o divide e discrimina.



As tensões entre tradicionalistas e inovadores não são uma novidade. Sempre existiram na Igreja, desde as suas origens. A leitura dos Actos dos Apóstolos deste domingo refere-se às tensões que surgiram na Igreja no seu início. Na comunidade distinguiam-se os Judeus e os pagãos. As relações entre estes dois grupos não eram nada tranquilas. O problema surgiu por causa da circuncisão imposta pela lei de Moisés. Reuniram-se os apóstolos para examinar o problema e chegaram a um acordo.
