# **Pastor's Notes**

Memorial Day is always a special time in our country and our community, with the Mineola Memorial Day Parade returning after a two-year absence due to the pandemic. Family and friends come together to celebrate the unofficial start to the summer season. But far more important is to remember; mindfully and prayerfully, those men and women who sacrificed their lives in military service to our nation and to the world. We would never be able to embrace the liberties we have today, had it not been for the commitment and courage of members of the USA armed forces, who died in the never-ending fight for freedom. Enjoy the Blue Angels flying over Jones Beach, and the Navy ships sailing into NYC harbor for Fleet Week. But never loose sight of the American flags planted over the graves in our military cemeteries. (P.S...Also remember in prayer those one-million-plus victims of covid in our country, along with their families who mourn their loss.)

Pentecost Sunday on June 5<sup>th</sup> brings out the brilliant color of red in the church sanctuary, as a sign of the tongues of fire that came upon the apostles, 50 days after the triumphant Resurrection of Christ rising on Easter Sunday. Red is also reminiscent of both Palm Sunday and Good Friday; recalling the blood of Jesus upon the Cross for the salvation of souls. As the priests wear red on the altar for Mass on Pentecost, so too we encourage all of you to dress in bright red, as a sign that we are all united in the Sacred Heart of Jesus, who nourishes us with His Body & Blood in the Eucharist. May this celebration of the birth of the Church on Pentecost, continue right through Trinity Sunday on 12 June; rejoicing in the mystery of Father, Son, Spirit!!!

Corpus Christi Sunday on 19 June is also Fathers' Day this year throughout our nation. As we see in the following page, Bishop Anjay will be celebrating the 11:30 AM Mass for our joyful feast day, along with blessing our dads, grand-fathers and Communion Ministers. The Eucharistic Procession will culminate with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament; and we encourage everyone to wear summer white. Please come to celebrate with all of our cultural/liturgic communities, as one Body of Christ united in the love of Jesus, Mary and Joseph!!!

### EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL 2022-2025



With the celebration of **The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, on June 19, 2022**, the Bishops of the United States are calling for a three-year grassroots revival of devotion and belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The initiative is an expression of desire to see a movement of Catholics across the United States, healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with the Lord in the Eucharist. It is so very much needed, especially after the challenging times of pandemic and forced disconnection.

Over the next three years, dioceses will receive support and be encouraged to revive their sacramental spirituality by organizing Eucharistic Congresses and processions. Parishes will also be urged to

increase or begin Eucharistic Adorations and Holy Hours. There will be a revival of faithful adherence to the liturgical norms in all their richness – the *ars celebrandi*. Families and friends will be invited to gather in small groups to learn and pray together. Filled with the flame of charity from the reception of Jesus in the Eucharist, missionary disciples will go to the margins, recognizing the mystery of Jesus' presence in the poor. All of this will culminate in the first **National Eucharistic Congress** in the United States in almost fifty years. From **July 17-21, 2024**, thousands of Catholics will journey on pilgrimage to Indianapolis to personally encounter Jesus in the Eucharist and be sent back out into their parishes and communities.

All parishioners from all languages are invited to celebrate with our own **Bishop Anjay** on **Sunday 19 June** at the **11:30AM Mass**. We will recommission all our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, followed by a short **Procession of the Blessed Sacraments** through the streets of Mineola. Let us rejoice as the only diocesan parish of Corpus Christi: **You Together Are My Body!!!**

#### **Re:** Memorial Day Moments of Remembrance



# <u>Corpus Christi's 2022</u> <u>"Continuing the Educational Mission"</u> <u>Scholarship Award</u>



We are pleased to announce again this year the Corpus Christi **"Continuing the Educational Mission" Scholarship** award. Even though our beloved parish school has closed, the mission of educating the young people of our parish continues. It is in this spirit that the scholarship award has been established.

A committee of educators from grammar school, middle school, high school and college as well as members from the financial community was formed and worked on this program for several months and developed this scholarship.

Based upon the success from past years, we will continue to offer three scholarships this year:

- One for a student parishioner attending a Catholic grammar or middle school.
- One for a student parishioner attending a Catholic High School
- One for a student parishioner attending, full time, a college or university.

Now three young people from our parish will each be awarded a scholarship toward their education. A scholarship award of \$4,000 will be given to a student in grades 6, 7 or 8 who will be attending starting September 2022 a local Catholic school for the academic school year 2022/2023. A scholarship award of \$5,000 will be given to a student who will be attending a local Catholic High School starting September 2022 for the academic school year 2022/2023.

A scholarship award of \$6,000 will be given to a matriculated college student carrying a full time course load of a minimum 12 credits/semester who will be attending starting September 2022, a 2-4-year college or university for the academic school year 2022/2023.

The scholarship will be paid directly to the school, college or university in two equal payments, one half for the fall semester and the second half for the spring semester or if the academic year is divided into trimesters, half will be paid in the first trimester and the second half paid in the third trimester. The funding for these scholarships will come directly from the investment income earned from the proceeds of the sale of the Searing Avenue properties and **not** from any weekly or special parish collections. The announcement of the scholarship recipients will be made later this summer on or around July 31. The scholarship is for one year. Applications must be submitted to the rectory by July 1, 2022.






Juan 17 es la culminación de los discursos de despedida de Jesús a sus discípulos que comienzan en Juan 13 y antecipan la glorificación de Jesús, o sea, su muerte y resurrección (Juan 18-20). Todo el capítulo 17 es una oración por los discípulos que están junto con Jesús en el momento en que la

pronuncia. Y ahora, nos llega e turno a los lectores de Juan – y a nosotros: Pero no ruego solamente por estos, sino también por los que han de crer en mí por la palabra de ellos. El ruego de Jesús es por la unidad de todas las persona creyentes, incluyendo a las presentes con Jesús y a las futuras: para que todos sean uno. Jesús ora al Padre para que los suyos sean perfectamente uno: quiere que sean entre ellos uno, como Él y el Padre. Es su última petición antes de la Pasión, la más sentida: que haya comunión en la Iglesia. La comunión es essencial. El enemigo de Dios y del hombre, el diablo, no puede nada contra el Evangelio, contra la humilde fuerza de la oración y de los sacramentos, pero puede hacer mucho daño a la Iglesia tentando nuestra humanidad. Provoca la presunción, el juicio sobre los demás, las cerrazones y las divisiones. Él mismo es el que divide y a menudo comienza haciéndonos crer que somos buenos, quizá mejor que los demás: así tiene el terreno listo para semblar la cizaña. Es la tentación de todas las comunidades y se puede insinuar también en los carismas más bonitos de la Iglesia.



La segunda lectura de este domingo es la conclusión del libro de Apocalipsis. Nos habla que Jesus es el ALFA y la OMEGA, el PRINCIPIO y el FIN. En esa lectura vemos a toda la Iglesia en el trânsito. Tanto más cuanto que el Señor le ha prometido su próxima venida y ha aumentado en ella el deseo del árbor de la vida y de la gloria de la ciudad eterna.




La primera lectura de este domingo, del lbro de los Hechos de los Apóstoles, nos habla del martírio de Esteban, el primer mártir de la Iglesia.

Pai, quero que onde eu estou, também estejam comigo os que me deste, para que vejam minha glória, a glória que me deste, por me teres amado antes da criação do mundo. Pai justo, o mundo não te conheceu, mas eu conheci-te e este reconheceram que tu me enviaste. Dei-lhes a conhecer o teu nome e dá-lo-ei a conhecer, para que o amor com que me amaste esteja neles e eu esteja neles.



No Evangelho deste domingo, Jesus pede a unidade dos cristãos, pelos que crerão em mim: a fim de que todos sejam um. Esta unidade é um reflexo, na Igreja, da união de Cristo com o Pai, e, por este motivo, é um testemunho que invoca a fé em Jesus como Deus e como enviado do Pai: ...para que o mundo creia que tu me enviaste...A unidade dos cristãos – na fé comum, na caridade fraterna – é um sinal da presença de Cristo na História. Houve época em que os perigos que ameaçavam a unidade dos cristãos eram as questões religiosa. Hoje, não parece que sejam estas as coisas que nos dividem. O que nos divide são a diversas classes sociais, às quais pertencemos, que faz com que os mais ricos desprezem os mais pobres.



A leitura deste domingo é tirada do fim do livro do Apocalipse. Ele termina como começou, com a apresentação do Senhor Jesus, o Primeiro e o último, que há de levar a História da Salvação ao seu ponto culminante. É a última palavra da Sagrada Escritura. É a espera da última vinda de Cristo na sua glória.



A Primeira Leitura deste domingo nos apresenta o martírio de Santo Estevão, o primeiro mártir cristão. Paulo está presente e apoia o assassinato de Estevão. Ele irá se converter e dará também a sua vida para testemunhar a sua fé em Jesus Christo.
