Pastor's Notes

Pentecost Sunday on June 5th brings out the brilliant color of red in the church sanctuary, as a sign of the tongues of fire that came upon the apostles, 50 days after the triumphant Resurrection of Christ rising on Easter Sunday. Red is also reminiscent of both Palm Sunday and Good Friday; recalling the blood of Jesus upon the Cross for the salvation of souls. As the priests wear red on the altar for Mass on Pentecost, so too we encourage all of you to dress in bright red, as a sign that we are all united in the Sacred Heart of Jesus, who nourishes us with His Body & Blood in the Eucharist. May this celebration of the birth of the Church on Pentecost, continue right through Trinity Sunday on 12 June; rejoicing in the mystery of Father, Son, Spirit!!!

Tuesday 24 May will always be sadly remembered as a horrific day for the people of Uvalde, Texas. Nineteen innocent angelic souls along with their two teachers were violently taken from their families and from our world, in a cruel act of madness and terror. We can never stop praying for God's peace to reign supremely over these tragic incidents of evil. And we can never stop working for our country to pass and enforce laws that protect our precious children, born and unborn. As the Bishops of the United States wrote recently: "There has been too many school shootings, too much killing of the innocent. Our Catholic faith calls us to pray for those who have died and to bind the wounds of others. As we do so, each of us also needs to search our souls for ways that we can do more to understand this epidemic of evil and violence, and implore our elected officials to help us take action."

Corpus Christi Sunday on 19 June is also Fathers' Day this year throughout our nation. As we see in the following page, Bishop Anjay will be celebrating the 11:30 AM Mass for our joyful feast day, along with blessing our dads, grand-fathers and Communion Ministers. The Eucharistic Procession will culminate with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament; and we encourage everyone to wear summer white. Please come to celebrate with all of our cultural/liturgic communities, as one Body of Christ united in the love of Jesus, Mary and Joseph!!!

EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL 2022-2025



With the celebration of **The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, on June 19, 2022**, the Bishops of the United States are calling for a three-year grassroots revival of devotion and belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The initiative is an expression of desire to see a movement of Catholics across the United States, healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with the Lord in the Eucharist. It is so very much needed, especially after the challenging times of pandemic and forced disconnection.

Over the next three years, dioceses will receive support and be encouraged to revive their sacramental spirituality by organizing Eucharistic Congresses and processions. Parishes will also be urged to

increase or begin Eucharistic Adorations and Holy Hours. There will be a revival of faithful adherence to the liturgical norms in all their richness – the *ars celebrandi*. Families and friends will be invited to gather in small groups to learn and pray together. Filled with the flame of charity from the reception of Jesus in the Eucharist, missionary disciples will go to the margins, recognizing the mystery of Jesus' presence in the poor. All of this will culminate in the first **National Eucharistic Congress** in the United States in almost fifty years. From **July 17-21, 2024**, thousands of Catholics will journey on pilgrimage to Indianapolis to personally encounter Jesus in the Eucharist and be sent back out into their parishes and communities.

All parishioners from all languages are invited to celebrate with our own **Bishop Anjay** on **Sunday 19 June** at the **11:30AM Mass**. We will recommission all our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, followed by a short **Procession of the Blessed Sacraments** through the streets of Mineola. Let us rejoice as the only diocesan parish of Corpus Christi: **You Together Are My Body!!!**

<u>Corpus Christi's 2022</u> <u>"Continuing the Educational Mission"</u> <u>Scholarship Award</u>



We are pleased to announce again this year the Corpus Christi *"Continuing the Educational Mission" Scholarship* award. Even though our beloved parish school has closed, the mission of educating the young people of our parish continues. It is in this spirit that the scholarship award has been established.

A committee of educators from grammar school, middle school, high school and college as well as members from the financial community was formed and worked on this program for several months and developed this scholarship.

Based upon the success from past years, we will continue to offer three scholarships this year:

- One for a student parishioner attending a Catholic grammar or middle school.
- One for a student parishioner attending a Catholic High School
- One for a student parishioner attending, full time, a college or university.

Now three young people from our parish will each be awarded a scholarship toward their education. A scholarship award of \$4,000 will be given to a student in grades 6, 7 or 8 who will be attending starting September 2022 a local Catholic school for the academic school year 2022/2023. A scholarship award of \$5,000 will be given to a student who will be attending a local Catholic High School starting September 2022 for the academic school year 2022/2023.

A scholarship award of \$6,000 will be given to a matriculated college student carrying a full time course load of a minimum 12 credits/semester who will be attending starting September 2022, a 2-4-year college or university for the academic school year 2022/2023.

The scholarship will be paid directly to the school, college or university in two equal payments, one half for the fall semester and the second half for the spring semester or if the academic year is divided into trimesters, half will be paid in the first trimester and the second half paid in the third trimester. The funding for these scholarships will come directly from the investment income earned from the proceeds of the sale of the Searing Avenue properties and **not** from any weekly or special parish collections. The announcement of the scholarship recipients will be made later this summer on or around July 31. The scholarship is for one year. Applications must be submitted to the rectory by July 1, 2022.



A los cinquenta días de la Pascua de Resurreción celebra la Iglesia la fiesta de Pentecostés, antigua celebracion judia que reunía a todos los judíos que habitaban dispersos por el mundo en torno al Templo. Originalmente se denominaba fiesta de las semanas y tenía lugar siete semanas después de la fiesta de los primeros frutos. Siete semanas son cincuenta días (penta=cincuenta en griego). Se celebraba al término de la cosecha de la cebada v antes de comenzar la del trigo; era una fiesta de acción de gracias por la cosecha recogida. De pronto se le añadió un sentido histórico: se celebraba en esta fiesta el hecho de la alianza y el don de la ley en el monte Sinaí. La diversidade de lenguas, que en Génesis presentaba su aspecto negativo, aparece ahora como el don del Espíritu que une todas las razas.

Português <u>Domingo de pentecostes</u>



EVANGELHO DE SÃO JOÃO 20, 19-23

Na tarde daquele dia, o primeiro da semana, estando fechadas as portas da casa onde os discípulos se encontravam, com medo dos judeus, veio Jesus, apresentou-se no meio deles e disselhes: "A paz esteja convosco". Dito isto, mostroulhes as mãos e o lado. Os discípulos ficaram cheios de alegria ao verem o Senhor. Jesus disse-lhes: de novo: "A paz esteja convosco. Assim como o Pai me enviou, também eu vos envio a vós. Dito isto, soprou sobre eles e disse-lhe: Recebei o Espírito Santo: àqueles a quem perdoardes os pecados ser-lhes-ão perdoados; e àqueles a quem os retiverdes ser-lhesão retidos".



Celebramos neste domingo a festa de Pentecostes. É a festa do Espírito Santo, que dá vida, renova e transforma todas as coisas e que foi derramado sobre os apóstolos para que eles pudessem continuar a missão iniciada por Jesus Cristo. O Evangelho de hoje narra o primeiro encontro de Cristo ressuscitado com os seus discípulos. João nos diz que foi justamente neste primeiro encontro que Jesus comunicou o seu Espírito aos apóstolos, mediante o gesto de soprar sobre eles. Os discípulos reconhecem Jesus depois que ele lhes oferece o dom da paz e mostra as suas chagas.



Aos seus discípulos Jesus tinha prometido que não os teria deixado sós e que lhes enviaria o Espírito. celebramos a festa desse Hoie dom do Ressuscitado. Pentecostes era uma festa judaica muito antiga, celebrada cinquenta dias depois da Páscoa judia: comemorava a chegada do povo de Israel ao monte Sinai. Ao afirmar que o Espírito tinha descido sobre os discípulos justamente na festa de Pentecostes, Lucas nos quis ensinar só uma coisa: que o Espírito tinha substituído a Lei antiga e se tornara a nova Lei para o cristão. Nos Actos, Lucas não tem como objetivo fornecer-nos uma informação cronológica: quer somente fazernos compreender que o cristão tem como sua única lei o Espírito. Realmente, como nos diz o Evangelho, o Espírito foi comunicado por Jesus aos apóstolos no mesmo dia da ressurreição.



O Espírito Santo é o princípio da unidade da Igreja, que Paulo compara a um corpo, que é uno apesar dos seus muitos membros.
