The media give a rather depressing picture of human nature, incurably bent on war, destruction, social and political injustice, and immorality. But it should blind none of us from being more aware in our daily lives of the basic goodness of human nature, and of noting the many selfless and quite unnoticed acts of love and charity. And by being positive about our human nature and its capabilities for good, we become more aware of our own potential to love selflessly. Jesus helps the lawyer by not giving him a definition of “neighbor,” He tells the parable about the Samaritan who acts not out of a sense of duty or of guilt, but out of sheer love and generosity. Perhaps we get impatient with the slowness of our society to make changes for the common good. Perfect love is not reached suddenly and perfect charity is a challenge all through life. Along our journey there will be stops and even wrong turns, but if we remember the Good Samaritan we can renew our desire to follow his example. To stress the negatives in the parable — the violence of the brigands, the neglect by the priest and the levite — would be pessimistic and miss the real point. The Samaritan shows the virtues of humanity – even in people of whom little good was expected. The Jews were meant to take special care of the stranger, the widow, and the orphan. These were the groups most in need of charity, and so whoever came to their help would be helpful to all.

XV DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 10, 25-37

En aquel tiempo, se presentó ante Jesús un doctor de la ley para ponerlo a prueba y le preguntó: Maestro, qué debo hacer para conseguir la vida eterna? Jesús le dijo: Qué es lo que está escrito en la ley? Qué lees en ella? El doctor de la ley contestó: Amarás al Señor tu Dios, con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma, con todas tus fuerzas y con todo tu ser, y a tu prójimo como a ti mismo. Jesús le dijo: Has contestado bien; si haces eso, vivirás. El doctor de la ley, para justificarse, le preguntó a Jesús: Y quién es mi prójimo? Jesús le dijo: Un hombre que bajaba por el camino de Jerusalén a Jericó, cayó en manos de unos ladrones, los cuales lo robaron, lo hirieron y lo dejaron medio muerto. Sucedió que por el mismo camino bajaba un sacerdote, el cual lo vio y pasó de largo. De igual modo, un levita que pasó por ahí, lo vio y siguió adelante. Pero un samaritano que iba de viaje, al verlo, se compadeció de él, se le acercó, ungió sus heridas con aceite y vino y se las vendó; luego lo puso sobre su cabalgadura, lo llevó a un mesón y cuidó de él. Al día siguiente sacó dos denarios, se los dio al dueño del mesón y le dijo: Cuida de él y lo que gastes de más, te lo pagaré a mi regreso. Cuál de estos tres te parece que se portó como prójimo del hombre que fue asaltado por los ladrones? El doctor de la ley le respondió: El que tuvo compasión de él. Entonces Jesús le dijo: Anda y haz tú lo mismo.



Demasiadas veces ponemos el centro de lo religioso en entender, aceptar, creer verdades. No es así. El centro no es el cerebro, sino el corazón. El centro no es la teoría sino el comportamiento. El secreto no es la erudición sino la con-pasión. Dios no es un enigma de naturalezas y personas. Dios es Abbá, es decir, Dios es amor. Y el amor no es entender, es sentir, conmoverse, acercarse, dar la mano. El amor no consiste en palabras sino en obras. El amor no consiste sólo en dar, sino en darse.

En la 1ª lectura, MOISÉS invita al pueblo a guardar los MANDAMIENTOS:



"Escucha la voz del Señor, tu Dios, guardando sus preceptos y mandatos".

Habló Moisés al Pueblo diciendo: Escucha la voz del Señor tu Dios, guardando sus preceptos y mandatos, lo que está escrito en el código de esta ley; conviértete al Señor tu Dios con todo tu corazón y con toda tu alma. Porque el precepto que yo te mando hoy no es cosa que te exceda ni inalcanzable; no está en el cielo, no vale decir: quién de nosotros subirá al cielo y nos lo traerá y nos lo proclamará para que lo comprendamos? Ni está más allá del mar, no vale decir: quién de nosotros cruzará el mar y nos lo traerá para que lo cumplamos? El mandamento está muy cerca de ti: en tu corazón y en tu boca. Cúmplo.



En la segunda lectura Pablo nos presenta un himno que presenta a Cristo como la referencia fundamental, como el centro alrededor del cual se construye la historia y la vida de cada creyente. Esta lectura nos lleva a pensar en la importancia de lo que nos dice el Evangelio de hoy. Si Cristo es el centro a partir de cual todo se construye, conviene hacer del amor a Dios y a los otros la exigencia fundamental de nuestro caminar.

DOMINGO XV DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO DE SÃO LUCAS 10, 25-37

Naquele tempo, levantou-se um doutor da lei e perguntou a Jesus para o experimentar: “Mestre, que hei de fazer para receber como herança a vida eterna”? Jesus disse-lhe: “Que está escrito na Lei? Como vês tu”? Ele respondeu: “Amarás o Senhor teu Deus com todo o teu coração e com toda a tua alma, com todas as tuas forças e com todo o teu entendimento; e ao próximo como a ti mesmo”. Disse-lhe Jesus: “Respondeste bem. Faz isso e viverás”. Mas ele, querendo justificar-se, perguntou a Jesus: “E quem é o meu próximo”? Jesus, tomando a palavra, disse: “Um homem descia de Jerusalém para Jericó e caiu nas mãos dos salteadores. Roubaram-lhe tudo o que levava, espancaram-no e foram embora, deixando-o meio-morto. Por coincidência, descia pelo mesmo caminho um sacerdote, viu-o e passou adiante. Do mesmo modo, um levita que vinha por aquele lugar, viu-o e passou também adiante. Mas um samaritano, que ia de viagem, passou junto dele, ao vê-lo, encheu-se de compaixão. Aproximou-se, ligou-lhe as feridas, deitando azeite e vinho, colocou-o sobre a sua própria montada, levou-o para uma estalagem e cuidou dele. No dia seguinte, tirou duas moedas, deu-as ao estalajadeiro e disse: Trata bem dele; e o que gastares a mais eu to pagarei quando voltar. Qual destes três te parece ter sido o próximo daquele homem que caiu nas mãos dos salteadores”? O doutor da lei respondeu: “O que teve compaixão dele”. Disse-lhe Jesus: “Então vai e faz o mesmo”.



Este evangelho nos dá uma lição tão importante. Que devemos fazer para ir para o céu? Para alguns, o importante é rezar muito, é ter muitas devoções. Neste evangelho vemos a resposta de Jesus para o doutor da lei que queria saber como alcançar a vida eterna. No final dos tempos, quando todos aparecerem diante do tribunal de Deus, nós sabemos quais serão os pontos importantes no nosso julgamento: Eu estava com fome e sede, e deste-me de comer e de beber; eu estava nu e me vestiste; eu estava doente e na prisão e foste visitar-me. As obras de caridade. Isso é o essencial na nossa vida cristã. Neste evangelho os dois homens que passam pela estrada evitam o homem caído. Ambos estavam ligados ao templo de Jerusalém. Somente um samaritano, que era desprezado pelos judeus tem compaixão do homem caído na estrada.



Na segunda leitura deste domingo, da Carta de Paulo aos Colossenses, ele, na primeira parte da carta, celebra o primado de Cristo sobre toda a criação. Na segunda parte, ele proclama que Cristo é o primeiro também na nova criação, porque foi o primeiro a vencer a morte e a abrir a todos o caminho para Deus.



Na primeira leitura deste domingo, Moisés fala ao povo sobre os mandamentos de Deus. Essa leitura nos lembra que os mandamentos estão bem perto de nós, estão no nosso coração. Basta ouvir o nosso coração para descobrirmos a lei de Deus.
