

## Solemnity of the Assumption of Our Blessed Virgin Mother


Our “treasure” is something very valuable to us. The gospel refers to “treasure” as inexhaustible, secure and incorruptible. This description is of the “treasure” understood as the kingdom of God. Interestingly, the way to possess this treasure is not by possessing, but by giving away. We become rich, by not having and then refocusing our hearts on God’s kingdom. If we are preoccupied by possessions, schedules, work, sports, etc., our heart is already filled with exhaustible, insecure, and corruptible matters. The challenge of this gospel is to redirect our hearts to what is our true treasure, Jesus, and then be faithful disciples. Our treasure is Jesus. “What we as Christians have to watch could be expressed in one word, and that word is more. We always seem to want more money, more pleasure, more power, and it is in desiring more that can draw us away from Christ and make us unhappy. So if we have sufficient food for ourselves, our families, and reasonable comfort in our homes, let us be content. Let us spare a thought and some money for those who, unlike us, are suffering from poverty. Thus we will be able to redirect our hearts to what is our true treasure, Jesus, and then we will be faithful disciples.”

Jesus said, “give and it will be given to you.” In other words, it is in giving that we receive. It is when we look beyond ourselves to others, to the Lord present in others, that we experience the Lord’s own joy, the Lord’s own life, which is a foretaste of the joy and life of the kingdom of heaven Jim

# Español

## XIX DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



### EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 12, 35-40

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: *“Estén listos, con la túnica puesta y las lámparas encendidas. Sean semejantes a los criados que están esperando a que su señor regrese de la boda, para abrirle en cuanto llegue y toque. Dichosos aquellos a quienes su señor, al llegar, encuentre en vela. Yo les aseguro que se recogerá la túnica, los hará sentar a la mesa y él mismo les servirá. Y si llega a medianoche o a la madrugada y los encuentra en vela, dichosos ellos. Fijense en esto. Si un padre de familia supiera a qué hora va a venir el ladrón, estaría vigilando y no lo dejaría que se metiera por un boquete en su casa. Pues también ustedes estén preparados, porque a la hora en que menos lo piensen vendrá el Hijo del hombre”*.




La Palabra de Dios que la liturgia de hoy nos ofrece nos invita a la vigilancia: el verdadero discípulo no vive con los brazos cruzados, en una existencia cómoda y resignada, sino que está siempre atento y disponible para acoger al Señor, para escuchar sus llamadas y trabajar por el “Reino”. El Evangelio presenta una catequesis sobre la vigilancia. Propone a los discípulos de todas las épocas una actitud de espera serena y atenta al Señor, que viene a nuestro encuentro para liberarnos y para insertarnos en una dinámica de comunión con Dios. El verdadero

discípulo es aquel que está siempre preparado para acoger los dones de Dios, para responder a sus llamadas y para comprometerse en la construcción del “Reino”. La primera parábola invita a tener la cintura ceñida y las lámparas encendidas (lo que parece aludir al libro del Éxodo 12, 11 y a la noche de la primera Pascua, celebrada de pie y con la cintura ceñida, antes de partir de la esclavitud de Egipto hacia la libertad. Los creyentes son así, invitados a estar preparados para acoger la liberación que Jesús vino a traer y que llevará de la tierra de la esclavitud a la tierra de la libertad. La segunda parábola apunta hacia la incertidumbre sobre la hora en que el Señor vendrá. El discípulo fiel es aquel que está siempre preparado, a cualquier hora y en cualquier circunstancia para acoger al Señor que viene.



La primera lectura se refiere, en concreto, a la noche en la que murieron los primogénitos de los egipcios, la noche del éxodo. Para los egipcios, fue una noche trágica, de ruina; para los judíos, fue una noche de salvación, de gloria y de alabanza al Dios libertador. El autor de este libro, dirigiéndose a los judíos, les anima a volver a los valores de la fe judía que habían abandonado.



El autor invita al creyente a confiar firmemente en la posesión de los bienes futuros, anunciados por Dios, pero invisibles todavía. Nuestro caminar por esta tierra está marcada por la finitud, por nuestras limitaciones, por nuestro pecado; pero eso no puede hacernos desanimar y desistir: vivir en la fe es mirar hacia la vida plena que Dios nos ha prometido y caminar a su encuentro.

# Português

## DOMINGO XIX DO TEMPO COMUM



### EVANGELHO DE SÃO LUCAS 12, 35-40

Naquele tempo disse Jesus aos seus discípulos: *“Tende os rins cingidos e as lâmpadas acesas. Sede coo homens que esperam o seu senhor ao voltar do casamento para lhe abrirem logo a porta , quando chegar e bater. Felizes esses servos, que o senhor, ao chegar, encontrar vigilantes. Em verdade vos digo: cingir-se-á e mandará que se sentem à mesa e, passando diante deles, os servirá. Se vier à meia-noite ou de madrugada, felizes serão se assim os encontrar. Compreendei isto: se o dono da casa soubesse a que hora viria o ladrão, não o deixaria arrombar a sua casa. Estais vós também preparados, porque na hora em que não pensais virá o Filho do homem”.*



A morte é um facto que tem que ser enfrentado e ao qual é preciso dar um sentido evangélico. Só a fé nos faz penetrar no significado da morte e nos dá coragem para enfrentá-la com serenidade. Não poderíamos viver felizes se pensássemos o tempo todo que vamos morrer e que isto pode acontecer a qualquer momento. Mas também não é humano não ter nenhuma consciência da morte e viver e agir como se ela não fosse certa para nós. É isso que Jesus reprova no Evangelho. Desta atitude falsa, que nos torna acomodados e materialistas, Deus, de vez em quando, nos arranca; quando sentimos a morte de outras pessoas ou o drama de

uma morte imprevista. A reflexão, à luz da fé, sobre a relatividade da vida e o sentido da morte, é necessária para que cultivemos em nós as atitudes que o Evangelho nos pede: vigilância para a vinda do Senhor, desprendimento dos bens, valorização das promessas eternas, sentido de nossa vida na terra. Não somos absolutos; Cristo é o único Senhor, a quem teremos de prestar contas da nossa vida.



A primeira leitura refere-se à noite em que foram mortos os primogénitos dos egípcios, à noite do êxodo. Para os egípcios, foi uma noite trágica; para os judeus, foi uma noite de salvação. Israel é um povo que gosta de recordar. Recorda sobretudo, os prodígios do Êxodo. Na noite em que deixaram a terra do faraó, os justos foram salvos e os inimigos exterminados. O comportamento de Israel é um convite aos cristãos a fazerem o mesmo, a recordar, a celebrar a memória do acontecimento em que Deus manifestou todo o seu amor e a sua fidelidade: a Páscoa.



A segunda leitura apresenta Abraão e Sara, modelos de fé para os crentes de todas as épocas. Aos cristãos em dificuldades é dirigida a Carta aos Hebreus. Considerando o que aconteceu a Abraão e a Sara, os cristãos são convidados a recuperar a confiança e a saber ler, através de sinais nem sempre evidentes, que está a nascer o mundo novo.
