Pastor's Notes

On Sunday 14 August (the Vigil of the Assumption of Mary), one of our most beloved parishioners was called home to heaven by her Lord and God. Irene Krause was born in her Mineola home on 30 April 1926, and 96+ years later she breathed her last breath in that same house on Horton Highway. Her entire lifetime from Baptism to burial was spent here at Corpus Christi; always in humble service to the Church and God's people.

Irene was first called at the tender age of 13, by Msgr. Edmund Fitzgerald to knit him a sweater. From that day forward for 83 years, she tirelessly gave of herself to our parish and school. Her primary employment was in banking, and her priority in life was taking care of her parents and family. But Corpus Christi was always close to her heart, in doing whatever she could to build up the Kingdom of God. She loved the Eucharist as a daily Mass goer and prayed the Rosary out of love for the Blessed Mother Mary.

When I first came to Corpus Christi as Pastor six years ago, Irene was one of the first persons to greet me, because her office was right next to mine. Her beautiful blue eyes, her sparkling smile, and her little-girl-like laughter were daily reminders to me of the youthful spirit of this grace-filled woman in her 90's! Six days a week, and even Sundays, you could find Irene at the computer keeping up all our parish records. How appropriate at her funeral Mass were two bishops, eight priests, one deacon, and around fifty faithful parishioners; all of whom so deeply appreciated the gift that Irene is in our lives. Eternal rest grant unto her O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon her. May Irene rest in the peace and joy of all the angels and saints in heaven!

The Comboni missionaries of the Heart of Jesus

The Comboni missionaries of the Heart of Jesus were founded by Saint Daniel Comboni, the first Bishop of Central Africa, in 1867. Originally, they were a group of priests and brothers from all over Europe doing mission work in Africa under the name of "Institute for the African missions." They became a religious society in 1879. Up to recent years they were popularly known as "Verona Fathers." In 1987 the name was changed to the present form to honor the founder and the spirituality of the Society.

Presently, the Comboni Missionaries number close to 1,700 but together with the Comboni sisters and Comboni lay missionaries, we are about 4000. They serve in over thirty countries of Africa, Europe, the Americas, and Asia.



The Comboni missionaries care for the poor and most abandoned people in any area of the world that the "Holy See" may want to entrust to them. Their evangelizing method is directed to the liberation of the whole person through the preaching of the gospel and the institution of the social and educational structures, in corporation with the existing resources and in a spirit of service to the local Church. They are very active in the formation of religious and lay leaders, in education, in the field of mass media and, when needed, in relief work and refugee relocation, especially in Africa.

Funds collected during the Missionary Cooperation Plan go mostly into "small mission projects fund" that sponsors people related projects in Africa and Latin America. Currently, many of these projects are directed to refugee settlement in the Sudan (Darfur included), Uganda and Congo, AIDS prevention and AIDS orphan assistance, training of local missionaries both lay and religious, women's education at secondary level, establishing wells and other sources of safe water for the desert dwellers in Ethiopia, Eritrea and Kenya.



In North America, the Comboni missionaries have a small contingent of about 30 members in the Archdioceses of Chicago, Cincinnati, Los Angeles and Newark and in the Diocese of Hamilton, Ontario - Canada. They work among the minority groups, educate young people for service in the foreign missions and conduct programs of global mission awareness. The COMBONI MISSION'S magazine is an integral part of this effort. Their main Center in North America is located at 1318 Nagel Road, OH 45255.

XXII DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 14. 1.7-14

Un sábado, Jesús fue a comer en casa de uno de los jefes de los fariseos, y éstos estaban espíandolo. Mirando cómo los invitados escogían los primeros lugares, les dijo esta parábola: *“Cuando te inviten a un banquete de bodas, no te sientes en el lugar principal, no sea que haya algún otro invitado más importante que tú, y el que los invitó a los dos venga a decirte: Déjate el lugar a éste, y tengas que ir a ocupar, lleno de vergüenza, el último asiento. Por el contrario, cuando te inviten, ocupa el último lugar, para que, cuando venga el que te invitó, te diga: Amigo, acércate a la cabecera. Entonces te verás honrado en presencia de todos los convidados. Porque el que se engrandece a sí mismo, será humillado; y el que se humilla, será engrandecido. Luego dijo al que lo había invitado: Cuando des una comida o una cena, no invites a tus amigos, ni a tus hermanos, ni a tus pariente, ni a los vecinos ricos; porque puede ser que ellos te inviten a su vez, y con eso quedarías recompensado. Al contrario, cuando des un banquete, invita a los pobres, a los lisiados, a los cojos y a los ciegos; y así serás dichoso, porque ellos no tienen con qué pagarte; pero ya se te pagará, cuando resuciten los justos.*

Evangelio según San Lucas 14,1.7-11.



“ Porque todo el que ensalza será humillado, y el que se humilla será ensalzado ”

Nos encontramos con dos parábolas del buen comportamiento en la mesa. El texto de Lucas está bien construido. En la primera Jesús se dirige a los

comensales a propósito del puesto que deben ocupar cuando son invitados y la segunda se dirige a quien invita para que haga una buena elección de los invitados. El evangelio se nos propone la humildad. Para ser un buen seguidor de Jesús es necesario ser el último, el servidor de todos. No son pocos los autores que nos advierten de que una sociedad como la nuestra, estructurada en torno al consumo y la competencia, ha devenido en personalidades narcisistas, obsecionados por aquello que entienden como el éxito personal. La advertencia contra la búsqueda del poder o la notoriedad nace de la misma lógica que en otros pasajes del Evangelio le ha llevado a decir: *Quien quiera ser el primero, que sea el último de todos y el servidor de todo.* La llamada a invitar a pobres, lisiados, cojos y ciegos es un convite al reequilibrio de las relaciones humanas, en el que son enaltecidos aquellos a quienes el mundo ha orillado y podamos experimentar la igualdad radical de los hijos de Dios.



La primera lectura del libro del Eclesiástico, es una colección de dichos y refranes de sabiduría, como casi todo el libro, en que se hace el elogio de la humildad, la reflexión y la limosna. Si tienes consciencia de ser grande, de valer algo, procura manifestarte ante los otros con humildad.



La segunda lectura es una exhortación fervorosa a una comunidad judeo-cristiana que está pasando por un mal momento, por dificultades internas y externas. Pone de manifiesto la obra redentora de Cristo, el Sumo Sacerdote, en comparación con la liturgia, ya muerta e irreversible, del antiguo templo de Jerusalén.

DOMINGO XXII DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO DE SAO LUCAS 14. 1.7-14

Naquele tempo, Jesus entrou, num sábado, em casa de um dos principais fariseus para tomar uma refeição. Todos o observavam. Ao notar como os convidados escolhiam os primeiros lugares, Jesus disse-lhes esta parábola: **“Quando fores convidado para um banquete nupcial, não tomes o primeiro lugar. Pode acontecer que tenha sido convidado alguém mais importante do que tu; então, aquele que vos convidou a ambos, terá que te dizer: Dá o lugar a este; e ficarás depois envergonhado, se tiveres que ocupar o último lugar. Por isso, quando fores convidado, vai sentar-te no último lugar; e quando vier aquele que te convidou, dirá: Amigo, sobe mais para cima; ficarás então honrado aos olhos dos outros convidados. Quem se exalta, será humilhado e quem se humilha será exaltado. Jesus disse ainda a quem o tinha convidado: Quando ofereceres um almoço ou um jantar, não convides os teus amigos nem os teus irmãos, nem os teus parentes nem os teus vizinhos ricos, não seja que eles por sua vez te convidem e assim serás retribuído. Mas quando ofereceres um banquete, convida os pobres, os aleijados, os coxos e os cegos; e serás feliz por eles não terem com que retribuir-te: ser-te-á retribuído na ressurreição dos justos”.**

Jesus tinha contato com todos. Especialmente com os enfermos, os pecadores. Não evitava as relações com os fariseus, seus adversários; aproveitava-as para questionar e transmitir uma mensagem. É isso que ele faz no almoço que Lucas nos relata neste evangelho. O enquadramento é pretexto para Jesus falar do banquete do “Reino”. A liturgia deste domingo propõe-nos uma reflexão sobre alguns valores que acompanham o desafio do “Reino de Deus”: a humildade, a gratuidade, o amor desinteressado. Tudo isso contrastam com os valores da nossa sociedade.



1ª LEITURA

«Humilha-te e encontrarás graça diante do Senhor»

Sir 3, 19-21.30-31 (gr. 17-18.20.28-29)

A primeira leitura apresenta-se como uma instrução que um pai dá ao seu filho. O tema fundamental desta instrução é o da humildade. A humildade é uma das qualidades fundamentais que o homem deve cultivar. Garantir-lhe-á estima perante os homens e graça diante do Senhor.



2ª LEITURA

«Aproximastes-vos do monte Sião, da cidade do Deus vivo»

Hebr 12, 18-19.22-24a

O povo de Deus do Antigo Testamento vivia da lembrança das maravilhas que Deus por ele tinha feito, sobretudo quando da saída do Egito.
