# **PATRIOT DAY**



11 September falls on a Sunday this year; recalling the tragic time 21 years ago when our beloved homeland was attacked by terrorists. Nearly 3000 souls from 60-plus different nations perished that day (with still more than 1000 bodies never identified). And through these many years, thousands more have died from related illnesses, especially our brave first responders. After 9/11/2001, I was doing a lot of funeral Masses and/or memorial Masses (without a body present). At one Mass, a widowed mother whose son died that day, gave me a steel cross, given to her by fire-fighters in New York City. The steel came from the Twin Towers, for family members who lost loved ones. So much of that steel has spread throughout the USA, for countless communities to have memorials in remembrance of the faithful departed souls.

On 10/11 September, we invite all our parishioners at the end of all Masses, to form a procession in the center aisle, to venerate the Cross of Christ. We will attach the small steel cross to the large wooden cross, which we always use on Good Friday. In this way, we honor the memory of all those who died at the hands of terror, as we lift them up to the glory and the victory of Christ Crucified!!!

Please join me and the civic leaders of Mineola on Sunday 11 September at 8:30 AM, at the Mineola Memorial Park in a remembrance ceremony for all those who tragically died on 9/11/2001.

### The Comboni missionaries of the Heart of Jesus

The Comboni missionaries of the Heart of Jesus were founded by Saint Daniel Comboni, the first Bishop of Central Africa, in 1867. Originally, they were a group of priests and brothers from all over Europe doing mission work in Africa under the name of "Institute for the African missions." They became a religious society in 1879. Up to recent years they were popularly known as "Verona Fathers." In 1987 the name was changed to the present form to honor the founder and the spirituality of the Society.

Presently, the Comboni Missionaries number close to 1,700 but together with the Comboni sisters and Comboni lay missionaries, we are about 4000. They serve in over thirty countries of Africa, Europe, the Americans, and Asia.



The Comboni missionaries care for the poor and most abandoned people in any area of the world that the "Holy See" may want to entrust to them. Their evangelizing method is directed to the liberation of the whole person through the preaching of the gospel and the institution of the social and educational structures, in corporation with the existing resources and in a spirit of service to the local Church. They are very active in the formation of religious and lay leaders, in education, in the field of mass media and, when needed, in relief work and refugee relocation, especially in Africa.

Funds collected during the Missionary Cooperation Plan go mostly into "small mission projects fund" that sponsors people related projects in Africa and Latin America. Currently, many of these projects are directed to refugee settlement in the Sudan (Darfur included), Uganda and Congo, AIDS prevention and AIDS orphan assistance, training of local missionaries both lay and religious, women's education at secondary level, establishing wells and other sources of safe water for the desert dwellers in Ethiopia, Eritrea and Kenya.





In North America, the Comboni missionaries have a small contingent of about 30 members in the Archdioceses of Chicago, Cincinnati, Los Angeles and Newark and in the Diocese of Hamilton, Ontario - Canada. They work among the minority groups, educate young people for service in the foreign missions and conduct programs of global mission awareness. The COMBONI MISSION'S magazine is an integral part of this effort. Their main Center in North America is located at 1318 Nagel Road, OH 45255.

On Sunday 14 August (the Vigil of the Assumption of Mary), one of our most beloved parishioners was called home to heaven by her Lord and God. Irene Krause was born in her Mineola home on 30 April 1926, and 96+ years later she breathed her last breath in that same house on Horton Highway. Her entire lifetime from Baptism to burial was spent here at Corpus Christi; always in humble service to the Church and God's people.

Irene was first called at the tender age of 13, by Msgr. Edmund Fitzgerald to knit him a sweater. From that day forward for 83 years, she tirelessly gave of herself to our parish and school. Her primary employment was in banking, and her priority in life was taking care of her parents and family. But Corpus Christi was always close to her heart, in doing whatever she could to build up the Kingdom of God. She loved the Eucharist as a daily Mass goer, and prayed the Rosary out of love for the Blessed Mother Mary.

When I first came to Corpus Christi as Pastor six years ago, Irene was one of the first persons to greet me, because her office was right next to mine. Her beautiful blue eyes, her sparkling smile, and her little-girl-like laughter were daily reminders to me of the youthful spirit of this grace-filled woman in her 90's! Six days a week, and even Sundays, you could find Irene at the computer keeping up all our parish records. How appropriate at her funeral Mass were two bishops, eight priests, one deacon, and around fifty faithful parishioners; all of whom so deeply appreciated the gift that Irene is in our lives. Eternal rest grant unto her O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon her. May Irene rest in the peace and joy of all the angels and saints in heaven!

It is obvious that, both physically and morally, the world is not all good. The culprit is sin, which is not only the root of all evil, but whose very existence is now denied by so many.

# Español XIII DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

Y el que no lleva su cruz y viene en pos de mí, no puede ser mi discípulo. Lucas 14:27

### **EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 14. 25-33**

En aquel tiempo, caminaba con Jesús una gran muchedumbre y él, volviéndose a sus discípulos, les dijo: "Si alguno quiere seguirme y no me prefiere a su padre y a su madre, a su esposa y a sus hijos, a sus hermanos y a sus hermanas, más aún a sí mismo, no puede ser mi discípulo. Y el que no carga su cruz y me sigue, no puede ser mi discípulo. Porque, quién de ustedes, si quiere construir una torre, no se pone primero a calcular el costo, para ver si tiene con qué terminarla? No sea que, después de haber echado los cimentos, no puede acabarla y todos los que se enterem comiencen a burlarse de él, diciendo: Este hombre comenzó a construir y no pudo terminar. O qué rey que va a combatir a otro rey, no se pone primero a considerar si será capaz de salir con diez mil soldados al encuentro del que viene contra él con veinte mil? Porque si no, cuando el otro esté aún lejos le enviará una embajada para proponerle las condiciones de paz. Así pues, cualquiera de ustedes que no renuncie a todos sus bienes, no puede ser mi discípulo".



La liturgia de este domingo nos invita a tomar conciencia de cuán exigente es el caminho del Reino. Optar por el Reino no es escoger un caminho de facilidade, sino aceptar recorrer un caminho de renuncia y de entrega de la vida. Jesús está a caminho de Jerusalén. La enseñanza de

Jesús va dirigida a las multitudes, esto es, a todos los discípulos presentes y futuros de Jesús. Él pone tres exigências, todas ellas subordinadas al tema de la renuncia. La primera exige el preferir a Jesús antes que a la própria família. La segunda exige la renuncia a la própria vida. El discípulo de Jesús no puede vivir haciendo opciones egoístas, poniendo en primer lugar sus interesses. La terceira exige la renuncia a los bienes. Jesús sabe que los bienes pueden facilmente tranformarse en dioses, esclavisando al hombre.



En la primera lectura, el autor del Libro de la Sabiduría dirige a sus compatriotas, submergidos en el paganismo, en la idolatria y en la immoralidad, y mostrales las ventajas de perseverar en la fe y de vivir en la justicia; por otro lado, se dirige a los paganos y les presenta la superioridad de la fe y de los valores israelitas. Sólo la "sabiduría" que es un don de Dios, permite al hombre compreender todo, hacer lo que agrada a Dios y salvarse. Sólo la acción de Dios que derrama sobre los hombres la "sabiduría" permite encontrar el sentido de la vida y discernir lo verdadeiro de lo falso, lo importante de lo inútil.



La Carta a Filemón es la más breve y personal de las cartas de Pablo. Está dirigida a un tal Filemón, aparentemente un miembro destacado de la Iglesia de Colosas. Onésimo, esclavo de Filemón, huyó de casa de su señor. Encontró a Pablo, se unió a él y se hizo cristiano. Pablo, que en ese momento estaba en prisión, le hizo su colaborador y lo mantuvo junto a si. Y Pablo pide a Filemón que lo reciba de vuelta como se fuera su hijo.

# Português DOMINGO XXIII DO TIEMPO COMUM



Naquele tempo, seguia Jesus uma grande multidão. Jesus voltou-se e disse-lhes: "Se alguém vem ter comigo, e não me preferir ao pai, à mãe, à esposa, aos filhos, aos irmãos, às irmãs e até à própria vida, não pode ser meu discípulo. Quem não toma a sua cruz para me seguir, não pode ser meu discípulo. Quem de vós, desejando construir uma torre, não se senta primeiro a calcular a despesa para ver se tem com que termina-la? Não suceda que, depois de assentar os alicerces, se mostre incapaz de a concluir e todos os que olharem comecem a fazer troça, dizendo: Esse homem começou a edificar, mas não foi capaz de concluir. E qual é o rei que parte para a guerra contra outro rei e não se senta primeiro a considerar se é capaz de se opor, com dez mil soldados, àquele que vem contra ele com vinte mil? Aliás, enquanto o outro ainda está longe, manda-lhe uma delegação a pedir as condições de paz. Assim, quem de entre vós não renunciar a todos os seus bens, não pode ser meu discípulo".



Lucas, neste evangelho, quer dirigir as palavras de Jesus aos numerosos convertidos das suas comunidades, que foram atraídos pelo Mestre, experimentam simpatia por ele e pela sua mensagem, mas são tentados a tornar o evangelho mais abordável, menos exigente. As condições que Jesus põe são claras e não são negociáveis. A quem deseja segui-lo, Jesus quer ensinar o caminho. E duas são as condições principais que ele apresenta: renúncia e negação de si mesmo e, depois, aceitação dos trabalhos e sacrifícios. Carregar a cruz significa aceitar a dor, os trabalhos e sacrifícios. Quem sonha com um um cristianismo cômodo está totalmente enganado. Todos os que seguem a Cristo têm de tomar a cruz. A raiz da fidelidade a Jesus é a disposição prévia de deixar para trás qualquer valor, qualquer bem, qualquer pessoa que se interponha entre as exigências de Cristo e nós. O evangelho é radical e nós devemos estar preparados para abraçar as suas exigências.



O capítulo 9 do Livro da Sabedoria contém uma maravilhosa oração para pedir a Deus a sabedoria. O autor do Livro da Sabedoria era um homem muito inteligente e preparado. E, no entanto, sentia necessidade de pedir a Deus a sabedoria, porque essa só pode ser dada por ele. Para fazer escolhas, é necessária a sabedoria, isto é, a luz que vem de Deus, porque – diz a leitura – seguindo os próprios impulsos e as próprias intuições, a pessoa não chega a descobrir aquilo que é bem. Não consegue conhecer o querer do Senhor porque os seus raciocínios são incertos.



Na Segunda Leitura Paulo recomenda a Filemón que recebe de volta o seu escravo Onésimo que tinha fugido e que foi batizado por Paulo na prisão. Paulo pede a Filemón que o acolha como se fosse seu filho.
