Pastor's Notes

I hope that you remember this past Lent in March of 2022, when Msgr. John Cervini came to speak at all the Masses, concerning his work in our diocesan mission in the Dominican Republic. At that time we took up a special second collection that amounted to over \$7,000. As you can see from the photos and words that follow, our prayers and generosity have helped to open Holy Family Vocational-Technical School for high-schoolers and young adults. They will learn life-long skills in areas such as plumbing, electricity, carpentry, cooking, etc...so that together they will improve the quality of life in such dire poverty. Thank you for making such a profound difference in the lives of these good people who share our Catholic faith.

As you can see from some of the scaffolding still surrounding part of our building, we are still working to complete the exterior roof project. The good news is that the shingles and flashing are all done, with no signs of leaking into the attic when we've had rain. The not so good news is that we are waiting to finish the work on the gutters and drain pipes (victims of supply chain slow downs). Once that is accomplished, we will be moving inside the church itself, to work on repairing and painting the ceiling and soffits that have been damaged over the years by water, fire, smoke and soot. Please pray for the completion and success of this effort.

Finally and most importantly, the United States National Eucharistic Revival began on our feast day of Corpus Christi; 19 June 2022. For the next three years, every Catholic Church in our country will be focusing on the power, the presence and the peace of Jesus Christ in the most Blessed Sacrament. Eucharistic holy hours, processions, retreats, seminars, sermons, adoration and benediction will be at the center of this revival; with the Mass being the source and summit of all that we are and all that we do as Roman Catholics. Let us together make our parish of Corpus Christi a place of deepest devotion and prayer in the name of the Sacred Body and Blood of Our Lord.

St. Francisco Assisi, Technical & Vocational School

Our High School Fe y Alegria, which began in 2015, officially opened. This school year 2021-2022 with 41 students enrolled in two areas: Environmental Conservation and Preservation and Computer Systems and Networking. A new modern science laboratory was installed by the Ministry of Education. The total enrollment in our St. Francis High School is 237 students from 7th grade to 12th grade.



We also completed the construction of our new Holy Family Vocational Building. The Vocational building will offer courses for both youth and adults in the area of nutrition and baking, sewing, arts & crafts for tourism, electricity, plumbing, pharmacy, computers, English language, beauty and hair styling, welding and others. Father John Cervini during the Lenten season visited many Long Island parishes and was able to raise enough donations to install all of above mention workshops. Sewing classes have already begun. Above are items that the students in the Technical School have made using recycled plastics. Fifteen containers have been placed in the communities to collect plastic bottles and plastics that the students will crush and recycle.



Liturgical Minister Training – Fall 2022

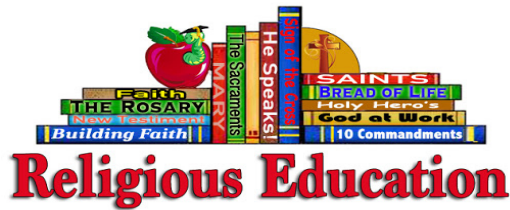
Words of Thanks from Parish Outreach

Prudent decisiveness that this gospel recommends means that we recognize that all our choices in daily living are really choices for eternal life. We honestly try to live good lives. When opportunities present themselves to act in a Christian way, most of us respond appropriately most of the time. This gospel challenges us to take this one step further. With an eye to the future, we must surrender ourselves to searching out opportunities to live the paschal mystery. There is such an urgency about discipleship that we cannot be passive in any way. Just as Jesus did all he needed to do to make his message known, so must we be as proactive in our own discipleship.

Admission into heaven is something money cannot buy. The only currency that has any value to secure our entrance is that of love. In a world where so many things can be brought with money, often our minds center more on money than upon love. What Jesus is trying to tell us is that money is a good servant but a bad master. When money is employed as a servant, it can bring joy and comfort to millions and especially to those who have little or none of it. But let money become our master, let it take the first place in our lives and it can be a tyrant. It can harden our hearts and blind our vision of the supreme realities of our existence. In what ways are we challenged to make our money a “true servant” not a master?

XXV DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 16. 10-13

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: *“El que es fiel en las cosas pequeñas, también es infiel en las grandes. Si ustedes no son fieles administradores del dinero, tan lleno de injusticias, quién les confiará los bienes verdaderos? Y si no han sido fieles en lo que no es de ustedes, quién les confiará lo que sí es de ustedes? No hay criado que pueda servir a dos amos, pues odiará a uno y amará al otro, o se apegará al primero y despreciará el segundo. En resumen, no pueden ustedes servir a Dios y al dinero”.*



El Evangelio nos presenta una serie de sentencias de Jesús sobre la utilización del dinero. Esas sentencias avisan a los discípulos para el buen uso de los bienes materiales: si sabemos utilizarlos teniendo en cuenta las exigencias del Reino de Dios, seremos dignos de recibir el verdadero bien, cuando nos encontremos definitivamente con el Señor resuscitado. El Evangelio termina con un aviso de Jesús acerca de la divinización del dinero. Dios y el dinero representan mundos contrarios. Los discípulos están invitados a realizar su opción entre un mundo de egoísmo, de intereses mezquinos, de explotación, de injusticia y un mundo de amor, de donación, de compartir, de fraternidad. El mundo en el que vivimos ha decidido que el dinero es el dios fundamental. Para

ganar más dinero, hay quien trabaja doce o quince horas al día, con un ritmo de esclavo, y se olvida de la familia y de los amigos. Por el dinero, hay quien sacrifica su dignidad. Por dinero, hay quien entierra su conciencia y renuncia a los principios en los que cree. Por dinero, hay quien no tiene escrúpulos en sacrificar la vida de sus hermanos y vende drogas y armas que matan. Por dinero, hay quien es injusto, explota a sus empleados, se niega a pagar el salario debido. Tal vez no llegemos nunca a estos casos extremos, pero, hasta donde seríamos capaces de llegar por dinero?



Amós es el profeta de la justicia social. Es una época de prosperidad económica y de tranquilidad política: las conquistas del rei Jeroboán II ampliarán los límites del reino. La prosperidad y el bienestar de las clases favorecidas contrastaban con la miseria de las clases bajas. El sistema de distribución estaba en manos de comerciantes sin escrúpulos que aprovechando el bienestar económico, aumentan los precios de los productos básicos. La clase dirigente, rica y poderosa, dominaba los tribunales. El oráculo del profeta es una denuncia de las actividades de esos que pisotean al pobre y quieren eliminar a los humildes de la tierra.



“Te ruego, hermano, que ante todo se hagan oraciones, plegarias, súplicas y acciones de gracias por todos los hombres. Dios, nuestro salvador quiere que todos se salven y todos lleguen al conocimiento de la verdad. Quiero que los hombres, libres de odios y divisiones, hagan oración dondequiera que se encuentren, levantando al cielo sus manos puras.
(1 Carta de Pablo a Timoteo 2, 1-8)

DOMINGO XXV DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO DE SÃO LUCAS 16. 10-13

Naquele tempo, disse Jesus aos seus discípulos: *“Quem é fiel nas coisas pequenas também é fiel nas grandes, e quem é injusto nas coisas pequenas também é injusto nas grandes. Se não fostes fiéis no que se refere ao vil dinheiro, quem vos confiará o verdadeiro bem? E se não fostes fiéis no bem alheio, quem vos entregará o que é vosso? Nenhum servo pode servir a dois senhores, porque, ou não gosta de um deles e estima o outro, ou se dedica a um e despreza o outro. Não podeis servir a Deus e ao dinheiro”.*



O Evangelho que nos é proposto apresenta-nos mais um passo do *caminho para Jerusalém*. Desta vez, Jesus não se dirige aos fariseus, mas aos discípulos e, através deles, aos crentes de todos os tempos. A mensagem essencial aqui apresentada gira à volta da sábia utilização dos bens deste mundo: eles devem servir para garantir outros bens, mais duradouros. O mundo em que vivemos decidiu que o dinheiro é o *“deus fundamental”* e que tudo deixa de ter importância, desde que se possam acrescentar mais uns números à conta bancária.

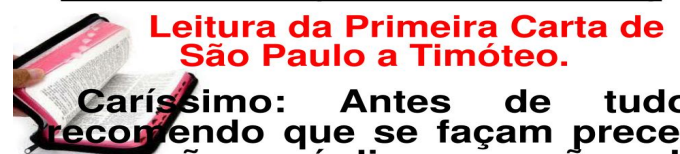
Jesus avisa os discípulos de que a aposta obsessiva o *deus dinheiro* não é o caminho mais seguro para construir valores duradouros, geradores de vida plena e de felicidade. É preciso, sugere Jesus, que

saibamos aquilo em que devemos apostar. O que é mais importante para nós: os valores do Reino de Deus ou o dinheiro? O dinheiro é algo imprescindível para vivermos neste mundo e para termos uma vida com qualidade e dignidade... No entanto, Jesus recomenda que o dinheiro não se torne uma obsessão, uma escravidão.



Na primeira leitura, o profeta Amós denuncia os comerciantes sem escrúpulos, preocupados em ampliar sempre mais as suas riquezas, que apenas pensam em explorar a miséria e o sofrimento dos pobres. Deus não está do lado de quem, por causa da obsessão do lucro, escraviza os irmãos. A exploração e a obsessão do lucro não passam em claro aos olhos de Deus.

2ª LEITURA: (1º Timóteo 2,1-8)



Leitura da Primeira Carta de São Paulo a Timóteo.

Caríssimo: Antes de tudo, recomendo que se façam preces e orações, súplicas e ações de graças, por todos os homens; pelos que governam e por todos que ocupam altos cargos, a fim de que possamos levar uma vida tranquila e serena, com toda piedade e dignidade.

Na Carta a Timóteo que nos é proposta hoje, Paulo dá disposições relativas à oração nas comunidades cristãs. A oração da comunidade cristã é universal: é dirigida a Deus pelos bons e pelos maus, pelos amigos e pelos inimigos. Não podemos rezar a Deus somente por nós mesmos, pelas nossas famílias e amigos. Note-se quantas vezes na leitura aparece o termo TODOS.
