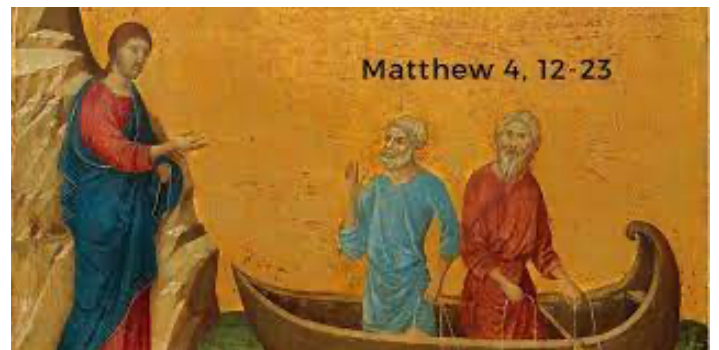

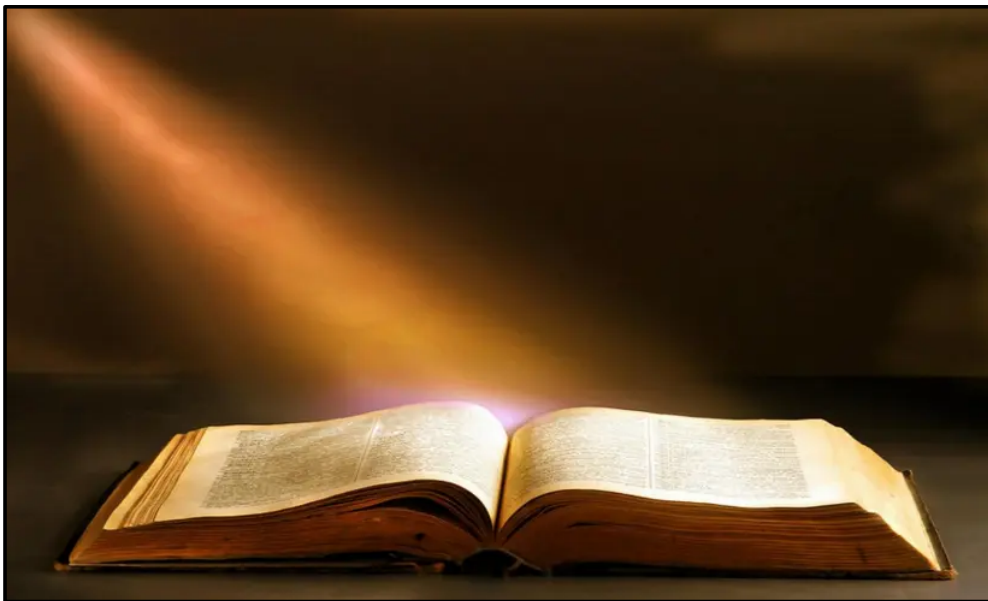

50th ANNUAL MARCH FOR LIFE



The theme for this year's March for Life, **Next Steps: Marching into a Post-Roe America**, emphasizes the need in the absence of *Roe v. Wade* for pro-life advocates to continue boldly marching in defense of the unborn – both on the state and federal level – and advocating for a minimum federal standard to protect innocent life against radical pro-abortion legislation.

Jeanne Mancini, March for Life president, said that she believed the testimony of marching every year was critical in changing the hearts and minds of Americans and leading to the reversal of what many deemed to be “settled in law.” “With *Roe* now behind us, we are empowered to save countless innocent American lives by continuing to advocate for commonsense protections at the state and federal level, educating Americans on the intrinsic dignity of all human life. This year will be a somber reminder of the millions of lives lost to abortion in the past 50 years, but also a celebration of how far we have come and where we as a movement need to focus our effort as we enter this new era in our quest to protect life. To God be the glory — in overturning *Roe*; and he uses his faithful instruments, which is all of you,” she said.

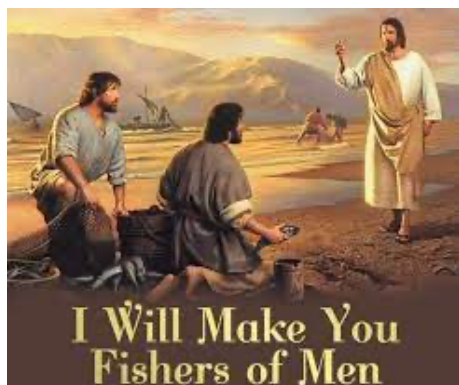

When Jesus began his public ministry of preaching and healing, John the Baptist had already been arrested, putting an end to his movement of religious revival. At that point, instead of going back home to Nazareth Jesus went to Capernaum. This marked a new beginning, whose purpose is described in a verse of prophecy: "The people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who lived in the land of the shadow of death, light has dawned." Jesus would later refer to himself as the light of the world; and, in commissioning his disciples, he would send us out also, to be light to the world. His vocation is our vocation too.

In times past the idea of "vocation" was focussed mainly on doctors, nurses, priests and religious. But now it has been restored to its original, wider application, and all our baptized people are invited to experience their calling from God. There is nothing dramatic about this. It just means that I didn't just stumble into the Christian way by default, but that God has chosen me: "I have called you by name; you are mine." "You didn't choose me; no, I chose you, and I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that would remain." If the gospel is now, and I am every person in the gospel, then, through the gospel of today, I am being called again.

III DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO SEGÚN SAN MATEO 4, 12-23

Al enterarse Jesús de que Juan había sido arrestado, se retiró a Galilea, y dejando el pueblo de Nazaret, se fue a vivir a Cafarnaum, junto al lago, en territorio de Zabulón y Neftalí, para que así se cumpliera lo que había anunciado el profeta Isaías: Tierra de Zabulón y Neftalí, camino del mar, al otro lado del Jordán, Galilea de los paganos. El pueblo que caminaba en tinieblas vio una gran luz. Sobre los que vivían en tierra de sombras una luz resplandeció. Desde entonces comenzó Jesús a predicar, diciendo: “*Conviértanse, porque ya está cerca el Reyno de los cielos*”. Una vez que Jesús caminaba por la ribera del mar de Galilea, vio a dos hermanos, Simón, llamado después Pedro, y Andrés, los cuales estaban echando las redes al mar, porque eran pescadores. Jesús les dijo: “*Sígueme y los haré pescadores de hombres*”. Ellos inmediatamente dejaron las redes y lo siguieron. Pasando más adelante, vio a otros dos hermanos, Santiago y Juan, hijos de Zebedeo, que estaban con su padre en la barca, remendando las redes, y los llamó también. Ellos, dejando enseguida la barca y a su padre, lo siguieron. Andaba por toda Galilea, enseñando en las sinagoga y proclamando la buena nueva del Reyno de Dios y curando a la gente de toda enfermedad y dolencia.



Hoy empezamos a escuchar la narración continua de la vida pública de Jesús según el evangelio de san Mateo. Nos presenta una síntesis que incluye los

elementos que definen el programa básico de la misión de Jesús: Predica y confirma su enseñanza con obras. Comenzó Jesús a predicar diciendo: *Convertíos, porque está cerca el reino de los cielos*. Convertirse es cambiar la orientación de la propia vida, cambiar de criterios y de corazón, para adecuarlos al plan de Dios y experimentar que Dios reina en nuestras vidas, que nos ama, que está cerca de nosotros. Esto es lo esencial de la predicación de Jesús. Jesús empieza su misión en Galilea. La llamaban Galilea de los gentiles (de los paganos). Era la región de Palestina que estaba más alejada de la práctica religiosa de Israel. Eran tierras de sombras en las que una luz brilló. Así se cumplía la profecía de Isaías que vemos en la primera lectura. Jesús comienza su misión llamando a sus primeros discípulos. Él busca colaboradores, no entre la gente importante, pero entre la gente sencilla. No son ellos los que se constituyen a si mismos discípulos, sino Jesús quien les llama.

El libro del profeta Isaías nos propone un conjunto de oráculos llamados mesiánicos, que alimentan la esperanza del Pueblo en ese mundo de justicia y de paz que Dios, en un futuro sin fecha señalada, va a ofrecer a los suyos. Por esa época, desilusionado con los reyes y con su política, el profeta comienza a soñar con una intervención de Dios para ofrecer a su Pueblo un mundo nuevo, de libertad y de paz sin fin.

Les suplico, hermanos, en el nombre de nuestro Señor Jesucristo, que todos vivan en armonía y que no haya divisiones entre ustedes, sino que se mantengan unidos en un mismo pensar y en un mismo propósito.

DOMINGO III DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO SEGUNDO SÃO MATEUS 1, 29-34

Quando Jesus ouviu dizer que João Baptista fora preso, retirou-se para a Galileia. Deixou Nazaré e foi habitar em Cafarnaum, terra à beira-mar, no território de Zabulão e Neftali. Assim se cumpria o que o profeta Isaías anunciara, ao dizer: “Terra de Zabulão e terra de Neftali, estrada do mar, além do Jordão, Galileia dos gentio: o povo que vivia nas trevas viu uma grande luz; para aqueles que habitavam na sombria região da morte, uma luz se levantou”. Desde então, Jesus começou a pregar: “Arrependei-vos, porque está próximo o reino dos Céus”. Caminhando ao longo do mar da Galileia, viu dois irmãos: Simão, chamado Pedro, e seu irmão André, que lançavam as redes ao mar,, pois eram pescadores. Disse-lhes Jesus: “Vinde e segui-me e farei de vós pescadores de homens”. Eles deixaram logo as redes e seguiram-no. Um pouco mais adiante, viu outros dois irmãos: Tiago, filho de Zebedeu e seu irmão João, que estavam no barco, na companhia de seu pai Zebedeu a consertar as redes. Jesus chamou-os e eles, deixando o barco e o pai, seguiram-no. Depois começou a percorrer toda a Galileia, ensinado nas sinagogas, proclamando o Evangelho do reino e curando todas as doenças e enfermidades entre o povo.



Depois da prisão de João Baptista, Jesus inicia seu ministério público na Galileia, zona de população mesclada e ponto de encontro de muito povos. A Galileia era habitada por israelitas considerados por todos como semipagãos, porque nascidos do cruzamento de vários povos. Os judeus de Jerusalém desprezavam-nos porque os consideravam pouco instruídos, ignorantes da lei, corruptos e pouco observantes das disposições rabínicas. Eram olhados com desconfiança também pelas suas tendências subversivas no campo político. É nessa região que Jesus inicia a sua missão e com essa escolha indica quem são os principais destinatários da sua luz: não os judeus puros, mas os excluídos, os distantes. Jesus anuncia a chegada do reino de Deus. Mas não o faz sozinho. Chama do meio do povo seu colaboradores. Faz dos pescadores do lago, pescadores de homens. Eles deixam seus afazeres, para se dedicar à missão de Jesus: anunciar a boa nova, a libertação

1ª LEITURA: (Isaías 8,23b-9,3)



Leitura do Livro do Profeta Isaías

No tempo passado o Senhor humilhou a terra de Zabulon e a terra de Neftali; mas recentemente cobriu de glória o caminho do mar, do além-Jordão e da Galiléia das nações.

A primeira leitura deste domingo é uma preparação ao Evangelho. Na região da Galileia o povo estava desanimado, tinha perdido toda a esperança. Havia um desânimo geral. A Galileia estava controlada pelos assírios. As tribos de Zabulão e Naftali foram envolvidas nestas perturbações político-militares: devastações, violência, pesados tributos. Neste momento de desânimo geral, eis que ressoa a voz do profeta que anuncia a aurora de um dia novo.
