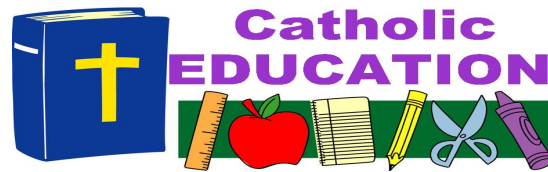


## 2023 Mass Book

“If they could only see me now.” What would our parents or friends think of us now if they saw how we behaved in various circumstance, whether we were honest, generous or mean? Unless there’s an audience of some kind to validate us, we hardly think it worthwhile to make the effort. How easy it is to dress up things with a veneer of virtue. God sees the heart and knows our thoughts. Opinions of others do matter to some extent. But what counts is God’s. The basic issue is whether we have been authentic human beings. Life in the state of grace, does not depend on social reputation, but on our inner quality. As Paul says, one cannot fully judge oneself. About righteousness, we can only trust in God’s mercy, while making an honest effort to do what is right. Then the principle applies: “for those who love God, all things work together towards good.”

If we did things simply for God’s approval, would we be exploited by others? So we won’t commit to being just and honest until others do so too. The rat-race is nobody’s fault, and yet it’s everybody’s. Social solidarity can only begin when individuals choose it for its own sake. “Ask not what your country can do for you, ask rather what you can do for your country.” Ultimately, this is the way to salvation. When our race has been run, and the Master comes to judge our service, only those who have been honest and generous will feel at home in God’s company. Then we will see that this was the right way to live. “Well done good and faithful servant”, and we can say, “It was no more than our duty.”

## XXVII DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



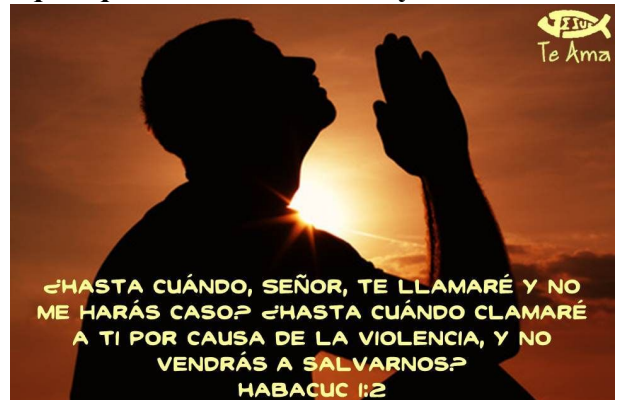
### EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 17, 5-10

En aquel tiempo, los apóstoles dijeron al Señor: “Auméntanos la fe”. El Señor les contestó: “Si tuvieras fe, aunque fuera tan pequeña como una semilla de mostaza, podrían decir a este árbol frondoso: Arráncate de raíz y plántate en el mar, y los obedecería. Quien de ustedes, si tiene un siervo que labra la tierra o pastorea los rebaños, le disse cuando éste regressa del campo: Entra enseguida y ponte a comer? No le dirá más bien: Prepárame de comer y disponte a servirme, para que yo coma y beba; Después comerás y beberás tú? Tendrá acaso que mostrarse agradecido como el siervo, porque éste cumplió con su obligación? Así también ustedes, cuando hayan cumplido todo lo que les mandó, diga: No somos más que siervos, sólo hemos hecho lo que teníamos que hacer”.



La fe es el misterio por el que nos fiamos de Dios como Padre. Ponemos nuestra vida en sus manos sencillamente porque su palabra, revelada en Jesús y en su evangelio, llena el corazón. Por eso, la fe se la compara aquí con un grano de mostaza, muy pequeño, porque en esa pequenez hay mucha calidad en la que puede encerrarse, sin duda, el fiarse verdaderamente de Dios. No es que la fe sea ilógica, o simplemente ciega, es una opción inquebrantable de confianza. Es como el que ama, que no puede explicarse muchas veces por qué se ama a alguien. Por tanto, existe una razón secreta

que nos impulsa a amar, como a creer. Sin la fe, la religión no lleva a ninguna parte. Y muy frecuentemente sucede que se tiene una religión, pero en ella no habita la fe. La fe no es algo mágico como un hechizo, sino que es la confianza radical en Aquel que nos ha convocado y nos envía.



El profeta Habacuc expresa los sentimientos que ayer y hoy muchas veces surge en nuestro corazón. Contrastar la realidad desde la óptica de la fe nos lleva a cuestionarnos. La realidad se nos presenta desafiante. Frente a las preguntas del profeta Dios le pide que escriba para hacer memoria y recordar su forma de actuar. También hoy enfrentamos muchas dificultades en la vida. Dios nunca nos deja. Son en esos momentos cuando más surgen signos de su presencia y acción. Es necesario volver a pasar por el corazón que Dios no permanece nunca indiferente frente al sufrimiento y el dolor. El creyente pone en Dios su confianza porque sabe que el amor nunca defrauda.



La segunda lectura de este domingo es el comienzo de la segunda carta a Timoteo en la que se ponen de manifiesto los elementos pastorales del que, según la tradición, ha recibido el encargo de Pablo para dirigir la comunidad Cristiana. Se habla del don de Dios que ha recibido, y que no es un don para temer, sino para luchar con fuerza y energía por los valores del evangelio frente a este mundo.

### DOMINGO XXVII DO TEMPO COMUM



#### EVANGELHO DE SÃO LUCAS 17, 5-10

Naquele tempo, os Apóstolos disseram ao Senhor: “Aumenta a nossa fé”. O Senhor respondeu: “Se tivésseis fé como um grão de mostarda, diríeis a esta amoreira: “Arranca-te daí e vai plantar-te no mar, e ela obedecer-vos-ia. Quem de vós, tendo um ervo a lavrar ou guardar gado, lhe dirá, quando ele voltar do campo: “Vem depressa sentar-te à mesa”? Não lhe dirá antes: “Prepara-me o jantar e cinge-te para me servires, até que eu tenha comido e bebido. Depois comerás e beberás tu”? Terá de agradecer ao servo por lhe ter feito o que mandou? Assim também vós, quando tiverdes feito tudo o que vos foi ordenado, dizei: “Somos inúteis servos: fizemos o que devíamos fazer”.

#### A Parábola dos Servos Inúteis

Lucas 17.7-10



Na Bíblia nunca é dito que Abrão entrou num santuário para rezar, e, no entanto, ele não só é considerado o pai dos crentes, mas também o modelo da pessoa que reza. Se para rezar é preciso acreditar, para acreditar é preciso rezar. Acreditar não diz respeito apenas à mente: comporta uma escolha concreta, implica a confiança plena e incondicional em Cristo e a adesão convicta à sua proposta de vida. Sendo assim, é fácil dar-se conta de que a fé pode crescer ou diminuir. A experiência de uma fé incerta e

vacilante é feita todos os dias: acreditamos em Jesus, mas não confiamos completamente nele, não temos a coragem de dar certos passos, de interromper certos hábitos, de fazer certas renúncias. Cá está a fé que se deve reforçar! A fé – diz Jesus – é capaz de realizar até mesmo o impossível: desenraizar uma amoreira e fazê-la crescer no mar. Para quem acredita – diz Jesus –, não existem situações irrecuperáveis. Quem confia na sua palavra será testemunha de milagres extraordinários e inesperados, verá realizarem-se as mudanças prodigiosas anunciadas pelos profetas: o deserto florescerá, a estepe será transformada num jardim do Éden.



Habacuc é contemporâneo do profeta Jeremias. A situação social, política e religiosa em que vivem é a mesma. A iniquidade reina no país. O rei é um fraco, um incapaz, ama o luxo, explora os operários para construir o seu palácio, não se importa com a causa do pobre e do miserável. Deus deixa andar. Parece ter-se desinteressado do que acontece na terra. Por que não intervém? Por que não socorre os oprimidos? Estupenda a oração de Habacuc! Ele tem coragem de dizer ao Senhor que não está de acordo com Ele, que não entende a sua tolerância para com os malvados; ousa pedir-lhe contas do seu modo de governar o mundo. A resposta de Deus não se faz esperar e está contida na segunda parte da leitura. Deus não dá nenhuma explicação, pede apenas confiança incondicional. Um dia o Senhor fará justiça. “Vede como sucumbe aquele que não tem alma recta; mas o justo viverá pela sua fidelidade”.
