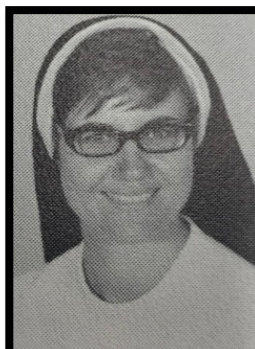
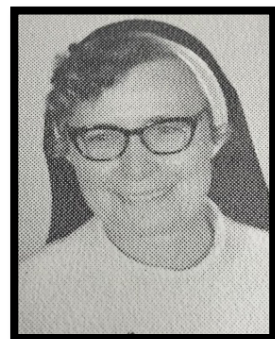
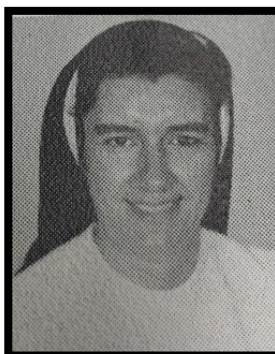
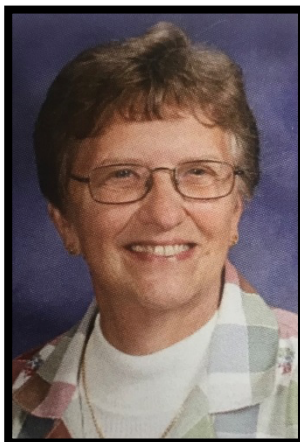
The Sisters of St. Dominic of Amityville

There will be a Mass at 7:30 AM and 12:30 PM, and 7:30 PM in Spanish.

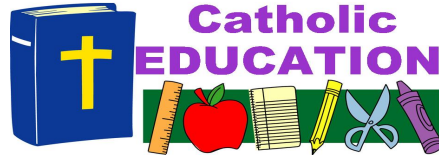

>We are an independent 501(c)(3) organization and do not receive funding from the Diocese or the Parish.

>All donations go to the needy in our community and are tax deductible.

>Our only overhead expense is a monthly checking account fee.

>Our single fundraiser is the Annual Walk for the Poor in September. However, donations are accepted at any time throughout the year. Checks can be made out to St. Vincent dePaul and can be deposited in the collection basket at any Mass or submitted to the Rectory.

XXVII DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



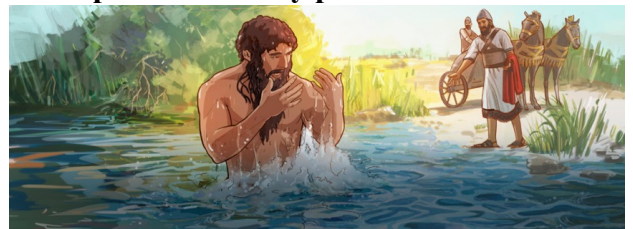
EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 17, 11-19

En aquel tiempo, cuando Jesús iba de camino a Jerusalén, pasó entre Samaria y Galilea. Estaba cerca de un pueblo, cuando le salieron al encuentro diez leprosos, lo cuales se detuvieron a lo lejos y a gritos le decían: *“Jesús, maestro, ten compasión de nosotros”*. Al verlos, Jesús les dijo: *“Vayan a presentarse a los sacerdotes”*. Mientras iban de camino, quedaron limpios de la lepra. Uno de ellos, al ver que estaba curado, regresó, alabando a Dios sen voz alta, se postró a a los pies de Jesús y le dio las gracias. Ese era un samaritano. Entonces dijo Jesús: *“No eran diez los que quedaron limpios? Dónde están los otros nueve? No ha habido nadie, fuera de est”e extranjero, que volviera para dar gloria a Dios? Después dijo al samaritano: “Tu fe te ha salvado”*.



Una vez más Lucas presenta un episodio situado en el “camino de Jerusalén”, ese camino espiritual, a lo largo del cual los discípulos van aprendiendo y interiorizando los valores y la realidad del Reino de Dios. En el camino de Jesús y de los discípulos aparecen diez leprosos. El leproso es en el tiempo de Jesús, el prototipo del marginado. Además de causar repugnancia por su apariencia y de infundir el miedo al contagio, el leproso es un impuro ritual a quien la religión

oficial atribuía pecados especialmente graves. La lepra era el castigo de Dios por esos pecados. Por eso, el leproso no podía ni siquiera entrar en la ciudad de Jerusalén, para no manchar la ciudad santa. Debía abstenerse de cualquier contacto humano para que no contaminase a los otros con su impureza física y religiosa. Uno de los leprosos es el samaritano. Los samaritanos eran despreciados por los judíos de Jerusalén, a causa de su sincretismo religioso. Había una enemistad entre judíos y samaritanos. Lucas está interesado en mostrar que quien recibe la salvación, debe reconocer el don de Dios y debe ser agradecido. La lepra, que roba la vida a esos diez hombres, representa el infortunio que afecta a la totalidad de la humanidad y que genera exclusión, marginación, opresión, injusticia. Esos diez hombres que se encuentran con Jesús, y que a través de Jesús descubren la misericordia y el amor de Dios, representan a toda la humanidad, envuelta por la miseria y por el sufrimiento.



La primera lectura nos presenta la historia de un leproso, el sirio Naamán. El episodio revela que sólo Yahvé ofrece al hombre la vida y la salvación, sin límites ni excepciones; al hombre le queda acoger el don de Dios, reconocerlo como el único salvador y manifestarle gratitud.

"Si fuéremos infieles,
Él permanece fiel: no se
puede negar a sí mismo."

- 2 Timoteo, 2:13

La segunda lectura define la existencia cristiana como la identificación con Cristo. Quien acoge el don de Dios, se hace discípulo: se identifica con Cristo, vive en el amor y en la entrega a los hermanos y llega a la vida nueva de la resurrección. Las palabras de San Pablo son para nosotros una exhortación a mantenernos firmes en nuestra fe ante nuestros contemporáneos dando razón de la misma y no negando nunca a Jesucristo

DOMINGO XXVIII DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO DE SÃO LUCAS 17, 11-19

Naquele tempo, indo Jesus a caminho de Jerusalém, passava entre a Samaria e a Galileia. Ao entrar numa povoação, vieram ao seu encontro dez leprosos. Conservando-se a distância, disseram em alta voz: “Jesus, Mestre, tem compaixão de nós”. Ao vê-los, Jesus disse-lhes: “Ide mostrar-vos aos sacerdotes”. E sucedeu que no caminho ficaram limpos da lepra. Um deles, ao ver-se curado, voltou atrás, glorificando a Deus em alta voz, e prostrou-se de rosto em terra aos pés de Jesus, para lhe agradecer. Era um samaritano. Jesus, tomando a palavra, disse: “Não foram dez os que ficaram curados? Onde estão os outros nove? Não se encontrou quem voltasse para dar glória a Deus senão este estrangeiro”? E disse ao homem. “Levanta-te e segue teu caminho; a tua fé te salvou”.



Todas as doenças eram consideradas um castigo pelo pecados, mas a lepra era o símbolo do próprio pecado. Por esse motivo os leprosos sentiam-se rejeitados por todos, pelos homens e por Deus. Note-se bem: não pedem a Jesus que os cure, mas apenas que sinta compaixão. Talvez esperem uma esmola. A lei determinava que quem se curasse desta doença devia apresentar-se a um sacerdote, o qual, depois das verificações necessárias, decidia se esta pessoa podia ser ou não admitida na comunidade. Jesus admira-se que só um

estrangeiro tenha sentido a necessidade de dar glória a Deus. Os dez leprosos são curados ao longo do caminho. Por que é que Jesus não os cura imediatamente – com costuma fazer – e não os manda aos sacerdotes para a verificação prevista na lei? Queria pôr à prova a sua gratidão?



A primeira leitura deste domingo nos conta a história do general sírio, Naamã. Um dia, uma rapariga de Israel, raptada durante uma incursão, revela ao general sírio que na sua terra há um profeta que faz curas extraordinárias. É o profeta Eliseu o discípulo do profeta Elias. Naamã vai ter com ele, mas quando está para chegar à casa de Eliseu, um servo do profeta que lhe diz que se deve ir a lavar sete vezes na água do rio Jordão. Eliseu não se dignou sequer vir a saudá-lo. Naamã fica indignado. Está prestes a se afastar quando os seus servos vêm ter com ele e o levam a fazer um raciocínio elementar: se o profeta te tivesse ordenado uma coisa difícil sem dúvida que a terias feito. Por que não por em prática uma ordem tão simples? Naamã desce ao Jordão, mergulha sete vezes e a sua carne torna-se como a de uma criança; está curado. Ele não é só curado da lepra do corpo, mas também da lepra da alma. Do paganismo passou à fé no Deus único e verdadeiro.

2ª LEITURA: (2º Timóteo 2,8-13)

Leitura da Segunda Carta de São Paulo a Timóteo.



Caríssimo: Lembra-te de Jesus Cristo, da descendência de Davi, ressuscitado dentre os mortos, segundo o meu evangelho. Por ele eu estou sofrendo até às algemas, como se eu fosse um malfeitor; mas a palavra de Deus não está algemada.
