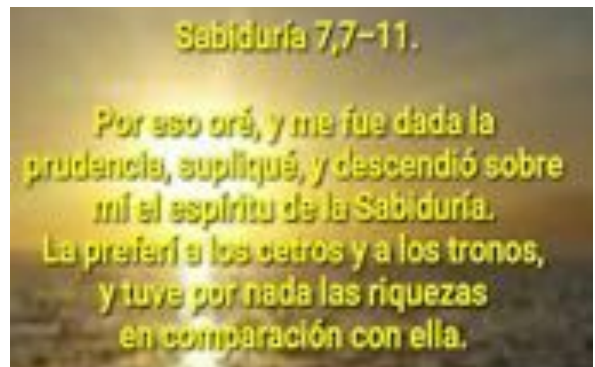
XXVIII DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN MARCOS 10, 17-27

En aquel tiempo, cuando salía Jesús a caminho, se le acercó un hombre, se arrodilló ante él y le preguntó: *“Maestro bueno, qué debo hacer para alcanzar la vida eterna?”* Jesús le contestó: *“Por qué me llamas bueno? Nadie es bueno sino sólo Dios. Ya sabes los mandamentos: No matarás, no cometerás adulterio, no robarás, no levantarás falso testimonio, no cometerás fraudes, honrarás a tu padre y a tu madre”*. Entonces él le contestó: *“Maestro, todo eso lo he cumplido desde muy joven”*. Jesús lo miró con amor y le dijo: *“Sólo una cosa te falta. Ve y vende lo que tienes, da el dinero a los pobres y así tendrás un tesoro en los cielos. Después, ven y sígueme”*. Pero al oír estas palabras, el hombre se entristeció y se fue apesadumbrado, porque tenía muchos bienes”. Jesús, mirando a su alrededor, dijo entonces a sus discípulos: *“Qué difícil les va a ser a los ricos entrar en el Reino de Dios!”* Los discípulos quedaron sorprendidos ante esta palabras; pero Jesús insistió: *“Hijitos, qué difícil es para los que confían en las riquezas entrarem en el Reino de Dios! Más fácil le es a un camello pasar por el ojo de una aguja, que a un rico entrar en el Reino de Dios”*. Ellos se asombraron todavía más y comentaban entre sí: *“Entonces, quién puede salvarse?”* Jesús, mirándolos fijamente, les dijo: *“Es imposible para los hombres, mas no para Dios. Para Dios todo es posible”*.

La figura del hombre rico nos lleva a una reflexión: Sólo se acercan a Jesús los que descubren que necesitan *algo* de él (aunque no sepan exactamente qué es) y descubren, además, que ese *algo* no se compra con dinero, ni se consigue con o que ya tenemos. Por lo tanto ese *algo* no puede ser ni la comodidad, ni el bienestar, ni la última moda. Ese *algo* tampoco es la amistad, por ejemplo, ni el amor, porque hay muchos no creyentes que viven ambas cosas. Encontrarse con Jesús nos pide descubrir que en la vida hay *algo* más, *algo* mucho más profundo de lo que solemos vivir, *algo* que nos deja insatisfechos que nos hace ver cierto vacío en este mundo. Jesús tiene respuestas más altas, más intensas, tiene un horizonte más amplio. Cuando Jesús fija la mirada en aquel joven, para nosotros hoy desconocido, mira a cada uno de los que ha llamado por el bautismo a la vida de cristianos.



La Primera Lectura de este domingo nos ofrece uno de los pensamientos más bellos sobre la sabiduría. Forma parte de una reflexión más amplia sobre la igualdad de los hombres en su naturaleza, y cómo esta nos perfecciona humanamente. Se supone que el autor es como un rey (algunos han pensado que era Salomón, pero no es así). Y este rey se considera igual a todos los hombres, porque los reyes y cualquier ser humano nacen lo mismo que todos y mueren lo mismo que todos. Pero lo que hace a los seres humanos distintos en la vida y en la muerte es la sabiduría, por la que compartimos la vida misma de Dios.

DOMINGO XXVIII DO TEMPO COMUM

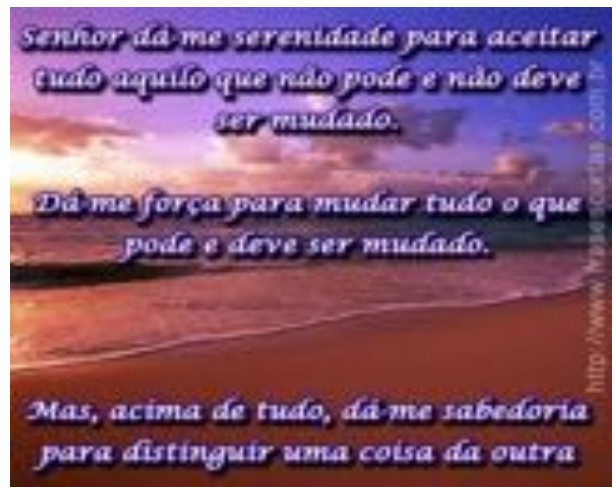


EVANGELHO DE SÃO MARCOS 10, 17-27

Naquele tempo, ia Jesus pôr-se a caminho, quando um homem se aproximou correndo, ajoelhou-se diante dele e perguntou-lhe: *“Bom Mestre, que hei de fazer para alcançar a vida eterna?”* Jesus respondeu: *“Porque me chamas bom? Ninguém é bom senão Deus. Tu sabes os mandamentos: Não mates; não cometas adultério; não roubes; não levantes falso testemunho; não cometas fraudes; honra pai e mãe”*. O homem disse a Jesus: *“Mestre, tudo isso tenho eu cumprido desde a juventude”*. Jesus olhou para ele com simpatia e respondeu: *“Falta-te uma coisa: vai vender o que tens, dá o dinheiro aos pobres e terás um tesouro no Céu. Depois, vem e segue-me”*. Ouvindo estas palavras, anuviou-se-lhe o semblante e retirou-se pesaroso, porque era muito rico. Então Jesus, olhando à sua volta, disse aos discípulos: *“Como será difícil para os quem têm riquezas entrar no reino de Deus”*. Os discípulos ficaram admirados com estas palavras. Mas Jesus afirmou-lhes de novo: *“Meus filhos, como é difícil entrar no reino de Deus! É mas fácil passar um camelo pelo fundo de uma agulha do que um rico entrar no reino de Deus”*. Eles admiraram-se ainda mais e diziam uns aos outros: *“Quem pode então salvar-se?”* Fitando neles os olhos Jesus respondeu: *“Aos homens é impossível, mas não a Deus, porque a Deus tudo é possível”*.



O Evangelho de Marcos nos mostra o caminho de Jesus para Jerusalém. Nesse caminho alguém que tinha apego às riquezas, corre ao encontro de Jesus, diante dele se ajoelha e pergunta: Bom Mestre, que devo fazer para ganhar a vida eterna? Esse encontro é determinante para a vida daquela pessoa que buscava um sentido para a sua vida. O homem rico não teve a coragem de aceitar o convite de Jesus, de colocar de lado suas riquezas e seguir a Jesus. Todos nós temos esse problema. Como é difícil não nos apegarmos ao que nós possuímos. Há pobres que tem o coração de rico e não pensam em nada mais que possuir mais e mais. É a grande tentação que temos em nossa vida. Deus não condena a riqueza, mas sim o apego às coisas materiais. O homem do Evangelho cumpria os mandamentos, mas ele procura algo mais na vida, ele sente a falta de algo mais que as suas riquezas não podem dar. E esse homem perdeu a grande oportunidade de ser um dos apóstolos e ter o seu nome escrito na História.



A primeira leitura deste domingo nos fala da importância da prudência e da sabedoria. A sabedoria é mais preciosa do que todas as riquezas deste mundo, é mais importante do que todo o poder deste mundo. Saber escolher o que é importante na vida é essencial. Do contrário nós podemos nos perder procurando tantas coisas na vida e nos esquecemos que a vida passa e podemos perdê-la.
