

This year of 2025 culminates the ongoing “National Eucharistic Revival” in every Roman Catholic Church throughout our country. The front facade of Corpus Christi Church is finally finished with the beautiful mosaic of the “monstrance” holding the Most Blessed Sacrament. But more importantly inside the church, the real presence of our Risen Lord Jesus in the Eucharist is the source and summit of everything we are and all that we do as Catholics. As your Pastor, I pray that our weekly hours of Adoration (Mondays, 8:00-9:00 AM; Wednesdays, 1:00-2:00 PM; Thursday, 7:00-8:00 PM) will continue to grow with your personal prayers & presence in worship of Christ Jesus.

Autumn is always the traditional time for our once-a-year parish fundraiser, by way of the four raffle tickets we are sending to each home. They are \$25 each, which will go toward the cost of purchasing two new doors leading into the Rectory offices. The current doors are wooden, and have been in place for more than 40 years. So clearly, they are deteriorating. Any additional funds that we raise will go towards needed improvements in the two large bathrooms in the lower hall of the Church. There will be three cash prizes (\$1,500, \$1,000, \$500) to be drawn on Sunday 23 November at the end of the 11:30 AM Mass, celebrating the Solemnity of Christ the King!

But also we are thankful for your weekly support of Corpus Christi, and the financial assistance we need to operate on a balanced budget as best as possible. 

*Español***XXVIII DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO  
ORDINARIO****EVANGELIO SEGÚN SAN LUCAS 17, 11-19**

En aquel tiempo, cuando Jesús iba de camino a Jerusalén, pasó entre Samaria y Galilea. Estaba cerca de un pueblo, cuando le salieron al encuentro diez leprosos, los cuales se detuvieron a lo lejos y a gritos le decían: "Jesús, maestro, ten compasión de nosotros". Al verlos, Jesús les dijo: "Vayan a presentarse a los sacerdotes". Mientras iban de camino, quedaron limpios de la lepra. Uno de ellos, al ver que estaba curado, regresó, alabando a Dios en voz alta, se postró a los pies de Jesús y le dio las gracias. Ese era un samaritano. Entonces dijo Jesús: "¿No eran diez los que quedaron limpios? ¿Dónde están los otros nueve? ¿No ha habido nadie, fuera de este extranjero, que volviera para dar gloria a Dios?" Después le dijo al samaritano: "Levántate y vete. Tu fe te ha salvado".



El samaritano, extranjero, casi hereje, sabe que si ha sido curado ha sido por la acción de Dios. Pero además, el texto pone de manifiesto que no es la curación física lo importante sino que, profundizando en ella, se habla de salvación; y es este samaritano quien la ha encontrado de verdad viniendo a Jesús antes de ir a cumplir preceptos. Quien sabe dar gracias a Dios, pues, sabe encontrar la verdadera razón de su felicidad. Es verdad que los judíos leprosos también darían gracias a Dios en su afán de cumplir con lo que estaba mandado, no debe haber la menor duda. Lo extraño de

relato, como alguien ha hecho notar, es que mientras estaban enfermos de muerte, estaban juntos, pero ahora curados cada uno va por su camino, casi con intereses opuestos. La intencionalidad de relato es mostrar que la verdadera acción de gracias es acudir a quien nos ha hecho el bien. Lo hace un hereje samaritano, que para los judíos era tan maldito como el tener todavía la lepra. Es, pues, ese samaritano quien muestra un acto religioso por excelencia: la acción de gracias a quien le ha dado vida verdadera: a Jesús y a su Dios. El Dios de Jesús, desde luego, no siempre coincide con el Dios de la ley, de los ritos y de los mitos. Es el Dios personal que, con entrañas de misericordia, acoge a todos los desvalidos y a todos los que la sociedad margina en nombre, incluso, de lo más sagrado. La lepra en aquella época, por impura, alejaba de la comunidad santa de Israel. Pero en el evangelio se nos quiera decir que no alejaba del Dios vivo y verdadero. Por eso el samaritano-hereje -sin religión verdadera para la teología oficial del judaísmo- expresa su religión de corazón agradecido y humano. Porque una religión sin corazón, sin humanidad, sin entrañas, no es una verdadera religión.



La segunda lectura de este domingo, del Libro de los Reyes, nos presenta una narración del ciclo del profeta Eliseo – discípulo del gran profeta Elías, en la que se os muestra la acción beneficiosa para un leproso extranjero; nada menos que Naamán, el general de Siria, pueblo enemigo de Israel. La lepra era considerada la enfermedad más impura y diabólica. Eliseo recurre al mítico Jordán, el río de la tierra sata, para que se bañe o se bautice en sus aguas curativas, casi divinas, para aquella mentalidad. Es como un baño en la fe de Israel; este es el sentido del texto. El ejemplo moral de Eliseo de o despreciar a un extranjero es un adelanto profético de lo que había de venir con la predicación del evangelio. Por ello, cuanto las religiones dividen y justifican guerras y odios, entonces las religiones han perdido su razón de ser y de existir. El leproso Naamán busca solución a su problema fuera de su tierra, pues en ella se siente marginado y nadie, ni siquiera sus propios dioses, puede devolverle la salud. Acude al Dios de Israel.

## Português

### DOMINGO XXVIII DO TEMPO COMUM



#### EVANGELHO DE SÃO LUCAS 17, 11-19

Naquele tempo, indo Jesus a caminho de Jerusalém, passava entre a Samaria e a Galileia. Ao entrar numa povoação, vieram ao seu encontro dez leprosos. Conservando-se a distância, disseram em alta voz: «Jesus, Mestre, tem compaixão de nós». Ao vê-los, Jesus disse-lhes: «Ide mostrar-vos aos sacerdotes». E sucedeu que no caminho ficaram limpos da lepra. Um deles, ao ver-se curado, voltou atrás, glorificando a Deus em alta voz, e prostrou-se de rosto por terra aos pés de Jesus para Lhe agradecer. Era um samaritano. Jesus, tomando a palavra, disse: «Não foram dez que ficaram curados? Onde estão os outros nove? Não se encontrou quem voltasse para dar glória a Deus senão este estrangeiro?» E disse ao homem: «Levanta-te e segue o teu caminho; a tua fé te salvou».



O leproso era, no tempo de Jesus, o protótipo do marginalizado. A teologia oficial considerava o leproso um impuro ritual (cf. Lev 13-14), um “castigado por Deus” por ter cometido pecados especialmente graves. O contacto com um leproso provocava impureza. Estava-lhe vedada a entrada na cidade de Jerusalém, a fim de não conspurcar, com a sua impureza, o lugar sagrado onde estava o templo. No caso improvável de cura, o leproso devia apresentar-se diante de um sacerdote, a fim de que este comprovasse o facto e lhe permitisse a reintegração na vida normal (cf. Lev 14). Podia, então, voltar a participar nas celebrações do culto. O episódio da cura dos dez leprosos por Jesus, é exclusivo de Lucas. No Evangelho, alguns leprosos pedem a Jesus que se compadeça deles. Foram

colocados à margem da vida e foi-lhes roubada toda a esperança. Jesus, profundamente compadecido, dispõe-se a oferecer-lhes a salvação de Deus. Mostra-lhes o caminho que eles devem percorrer para chegarem à vida nova. Estranhamente, só um deles reconheceu os dons de Deus e se mostrou grato pela salvação que lhe foi oferecida. Era um samaritano, um “herege”. Por vezes são os “improváveis”, aqueles pelos quais ninguém dá nada, que mais facilmente se deixam “tocar” pela bondade de Deus.



Na primeira leitura, do Segundo Livro dos Reis, Deus, através da ação do profeta Eliseu, oferece a sua salvação a um leproso estrangeiro, o general sírio Naamã que mergulha sete vezes no Rio Jordão e é curado da lepra, voltando-se para o Deus de Israel. Curado da sua doença física e da sua cegueira espiritual, Naamã reconhece o poder de Deus e proclama a sua fé. A misericórdia infinita de Deus derrama-se sobre todos os que n’Ele confiam, independentemente da sua origem étnica, da sua história de vida, da sua condição social ou religiosa.



Em 2 Timóteo 2:8-13, Paulo exorta Timóteo a se lembrar de Jesus Cristo, o descendente de David que ressuscitou dos mortos, e a suportar sofrimentos por causa do evangelho, pois Deus não está acorrentado. O trecho afirma que, se morrermos com Cristo, viveremos com ele; se perseverarmos, reinaremos com ele; mas se o negarmos, ele nos negará, embora sua fidelidade seja eterna.
