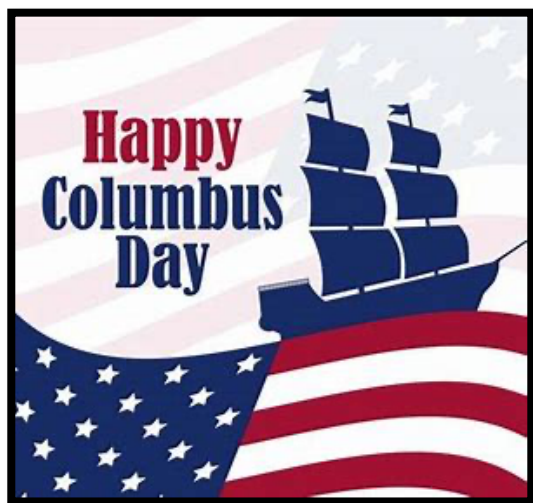

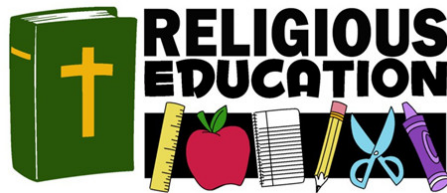

We will continue to pray for healing within the Body of Christ; especially for all the legitimate survivors who suffer still after many years, in binding up their scars and wounds.

Towards that end, financial settlements are being prepared through all the proper legal channels, so that all victims who were truly violated might continue on the road to recovery of their faith in God and Church. No amount of money will ever compare to the sacredness of each person. But we at Corpus Christi will contribute our part (along with every other parish in the Diocese), as the mission of God's people must move forward.

### **DIOCESAN STATEMENT REGARDING BANKRUPTCY AND THE ABUSE OF MINORS**

The Diocese of Rockville Centre and its related ministries are grateful that preliminary terms have been agreed upon for the settlement of our bankruptcy case. For the sake of survivors and the Church's mission on Long Island, we pray that the plan is approved and completed as quickly as possible.

The total proposed settlement amount is just over \$323 million, which includes insurance contributions, Diocesan assets and sale proceeds from Diocesan property, and contributions from parishes and other related entities. The Diocese, Parishes and other related entities will contribute a total of \$234.8 million. Insurance companies will contribute a total of just over \$85 million. Counsel for the Creditor's Committee will contribute \$3 million. All participated in order to help offer equitable compensation to survivors and move this difficult ordeal towards a conclusion. Part of the settlement plan involves all parishes entering into an abbreviated Chapter 11 with the approval of the court and the parties to the case, in order to secure a release from liability for the parishes. It is expected that parish Chapter 11's will be resolved within 48 hours of filing and will not interfere with parish work and ministries. No parishes are closing as a result of this process.

The Diocese's goal has always been the equitable compensation of survivors of abuse while allowing the Church to continue her essential mission. We believe that this plan will achieve those goals.

There is nothing wrong with money as such, or even with being wealthy. Some of the world’s greatest people who did most for the welfare of humanity, have been wealthy people. But at a deeper level the fact is that we own nothing, absolutely. Our hold on things is provisional, temporary. A sudden stroke, a brain hemorrhage or a heart attack, and we are separated forever from all our worldly belongings. “There are no pockets in the shroud.” Apparently there was a narrow entrance at the side of the temple called the “Needle.” It was wide enough for a camel to pass through, but only if the load was removed from the camel’s back. With the baskets of goods the camel normally carried on either side, it would be impossible to pass through the Needle gate.

How hard it is for people who are weighed down with money and ambitions to enter the Kingdom of God. The Kingdom belongs to children. It belongs to the poor in spirit; not so much economically poor, but detached from riches in their inmost spirit.

## XXVIII DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



### EVANGELIO: SAN MARCOS 10, 17-27

En aquel tiempo, cuando salía Jesús al camino, se le acercó corriendo un hombre, se arrodilló ante él y le preguntó: *“Maestro bueno, qué debo hacer para alcanzar la vida eterna?”* Jesús le contestó: *“Por qué me llamas bueno? Nadie es bueno sino sólo Dios. Ya sabes los mandamientos: No matarás, no cometerás adulterio, no robarás, no levantarás falso testimonio, no cometerás fraudes, honrarás a tu padre y a tu madre”*. Entonces él le contestó: *“Maestro, todo eso lo he cumplido desde muy joven*. Jesús lo miró con amor y le dijo: *“Sólo una cosa te falta. Ve y vende lo que tienes, da el dinero a los pobres y así tendrás un tesoro en los cielos. Después, ven y sígueme*. Pero al oír estas palabras, el hombre se entristeció y se fue apesadumbrado, porque tenía muchos bienes. Jesús, mirando a su alrededor, dijo entonces a sus discípulos: *“Qué difícil les va a ser a los ricos entrar en el Reino de Dios”*. Los discípulos quedaron sorprendidos ante estas palabras, pero Jesús insistió: *“Hijos, qué difícil es para los que confían en las riquezas entrar en el Reino de Dios! Más fácil le es a un camello pasar por el ojo de una aguja, que a un rico entrar en el Reino de Dios*. Ellos se asombraron todavía más y comentaban entre sí: *Entonces, quién puede salvarse?* Jesús, mirándolos fijamente, le dijo: *Es imposible para los hombres, mas no para Dios. Para Dios todo es posible*.

El evangelio nos ofrece una escena muy conocida: el joven rico y su pretensión de obtener la salvación. Es muy razonable distinguir tres partes: a) la escena del joven rico; b) la dificultad para entrar en el Reino de Dios; c) las renunciaciones de los verdaderos discípulos. Todo rematado sobre el dicho los últimos serán los primeros y los primeros los últimos. Las riquezas, poseerlas, amarlas, buscarlas es un modo de vida que define una actitud contraria a la doctrina del evangelio. Todo eso no es la felicidad. Sin embargo, a pesar de tener tantas buenas cualidades, el joven comprendía que le faltaba algo. En su corazón seguía habiendo un vacío que no podía ser llenado con ninguna de las cosas que había alcanzado en la vida. Aparentemente, el hombre era sincero en su pregunta a Jesús, y también daba la impresión de que deseaba intensamente lo que estaba pidiéndole. Jesús lo invita para que el sea su discípulo, pero, para hacerlo el tenía que dejar todo. El joven no tiene el valor de aceptar la invitación de Jesús y así, pierde la gran oportunidad de compartir con Jesús la tarea de construir el Reino de Dios.

*Sa 7,7-11 Supliqué, y se me concedió la prudencia; invoqué, y vino a mí el espíritu de sabiduría. La preferí a cetros y tronos, y, en su comparación, tuve en nada la riqueza. No le equiparé la piedra más preciosa, porque todo el oro, a su lado, es un poco de arena, y, junto a ella, la plata vale lo que el barro. La quise más que la salud y la belleza, y me propuse tenerla por luz, porque su resplandor no tiene ocaso. Con ella me vieron todos los bienes juntos, en sus manos había riquezas incontables.*

La sabiduría no es un mero conocimiento teórico, sino el don del espíritu que nos mueve a vivir en plenitud y no nos permite hacer alarde de poseerla. La sabiduría como don de Dios no es sólo cuestión de inteligencia

### DOMINGO XXVIII DO TEMPO COMUM

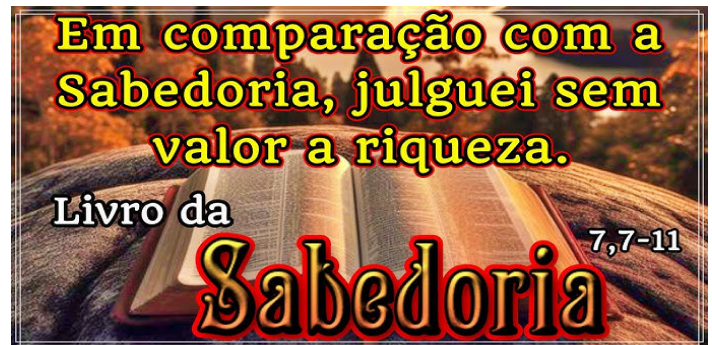


#### EVANGELHO: SÃO MARCOS 10, 17-27

Naquele tempo, ia Jesus pôr-se a caminho, quando um homem se aproximou correndo, ajoelhou diante dele perguntou-lhe: *“Bom Mestre, que hei-de fazer para alcançar a via eterna?”* Jesus respondeu: *“Porque me chamas bom? Ninguém é bom senão Deus. Tu sabes os mandamentos: Não mates; não cometas adultério; não roubes; não levantes falso testemunho; não cometas fraudes; honra pai e mãe”.* O homem disse a Jesus: *“Mestre, tudo isso tenho eu cumprido desde a juventude”.* Jesus olhou para ele com simpatia e respondeu: *“Falta-te uma coisa: vai vender o que tens, dá o dinheiro aos pobres e terás um tesouro no Céu. Depois, vem e segue-me”.* Ouvindo estas palavras, anuviou-se-lhe o semblante e retirou-se pesaroso, porque era muito rico. Então Jesus olhando à sua volta, disse aos discípulos: *“Como será difícil para os que têm riqueza entrar no reino de Deus”.* Os discípulos ficaram admirados com estas palavras. Mas Jesus afirmou-lhes de novo: *“Meus filhos, como é difícil entrar no reino de Deus! É mais fácil passar um camelo pelo fundo de uma agulha do que um rico entrar no reino de Deus”.* Eles admiravam-se ainda mais e diziam uns aos outros: *“Quem pode então salvar-se?”* Fitando neles os olhos, Jesus respondeu: *“Aos homens é impossível, mas não a Deus, porque a Deus tudo é possível”.*



É possível ser rico e bom cristão? O evangelho de Marcos nos fala de um homem rico que quer entrar no Reino de Deus, isto é, participar daquilo que Jesus está anunciado, a nova realidade de paz, justiça e fraternidade. Jesus, vendo nele um homem preocupado com a justiça e observador do mandamentos, entusiasmou-se por ele. Convidou-o para que o acompanhasse na sua missão. Mas para ele poder seguir Jesus ele deveria primeiro se livras das suas posses, como tinham feito os outros apóstolos. Jesus o aconselhou a vendê-las e dar o dinheiro aos pobres. Diante disto, o homem desistiu. Tinha posses demais. Jesus ficou triste, porque esse homem tão prendado não o podia seguir no caminho que ele trilhava para anunciar a chegada do Reino. Se ele tivesse aceito o convite de Jesus, ele teria sido um dos seus apóstolos. Seu nome seria conhecido e ele estaria nos nossos altares, como os outros apóstolos.



Na primeira leitura, um sábio de Israel exalta a *“sabedoria”*, dom de Deus. A partir da sua própria experiência, esse sábio convida-nos a fazer da *“sabedoria”* a nossa aposta fundamental. Ela é, mais do que qualquer outro valor (o poder, a riqueza, a saúde, a beleza), a base perfeita para construir uma vida com sentido.
