

Celebrating the Founding of Corpus Christi School The Sisters of St. Dominic of Amityville 100 Years!!!! 1922-2022


Sunday October 23, at 11:30 AM





Gospel – Luke 18:1-8

• In today's Gospel, Jesus encouraged His disciples to pray always and, through the parable of the widow and the judge, to be persistent in their prayer. Our journey into stewardship begins with the fundamental principle of grateful prayer. It is our direct communication with God that



draws us closer to Him. Do we, as Christian stewards, make time for daily prayer?

The widow's dogged perseverance, in the Gospel of today, is reflected in the lives of many strong women. History recalls the struggle of various women to achieve particular aims. Think of the persistence of Joan of Arc, of the suffragettes, the women who protest at all inequalities based on gender; the mothers who face up to all bureaucratic barriers on behalf of their family. Their styles may be different; but the perseverance is the same. Today's story of the widow, kept up her petition until finally she forced the judge to try her case and give her justice. Her situation was that of a poor person under threat, but with the law firmly on her side. There was no doubt about the justice of her case, but the problem was to get a judge to hear it.

That persevering widow encourages us to pray constantly, for ourselves and for others. We recognize our needs (especially for peace, love, grace and salvation), and ask for them. Our God is not like the unheeding judge of the parable, though it may often seem so. We need to persevere and never abandon hope. In this spirit, eventually all will be well.

Español XXIX DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 18, 1-8

En aquel tempo, para enseñar a sus discípulos la necesidad de orar siempre y sin desfalecer, Jesús les propuso esta parábola: "En cierta ciudad habia un juez que no temía a Dios ni respetaba a los hombres. Vivia en aquella misma ciudad una viuda que acudía a él con frecuencia para decirle: Hazme justicia contra mi adversario. Por mucho tiempo, el juez no le hizo caso, pero después se dijo: Aunque no temo a Dios ni respeto a los hobres, sin embargo, por la insistencia de esta viuda, voy a hacerle justicia para que no me siga molestando. Dicho esto Jesús comentó: Si así pensaba el juez injusto, creen ustedes acaso que Dios no hará justicia a sus elegidos, que claman a él día v noche, v que los hará esperar? Yo les digo que les hará justicia sin tardar. Pero, cuando venga el Hijo del hombre, creen ustedes que encontrará fe sobre la tierra"?



Jesús enseña a sus discípulos que la oración no puede reducirse a una petición a Dios que se resuelve imediatamente con la con la concesión de lo que le pedimos. Ya en otra oasión él mismo había insistido en el tema de la oración diciendo: pedi y recibiréis; y añadió: algunos os lamentáis de que no alcanzáis lo que pedís v es que no sabeis pedir. Nos hemos habituado a buscar la utilidade de la oración y hemos perdido el sentido de la unión con Dios, como fuerza que alcanzamos y que nos ayuda a resolver nuestros problemas. Orando conocemos y nos familiarizamos con Dios; conseguimos penetrar en su designio e allí descubrimos cuál es nuestra tarea y nuestro destino. Si prescindimos de la oración acabamos crevendo los únicos que somos responsables de nuestras decisiones, y en todo caso nos volvemos a Dios para orar, pedirle ayuda, y nos decepcionamos si no nos concede como nosotros quisiéramos. Es decir, nos cansamos de orar y nos quejamos de que Dios no escucha nuestra plegaria.



El tema central de este domingo es la oración. La primera lectura, del libro del Éxodo nos sitúa en el contexto del camino de los hebreos por el desierto antes de la entrada e la Tierra Prometida y en momento de un violenta enfrentamento entre los hebreos y los Amalecitas. Ilustra, a través de la figura de Moisés que mantiene las manos alzadas hasta la puesta del sol, la importância de la perseverancia en la oración.

Português Domingo xxix do tempo comum



EVANGELHO DE SÃO LUCAS 18, 1-8

Naquele tempo, Jesus disse aos seus discípulos uma parábola sobre a necessidade de orar sempre, sem desanimar: "Em certa cidade vivia um juiz que não temia a Deus nem respeitava os homens. Havia naquela cidade uma viúva que vinha ter com ele e lhe dizia: Faz-me justiça contra o meu adversário. Durante muito tempo ele não quis atendê-la. Mas depois disse consigo: É certo que eu não temo a Deus nem respeito os homens; mas, porque esta viúva me importuna, vou fazer-lhe justiça, para que não venha incomodar-me indefinidamente. E o Senhor acrescentou: Escutai o que diz o juiz iníquo... E Deus não havia de fazer justiça aos seus eleitos, que por ele clamam dia e noite, e iria fazêlos esperar muito tempo? Eu vos digo que lhes fará justiça bem depressa. Mas quando voltar o Filho do homem, encontrará fé sobre a terra"?



Lucas nos diz que Jesus narrou a parábola para ensinar aos seus discípulos que é preciso rezar sempre, sem cessar. A oração é o grande meio para não perder a fé, mesmo nos momento mais difíceis e dramáticos, quando tudo parece estar contra nós e contra o Reino de Deus. Como é possível rezar sempre? Não

disse Jesus que o cristão não deve fazer como os pagãos que acreditam que serão ouvidos à força de palavras? A oração da qual nos fala o Evangelho não deve ser confundida com a repetição de fórmulas. A oração autêntica, aquela que nunca deve ser interrompida, consiste em manter-se constantemente em diálogo com o Senhor. Rezar sempre quer dizer não tomar nenhuma decisão sem antes ter conversado com o Senhor, sem antes ter ponderado com ele qualquer acontecimento da nossa vida. Se por um instante sequer interrompemos este contacto com Deus, e como diz a primeira leitura – deixamos cair os bracos, logo socobraremos diante das circunstâncias adversas.



A primeira leitura deste domingo, do livro do Êxodo, nos conta o combate entre os israelitas e os amalecitas que eram uma tribo de nômades violentos que viviam nas regiões desoladas do deserto do Sinai e que atacavam os israelitas que haviam saído do Egipto. Moisés deu ordens a Josué para atacá-los, enquanto ele, junto com Aarão e Hur, subiria à montanha para invocar a ajuda de Deus. Aconteceu então que, enquanto Moisés estava com as mãos erguidas em oração, Josué vencia, mas logo que, vencido pelo cansaço, as deixava cair, os amalecitas levavam a melhor
