INSPIRE is a new initiative designed to invite young people to embrace their Catholic faith and deepen their relationship with Jesus Christ, as well as to encourage renewal in outreach to teenagers in parish communities throughout the Diocese. Three "hub" parishes – St. Barnabas in Bellmore, St. John the Evangelist in Riverhead, and St. Joseph in Babylon – are hosting a series of INSPIRE Youth Nights over the next year. The nights will consist of Eucharistic Adoration with praise and worship and inspiring talks, followed by games and refreshments. Each hub parish has a unique team of veteran youth ministers, worship leaders, and faithful young adults who will facilitate the night. The initiative officially kicked off on Friday, October 8th at St. Barnabas, with the other locations offering theirs in the weeks that follow.

The Office of Youth Ministry has been hosting information sessions for parish leaders to learn and discuss how they can make the most of the initiative. Youth ministers, catechetical leaders, priests, parents, and other adult leaders will have the opportunity to accompany the youth (grades 8-12) of their parish to each INSPIRE night and use the event as a vehicle to build relationships with the teens and their families. Local follow-up to these nights is encouraged and some resources will be provided.

In last week's Gospel Jesus is asked by a rich man: "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus answered: "Keep the commandments" The young man replied and said to Him, "Teacher, all of these I have observed from my youth." Jesus, said to him: "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me."

Did the young man tend to rely too much on negative goodness? He had not broken the commandments, but how much good had he done for others? Was Our Lord saying to him: "With all your possessions, with all your wealth, with all that you could give away, what positive good have you done to others? Have you gone out of your way to help and comfort and strengthen others as you might have done?" Perhaps Our Lord was saying to him: "Stop looking at goodness as consisting in not doing things. Take all that you have and spend yourself and your possessions on others. Then you will find true happiness, here and in eternity."

What Jesus is saying is that we can't let possessions (or anything else, for that matter) divide our hearts. Too often possessions possess us; we must let go so only God can possess us. It is hard to enter the kingdom of God because too often our hearts are divided-we want to let go and follow Jesus at the same time we want to hang onto our possessions and, indeed our very lives! Divided hearts just won't do. God wants our all so God can give all in return. What "possessions"-time, money, talent-are you called to give to the poor?

XXIX DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO Es fácil ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN MARCOS 10, 35-45


En aquel tiempo se acercaron a Jesús Santiago y Juan, los hijos de Zebedeu, y les dijeron: Maestro, queremos que nos concedas lo que vamos a pedirte. Él les dijo: Qué es lo que desean? Le respondieron: Concede que nos sentemos uno a tu derecha y otro a tu izquierda, cuando estés en tu gloria. Jesús les replicó: No saben lo que piden. Podrán pasar la prueba que yo voy a pasar? Y recibir el bautismo con que seré bautizado? Le respondieron: Si, podemos. Y Jesús les dijo: Ciertamente pasarán la pruebas que yo voy a passar y recibirán el bautismo con que vo seré bautizado; pero eso de sentarse a mi derecho o a mi izquierda no me toca a mi; eso es para quienes está reservado. Cuando los otros diez apóstoles oyeron esto, se indiganron contra Santiago y Juan. Jesús reunió entonces a los doces apóstoles y les dijo: Ya saben que los jefes de las naciones las goviernan como si fueran sus dueños y los poderosos las oprimen. Pero no debe ser así entre ustedes. Al contrario: el que quiera ser grande entre ustedes, que sea su servidor, y el que quiera ser el primero, que sea el esclavo de todos, así como el Hijo del Hombre, que no ha venido para que lo sirvan, sino a servir y a dar su vida por la redención de todos.



Es fácil suponer lo afortunados que se sintieron los apóstoles al ser escogidos por Jesús como discípulos suyos; como todo judio, esperaban ardentemente al mesías, pero un mesias hecho a la medida de sus interesses, no es mesías anunciado por los profetas, el mesias triturado con el sufrimiento, como hemos escuchado en la lectura de Isaías. Mientras caminan hacia Jerusalén, Jesús aprovecha para anunciarles una vez más el caminho doloroso que le espera. Jesús se presenta como alguien que ha renunciado a usar el poder. Los hermanos Juan y Santiago, le piden algo muy humano y que consideran que es lo mejor que les pueda oferecer. Las paretensiones de los hermanos manifestan na incomprensión del messianismo de Jesús. Seguir a Jesús con lleva una dosis de sufrimiento. Si Jesús nos preguntara hoy, qué quereis que haga por vosotros: qué le responderíamos? Corresponde nuestra respuesta a los valalores de Jesús?

»Dios quiso humillarlo y hacerlo sufrir,y el fiel servidor ofreció su vidacomo sacrificio por nosotros.Por eso, él tendrá una vida muy larga,llegará a ver a sus descendientes,y hará todo lo que ...

La Primera Lectura de este domingo nos presenta uno de los textos más claros en los que se pone de manifiesto el valor redentor del sufrimiento, de tal manera que es la Iglesia primitiva, después de lo que sucedió con la muerte y resurreción de Jesús, quien se arevió a desafiar a la teologia oficial del judaísmo y hablar de un Mesías que podia sufrir para salvar a su Pueblo. Esto era lo que no admitía el judaísmo y lo que encontro la Iglesia primitia como la identidade de su Mesías salvador. Como podia ser eso que el Mesías no particiara de los sufrimientos de su Pueblo? Si Dios sufre con su Pueblo, también debía sufrir su enviado.



Português Domingo xxix do tiempo comum



EVANGELHO DE SÃO MARCOS 10, 35-45

Naquele tempo, Tiago e João, filhos de Zebedeu, aproximaram-se de Jesus e disseram-lhe: "Mestre, nós queremos que nos faças o que te vamos pedir". Jesus respondeu-lhes: "Que quereis que vos faça"? Eles responderam: "Concedei-nos que, na tua glória, nos sentemos um à tua direita e outro à tua esquerda". Disse-lhe Jesus: "Não sabeis o que pedis. Podeis beber o cálice que eu vou beber e receber o baptismo com que eu vou ser baptizado"? Eles responderam-lhe: "Podemos". Então Jesus disselhes: "Bebereis o cálice que eu vou beber e sereis baptizados com o baptismo com que eu vou ser baptizado. Mas sentar-se à minha direita ou à minha esquerda não me pertence a mim concedê-lo; é para aqueles a quem está reservado". Os outros dez, ouvindo isto, começaram a indignar-se contra Tiago e João. Jesus chamou-os e disse-lhes: "Sabeis que os que são considerados como chefes das nações exercem o domínio sobre elas e os grandes fazem sentir sobre elas o seu poder. Não deve ser assim entre vós: quem entre vós quiser tornar-se o primeiro, será escravo de todos; porque o Filho do Homem não veio para ser servido, mas para servir e dar a vida pela redenção de todos".



Apesar das inúmeras advertências de Jesus sobre a Sua Paixão, os discípulos continuam imaginando um messias triunfante, um grande chefe político que chegaria a vencer o domínio romano sobre Israel e declarar-se rei. A partir dessa ilusão, João e Tiago pretendiam conquistar um lugar no Reino de Deus, pois não estavam interessados no sacrifício, mas nos privilégios do poder. O equívoco dos dois discípulos é uma coisa comum, é algo que se repete na historia do cristianismo. Temos muita dificuldade de aceitar a cruz de Cristo. Mas Jesus é muito claro com João e Tiago: devemos estar dispostos a carregar a cruz com Jesus, se queremos entrar no seu reino eterno. Ele nos deu o exemplo. Da mesma forma, no seu reino, se queremos ser importantes, devemos servir os nossos irmãos, como Cristo serviu a todos.



Na Primeira Leitura de hoje Isaías nos apresenta novamente a figura do "Servo Fiel", do "Servo Sofredor". A leitura mostra-nos como Deus julga a vida deste "Servo". O que aos olhos dos homens é um fracasso, para Deus é um sucesso. É através do sacrifício, do sofrimento e do dom de si mesmo que ele leva a cabo a salvação. É precisamente por ser vítima do ódio, da injustiça e da violência que o "Servo" liberta os seus próprios perseguidores das suas iniquidades. Ele é a imagem perfeita de Jesus que salvou os homens, não os dominando, mas humilhando-se a si mesmo, ajoelhando-se diante deles para os servir, doando-lhes a própria vida.

"Porque não temos um sumo sacerdote que não possa compadecer-se das nossas fraquezas; porém um que, como nós, em tudo foi tentado, mas sem pecado."

Hebreus 4:14-15

A Segunda Leitura nos apresenta Jesus como nosso Supremo Sacerdote.
