

Dear Friends and Family of Corpus Christi Church,

This year of 2025 culminates the ongoing “National Eucharistic Revival” in every Roman Catholic Church throughout our country. The front facade of Corpus Christi Church is finally finished with the beautiful mosaic of the “monstrance” holding the Most Blessed Sacrament. But more importantly inside the church, the real presence of our Risen Lord Jesus in the Eucharist is the source and summit of everything we are and all that we do as Catholics. As your Pastor, I pray that our weekly hours of Adoration (Mondays, 8:00-9:00 AM; Wednesdays, 1:00-2:00 PM; Thursday, 7:00-8:00 PM) will continue to grow with your personal prayers & presence in worship of Christ Jesus.

Autumn is always the traditional time for our once-a-year parish fundraiser, by way of the four raffle tickets we are sending to each home. They are \$25 each, which will go toward the cost of purchasing two new doors leading into the Rectory offices. The current doors are wooden, and have been in place for more than 40 years. So clearly, they are deteriorating. Any additional funds that we raise will go towards needed improvements in the two large bathrooms in the lower hall of the Church. There will be three cash prizes (\$1,500, \$1,000, \$500) to be drawn on Sunday 23 November at the end of the 11:30 AM Mass, celebrating the Solemnity of Christ the King!

We give gratitude to God for your faithful giving to our parish; most importantly by your presence and prayers. But also we are thankful for your weekly support of Corpus Christi, and the financial assistance we need to operate on a balanced budget as best as possible. DOMINGO XXIX DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 18. 1-8

En aquel tiempo, para enseñar a sus discípulos la necesidad de orar siempre y sin desfallecer, Jesús les propuso esta parábola: *“En cierta ciudad había un juez que no temía a Dios ni respetaba a los hombres. Vivía en aquella misma ciudad una viuda que acudía a él con frecuencia para decirle: Hazme justicia contra mi adversario. Por mucho tiempo el juez no le hizo caso, pero después le dijo: Aunque no temo a Dios ni respeto a los hombres, sin embargo, por la insistencia de esta viuda, voy a hacerle justicia para que no me siga molestando. Dicho esto, Jesús comentó: Si así pensaba el juez injusto, creen ustedes acaso que Dios no hará justicia a sus elegidos, que claman a él día y noche, y que los hará esperar? Yo les digo que les hará justicia sin tardar. Pero, cuando venga el Hijo del hombre, ¿creen ustedes que encontrará fe sobre la tierra?”*



En el evangelio de este domingo, Jesús, que nos conoce bien, a través de una parábola, nos enseña cómo debemos orar siempre, sin desfallecer, sin desanimarnos. Es preciso que comencemos por reflexionar brevemente sobre el papel o significado de la oración, en nuestro tiempo. Quizá estamos anclados en una concepción meramente utilitarista de la oración: ¿para qué sirve rezar? ¿No será acaso la oración algo inútil o una pérdida de tiempo? Estamos en un error si pensamos que la oración solo es eficaz cuando conseguimos lo que pedimos a Dios. La verdadera oración cristiana es la expresión de nuestra

relación con Dios. En la oración ponemos nuestro corazón a la escucha de Dios, y también nos ayuda a escuchar a nuestro prójimo. Pero tratando este tema de la oración, no podemos olvidar que una de las objeciones más serias que se plantean en la religión y sobre la misma existencia de Dios es su silencio o indiferencia ante el sufrimiento del ser humano. ¡Cuántas veces hemos oído a muchos creyentes la queja de que Dios no escucha las peticiones y los ruegos que se le dirigen! Esta experiencia ha llevado a muchos a dejar de creer en un Dios que parece desentenderse de nosotros, que no nos cuida. En la humanidad de antes y de ahora, siempre ha habido mucho sufrimiento. Y a Dios se le sigue acusando de su silencio, de permanecer callado. Los creyentes no podemos caer en esta tentación. Es preciso recordar que Dios nos ha hablado definitivamente a través de su Hijo encarnado, corriendo nuestra misma suerte, asumiendo la vulnerabilidad de nuestra condición humana. El propio Jesús murió experimentando ese silencio de Dios, pero habiendo puesto su confianza en el Padre a lo largo de toda su vida; también sintiéndose acompañado por Él en el momento supremo de la cruz: “Padre, en tus manos encomiendo mi espíritu”. Así ha de ser también inquebrantable nuestra fe y confianza en Dios y en su salvación. Porque Él siempre hace justicia.



Éxodo 17: 8-14

En Éxodo 17, 8-13, los amalecitas atacan a los israelitas en Refidín, y Moisés envía a Josué a la batalla mientras él sube a una colina. Cuando Moisés levanta las manos, Israel gana; cuando las baja, Amalec gana. Para que sus brazos se mantuvieran arriba, Aarón y Hur le sostienen las manos hasta el atardecer, logrando así Josué la victoria sobre los amalecitas. El pasaje concluye con Moisés erigiendo un altar llamado "Jehová-Nisi" (El Señor es mi estandarte), y Dios declarando que lucharía contra Amalec de generación en generación

DOMINGO XXIX DO TEMPO COMUM



Evangelho - Lucas 18,1-8

Naquele tempo, Jesus disse aos seus discípulos uma parábola sobre a necessidade de orar sempre sem desanimar: «Em certa cidade vivia um juiz que não temia a Deus nem respeitava os homens. Havia naquela cidade uma viúva que vinha ter com ele e lhe dizia: ‘Faz-me justiça contra o meu adversário’. Durante muito tempo ele não quis atendê-la. Mas depois disse consigo: ‘É certo que eu não temo a Deus nem respeito os homens; mas, porque esta viúva me importuna, vou fazer-lhe justiça, para que não venha incomodar-me indefinidamente’». E o Senhor acrescentou: «Escutai o que diz o juiz iníquo!...

E Deus não havia de fazer justiça aos seus eleitos, que por Ele clamam dia e noite, e iria fazê-los esperar muito tempo? Eu vos digo que lhes fará justiça bem depressa. Mas quando voltar o Filho do homem, encontrará fé sobre esta terra?»



O Evangelho deste domingo nos apresenta uma parábola marcante: a da viúva insistente que, mesmo diante de um juiz injusto e indiferente, não desiste de clamar por justiça. Jesus usa essa imagem para nos ensinar algo essencial: a importância de perseverar na oração e de confiar que Deus nos escuta. A viúva, naquela sociedade, era símbolo de fragilidade e desamparo. Ela não tinha poder, nem influência, mas tinha algo que ninguém podia tirar: a fé e a insistência. Ela não se calava. Jesus termina com uma pergunta provocadora: Quando o Filho do Homem vier, será que ainda encontrará fé sobre a terra? Essa pergunta ressoa como um apelo. Não basta rezar por um momento, esperar uma resposta rápida, e depois desistir. A verdadeira

fé é aquela que persiste, mesmo no silêncio de Deus, mesmo quando tudo parece sem resposta. Muitos hoje se cansam da oração porque vivem num mundo da pressa, do imediatismo. Querem milagres como se fossem produtos. Deus, em geral, demora muito para nos atender, porque os seus tempos não são os nossos, os seus caminhos não são os nossos caminhos, os seus pensamentos não são os nossos pensamentos. A oração não é só pedir. É confiar. Quem reza não perde a esperança, e quando o Senhor vier para fazer justiça, será encontrado em vigilante espera. Rezar é dizer a Deus: Eu creio em Ti, mesmo quando não entendo Teus caminhos. Essa parábola de Jesus é também um chamado à justiça. Jesus nos convida não só a orar, mas a agir pela justiça, a não sermos como o juiz que ignora o clamor dos pequenos.



Os amalecitas eram uma tribo de nômades violentos que viviam nas regiões do deserto do Sinai. Poucos povos foram tão odiados pelos israelitas como eles. O que tinham feito eles? Tinham cometido um crime imperdoável. Depois da saída do Egito, os israelitas deviam atravessar o território ocupado por essa tribo. Estavam cansados da longa viagem, pediam um pouco de água, mas os amalecitas, em vez de ajuda-los, os atacaram e mataram os mais fracos da retaguarda da caravana. A leitura de hoje nos relata um dos primeiros combates ocorridos com esta tribo do deserto. A primeira leitura deste domingo, do livro do Êxodo, nos ensina que, para atingir objetivos superiores às nossas forças, precisamos orar sem cessar! Como Moisés, devemos manter os braços sempre erguidos até o fim da nossa vida, sem nos deixarmos vencer.
