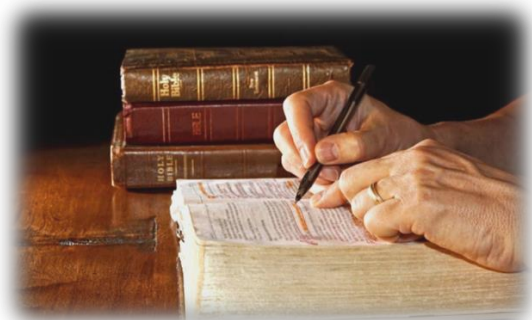

In our world, where most of the celebrities highlighted in the media seem motivated by self-interest and self-assertion Jesus' call to total service seems unrealistic, and one might think, unlikely to succeed. But today's Gospel offers the ideal of dedication to the service of others as fundamental to Christian discipleship. Jesus came "not to be served, but to serve" and this example must always be a guiding light for his followers. He went about doing good, bringing justice, healing, forgiveness and kindness into people's lives. This is why those who believe in Him are challenged to give themselves, their talents and their time, to the service of others without seeking any other reward than knowing that this is supremely worthwhile. In practice what can we learn from our Lord's life and actions? He clearly said that He came to do the Father's will, and this thought stayed with Him, even when it led to suffering and a cruel death. Normally, we discover our duty and God's will for us, not in world-changing plans or in heroic ideals but in the ordinary tasks of each day. At home or in the office, or the school or other workplace, or wherever the activity of the moment calls us, we try to be aware of duty and a sense of dedication. Whenever we work in a slipshod manner, or fail to offer the needed helping hand, we fall below our personal call to service. What a change it would make, if there was a widespread return to this spirit, with regard to people's daily work. We need to be reminded that in rendering to others the service of a job well done we are imitating the serving Christ and being his fellow-workers in building up the kingdom of God on earth. It is tempting to be selfish with our time and energy. There are so many plausible excuses for excluding ourselves from the work that needs to be done.

### XXIX DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



#### EVANGELIO: SAN MARCOS 10, 42-45

En aquel tiempo, se acercaron a Jesús, Santiago e Juan, los hijos de Zebedeu, y le dijeron: *“Maestro, queremos que nos concedas lo que vamos a pedirte”*. Él les dijo: *“Qué es lo que desean?”* Le respondieron: *“Concede que nos sentemos uno a tu derecha y otro a tu izquierda, cuando estés en tu gloria”*. Jesús les replicó: *“No saben lo que piden. Podrán pasar la prueba que yo voy a pasar y recibir el bautismo con que seré bautizado?”* Le respondieron: *“Sí podemos”*. Y Jesús les dijo: *“Ciertamente pasarán la prueba que yo voy a pasar y recibirán el bautismo con que yo seré bautizado, pero eso de sentarse a mi derecha o a mi izquierda no me toca a mí concederlo; eso es para quienes está reservado”*. Cuando los otros diez apóstoles oyeron esto, se indignaron contra Santiago y Juan. Jesús reunió entonces a los Doce y les dijo: *“Ya saben que los jefes de las naciones las gobiernan como si fueran sus dueños y los poderosos las oprimen. Pero no debe ser así entre ustedes. Al contrario: el que quiera ser grande entre ustedes, que sea su servidor, y el que quiera ser el primero, que sea el esclavo de todos, así como el Hijo del hombre, que no ha venido a que lo sirvan, sino a servir y a dar su vida por la redención de todos”*.



El evangelio nos ofrece una escena llena de paradojas, en las que se ponen de manifiesto los intereses de sus discípulos y la verdadera meta de Jesús en su caminar hacia Jerusalén. Ha precedido a todo esto el tercer anuncio de la pasión. La intervención de los hijos de Zebedeo no estaría en sintonía con ese anuncio de la pasión. La pretensión de los hijos de Zebedeo indigna y pone furiosos a los otros diez apóstoles que la sienten que la intervención de Santiago y Juan les descarta a ellos para ocupar un puesto de preferencia en el reino de Dios. Pensaban los discípulos que iban a conseguir la grandeza y el poder, como le piden los hijos de Zebedeo: estar a su derecha y a su izquierda, ser ministros o algo así. Incluso están dispuestos, decían, a dar la vida por ello; la copa y el martirio es uno de los símbolos de aceptar la suerte y el sufrimiento y lo que haga falta. Podemos imaginar que los hijos de Zebedeo estaban pensando en una copa o bautismo de gloria, más que de sufrimiento. El verdadero título de grandeza está en servir y dar la vida por los demás.



La figura del Siervo de Yahvé se hace realidad personal y viva en Jesús, quién sufre y entrega su vida como expiación de los pecados de los demás. Este es uno de los textos más claros en los que se pone de manifiesto el valor redentor del sufrimiento, de tal manera que es la Iglesia primitiva, después de lo que sucedió con la muerte y resurrección de Jesús, quien se atrevió a desafiar a la teología oficial del judaísmo y hablar de un Mesías que podía sufrir para salvar a su pueblo. Eso era lo que no admitía el judaísmo y lo que encontró la Iglesia primitiva como la identidad de su Mesías salvador. Cómo podía ser eso que el Mesías no participara de los sufrimientos del pueblo?

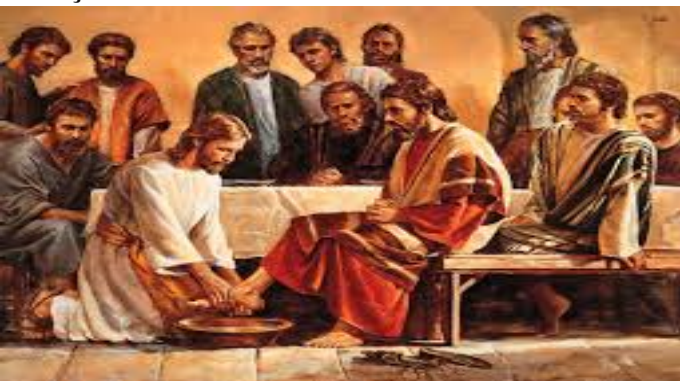

### DOMINGO XXIX DO TEMPO COMUM

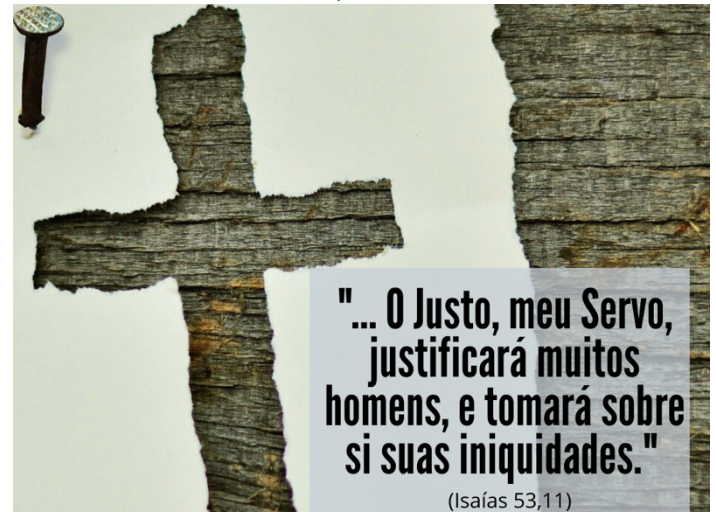


#### EVANGELHO: SÃO MARCOS 10, 35-45

Naquele tempo, Tiago e João, filhos de Zebedeu, aproximaram-se de Jesus e disseram-lhe: *“Mestre, nós queremos que nos faças o que te vamos pedir”*. Jesus respondeu-lhes: *“Que quereis que vos faça?”* Eles responderam: *“Concede-nos que, na tua glória, nos sentemos um à tua direita e outro à tua esquerda”*. Disse-lhes Jesus: *“Não sabeis o que pedis. Podeis beber o cálice que eu vou beber e receber o baptismo com que eu vou ser baptizado?”* Eles responderam: *“Podemos”*. Então Jesus disse-lhes: *“Bebereis o cálice que eu vou beber e sereis baptizados com o baptismo com que eu vou ser baptizado. Mas sentar-se à minha direita ou à minha esquerda não pertence a mim concedê-lo; é para aquele a quem está reservado”*. Os outros dez, ouvindo isto, começaram a indignar-se contra Tiago e João. Jesus chamou-os e disse-lhes: *“Sabeis que os que são considerados como chefes das nações exercem domínio sobre elas e os grandes fazem sentir sobre elas o seu poder. Não deve ser assim entre vós: quem entre vós quiser tornar-se grande, será vosso servo, e quem quiser entre vós ser o primeiro, será escravo de todos, porque o Filho do homem não veio para ser servido, mas para servir e dar a vida pela redenção de todos”*.



Jesus está a caminho de Jerusalém. Jesus anuncia pela terceira vez que será insultado, condenado à morte. Os discípulos demonstram uma incompreensão total das suas palavras. Por mais estranho que possa aparecer, eles estão ainda convencido de que ele vai a Jerusalém realizar as esperanças de todo o povo que espera pela inauguração do reino messiânico, um reino deste mundo. Quando Marcos escreve este trecho do Evangelho, um dos dois irmãos, Tiago, já tinha dado a vida por Cristo, porque tinha sido martirizado em Jerusalém. E o outro estava generosamente empenhado na causa do Evangelho. Já tinham, portanto, demonstrado ter compreendido o ensinamento do Mestre. A reação de indignação dos outros dez apóstolos demonstra bem como também eles estão muito longe de ter assimilado o pensamento do Mestre. Na Igreja não há chefes que mandam e súbditos que obedecem; gente honrada e respeitada, cheia de privilégios, e pessoas com menor dignidade. Todos são irmãos e cada um deve considerar-se sempre ao serviço dos outros. As diversas capacidades e habilitações de cada um não foram dadas por Deus para provocar divisões e para favorecer a competição. Ser grande significa ser o último e o servo de todos, como Cristo fez.
