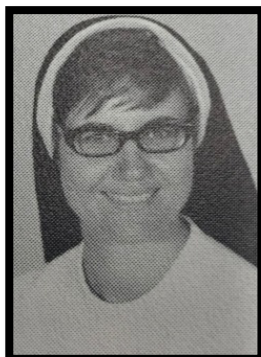
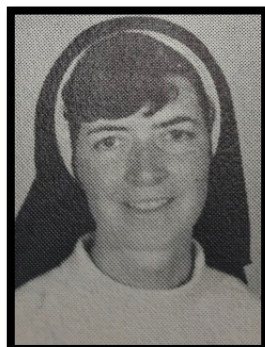
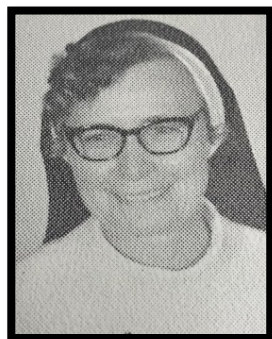
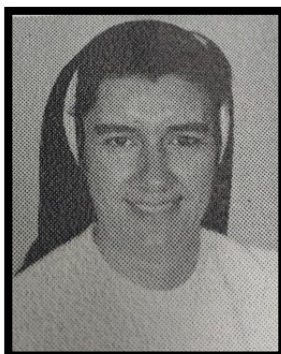
The Sisters of St. Dominic of Amityville

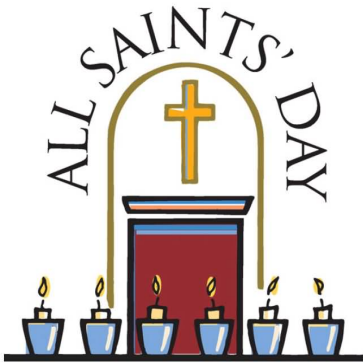

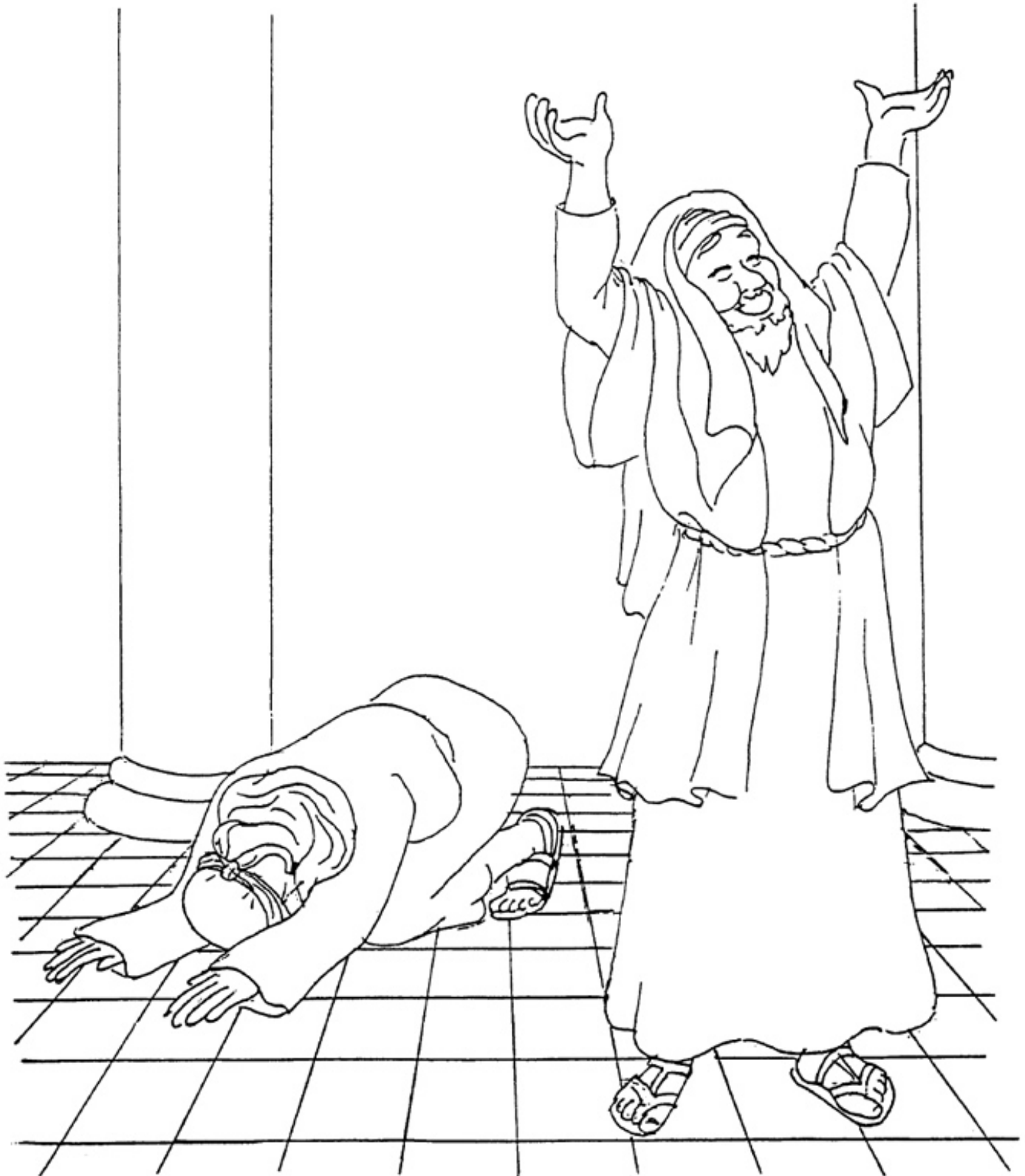


2023 Mass Book

'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' Humility is simply an honest self-appraisal in God's presence, with no pretenses, or masks. In the presence of Almighty God each of us knows ourselves as weak, imperfect and indeed sinful; and we recognize our need for mercy. There is nothing we can offer to blot out our guilt, or pressure we can exert to gain something we do not deserve. Our best recourse is a humble spirit; this attitude will draw down divine mercy and grace upon us. The Publican felt this need for complete honesty.

What's wrong with the outlook of this Pharisee, he leads an admirable life and gives good example within the Jewish tradition. He kept all the rules. But his virtues made him forget that he remained weak and sinful. His sense of "correct behavior" holiness took the place of prayer. He undermines his other virtues by despising others, while giving thanks for his own merits. And by this attitude, it turns him from speaking to God, to talking about himself. This may apply to our church's attitude, towards God and others. In the past, we sometimes took a stance of collective pride towards people of other religions. We continue to value our own beliefs and want to share them with people who are searching for the truth. But we must resist the temptation to look down on outsiders, to disparage their values or under-rate their sincerity? We need to guard against self-righteous Catholicism and respect other pathways of faith. Let God judge the merits of other persons and their faith. Let us trust in his mercy and live with a spirit of compassion.

XXX DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 18, 9-14

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo esta parábola sobre algunos que se tenían por justos y despreciaban a los demás. *“Dos hombres subieron al templo para orar; uno era fariseo y el otro, publicano. El fariseo, erguido, oraba así en su interior: Dios mío, te doy gracias porque no soy como los demás hombres: ladrones, injustos y adúlteros; tampoco soy como ese publicano. Ayuno dos veces por semana y pago el diezmo de todas mis ganancias. El publicano, en cambio, se quedó lejos y no se atrevía a levantar los ojos al cielo. Lo único que hacía era golpearse el pecho, diciendo: Dios mío, apiádate de mí, que soy un pecador. Pues bien, yo les aseguro que éste bajo a su casa justificado y aquél no; porque todo el que se enaltece será humillado y el que se humilla será enaltecido”.*



No es mas que conocida la parábola del fariseo y del publicano. Ambos personajes representan los dos extremos religiosos de la sociedad judía. La parábola, según el primer versículo, va dirigida a algunos que confiaban en sí mismos por considerarse justos y despreciaban a los demás. El fariseo era una buena persona, era un hombre piadoso, cumplía la ley, ayunaba más de lo mandado, sólo él era bueno, su corazón estaba lleno de orgullo y agradece a Dios ser mejor que

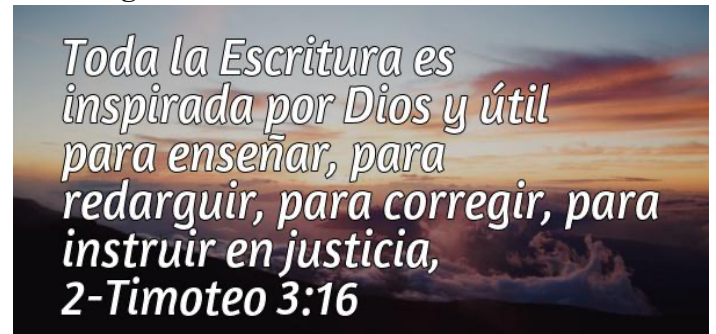
los demás. Su oración es una exaltación de sus buenas cualidades y un desprecio de los demás, especialmente del publicano; considera a Dios y a los demás en función de sí mismo. El publicano, por el contrario, era un hombre vendido a los romanos, enriquecido a base de robar a su propio pueblo, pero se reconocía pecador, necesitado de la misericordia. La oración del publicano es muy diferente a la del fariseo, no se atreve a mirar al cielo por el peso de sus pecados. Siente indigno de estar ante Dios, solo pide su misericordia. Suplicó misericordia y recibió el perdón. Jesús disse que el publicano bajo a su casa justificado, es decir, salió transformado.



En la **1ª Lectura**, se afirma que Dios escucha las súplicas de los pobres y oprimidos:

“La oración del humilde atraviesa las nubes...”

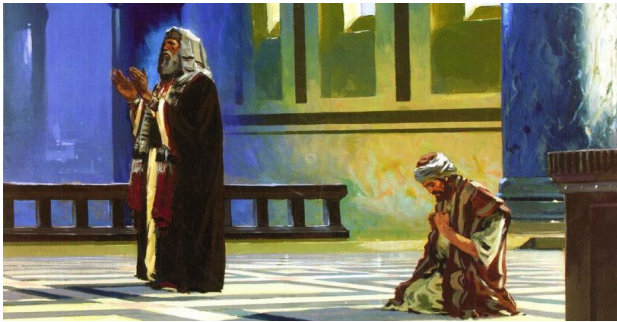
El autor del libro de Ben Sirá informa que Dios no puede ser comprado con actos de culto, por parte de aquellos que practican la injusticia y que esclavizan a los hermanos. La llamada del autor va en el sentido que se cumplan los mandamientos de la Ley y sean respetados los derechos de los pobre y de los débiles. Esa es la verdadera religión que Dios exige del hombre.



En la segunda lectura, tenemos una invitación a vivir el camino cristiano con entusiasmo, con entrega, con ánimo, a ejemplo de San Pablo. Pablo fue un buen ejemplo de la actitud que el Evangelio propone: él confío, no en sus méritos, sino en la misericordia de Dios.

DOMINGO XXX DO TEMPO



EVANGELHO DE SÃO LUCAS 18, 9-14

Naquele tempo, Jesus disse a seguinte parábola para alguns que se consideravam justos e desprezavam os outros: *“Dois homens subiram ao templo para orar; um era fariseu e o outro publicano. O fariseu, de pé, orava assim: Meu Deus, dou-vos graças por não ser como os outros homens, que são ladrões, injustos e adúlteros, nem como este publicano. Jejuo duas vezes por semana e pago o dízimo de todos os meus rendimentos. O publicano ficou a distância e nem sequer se atrevia a erguer os olhos ao céu; mas batia o peito e dizia: Meu Deus, tende compaixão de mim, que sou pecador. Eu vos digo que este desceu justificado para sua casa e o outro não. Porque todo aquele que se exalta será humilhado e quem se humilha será exaltado”*.



A liturgia de hoje está centrada no tema da humildade. Deus é o protetor dos humildes, dos pobres, dos marginalizados. O Evangelho define a atitude correta que o crente deve assumir diante de Deus. O fariseu é apresentado qual modelo de pessoa que se sente segura de si mesma, pois cumpre metodicamente a observância religiosa. O publicano sabe que é pecador e não se arvora

merecedor da misericórdia de Deus. O fariseu não conquista a misericórdia de Deus, pois se julga merecedor dela. Quem pensa poder acumular méritos diante de Deus acaba inevitavelmente por desprezar os outros, por não querer ter nada a ver com os ímpios. Torna-se importante o versículo introdutivo que esclarece a quem é dirigida a parábola. Os destinatários são alguns que se consideravam justos e desprezavam os outros.



A primeira leitura deste domingo nos fala da oração da pessoa humilde. *“A oração do humilde atravessa as nuvens e não descansa enquanto não chega ao seu destino”*. Essa leitura define Deus como um juiz justo, que não se deixa subornar pelas ofertas desses poderosos que praticam injustiças na comunidade; em contrapartida, esse Deus justo ama os humildes e escuta as suas súplicas, pois eles só tinham Deus para os defender da prepotência dos grandes.



Um cristão anônimo, usando o nome de Paulo, escreveu a pedir aos seus irmãos na fé que se mantivessem fiéis à missão que Deus lhes confiou.
