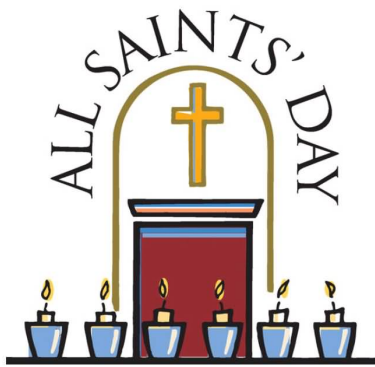

In Mark's Gospel, Bartimaeus, the blind beggar has the courage to beg for healing from Jesus. He is hushed by the crowd but continues to call loudly for Jesus, who hears him and heals him. "Go your way; your faith has saved you."

## XXX DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



### EVANGELIO DE SAN MARCOS 10, 46-52

En aquel tiempo, al salir Jesús de Jericó en compañía de sus discípulos y de mucha gente, un ciego, llamado Bartimeo, se hallaba sentado al borde del camino pidiendo limosna. Al oír que el que pasaba era Jesús Nazareno, comenzó a gritar: *Jesús, hijo de David, ten compasión de mí!* Muchos lo reprendían para que se callara, pero él seguía gritando todavía más fuerte: *Hijo de David, ten compasión de mí!* Jesús se detuvo entonces y dijo: *Llámelo.* Y llamaron al ciego, diciéndole: *¡Animo! Levántate, porque él te llama.* El ciego tiró su manto; de un salto se puso en pie y se acercó a Jesús. Entonces le dijo Jesús: *¿Qué quieres que haga por tí?* El ciego le contestó: *Maestro, que pueda ver.* Jesús le dijo: *Vete; tu fe te ha salvado.* Al momento recobro la vista y comenzó a seguirlo por el camino



En este pasaje Marcos nos presenta al Señor Jesucristo en su último viaje a Jerusalén. Como él mismo había anunciado, su destino era la cruz. Ahora llega a Jericó, a unos 25 kilómetros de Jerusalén, y allí tuvo lugar un incidente que por su

interés, el evangelista lo ha recogido en su relato. El encuentro con el ciego Bartimeo. La gente que rodea al ciego de Jericó intenta acallar el grito del ciego Bartimeo, un grito esperanzador que pide al Mesías, al Hijo de David, que escuche su voz. A pesar de su ceguera, Bartimeo se entera de que por su vida está pasando Jesús. No puede dejar escapar la ocasión y comienza a gritar. Apesar de su falta de visión el ciego reconoce la presencia de Jesús y estima su generosidad y benevolencia. No siente ningún derecho ni reclama para sí otra cosa que la atención del Hijo de David; él espera que su voz llega hasta Él, y que Jesús le conceda una mirada llena de vida y de luz. El grito del ciego fue escuchado por Jesús y se vuelve invitándole a que se acerque. El ciego de un salto se puso en pie y se acercó a Jesús. Su respuesta es no solo inmediata sino entusiasta. Se levanta de un brinco, con toda la fuerza que le da percibir que está a punto de tener el encuentro más significativo de toda su vida. No duda, no pone pretexto, no se toma su tiempo, no quiere perder ni un minuto. ***Jesús, Hijo de David, ten misericordia de mí!*** Era una oración que Jesús no podía dejar pasar sin ser escuchada. Lamó el hombre ciego y lo curó. Te imaginas? Después de tanto tiempo a oscuras, lo primero que pudo contemplar fue la luz del rostro amoroso del Señor, y ya no quiso perderlo de vista nunca más.

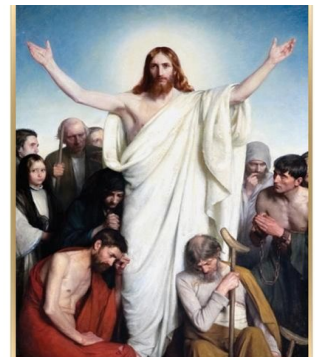
7 Porque así habla el Señor:

Jeremías en la primera lectura de hoy nos cuenta la tragedia que se inició el día del gran destierro. Pero ese no era el final de una etapa, sino curiosamente el inicio de un proceso que acabó con la vuelta, el retorno del exilio de Babilonia, entre cantos y alegrías, celebrando la grandeza de un Dios amoroso. La grandeza de Israel estaba en ser Pueblo de Dios. El Pueblo andaba en tinieblas y necesitaba limpiar sus ojos para ver. Solo llorando podrá el Pueblo limpiar sus ojos y ver que ese castigo no es contrario al designio de su Dios.

### XXX DOMINGO XXX DO TEMPO COMUM



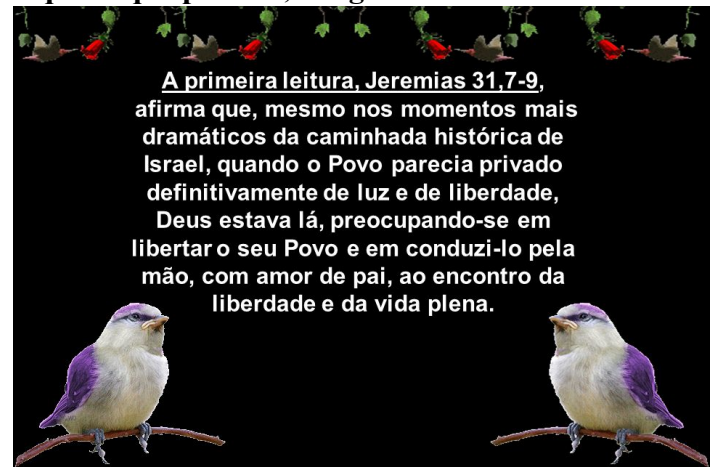
#### EVANGELHO DE SÃO MARCOS 10, 46-52

Naquele tempo, quando Jesus ia a sair de Jericó com os discípulos e uma grande multidão, estava um cego, chamado Bartimeu, filho de Timeu, a pedir esmola à beira do caminho. Ao ouvir dizer que era Jesus de Nazaré que passava, começou a gritar: “Jesus, Filho de David, tem piedade de mim”. Muitos repreendiam-no para que se calasse. Mas ele gritava cada vez mais: “Filho de David, tem piedade de mim”. Jesus parou e disse: “Chamai-o”. Chamaram então o cego e disseram-lhe: “Coragem! Levanta-te, que ele está a chamar-te”. O cego atirou fora a capa, deu um salto e foi ter com Jesus. Jesus perguntou-lhe: “Que queres que eu te faça”? O cego respondeu-lhe: “Mestre, que eu veja”. Jesus disse-lhe: “Vai: a tua fé te salvou”. Logo ele recuperou a vista e seguiu Jesus pelo caminho.



Jesus caminha para Jerusalém onde será preso e condenado. Em sua caminhada da Galiléia para Jerusalém, Jesus procura esclarecer aos seus discípulos que sim, ele é o Messias prometido, mas não o Messias que eles e todo o povo de Israel esperava: um Messias glorioso, um libertador do domínio romano. E na sua caminhada de Jericó

para Jerusalém Jesus tem o encontro com o cego Bartimeu. As pessoas que cercam a Jesus tentam calar os gritos de Bartimeu que pede ao Messias, ao Filho de David, que escute a sua voz. Apesar da sua falta de visão o cego reconhece a presença de Jesus. Não reclama para si outra coisa que a atenção do Filho de David; ele espera que sua voz chegue até Jesus e que Jesus conceda a ele um olhar cheio de vida e de luz. O grito do cego foi ouvido por Jesus que se volta e convida-o para que chegue perto dele. A atitude do cego exprime sua profunda certeza de que Jesus é o seu salvador. Ele crê em Jesus, espera dele a cura para sair da escuridão da cegueira e abrir os olhos para a luz. A resposta de Jesus à pergunta que faz a Bartimeu: *Que queres que eu te faça?* Bartimeu pedia esmola, vivia na miséria toda a sua vida. Ele não pede esmola. Ele pede a cura; ele tem ânsia de ver. E Bartimeu se converte em um seguidor de Jesus. Seguir a Jesus é confiar nele. A atitude do cego Bartimeu é a que Jesus pediu ao jovem rico que cumpria todos os preceitos da lei e não quis aceitar o convite de Jesus: deixar tudo para segui-lo. Bartimeu deixa tudo, até o seu manto, única riqueza que possuía, e segue o Messias.



Na Primeira Leitura deste domingo Jeremias tem um grito de esperança ao povo que está cativo em Babilônia. “Vou trazê-los e reuni-los dos confins do mundo. Entre eles vêm o cego e o coxo...Eles partiram com lágrimas nos olhos e Eu vou trazê-los no meio de consolações. Eu sou um Pai para Israel”.
