November always begins with the Catholic Holy Days of All Saints and All Souls (following “All-Halloween” for fun and safety of our children!). These sacred celebrations remind us of so many men and women of our past who lived out holiness in their humanity. We also recall the souls of our deceased loved ones whom we pray are resting in the peace of paradise.

As we approach the end of 2022, November brings to mind our need to care for our own bodies and souls; especially after surviving nearly three years of the pandemic that has taken so many lives. The Sacrament of the Anointing formerly was called “Extreme Unction”/Last Rites, and was given only to people dying. Priests still offer that gift to those facing death. But more so we anoint people who are sick and suffering; always in the name of Jesus Christ who constantly heals physically and spiritually throughout the Gospels.

We invite all our parishioners who feel the need for this healing Sacrament of anointing: the aged, the infirmed, those with serious medical or addiction issues, those with mental illness and those facing upcoming surgery; are all welcome to receive the Sacrament of the Sick.

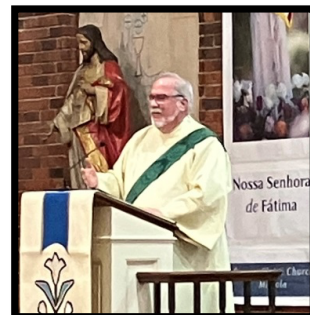

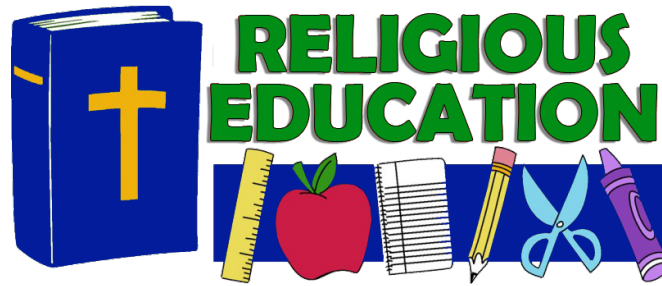

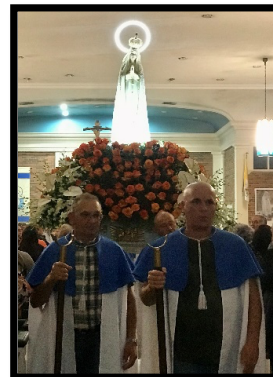

# Español

## XXXI DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



### EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 19, 1-10

En aquel tiempo, Jesús entró en Jericó, y al ir atravesando la ciudad, sucedió que un hombre llamado Zaqueo, jefe de publicanos y rico, trataba de conocer a Jesús; pero la gente se lo impedía, porque Zaqueo era de baja estatura. Entonces corrió y se subió a un árbol para verlo cuando pasara por ahí. Al llegar a ese lugar, Jesús levantó los ojos y le dijo: *“Zaqueo, bájate pronto, porque hoy tengo que hospedar en tu casa”*. Él bajo eseguida y lo recibió muy contento. Al ver esto, comenzaron todos a murmurar diciendo: *“Ha entrado a hospedarse en casa de un pecador”*. Zaqueo, poniéndose de pie, dijo a Jesús: *“Mira, Señor, voy a dar a los pobres la mitad de mis bienes, y si he defraudado a alguien, le restituiré cuan tro veces más”*. Jesús le dijo: *“Hoy ha llegado la savación a esta casa, porque también él es hijo de Abraham, y el Hijo del hombre ha venido a buscar y a salvar lo que se había perdido”*.



En el Evangelio de hoy nos encontramos a un Jesucristo que vuelve a mostrarse como amigo y redentor de los pecadores. Zaqueo es jefe de publicanos en Jericó, trabaja al servicio de Roma, ganándose la vida con una labor económicamente

muy provechosa pero despreciada por su pueblo. Sabiéndose despreciado por su profesión seguramente no quiere entrar en alguna de las casas que Jesucristo visita. Jesús le mira, le llama por su nombre y disse que quiere entrar en su casa. Lo que para Zaqueo es causa de enorme alegría, para otros es motivo de escándalo, a saber que Jesucristo se hospede en la casa de un pecador. Sin que Jesús le diga nada, simplemente por la gratitud que tiene ante la visita inesperada y la influencia de su persona, tiene lugar una transformación del alma del publicano, expresada en el desapego frente a las riquezas. Jesucristo no lo critica ni le acusa de injusticia alguna. Manifestada esa transformación de Zaqueo, Jesús disse: *“Hoy ha llegado la salvación a esta casa...el hijo del hombre ha venido para salvar lo que estaba perdido”*. También Jesucristo está pidiendo hospedarse en nuestra casa. Nos mira a los ojos, nos llama por nuestro nombre y nos dice que quiere venir a habitar en nosotros. Si bajamos del árbol de nuestra soberbia y auto-justificación, si le acogemos con humilde alegría en nuestra vida, se producirá nuestra conversión.



En la primera lectura un sábio de Israel explica la moderación con la que Dios trató a los opresores egipcios. Esa moderación solo tiene una explicación: por amor. Ese Dios omnipotente, que lo creó todo, ama con amor de Padre a cada ser que salió de sus manos, también a los opresores, incluso a los egipcios, porque todos son sus hijos.

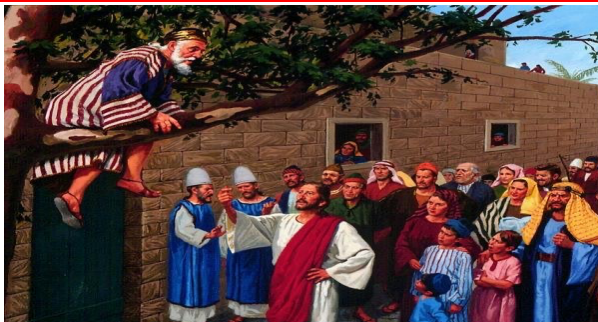
Por lo cual asimismo oramos siempre por vosotros, para que nuestro Dios os tenga por dignos de su llamamiento, y cumpla todo propósito de bondad y toda obra de fe con su poder,

La segunda lectura hace referencia al amor de Dios, poniendo de relieve su papel en la salvación del hombre. Además de eso, alerta a los creyentes para que no se dejen manipular por fantasías de fanáticos que aparecen, a veces perturbando el camino normal del cristiano.

### DOMINGO XXXI DO TEMPO COMUM



#### EVANGELHO DE SÃO LUCAS 19, 1-10

Naquele tempo, Jesus entrou em Jericó e começou a atravessar a cidade. Vivia ali um homem rico chamado Zaqueu, que era chefe de publicanos. Procurava ver quem era Jesus, mas, devido à multidão, não podia vê-lo porque era de pequena estatura. Então correu mais à frente e subiu a um sicómoro para ver Jesus, que havia de passar por ali. Quando Jesus chegou ao local, olhou para cima e disse-lhe: “Zaqueu, desce depressa que eu hoje devo ficar em tua casa”. Ele desceu rapidamente e recebeu Jesus com alegria. Ao verem isto, todos murmuravam, dizendo: Foi hospedar-se em casa dum pecador. Entretanto, Zaqueu apresentou-se ao Senhor, dizendo: “Senhor, vou dar aos pobres metade dos meus bens e, se causei qualquer prejuízo a alguém, restituirei quatro vezes mais”. Disse-lhe Jesus: “Hoje entrou a salvação nesta casa, porque Zaqueu também é filho de Abraão. Com efeito, o Filho do homem veio procurar e salvar o que estava perdido”.



Os publicanos eram considerados por todos uns ladrões e Zaqueu não só é um publicano, mas é o chefe de publicanos. Por uma estranha ironia do destino, Zaqueu significa o *puro*, o *justo*. No entanto ele era um pecador. À entrada da cidade de Jericó Jesus curou um mendigo cego que lhe suplicava: Senhor, que eu veja. A associação destes dois factos não é casual. Tanto o cego como Zaqueu desejam ver. Ambos os relatos se

concluem recordando os efeitos chocantes – a visão nova do mundo e da vida – produzidos pelo encontro com Jesus. No trecho deste evangelho quem procura ver é um publicano rico que se chama Zaqueu. Ele está bem consciente da sua condição. Ele quer ver Jesus porque – pensa ele é talvez a única pessoa que pode entender as suas angústias e o seu drama interior, e para o poder ver sobe a um sicómoro. E o encontro com Jesus transforma a sua vida.



#### 1ª LEITURA

*«De todos Vós compadeceis, porque amais tudo o que existe»*  
Sab 11, 22 - 12, 2

A primeira leitura do Livro da Sabedoria nos recorda que Deus tem olhos diferentes dos nossos. Ele observa com amor toda a criação porque tudo aquilo que existe é obra sua. Se ele castiga não é para destruir o pecador, mas para o recuperar, para o conduzir ao arrependimento. *Vós amais tudo o que existe e não odiáis nada do que fizeste, porque, se odiásseis alguma coisa, não a tivésseis chamado à existência.*



Os cristãos de Tessalónica estão a atravessar um momento bastante difícil: na sua comunidade infiltraram-se alguns visionários que anunciam a iminência do fim do mundo. Para difundirem mais facilmente os seus desvarios, estes pregadores afirmam referir o pensamento de Paulo e, como prova, mostram algumas cartas que juram ter recebido dele. Paulo recomenda aos cristãos de Tessalónica que estejam atentos, que não se deixem influenciar por estes fanáticos.
