Pastor's Notes

It's rather unusual to say "Happy All-Hallows-Eve" on a Sunday; most commonly proclaimed by children as "Happy Halloween" on 31 October! It's also rather obvious in society that the secular holiday of costumes and candy has overshadowed the sacred holy days of saints and souls. Nevertheless, the Church perseveres in prioritizing 1 November as a day we honor all the saints who lead us all to pursue the path of holiness; and 2 November as a day of remembrance and prayer for the souls of our deceased loved ones. Both days are always holy; but this year All Saints on 1 November is not obligatory because it falls on a Monday. Please join us for prayer at Mass on these days; and especially to watch over and protect our youngsters this weekend of having fun!

I wanted to give you a brief update on the "boilers project" that we began last April for both the church and school buildings. We started with the essential asbestos removal, and proceeded to replace the ancient/original boilers that were running on their last legs. The new systems are hi-tech with built-in back-up mechanisms, so we should never be without heat. Unfortunately, we have been affected by the global supply chain crisis; resulting in some increased expenses, as well as a time-line extension from 3/4 months, to now 7/8 months for completion. Pray that it all works well, when we start up this first week of November!

Thank you for supporting our once-a-year parish fall fundraiser, by sending in your donations and raffle tickets (drawing three winners, \$1,500, \$1,000, \$500, on 28 November). Additional tickets can be purchased in the church office, and soon we will be selling them in the lobby after weekend Masses. The funds will go toward repairing and/or replacing the exterior slate roof covering the church and offices which is original from 51 years ago. Obviously, we are having leaks in the ceiling that you can see from the interior; especially when the rains are heavy. Like the boilers, a new roof (not slate again!) will go into the hundreds of thousands of dollars. But between your constant generosity, and the parish investment portfolio, our parish finance committee will meet this week to discuss how we might best fund this new project. I give gratitude to God every day for the privilege of serving as your Pastor!

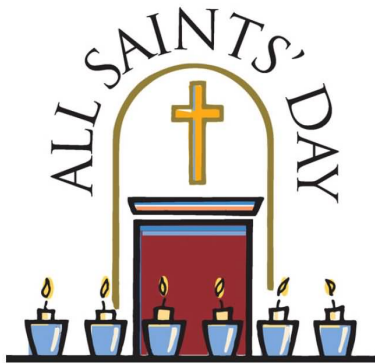

XXXI DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN MARCOS 12, 28-34

En aquel tiempo, uno de los escribas se acercó a Jesús y le preguntó: “*Cuál es el primero de todos los mandamientos*”? Jesús le respondió: “*El primero es: Escucha, Israel, el Señor, nuestro Dios, es el único Señor; amarás al Señor tu Dios, con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma, con toda tu mente y con todas tus fuerzas. El segundo es éste: Amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo. No hay ningún mandamiento mayor que éstos*”. El escriba replicó: “*Muy bien, Maestro. Tienes razón cuando dices que el Señor es único y que no hay otro fuera de él, y que amarlo con todo el corazón, con toda el alma, con todas las fuerzas, y amar al prójimo como a uno mismo, vale más que todos los holocaustos y sacrificios*”. Jesús, viendo que había hablado muy sensatamente, le dijo: “*No estás lejos del Reino de Dios*”. Y ya nadie se atrevió a hacerle más preguntas.

«Y amarás al Señor tu Dios con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma, con toda tu mente y con todas tus fuerzas»

Terminado el camino a Jerusalén, Jesús afronta las preguntas de los dirigentes judíos. Los letrados en tiempos de Jesús estimaban de tal grado la Ley que acabaron proponiéndola como el fin último hasta el punto de que la observancia minuciosa de la Ley acabó con la generosidad de la Alianza

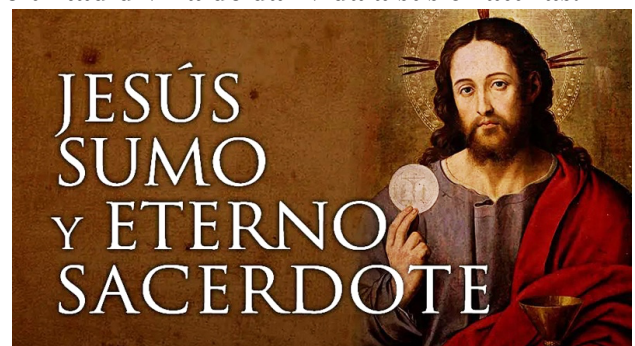
para la cual la Ley era una de las condiciones pero no su último fin. Los judíos tenían 613 mandamientos. La Alianza era la oferta generosa de Dios para su pueblo. San Marcos presenta al escriba entusiasmado con la respuesta de Jesús y luego añade que Jesús valora la sensatez del escriba a quien considera cerca del Reino de Dios. Es quizás uno de los pocos lugares donde el evangelio habla favorablemente de los escribas. La razón está en que ha aceptado el nuevo mensaje que Jesús introduce en la lectura de la Ley mosaica: amar a Dios y amar al prójimo vale más que todos los holocaustos y sacrificios.

En la **1ª lectura**, MOISÉS invita al pueblo a guardar los **MANDAMIENTOS**:



"Escucha la voz del Señor, tu Dios, guardando sus preceptos y mandatos".

La Alianza era esa declaración de amor que se formula en la clásica expresión: Yo seré tu Dios y tú serás Mi Pueblo. La Alianza es la garantía de que Dios está a nuestro favor, de que está atento a nuestras necesidades y siempre dispuesto a ayudarnos sin obligarnos a nada: sólo requiere que realicemos la Alianza, que seamos fieles a la condición de Pueblo suyo, elegido para realizar el designio salvífico, para llevar a feliz término la voluntad divina de dar vida a sus criaturas.



“Hermanos: Durante la antigua alianza hubo muchos sacerdotes, porque la muerte les impedía permanecer en su oficio. En cambio, Jesús tiene un sacerdocio eterno, porque él permanece para siempre.”(Carta a los Hebreos 7, 23)

DOMINGO XXXI DO TEMPO COMUM



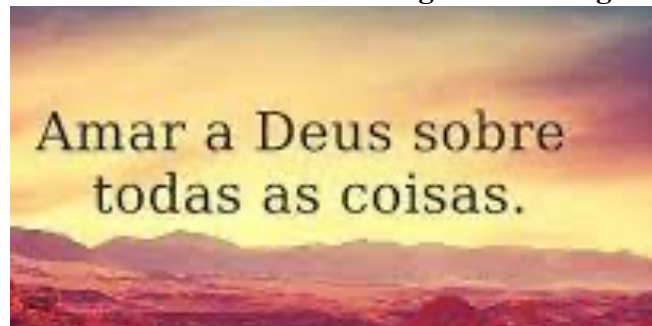
EVANGELHO DE SÃO MARCOS 12, 28b-34

Naquele tempo, aproximou-se de Jesus um escriba e perguntou-lhe: *“Qual é o primeiro de todos os mandamentos?”* Jesus respondeu: *“O primeiro é este: Escutai, Israel: O Senhor nosso Deus é o único Senhor. Amarás o Senhor teu Deus com todo o teu coração, com toda a tua alma, com todo o teu entendimento com todas as tuas forças. O segundo é este: Amarás o teu próximo como a ti mesmo. Não há nenhum mandamento maior que este”*. Disse-lhe o escriba: *“Muito bem, Mestre! Tens razão quando dizes: Deus é o único e não há outro além dele. Amá-lo com todo o coração, com toda a inteligência e com todas as forças, e amar o próximo como a si mesmo, vale mais do que todos os holocaustos e sacrifícios”*. Ao ver que o escriba dera uma resposta inteligente, Jesus disse-lhe: *“Não estás longe do reino de Deus”*. E ninguém mais se atrevia a interroga-lo



Jesus encontra-se em Jerusalém há três dias. Expulsara os vendilhões do lugar santo e, com o seu gesto, tinha feito com que o conflito com a autoridade religiosa se agravasse. Os sumos sacerdotes, os escribas e os anciãos estudam a maneira de o apanhar em alguma coisa, fazendo-lhe perguntas e medindo meticulosamente as suas palavras com a intenção de descobrir algum passo em falso de maneira a poderem acusá-lo e eliminá-

lo. O evangelho deste domingo coloca-se neste contexto polémico. Estudando a bíblia, os rabinos tinham conseguido arranjar 613 mandamentos. Discutia-se se era possível resumi-los e reduzi-los um pouco ao essencial. Muitos mestres defendiam que o mais importante dos mandamentos era a observância do sábado. Qual é a posição de Jesus sobre este assunto tão debatido? Os dois mandamentos de que Jesus fala no evangelho de Marcos, na realidade, não se podem separar, porque são a manifestação dum único amor. Só nos podemos aproximar de Deus quando amamos. Só uma vida vivida por amor tem sentido e vale a pena. O amor, que tem origem em Deus e se estende a todos os homens, é a síntese de todos os mandamentos. Esta é a mensagem do Evangelho.



A Primeira Leitura deste domingo é uma introdução ao Evangelho. Desde o dia em que o Senhor entregou a lei de Moisés no monte Sinai, Israel considerou-se o depositário da sabedoria e da inteligência. Ainda hoje, na oração da manhã, todos os judeus louvam o Senhor com estas palavras: *“Bendito seiais Vós, Senhor, que nos escolheste de entre todas as nações e nos destes a vossa Lei”*.
