November always begins with the Catholic Holy Days of All Saints and All Souls (following “All-Halloween” for fun and safety of our children!). These sacred celebrations remind us of so many men and women of our past who lived out holiness in their humanity. We also recall the souls of our deceased loved ones whom we pray are resting in the peace of paradise.

As we approach the end of 2022, November brings to mind our need to care for our own bodies and souls; especially after surviving nearly three years of the pandemic that has taken so many lives. The Sacrament of the Anointing formerly was called “Extreme Unction”/Last Rites, and was given only to people dying. Priests still offer that gift to those facing death. But more so we anoint people who are sick and suffering; always in the name of Jesus Christ who constantly heals physically and spiritually throughout the Gospels.

We invite all our parishioners who feel the need for this healing Sacrament of anointing: the aged, the infirmed, those with serious medical or addiction issues, those with mental illness and those facing upcoming surgery; all are welcome to receive the Sacrament of the Sick.

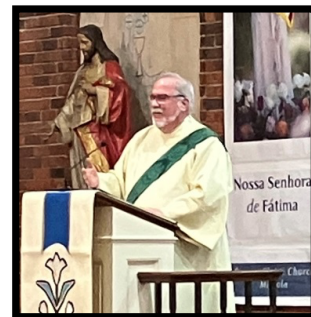
May God continue to bless you, your staff and the parish.

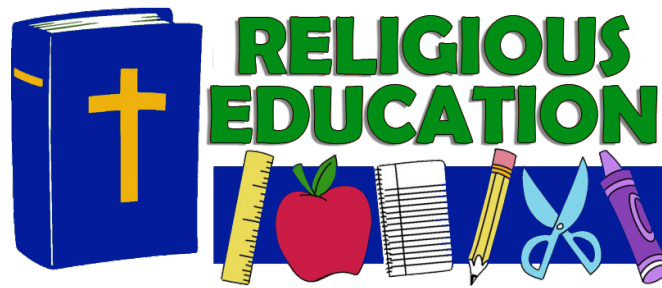

XXXII DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 20, 27-38

En aquel tiempo, se acercaron de Jesús algunos saduceos. Como los saduceos niegan la resurrección de los muertos, le preguntaron: *“Maestro, Moisés nos dejó escrito que si alguno tiene un hermano casado que muere sin haber teido hijos, se case con la viuda para dar descendencia a su hermano. Hubo una vez siete hermanos, e mayor de los cuales se casó y murió sin dejar hijos. El segundo, el tercero y los demás, hasta el séptimo tomaron por esposa a la viuda y todos murieron sin dejar sucesión. Por fin murió también la viuda. Ahora bien, cuando llegue la resurrección, de cual de ellos será esposa la mujer,, pues los siete estuvieron casados con ella”?* Jesús les dijo: *“En esta vida, hombres y mujeres se casan, pero en la vida futura, los que sean juzgados dignos de ella y de la resurrección de los muertos, no se casarán ni podrán ya morir, porque serán como ángeles e hijos de Dios, pues él los habrá resucitado. Y que los muertos resucitan, el mismo Moisés lo indica en el episodio de la zarza, cuando llama al Señor, Dios de Abraham, Dios de Isaac, Dios de Jacob. Porque Dios no es Dios de muertos, sino de vivos, pues para él todos viven”.*



En el evangelio de este día es donde encontramos una de las páginas magistrales de lo que Jesús pensaba sobre esas ultimidades de la vida. La vida después de la muerte es uno de los grandes

interrogantes que atraviesan la historia humana. Con sufrimiento experimentamos la muerte, pero, al no tener evidencia de la vida resucitada, sentimos angustia ante la existencia que llegará a su fin. Solo Dios, que nos regala ese don, tiene una palabra sobre la misma. Jesús, respondiendo a los saduceos que negaban la aresurrección de los muertos, se apoya en lo que constituye el núcleo de la revelación bíblica del Antiguo Testamento: el vínculo de amistad que Dios estableció con los patriarcas, un vínculo tan fuerte que ni siquiera la muerte puede romper.



La primera lectura, del libro de los Macabeos, nos cuenta la historia del martirio de una familia piadosa judia del siglo II antes de Cristo. Que no consintió en renunciar a sus tradiciones religiosas de comer algo impuro y someterse a la mentalidade pagana de los griegos. Es una de las epopeyas religiosas en que e descubre que, cuando se da la vida por algo, siempre se hace porque se considera que la vida aqui en la tierra no lo es todo, que deber haber otra vida. Esta creencia le costó mucho descubrirla al pueblo de Dios. Durante muho tiempo se creia en Dios, pero no fue fácil dar un paso hacia la afirmación de que ese Dios nos ha creado para la vida y no para la muerte.



La segunda lectura nos ofrece un texto de consolación. El autor se apoya en que Dios es fiel y nunca falta a sus promesas; si Él ha prometido la vida, debemos vivir con esa esperanza espléndida.

DOMINGO XXXII DO TEMPO COMUM

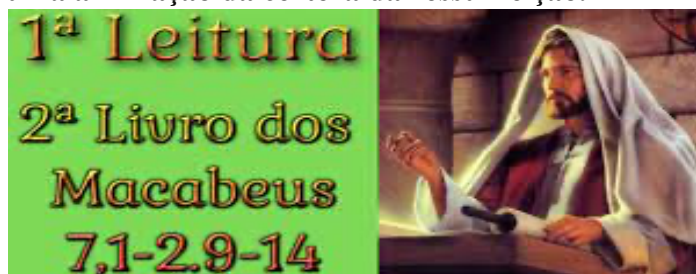


EVANGELHO DE SÃO LUCAS 20, 27-38

Naquele tempo, aproximaram-se de Jesus alguns saduceus – que negam a ressurreição – e fizeram-lhe a seguinte pergunta: *“Mestre, Moisés deixou-nos escrito: Se morrer a alguém um irmão, que deixe mulher, mas sem filhos, esse homem deve casar com a viúva, para dar descendência a seu irmão. Ora havia sete irmãos. O primeiro casou-se e morreu sem filhos. O segundo e depois o terceiro desposaram a viúva, e o mesmo sucedeu aos sete, que morreram e não deixaram filhos. Por fim morreu também a mulher. De qual destes será ela esposa na ressurreição, uma vez que os sete a tiveram por mulher?”* Disse-lhes Jesus: *“Os filhos deste mundo casam-se e dão-se em casamento. Mas aqueles que forem dignos de tomar parte na vida futura e na ressurreição dos mortos, nem se casam nem se dão em casamento. Na verdade, já não podem morrer, pois são como os Anjos, e, porque nasceram da ressurreição, são filhos de Deus. E que os mortos ressuscitam, até Moisés o deu a entender no episódio da sarça ardente, quando chama ao Senhor o Deus de Abraão, o Deus de Isaac e o Deus de Jacob. Não é um Deus de mortos, mas de vivos, porque para ele todos estão vivos”.*



O evangelho de hoje introduz um novo grupo do qual até agora não se tinha falado no Evangelho de Lucas, os saduceus. Deles sabemos que constituíam a classe dos ricos, que colaboravam com o governo romano, que não gozavam de boa consideração por parte do povo. Os chefes dos sacerdotes (que serão os principais responsáveis pela morte de Jesus) pertenciam todos a esta seita. Enquanto os fariseus aceitavam a ressurreição dos mortos, os saduceus defendiam que na Torah não há nenhuma referência a este assunto. Com o dinheiro de que dispunham, podiam gozar o Paraíso neste mundo e não experimentavam nenhuma necessidade de sonhar um outro no além. A primeira parte da resposta de Jesus aos saduceus afirma que a ressurreição não é uma simples continuação da vida que vivemos nesse mundo. A segunda parte da resposta de Jesus é uma afirmação da certeza da ressurreição.



O martírio dos sete irmãos e de sua mãe, mostra a fortaleza diante do sofrimento e a certeza que vale mais perder a vida e ter a ressurreição que desobedecer uma lei de Deus. É uma proclamação da vida eterna.



Na primeira parte da segunda leitura, Paulo pede ao Senhor que confirme os corações de todos nesta boa disposição. Na segunda parte, convida os Tessalonicenses a rezar para que a Palavra de Deus, que já produziu muitas transformações no meio deles, se propague e seja conhecida por toda a gente.
