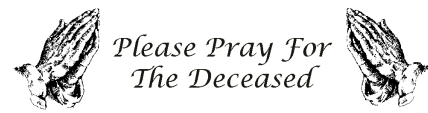

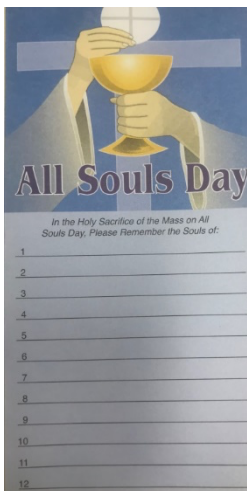

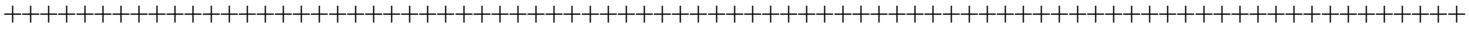
ROSARY ALTAR SOCIETY

In the upcoming Year of Mercy we could look at how we are practicing the Christian virtue of mercy? Statistics quote about trends in the Church: the drop-off in sacramental practice and Mass attendance, vocations, and the difficulty of involving young people. Then comes the question: Is Catholicism in decline in the developed world? If we define “decline” by irregular attendance in Church and the ignoring of hierarchical authority, the answer must be Yes. This challenges all of us, priests and people alike: How to make our Church a more welcoming place, where people who have drifted away would feel more welcomed and understood.

But there is another side to practicing the faith. Today’s Scripture tells of a poor widow who showed mercy in the form of practical compassion, by sharing her last crust with the prophet Elijah. Was she practicing the faith? Very much so, yes, because she did what Jesus expects of us . *I was hungry and you.. If you give a cup of water in my name ..* Then that other poor woman in the Temple, who quietly put in her last savings so that God would be properly worshipped, was she practicing the faith, through a work of mercy? Yes, she followed the generous impulse of her heart. Whoever gives whole-heartedly of himself/herself to a worthy cause is following the example of Jesus, whether they are aware of it or not. They have the blessing of God and are promised their reward.

We need to make sure that our idea of “practicing Catholic” includes these vital qualities of compassion and generosity. Indeed, sharing in the Mass and the sacraments is only genuine if it prompts us to loving mercy of this kind. We also need our Church leaders to engage with us in open dialogue on sensitive points of sacramental discipline which many church members perceive as arbitrary impositions by authority, rather than as life-values arising from the spirit of the Gospel.

XXXII DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO: SAN MARCOS 12, 38-44

En aquel tiempo, enseñaba Jesús a la multitud y le decía: “¡Cuidado con los escribas! Les encanta pasearse con amplios ropajes y recibir reverencias en las calles; buscan los asientos de honor en las sinagogas y los primeros puestos en los banquetes; se echan sobre los bienes de las viudas haciendo ostentación de largos rezos. Estos recibirán un castigo muy riguroso”.

En una ocasión Jesús estaba sentado frente a las alcancías del templo, mirando cómo la gente echaba allí sus monedas. Muchos ricos daban en abundancia. En esto, se acercó una viuda pobre y echó dos moneditas de muy poco valor. Llamando entonces a sus discípulos, Jesús les dijo: “Yo les aseguro que esa pobre viuda ha echado en la alcancía más que todos. Porque los demás han echado de lo que les sobraba; pero ésta, en su pobreza, ha echado todo lo que tenía para vivir”.



Las palabras de Jesús contra los escribas que buscan los primeros puestos es probablemente una advertencia independiente, pero que se entiende en nuestro texto con la narración que describe la acción de la viuda. Jesús, en el Templo, está mirando a las personas que llegan para dar culto a Dios. ¿Está Jesús a favor o en contra del culto? No! No está Jesús contra el culto. Jesús está proponiendo el culto de la vida, del corazón, ya que aquella viuda pobre ha echado en el arca del tesoro lo que necesitaba para

vivir. Jesús va más allá de una religión vacía y sin sentido; va más allá de un culto sin corazón, o de una religión sin fe, que es tan frecuente. La viuda pobre entrega en aquellas monedas su vida misma. Ese es el verdadero culto a Dios en el templo de la vida, en el servicio a los demás. La viuda ofrece una religión con fe, con confianza en Dios. Marcos enseña que la generosidad sincera y basada en la fe es una virtud, y que la injusticia puede ser encubierta por mecanismos que parecen piadosos. Jesús denuncia la corrupción de los escribas, quienes se aprovechan de su posición privilegiada para despojar a las viudas.



La primera lectura es del 1 Reyes 17, 10-16. El Profeta Elías lucha contra los falsos dioses y los cultos cananeos que se prodigaban en territorio de Israel. El marco en que aparece este relato es una sequía que estaba a punto de matar de hambre a los habitantes del pueblo. El profeta Elías llega en la aldea de Sarepta, fuera del territorio del pueblo elegido. El profeta pide pan a una pobre viuda que está a punto de hacer pan para ella y su hijo, aunque cree que no sobrevivirán. Ella comparte con Elías el poco que tiene y Dios va a recompensar su generosidad. Le dice el profeta: “La tinaja de harina no se vaciará, la vasija de aceite no se agotará”. El relato pone de manifiesto que Dios no abandonará a sus hijos. Los pobres siempre son más generosos para compartir que los que gozan de todo.

También Cristo fue ofrecido en sacrificio una sola vez para quitar los pecados de muchos; y aparecerá por segunda vez, ya no para cargar con pecado alguno, sino para traer salvación a quienes lo esperan.

La segunda lectura es de la Carta a los Hebreos 9, 24-28

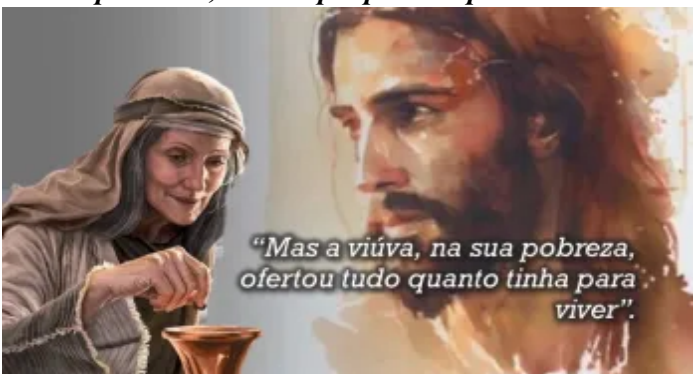

DOMINGO XXXII DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO: SÃO MARCOS 12, 38-44

Naquele tempo, Jesus ensinava a multidão, dizendo: *“Acautelai-vos dos escribas que gostam de exhibir longas vestes, de receber cumprimentos nas praças, de ocupar os primeiros assentos nas sinagogas e os primeiros lugares nos banquetes. Devoram as casas das viúvas com pretextos de fazerem longas rezas. Estes receberão uma sentença mais severa”*. Jesus sentou-se em frente da arca do tesouro a observar como a multidão deitava o dinheiro na caixa. Muitos ricos deitavam quantias avultadas. Veio uma pobre viúva e deitou duas pequenas moedas, isto é, um quadrante. Jesus chamou os discípulos e disse-lhes: *“Em verdade vos digo. Esta pobre viúva deitou na caixa mais do que todos os outros. Eles deitaram do que lhes sobrava, mas ela, na sua pobreza, ofereceu tudo o que tinha, tudo o que possuía para viver”*.



O Evangelho de hoje divide-se em duas partes. A primeira apresenta-nos o juízo que Jesus faz das pessoas mais respeitadas da sociedade judaica do seu tempo: os escribas. A segunda refere-se ao exemplo duma atitude oposta: o gesto generoso duma pobre viúva. A condenação do Mestre contra os escribas. Eles eram os que interpretavam com autoridade a Lei de Deus e julgavam nos tribunais os que não a observavam. Jesus condena a sua vaidade, sua ambição, a sua pretensão de serem superiores aos outros. Não era só o pecado de vaidade que Jesus condena nos escribas. Eles eram réus duma culpa ainda mais grave. Exploravam os pobres, os que não podiam defender-se. Jesus elogia a humildade da viúva, e apresenta a viúva como um exemplo para os seus discípulos, apesar de ela não conhecer Jesus e não ser seu discípulo. Ela fez o seu gesto sem chamar a atenção de ninguém. Não há ninguém tão pobre que não tenha nada para compartilhar.



O rei Acab persegue o Profeta Elias e responsabiliza o profeta pela falta de chuva e pela calamidade que atingia o povo. Elias, fugindo da perseguição, chega à cidade de Sarepta, onde uma viúva pobre comparte com o profeta o pouco que ela tem. Deus recompensa a viúva. Não lhe faltará o azeite e a farinha durante a tragédia que enfrenta o povo. Deus protege os pobres e abençoa os que repartem os seus bens.
