Dear Friends and Family of Corpus Christi Church,

This year of 2025 culminates the ongoing “National Eucharistic Revival” in every Roman Catholic Church throughout our country. The front facade of Corpus Christi Church is finally finished with the beautiful mosaic of the “monstrance” holding the Most Blessed Sacrament. But more importantly inside the church, the real presence of our Risen Lord Jesus in the Eucharist is the source and summit of everything we are and all that we do as Catholics. As your Pastor, I pray that our weekly hours of Adoration (Mondays, 8:00-9:00 AM; Wednesdays, 1:00-2:00 PM; Thursday, 7:00-8:00 PM) will continue to grow with your personal prayers & presence in worship of Christ Jesus.

Autumn is always the traditional time for our once-a-year parish fundraiser, by way of the four raffle tickets we are sending to each home. They are \$25 each, which will go toward the cost of purchasing two new doors leading into the Rectory offices. The current doors are wooden, and have been in place for more than 40 years. So clearly, they are deteriorating. Any additional funds that we raise will go towards needed improvements in the two large bathrooms in the lower hall of the Church. There will be three cash prizes (\$1,500, \$1,000, \$500) to be drawn on Sunday 23 November at the end of the 11:30 AM Mass, celebrating the Solemnity of Christ the King!







XXXIII DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 21, 5-19

En aquel tiempo, como algunos ponderaban la solidez de la construcción del templo y la belleza de las ofrendas votivas que lo adornaban, Jesús dijo: *"Días vendrán en que no quedará piedra sobre piedra de todo esto que están admirando; todo será destruido".* Entonces le preguntaron: *"Maestro, ¿cuándo va a ocurrir esto y cuál será la señal de que ya está a punto de suceder?"* Él les respondió: *"Cuidense de que nadie los engañe, porque muchos vendrán usurpando mi nombre y dirán: 'Yo soy el Mesías. El tiempo ha llegado'. Pero no les hagan caso. Cuando oigan hablar de guerras y revoluciones, que no los domine el pánico, porque eso tiene que acontecer, pero todavía no es el fin".* Luego les dijo: *"Se levantará una nación contra otra y un reino contra otro. En diferentes lugares habrá grandes terremotos, epidemias y hambre, y aparecerán en el cielo señales prodigiosas y terribles. Pero antes de todo esto los perseguirán a ustedes y los apresarán; los llevarán a los tribunales y a la cárcel, y los harán comparecer ante reyes y gobernadores, por causa mía. Con esto darán testimonio de mí. Grábense bien que no tienen que preparar de antemano su defensa, porque yo les daré palabras sabias, a las que no podrá resistir ni contradecir ningún adversario de ustedes. Los traicionarán hasta sus propios padres, hermanos, parientes y amigos. Matarán a algunos de ustedes y todos los odiarán por causa mía. Sin embargo, no caerá ningún cabello de la cabeza de ustedes. Si se mantienen firmes, conseguirán la vida".*



El texto del evangelio de Lucas corresponde a lo que se ha llamado el discurso escatológico de Jesús que aparece en los tres evangelios sinópticos, aunque con visiones diferentes entre uno y otro. El de Lucas es el más explícito en cuanto a corregir los abusos de algunos que se presentaban en Jerusalén o en cualquier comunidad para decir que llegaba el día del Señor, el fin del mundo, para que les siguieran a ellos. Con la destrucción de Jerusalén no llegó el fin del mundo, ni del judaísmo siquiera. Los judíos pensaban que el día que el templo fuera destruido desaparecería el pueblo de Israel. ¡No fue así! Porque sin templo, una religión puede tener mucho sentido. Es seguro que Jesús nunca se definió por un fin del mundo y de la historia con la llegada del reinado de Dios. No era un iluso, aunque fuera un "profeta" escatológico. Pero con ello hay que entender que algo nuevo y "definitivo" estaba surgiendo con su llamada a la conversión y a buscar a Dios con toda el alma y todo el corazón. Los cristianos deben saber que estarán en conflicto con los que dominan en el mundo. En el caso de Lucas, el discurso prepara a los cristianos, no para el fin del mundo, sino para estar dispuestos a la persecución y a la lucha si en verdad son fieles al mensaje de profeta de Galilea. Por ello hay que mantenerse "vigilantes", pero no por catástrofes apocalípticas, sino porque el reinado de Dios es una instancia crítica que no puede aceptar en muchas ambientes de este mundo.




La primera lectura, del profeta Malaquías, es un texto que se centra en un término consagrado de la teología profética del Antiguo Testamento: el día de Yahvé, el día de la actuación de Dios. Para aquella mentalidad se trataba de presentar el final de la historia. Y son obvias sus afirmaciones: para los que han vivido arrogantemente, en la injusticia, en la ceguera del poder y la corrupción, será su final. Pero los que han vivido según el proyecto de Dios no tienen por qué temer. Es lógico pensar que alguien tiene que denunciar a los arrogantes y soberbios que un día todo eso se acabará; en ese sentido los mensajes apocalípticos tienen mucho de profético. Es, a veces, el grito reivindicativo de los que han soportado la injusticia y el oprobio.

DOMINGO XXXIII DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO DE SÃO LUCAS 24, 5-19

Naquele tempo, comentavam alguns que o templo estava ornado com belas pedras e piedosas ofertas. Jesus disse-lhes: «Dias virão em que, de tudo o que estais a ver, não ficará pedra sobre pedra: tudo será destruído». Eles perguntaram-lhe: «Mestre, quando sucederá isso? Que sinal haverá de que está para acontecer?» Jesus respondeu: «Tende cuidado; não vos deixeis enganar, pois muitos virão em meu nome e dirão: “sou eu”; e ainda: “O tempo está próximo”. Não os sigais. Quando ouvirdes falar de guerras e revoltas, não vos alarmeis: é preciso que estas coisas aconteçam primeiro, mas não será logo o fim». Disse-lhes ainda: «Há de erguer-se povo e reino contra reino. Haverá grandes terremotos e, em diversos lugares, fomes e epidemias. Haverá fenómenos espantosos e grandes sinais no céu. Mas antes de tudo isto, deitar-vos-ão as mãos e hão de perseguir-vos, entregando-vos às sinagogas e às prisões, conduzindo-vos à presença de reis e governadores, por causa do meu nome. Assim tereis ocasião de dar testemunho. Tende presente em vossos corações que não deveis preparar a vossa defesa. Eu vos darei língua e sabedoria a que nenhum dos vossos adversários poderá resistir ou contradizer. Sereis entregues até pelos vossos pais, irmãos, parentes e amigos. Causarão a morte a alguns de vós e todos vos odiarão por causa do meu nome; mas nenhum cabelo da vossa cabeça se perderá. Pela vossa perseverança salvareis as vossas almas.



O Evangelho do trigésimo terceiro domingo comum situa-nos em Jerusalém, num dos dias que precedem a prisão, condenação e morte de Jesus na cruz. O programa de Jesus, nestes dias, é sempre igual: de manhã dirige-se ao templo e passa aí o dia, “a ensinar”; ao final da tarde sai da cidade, atravessa o vale do Cedron e vai até ao Monte das Oliveiras, onde passa a noite (cf. Lc 21,37). Esses dias também vão ser marcados por diversas controvérsias entre Jesus e os líderes judaicos. Tudo começa com os comentários “de alguns” sobre a beleza e a riqueza do templo de Jerusalém (cf. Lc 21,5). O templo era, na verdade, uma construção magnífica. Em resposta aos comentários sobre a grandiosidade e a beleza do templo, Jesus avisa que, um dia, toda essa construção desaparecerá (cf. Lc 21,6). Muito impressionados, os interlocutores de Jesus pedem-lhe explicações: quando será isso (cf. Lc 21,7)? Em resposta, Jesus deixa-lhes uma longa instrução que é conhecida como o “discurso escatológico” (cf. Lc 21,8-38). Na versão do evangelista Lucas, o “discurso escatológico” de Jesus refere três momentos, ou temas, da história futura: a destruição de Jerusalém (que veio a concretizar-se no ano 70, quando as tropas romanas sob o comando de Tito tomaram Jerusalém e destruíram o templo), as vicissitudes que os discípulos irão enfrentar ao longo do seu caminho histórico e, por fim, a vinda definitiva do Filho do Homem. A finalidade de Lucas, ao oferecer-nos o “discurso escatológico de Jesus”, não é tanto descrever os acontecimentos da história futura dos homens, mas sim transmitir aos crentes – aos crentes da década de oitenta do primeiro século e aos crentes de todas as épocas – a força para viverem o seu compromisso com Jesus no meio das dificuldades, incompreensões e perseguições que a história os obrigará a enfrentar.



Na primeira leitura, um “enviado de Deus” anuncia a uma comunidade desanimada que, ao contrário do que dizem alguns cétricos, Javé não abandonou o seu Povo nem deixou o mal assumir as rédeas da história dos homens. No tempo oportuno Deus vai atuar, vai limpar o mundo, vai derrotar as forças da opressão e da morte que privam os homens de vida.
