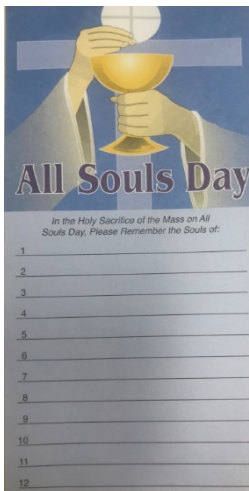

Our vision of the end of life should not sink us in pessimism, or despair at our sinfulness. But the question is: How ready are we? Our faith tells us that some generation in history will experience the second coming of Christ. Even if ours is not the generation to see the second coming, still each of us must face our personal day of death. For some it comes unexpectedly, out of the blue. For others it will be fairly predictable and follow the more natural course of aging and decline. Regardless, there will be a time when each must ask the question: "Am I ready? Am I prepared? Meanwhile, we are faced with multiple choices to make each day which may seem insignificant; but they all add up pointing us in particular directions, sometimes good, sometimes less so. Are our everyday decisions helping to make us ready?

"In those days after that tribulation the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from the sky, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. "And then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in the clouds' with great power and glory, and then he will send out the angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the end of the earth to the end of the sky.

We prefer to ignore our mortality and put off our preparation for the death which we all must face. How do we prepare ourselves? How do we get ready? How will we be sure that the Lord recognizes us? What are the right choices to make during our day? The end of chapter 25 reads: "Then the king will say to those on his right, Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink,... Although we do not know the day or the hour of the second coming of Christ, Although we do not know the day or the hour of our own deaths, we have been told what staying awake entails. It seems that if we meet the response from the Lord: "Amen, I say to you, I do not know you, it will be because of our foolishness and not because of a lack of mercy or justice on the part of the Lord.

XXXIII DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO: SAN MARCOS 13, 24-32

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: *“Cuando lleguen aquellos días, después de la gran tribulación, la luz del sol se apagará, no brillará la luna, caerán del cielo las estrellas y el universo entero se conmoverá. Entonces verán venir al Hijo de hombre sobre las nubes con gran poder y majestad. Y él enviará a sus ángeles para congregar a sus elegidos desde los cuatro puntos cardinales y desde lo más profundo de la tierra a lo más alto del cielo. Entiendan esto con el ejemplo de la higuera. Cuando las ramas se ponen tiernas y brotan las hojas, ustedes saben que el verano está cerca. Así también, cuando vean ustedes que suceden estas cosas, sepan que el fin ya está cerca, ya está a la puerta. En verdad que no pasará esta generación sin que todo esto se cumpla. Podrán dejar de existir el cielo y la tierra, pero mis palabras no dejarán de cumplirse. Nadie conoce el día ni la hora. Ni los ángeles del cielo ni el Hijo; solamente el Padre”.*



El evangelio de hoy forma parte del discurso apocalíptico de Marcos con que se cierra la actividad de Jesús, antes de entrar en la pasión. Tenemos que reconocer que este texto de Marcos se presta a

muchas interpretaciones. Se reconoce que no es propiamente de Jesús, sino de los cristianos que, ante una crisis, de guerra, de persecución, escribieron este texto. Pusieron palabras de Jesús que se mantenían en la tradición para tratar de afrontar los problemas que se presentaban para judíos y cristinos. El cristianismo primitivo estuvo muy influenciado por la corriente apocalíptica. El discurso de Marcos está construido sobre palabras de Daniel en lo que se refiere a venida del Hijo del Hombre.



La primera lectura del libro de Daniel nos introduce a un contexto que habla del final de los tiempos, de los tiempo escatológicos. En nuestra lectura de hoy, Miguel (quién como Dios?), el protector del pueblo según aquella mentalidad, vendrá para proclamar salvación y resurrección para los elegidos. Es en este libro donde aparece por primera vez la resurrección y la vida más allá de la muerte en la fe de Israel. En esta lectura apocalíptica hay un mensaje de esperanza y salvación.



La segunda lectura nos ofrece el último texto de la carta a los Hebreos en este ciclo que está a punto de terminar. Se vuelve a insistir en la diferencia entre el sacerdocio y los sacrificios de la antigua Alianza y el sacerdocio y sacrificio de Cristo.

DOMINGO XXXIII DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO: SÃO MARCOS 13, 24-32

Naquele tempo, disse Jesus aos seus discípulos: “Naqueles dias, depois de uma grande aflição, o sol escurecerá e a lua não dará a sua claridade; as estrelas cairão do céu e as forças que há nos céus serão abaladas. Então, hão-de ver o Filho do homem vir sobre as nuvens, com grande poder e glória. Ele mandará os Anjos, para reunir os seus eleitos dos quatro pontos cardeais, da extremidade da terra à extremidade do céu. Aprendei a parábola da figueira: quando os seus ramos ficam tenros e brotam as folhas, sabeis que o Verão está próximo. Assim também, quando virdes acontecer estas coisas, sabeis que o Filho do homem está perto, está mesmo à porta. Em verdade vos digo: Não passará esta geração sem que tudo isto aconteça. Passará o céu e a terra, mas as minhas palavras não passarão. Quanto a esse dia e a essa hora, ninguém os conhece: nem os Anjos do Céu, nem o Filho; só o Pai”.



"Ele reunirá os eleitos de Deus, de uma extremidade à outra da terra". Marcos 13,24-32

Liturgicamente estamos chegando ao ponto final do ano. Quando Marcos escreve este capítulo do seu Evangelho, as comunidades cristãs vivem agitadas e em terror por causa das guerras, calamidades e carestias que agitam o mundo. Os cristãos são perseguidos, são vítimas de opressão, são torturados e condenados à morte. E entre eles há discórdias e divisões. A estes cristãos tentados a deixar cair os braços, Marcos recorda as palavras de Jesus: O Filho do homem não permitirá que sejam dispersos. Congregá-los-á não para o juízo, mas para a

salvação. Jesus assegura-nos que, num futuro sem data marcada, o mundo velho do egoísmo e do pecado vai cair e que, em seu lugar, Deus vai fazer surgir um mundo novo, de vida e de felicidade sem fim. Aos seus discípulos, Jesus pede que vivam atentos aos sinais que anunciam essa nova realidade. O ano que vai findar é a imagem da vida que precipita para sua conclusão. A exortação de Jesus não tem um tempo limitado de validade. Seu valor é eterno, como eternas são todas as palavras de Jesus. Elas não passarão, embora tudo o mais perca seu valor. Assim, é absolutamente certa a vinda do Filho do homem e a necessidade de manter-se vigilante e preparado para acolhê-lo.



O livro de Daniel pertence ao conjunto de livros chamados apocalípticos. Apocalíptico é um escrito em que os ensinamentos são transmitidos mediante imagens misteriosas. Para apresentar, por exemplo, os graves problemas dum povo ou duma nação, o autor apocalíptico serve-se de figuras de animais, de lutas entre monstros, de convulsões das forças da natureza; utiliza simbolicamente os números, as cores, os tipos de vestes dos vários personagens. Esta linguagem a nós parece-nos estranha, mas no tempo de Jesus era muito comum e os próprios evangelhos recorrem a ela com bastante frequência.
