HOW WILL YOU GET INVOLVED?

1. The Background:

- **January 22, 1973:** Roe v Wade decision of the Supreme Court ushered in the era of abortion on demand in the United States.
- **2018:** Mississippi passed a law protecting unborn children after 15 weeks of gestation, when the baby has a heartbeat, eyes that open, ears that hear, and can move and kick. The law was challenged and the case, known as Dobbs v Jackson Women's Health Organization, is being heard by the Supreme Court.
- **Dobbs v Jackson** is a landmark case that could potentially overturn the decision of Roe v Wade. The possibility for future laws protecting the unborn hangs in the balance.
- **December 1, 2021** oral arguments for the case will be heard. A decision is expected in June 2022.

2. Our Response:

- **People of every faith** are coming together in a united effort to pray and fast for this intention in the coming months. www.prayfordobbs.com
- **For the past 49 years**, the infamous date of January 22 has been one of solemn prayer and remembrance for the tragedy of legalized abortion in this country.
- **In these next crucial 9 months**, from October until June let us make the 22nd of each month a special day of prayer and fasting for the Dobbs case, in the hopes that on its 50th anniversary (Jan 22, 2023) Roe v Wade will have been finally overturned.

3. Ideas for your Parish or Family:

- **Encourage** your pastor to celebrate the "Mass for Giving Thanks to God for the Gift of Human Life" at all the daily Masses in your parish on the 22nd of each month.
- **Host** a special Mass, Rosary, or Holy Hour for Life on the 22nd of each month. www.lifeofficenyc.org
- **Limit yourself** to one meal and two smaller meals on that day, or fast from social media, videos, music or something else you like on the 22nd.
- **Pray** the rosary together with your family or a group of friends for this intention.

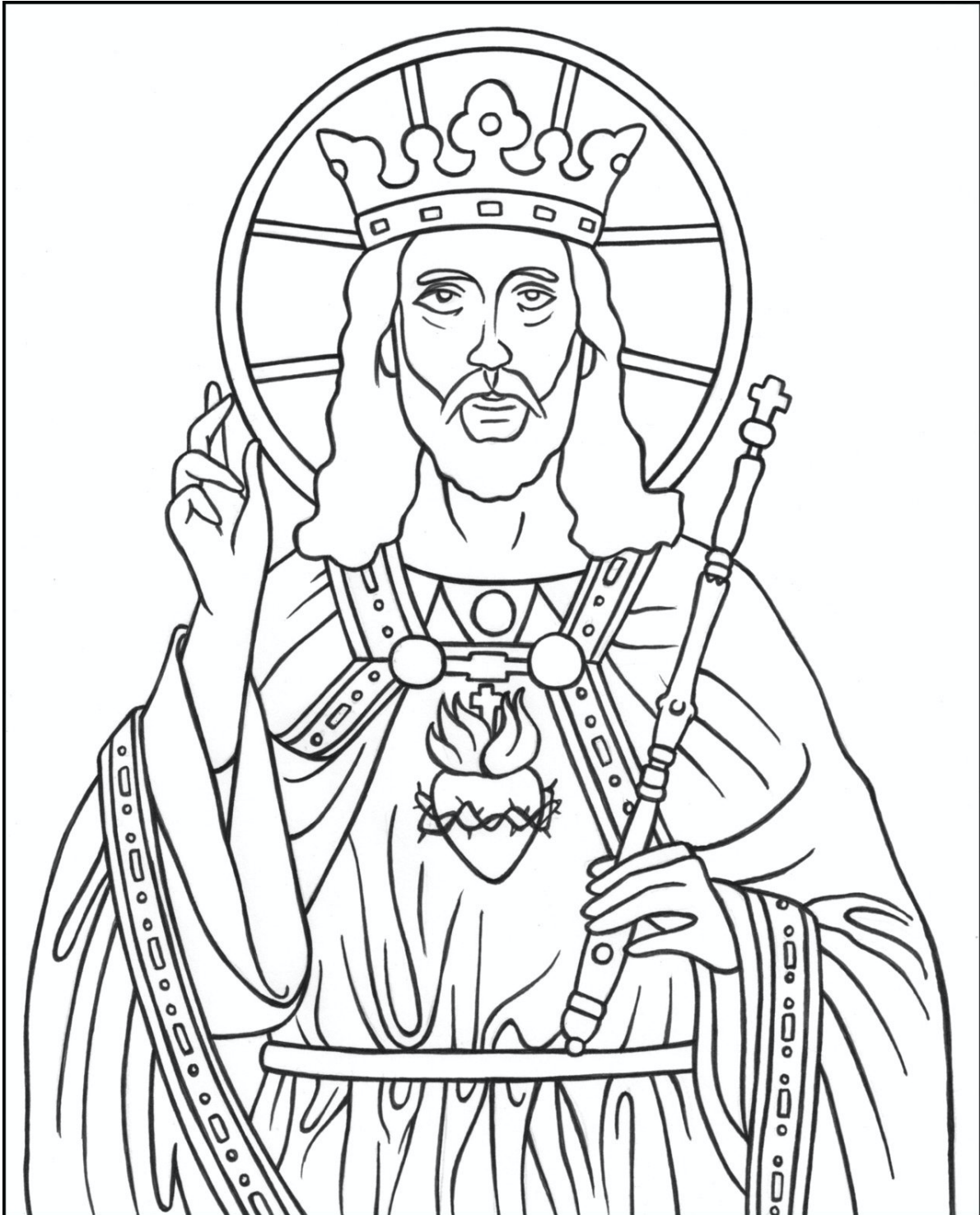

NUESTRO SEÑOR JESUCRISTO REY DEL UNIVERSO



EVANGELIO DE SAN JUAN 18, 33-37

En aquel tiempo, preguntó Pilato a Jesús: *“Eres tú el rey de los judíos?”* Jesús le contestó: *“Eso lo preguntas por tu cuenta o te lo han dicho otros?”* Pilato le respondió: *“Acaso soy yo judío? Tu Pueblo y los sumos sacerdotes te han entregado a mí. Qué es lo que has hecho?”* Jesús le contestó: *“Mi Reino no es de este mundo. Si mi Reino fuera de este mundo, mis servidores habrían luchado para que no cayera yo en manos de los judíos. Pero mi Reino no es de aquí”.* Pilato le dijo: *“Conque tú eres rey?”* Jesús le constestó: *“Tú lo has dicho. Soy rei. Yo nací y viene al mundo para ser testigo de la verdade. Todo el que es de la verdade, escucha mi voz”.*



Jesús no es el restaurador del reino de David tal como esperaban algunos de sus contemporáneos. Y que ciertamente hubiese inquietado a Pilato. Lo que preocupa a Pilato es saber si Jesús es verdaderamente un rival de su autoridad que pretende usurparle la que él ejerce sobre los judíos por orden de Roma. Cristo es rey, pero su reino no es de este mundo. Él ha venido a este mundo para dar testimonio de esa realidad trascendente que es la Verdad. Su presencia en el mundo significa que el Reino de Dios tiene que hacer en la tierra; que aunque Dios se la confió al ser humano para que la

cuidase y cultivase ese poder humano está sometido al poder de Dios. Esa es la verdad que Jesús viene a enseñar al mundo y lo hace sometiéndose voluntariamente a un poder que ni sabe ni puede condenarle de verdad. La fiesta de Cristo Rey es la celebración de esa manifestación gloriosa en la que el poder de Dios se declara real en la historia, el día en que la realeza como expresión de todo poder humano sirvió a causa de la humanidad. Un Cristo Rey que no condena a sus súbditos, sino que con la condena que le infiere uno de ellos por afirmar su realeza, les libera del dominio de la mentira.



En la segunda lectura de este domingo, el libro del Apocalipsis de San Juan, presenta a Dios como el Alfa y la Omega, el que es, el que era y el que ha de venir, el todo-poderoso. El Alfa y la Omega son la primera y última letras del antiguo alfabeto griego. Como tales representan el principio y el fin y son, por lo tanto, un símbolo y representación de Dios y de Jesucristo dentro de la tradición Cristiana. La interpretación cristiana de esta afirmación es que Dios es eterno. El Alfa y la Omega han sido un símbolo cristiano desde los tiempos de los primeros cristianos. Ya en las catacumbas romanas pueden encontrarse inscripciones que contienen este símbolo.

"MIRABA YO EN LA VISIÓN DE LA NOCHE, Y HE AQUÍ CON LAS NUBES DEL CIELO VENÍA UNO COMO UN HIJO DE HOMBRE, QUE VINO HASTA EL ANCIANO DE DÍAS, Y LE HICIERON ACERCARSE DELANTE DE ÉL. Y LE FUE DADO DOMINIO, GLORIA Y REINO, PARA QUE TODOS LOS PUEBLOS, NACIONES Y LENGUAS LE SIRVIERAN; SU DOMINIO ES DOMINIO ETERNO, QUE NUNCA PASARÁ, Y SU REINO UNO QUE NO SERÁ DESTRUIDO."

La primera lectura de hoy nos presenta la visión del profeta Daniel. En ella Daniel describe la realeza de Jesucristo.

NOSSO SENHOR JESUS CRISTO REI DO UNIVERSO



EVANGELHO DE SÃO JOÃO 18, 33b-37

Naquele tempo, disse Pilatos a Jesus: *“Tu és o Rei dos Judeus?”* Jesus respondeu-lhe: *“É por ti que o dizes, ou foram outros que to disseram de mim?”* Disse-lhe Pilatos: *“Porventura eu sou judeu? O teu povo e os sumos sacerdotes é que te entregaram a mim. Que fizeste?”* Jesus respondeu: *“O meu reino não é deste mundo. Se o meu reino fosse deste mundo, os meus guardas lutariam para que eu não fosse entregue aos judeus. Mas o meu reino não é daqui”.* Disse-lhe Pilatos: *“Então, tu és Rei?”* Jesus respondeu-lhe: *“É como dizes: sou Rei. Por isso nasci e vim ao mundo, a fim de dar testemunho da verdade. Todo aquele que é da verdade escuta a minha voz”.*



O Evangelho de hoje descreve com precisão a cena. Jesus encontra-se nas mãos das autoridades romanas, está só, desarmado e não tem soldados que o possam defender. É um prisioneiro abandonado até pelos amigos, é esbofeteado e ridicularizado. Não pode certamente pôr em perigo o poder de Roma. Não há qualquer possibilidade de equívoco. Agora, que está vencido, proclama solenemente: **EU SOU REI.** Pilatos só conhece os reinos deste mundo, aqueles em que os chefes são fortes, dominadores, comandam e têm súbditos submissos e obedientes.

Não consegue compreender do que é que Jesus está a falar. Mas o Mestre dá-lhe uma ajuda: O meu reino não é deste mundo. A festa de Cristo Rei pode facilmente ser compreendida de modo equívoco, pode inclusivamente indicar o contrário daquilo que, na realidade, significa. É importante esclarecer que a realeza de Cristo é exatamente o oposto da deste mundo. Para os homens, reino indica domínio, glória e triunfo. Para Cristo, o seu reinado é de paz e de justiça, de vida e de verdade, e nos compromete a todos para que assumamos nossa missão de sermos seus discípulos.

“... Seu domínio é um domínio eterno que não acabará, e seu reino jamais será destruído.”

Daniel 7:14

A primeira leitura deste domingo nos apresenta a visão do profeta Daniel. Ela anuncia que Deus vai intervir no mundo, a fim de eliminar a crueldade, a ambição, a violência, a opressão que marcam a história dos reinos humanos. Através de um *Filho de Homem* que vai aparecer sobre as nuvens, Deus vai devolver à história a sua dimensão de humanidade, possibilitando que os homens sejam livres e vivam na paz e na tranquilidade. Os cristãos verão nesse *Filho de Homem* victorioso um anúncio da realeza de Jesus.



A Segunda Leitura deste domingo, do livro do Apocalipse, lembra aos cristãos uma verdade central da sua fé: Jesus Cristo é o príncipe dos reis da terra. Os chefes das nações estão convencidos de serem os árbitros dos destinos dos povos, mas, em vez disso, há um soberano superior a eles: Jesus Cristo.
