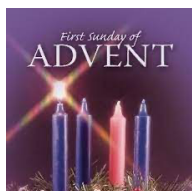

DOMINGO I DE ADVIENTO



EVANGELIO SEGUN SAN MATEO 24, 37-44

En aquel tiempo dijo Jesús a sus discípulos: *“Cuando se manifieste el Hijo del hombre, sucederá lo mismo que en tiempos de Noé. En los días anteriores al diluvio, la gente comía y bebía, hombres y mujeres se casaban hasta el día en que Noé entró en el arca; y cuando menos lo esperaban llegó el diluvio y se llevó a todos; lo mismo sucederá cuando venga el Hijo del hombre. Dos hombres estarán en el campo: a uno se lo llevarán y a otro lo dejarán; dos mujeres estarán moliendo: a una se llevarán y a otra la dejarán. Estén pues atentos, porque no sabem qué día vendrá su Señor. Entiendan bien que si supiera el dueño de la casa a qué hora de la noche viene el ladrón estaría en vela y no dejaría asaltar su casa”*.

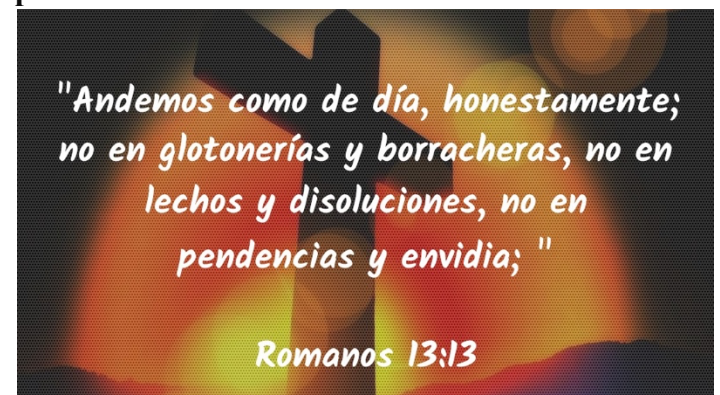


Para Mateo, la venida del Señor es cuerta, aunque nadie sepa el día ni la hora. A los creyentes les corresponde estar vigilantes, preparados y activos. Para transmitir este mensaje, Mateo utiliza tres escenas. La primera es la escena de la humanidad en la época de Noé: los hombres vivían preocupados únicamente por vivir su vida sin compromiso; cuando el diluvi llegó, les pilló por sorpresa y sin estar preparados. Si el vivir la vida al máximo es para el hombre la prioridad fundamental, se arriesga a pasar de largo ante lo que es importante y no cumplir su papel en mundo. La segunda escena pone ante nosotros dos

situaciones de la vida cotidiana: el trabajo agrícola y la molienda del trigo. Los compromisos y trabajos necesarios para la subsistencia del hombre tampoco puede ocuparle de tal forma que le lleven a olvidar lo fundamental: la preparación de la venida del Señor. La tercera escena nos pone frente al ejemplo del dueño de una casa que se duerme y deja que su casa sea saqueada por el ladrón. Los creyentes no pueden, nunca, dormirse, pues su sueño puede llevarlos a perder la oportunidad de descubrir al Señor que viene. El creyente ideal es aquel que está siempre vigilante, atento, preparado para acoger al Señor que viene.



La primera lectura del libro de Isaías invita a los hombres, a todos los hombres, de todas las razas y naciones, a dirigirse a la montaña donde habita el Señor. Del encuentro con el Señor y con su Palabra surgirá un mundo de concordia, de armonía, de paz sin fin.



La segunda lectura de la carta de Pablo a los Romanos recomienda a los creyentes que despierten del letargo en el que están inmersos, en el mundo de las tinieblas (el mundo del egoísmo, de la injusticia, de la mentira, del pecado), que se vistan de luz (la vida de Dios, que Cristo ofreció a todos) y que caminen, con alegría y esperanza, al encuentro de Jesús, a encuentro de la salvación.

DOMINGO I DO ADVENTO



Naquele tempo, disse Jesus aos seus discípulos: “Como aconteceu nos dias de Noé, assim sucederá na vinda do Filho do homem. Nos dias que precederam o dilúvio, comiam e bebiam, casavam e davam em casamento, até ao dia em que Noé entrou na arca; e não deram por nada, até que veio o dilúvio, que a todos levou. Assim será também na vinda do Filho do homem. Então, de dois que estiverem no campo, um será tomado e outro deixado; de duas mulheres que estiverem a moer com a mó, uma será tomada e outra deixada. Portanto vigiai, porque não sabeis em que dia virá o vosso Senhor. Compreendei isto; se o dono da casa soubesse a que horas da noite virá o ladrão, estaria vigilante e não deixaria arrombar a sua casa. Por isso, estai vós também preparados, porque na hora em que menos pensais, virá o Filho do homem”.



Iniciamos o tempo do Advento que significa chegada e, com ele, a preparação para celebrar o Natal de Jesus mais uma vez. O Advento é marcado pela esperança alegre no cumprimento das promessas de Deus, que vem ao nosso encontro como salvador. Este tempo recorda-nos a fidelidade de Deus, que não abandona o seu povo e cumpre suas promessas de salvação. O Advento, no entanto, tem uma segunda dimensão importante: este tempo litúrgico nos coloca diante da promessa de Jesus, que um dia virá gloriosamente para julgar os vivos e os mortos e para inaugurar o reino definitivo. No Evangelho, Jesus ensina que a sua vinda gloriosa será

surpreendente e ninguém sabe quando isso acontecerá. O que importa, é estar sempre vigilantes e preparados. Este tempo refere-se à primeira vinda (chegada) do Salvador, que recordamos cheios de alegria e gratidão. E anuncia a segunda vinda do Salvador, para a qual ainda nos preparamos. Esta segunda vinda acontecerá para cada um, individualmente, na hora da morte. E um dia, no futuro de Deus, acontecerá gloriosamente e definitivamente.



Na primeira leitura deste domingo o profeta Isaías anuncia os dias do Messias e do seu reino como tempos de paz completa e de superação de todos os males, quando todos se deixarão guiar pela luz de Deus. Na visão do profeta, o monte do Senhor (o monte do Templo) eleva-se e transforma-se no centro do mundo. De todas as partes do mundo vêm-se convergir caravanas de povos e de nações que avançam ao encontro do Senhor. Este é o reverso de Babel. Na história da torre de Babel os homens escolheram o confronto com Deus, o orgulho e a autossuficiência; e isso conduziu à divisão, ao conflito à confusão, à falta de entendimento, à dispersão... Agora os homens escolheram escutar Deus e seguir os caminhos indicados por Ele; o resultado é a reunião de todos os povos, o entendimento, a harmonia, a paz universal.

A noite está quase acabando; o dia logo vem. Portanto, deixemos de lado as obras das trevas e (...)

Na segunda leitura da Carta de Paulo aos Romanos, ele fala do tempo que passa depressa, e convida os fiéis a deixarem de lado toda forma indigna de viver.
