Dear Friends and Family of Corpus Christi Church,

This year of 2025 culminates the ongoing “National Eucharistic Revival” in every Roman Catholic Church throughout our country. The front facade of Corpus Christi Church is finally finished with the beautiful mosaic of the “monstrance” holding the Most Blessed Sacrament. But more importantly inside the church, the real presence of our Risen Lord Jesus in the Eucharist is the source and summit of everything we are and all that we do as Catholics. As your Pastor, I pray that our weekly hours of Adoration (Mondays, 8:00-9:00 AM; Wednesdays, 1:00-2:00 PM; Thursday, 7:00-8:00 PM) will continue to grow with your personal prayers & presence in worship of Christ Jesus.

Autumn is always the traditional time for our once-a-year parish fundraiser, by way of the four raffle tickets we are sending to each home. They are \$25 each, which will go toward the cost of purchasing two new doors leading into the Rectory offices. The current doors are wooden, and have been in place for more than 40 years. So clearly, they are deteriorating. Any additional funds that we raise will go towards needed improvements in the two large bathrooms in the lower hall of the Church. There will be three cash prizes (\$1,500, \$1,000, \$500) to be drawn on Sunday 23 November at the end of the 11:30 AM Mass, celebrating the Solemnity of Christ the King!

We give gratitude to God for your faithful giving to our parish; most importantly by your presence and prayers. But also we are thankful for your weekly support of Corpus Christi, and the financial assistance we need to operate on a balanced budget as best as possible. Please return the raffle ticket stubs and donations to the rectory by mail, in person, or in the collection baskets.







CONMEMORACIÓN DE TODOS LOS FIELES DIFUNTOS



EVANGELIO SEGÚN SAN JUAN 6,37-40

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a la multitud: Todo aquel que e da el Padre viene hacia mí; y al que viene a mí yo no lo echaré fuera, porque he bajado del cielo, no para hacer mi voluntad, sino la voluntad del que me envió. Y la voluntad del que me envió es que yo no pierda nada de lo que él me ha dado, sino que lo resucite en el último día. La voluntad de mi Padre consiste en que todo el que vea al Hijo y crea en él, tenga vida eterna y yo lo resucite en el último día.



El evangelio de hoy se centra en la promesa de Jesús de no rechazar a nadie que venga a Él y en la voluntad del Padre, que es que todos los que crean en el Hijo tengan vida eterna y sean resucitados en el último día. Estos versículos transmiten seguridad para los creyentes, pues Jesús garantiza que no perderá a ninguno de los que le fueron dados por el Padre y que la fe en Él es el camino hacia la vida eterna y la resurrección. El resultado de creer en Jesús y ver al Hijo es la vida eterna. Esta vida no se limita al presente sino que se extiende hasta el día de la resurrección, cuando Jesús resucitará a los creyentes. La fe en el Hijo y la creencia

en Él son condiciones necesarias para recibir la promesa de vida eterna.



La primera lectura es del Libro de la Sabiduría. La reflexión sobre el pasaje se centra en la perspectiva de la fe ante el sufrimiento y la muerte. Destaca que las almas de los justos están seguras en manos de Dios, a pesar de que los insensatos las consideren destruidas. La verdadera prueba del justo no es el sufrimiento físico, que es temporal, sino la perseverancia en la fe, lo que garantiza una recompensa eterna. Las almas de los justos están en las manos de Dios y no están sujetas a ningún tormento, contradiciendo la idea popular de que la muerte es una desgracia. El sufrimiento que soportan los justos es visto por Dios como una prueba para forjar su carácter y hacerlos dignos de Él. A pesar de los sufrimientos en la vida terrenal, los justos tienen la esperanza de la inmortalidad. Este pasaje invita a los creyentes a no temer a las dificultades y al sufrimiento, sino a verlos como una oportunidad de crecimiento espiritual y como una prueba de su fe.



La Segunda lectura de este domingo es de la carta de san Pablo a los Romanos 6, 3-9. La reflexión se centra en la unión del creyente con Cristo a través del bautismo, que simboliza una muerte al pecado y un renacimiento a una nueva vida. Pablo explica que, al identificarnos con la muerte de Cristo, se destruye el poder del pecado. Por lo tanto, quienes han muerto con Cristo pueden estar seguros de que también vivirán con él, ya que la muerte ya no tiene dominio sobre quien ha resucitado y vive para Dios.

COMEMORAÇÃO DE TOOS OS FIÉIS DEFUNTOS



EVANGELHO DE SÃO MATEUS 11, 25-30

Naquele tempo, Jesus exclamou: Eu te bendigo, ó Pai, Senhor do céu e da terra, porque escondeste estas verdades aos sábios e inteligentes e as revelastes aos pequeninos. Sim, Pai, eu Te bendigo, porque assim foi do teu agrado. Tudo me foi dado por meu Pai. Ninguém conhece o Filho senão o Pai e ninguém conhece o Pai senão o Filho e aquele a quem o Filho o quiser revelar. Vinde a mim, todos os que andas cansados e oprimidos, e eu vos aliviarei. Tomai sobre vós o meu jugo e aprendei de mim, que sou manso e humilde de coração, e encontrareis descanso para as vossas almas. Porque o meu jugo é suave e a minha carga é leve.



Somos mortais, nossa vida é preciosa, mas frágil, e todos morreremos um dia. O dia dos fiéis defuntos nos coloca diante desse fato da vida e nos faz refletir. Se não podemos escapar da morte, como nos posicionamos diante dela? A fé cristã oferece um sentido à vida e à morte. Não é que os cristãos fiquem livres de angústia e medo diante da morte: até Jesus sentiu angústia e pavor diante da morte. Mas os cristãos podem contar com uma luz, que os ajuda a superar a angústia e o medo diante da morte a partir de uma grande certeza: Deus vive e fará viver também a todos os que se aproximam dele e creem nele. Deus não nos fez existir para depois, nos aniquilar, mas para nos dar vida em plenitude. A revelação divina, na Sagrada Escritura,

sobretudo nas palavras de Jesus Cristo, nos dá a firme certeza de que Deus tem mais vida para nos dar além da via neste mundo. Nossa fé em Deus, por meio de Jesus Cristo, fundamenta nossa profunda esperança na vida eterna. Vivemos e seguimos na vida, não para morrer, mas para viver eternamente. Somos peregrinos dessa esperança.



A primeira leitura deste domingo é do Livro de Job. O Livro de Job apresenta uma reflexão sobre algumas das grandes questões que se colocam aos seres humanos: qual o sentido da vida? Qual o sentido do sofrimento? Job, a figura principal deste livro, é apresentado como um homem piedoso, bom, generoso e cheio de “temor de Deus”. Possuía muitos bens e uma família numerosa... Mas, repentinamente, viu-se privado de todos os seus bens, perdeu a família e foi atingido por uma grave doença. Para a catequese tradicional de Israel, Javé recompensava os bons pelas suas boas obras e castigava os maus pelas injustiças e arbitrariedades que praticavam. No entanto, a vida nem sempre confirmava esta visão de Deus e da sua forma de atuar. Constatava-se, com frequência, que os maus possuíam bens em abundância e viviam vidas longas e felizes, enquanto que os justos eram pobres e sofriam por causa da injustiça e da violência dos poderosos. Como não pode aceitar esse deus falso, Job parte a procura do verdadeiro rosto de Deus. A Job nada resta senão reconhecer a sua pequenez e finitude, a sua incapacidade para compreender os projetos de Deus. Job decide, finalmente, trilhar o único caminho que faz sentido: vai entregar-se totalmente nas mãos desse Deus incompreensível mas cheio de amor, e vai confiar plenamente n’Ele.
