My Dear Friends and Families of Corpus Christi Church,

“Now there were shepherds in that region, living in the fields and watching over their flock. The angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them; and they were struck with great fear. The angel said to them, ‘Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all people. For today in the city of David, a Savior has been born for you, who is Messiah and Lord’”. (Gospel according to Luke 2: 8-11)

To the People of God of the Diocese of Rockville Centre:

Merry Christmas!

Throughout this year, we have marked many significant milestones in the life of the Church leading us to the Lord's Nativity and this holy season of Christmas, most especially the passing of Pope Francis at Easter and the election of Pope Leo XIV in May.

What a gift it has been to walk these months with our new Holy Father, to learn from his teaching, and witness his example.

On October 4<sup>th</sup>, the Memorial of Saint Francis of Assisi, Pope Leo released his first Apostolic Exhortation, *Dilxit Te - I Have Loved You*. It is a profound meditation on love for the poor and speaks powerfully to the mystery of the Lord's Birth and the grace of this season.

The Holy Father reminds us: "The Gospel shows us that poverty marked every aspect of Jesus' life. From the moment he entered the world, Jesus knew the bitter experience of rejection. The Evangelist Luke tells how Joseph and Mary, who was about to give birth, arrived in Bethlehem, and then adds, poignantly, that 'there was no place for them in the inn' (*Lk 2:7*). Jesus was born in humble surroundings and laid in a manger; then, to save him from being killed, they fled to Egypt (cf. *Mt 2:13-15*). At the dawn of his public ministry, after announcing in the synagogue of Nazareth that the year of grace which would bring joy to the poor was fulfilled in him, he was driven out of town (cf. *Lk 4:14-30*). He died as an outcast, led out of Jerusalem to be crucified (cf. *Mk 15:22*). Indeed, that is how Jesus' poverty is best described: he experienced the same exclusion that is the lot of the poor, the outcast of society. Jesus is a manifestation of this *privilegium pauperum*. He presented himself to the world not only as a poor Messiah, but also as the Messiah of and for the poor." (n. 19)

Before these words of Pope Leo, we recall the wonderful truth: Christ became poor so that we who are poor might become rich (cf. 2 Cor. 8:9). This is the good news of Christmas. We are not alone. We are not left to ourselves. A Savior has come - Christ the Lord.

As we celebrate the Christmas season, we remember with Pope Leo that "Christian holiness often flourishes in the most forgotten and wounded places of humanity." (n. 76)

How beautifully the followers of Christ have responded to the cry of the poor and looked with love upon the most vulnerable among us. As we rejoice in Christ's Birth, we renew our commitment to love others as he has loved us.



# Español

## IV DOMINGO DE ADVIENTO



### EVANGELIO DE SAN MATEO 1, 18-24

Cristo vino al mundo de la siguiente manera: Estando la madre de Jesús desposada con José y, antes de vivir juntos, sucedió que esperaba un hijo, por obra del Espíritu Santo. José, su esposo, que era justo, y no quería ponerla en evidencia, pensó dejarla en secreto. Mientras pensaba en estas cosas, un ángel del Señor le dijo en sueños: «José, hijo de David, no dudes en recibir a María tu esposa, porque ella ha concebido por obra del Espíritu Santo. Dará a luz un hijo, y le pondrás por nombre Jesús, porque él salvará a su pueblo de los pecados». Todo esto sucedió para que se cumpliera lo que había dicho el Señor por boca del profeta Isaías: Miren: la virgen concebirá y dará a luz un hijo, y le pondrán por nombre Emmanuel, que significa: Dios con nosotros. Cuando José se despertó, hizo lo que le había mandado el ángel del Señor: recibió a su esposa.



Mateo 1:18-25 narra el nacimiento de Jesús a través de José, destacando la obediencia a Dios en medio de la incertidumbre: María concibe por el Espíritu Santo, José decide dejarla discretamente pero un ángel lo detiene, revelando que el niño será Jesús, el Salvador, cumpliendo profecías

La reflexión se centra en la fe, la obediencia, la justicia de José, y el plan redentor de Dios, mostrando a Jesús como "Dios con nosotros" (**Emmanuel**) y que Dios actúa para unir y sanar, invitándonos a una respuesta activa de fe y seguimiento, no a la indiferencia.



Isaías 7:10-14 es una profecía crucial. donde Dios le ofrece una señal al rey Acas, amenazado por Siria y Israel, quien se niega a pedirla; entonces Dios, a través de Isaías, promete que una virgen concebirá y dará a luz un hijo llamado Emanuel ("Dios con nosotros"), una señal que apunta a la futura venida del Mesías, Jesús, cumpliendo la promesa divina de salvación a pesar de la incredulidad humana y el peligro inminente.



La segunda lectura de la Carta a los Romanos 1, 1-7 presenta a Pablo como siervo y apóstol de Jesucristo, llamado para anunciar el Evangelio de Dios prometido por los profetas, el cual se centra en su Hijo, nacido de la descendencia de David, pero resucitado como Hijo de Dios con poder por el Espíritu Santo: Jesucristo nuestro Señor. Pablo escribe a los amados de Dios en Roma, llamados a ser santos, deseando que la gracia y paz de Dios Padre y Jesucristo estén con ellos, un mensaje de salvación que llama a todas las naciones a creer y obedecer por fe.

## Português

### DOMINGO IV DO ADVENTO



#### EVANGELHO DE SÃO MATEUS 1, 18-24

O nascimento de Jesus deu-se do seguinte modo: Maria, sua Mãe, noiva de José, antes de terem vivido em comum, encontrara-se grávida por virtude do Espírito Santo. Mas José, seu esposo, que era justo e não queria difamá-la, resolveu repudiá-la em segredo. Tinha ele assim pensado, quando lhe apareceu num sonho o Anjo do Senhor, que lhe disse: «José, filho de David, não temas receber Maria, tua esposa, pois o que nela se gerou é fruto do Espírito Santo. Ela dará à luz um Filho e tu pôr-Lhe-ás o nome de Jesus, porque Ele salvará o povo dos seus pecados». Tudo isto aconteceu para se cumprir o que o senhor anunciara por meio do Profeta, que diz: «A Virgem conceberá e dará à luz um Filho, que será chamado ‘Emanuel’, que quer dizer ‘Deus conosco’». Quando despertou do sono, José fez como o Anjo do Senhor lhe ordenara e recebeu sua esposa.



Para entendermos a “narração do nascimento de Jesus” que Mateus nos apresenta, devemos enquadrá-la no contexto dos costumes matrimoniais em vigor na sociedade palestina da época. Mateus diz-nos, logo no início do relato, que Maria e José estavam noivos, mas ainda não viviam em comum. O casamento hebraico considerava o compromisso matrimonial em duas etapas: havia uma primeira fase, na qual os noivos se prometiam um ao outro (os “esponsais”); só depois, numa segunda fase, surgia o compromisso definitivo, selado com as cerimónias do matrimónio propriamente dito. Entre os “esponsais” e a celebração do

matrimónio, passava um tempo mais ou menos longo, durante o qual qualquer uma das partes podia voltar atrás, ainda que sofrendo uma penalidade. Durante esse tempo, os noivos não viviam em comum; mas o compromisso que os dois assumiam tinha já um carácter estável e vinculativo, de tal forma que, se surgia um filho, este era considerado filho legítimo de ambos. A Lei de Moisés considerava a infidelidade da noiva “prometida” como uma ofensa semelhante à infidelidade da esposa. A união entre os dois “prometidos” só podia dissolver-se com a fórmula jurídica do divórcio. Ora, segundo o texto que nos é proposto, José e Maria estavam na situação de “prometidos”: ainda não tinham celebrado o matrimónio, mas já tinham celebrado os “esponsais”. A resposta humilde e generosa de José às solicitações de Deus fazem dele um exemplo para todos aqueles que se preparam para acolher o nascimento de Jesus



Na primeira leitura do profeta Isaías, o profeta garante ao rei Acáz – preocupado porque o seu reino está sob ameaça dos inimigos – que há razões para encarar o futuro com esperança.
