Ash Wednesday always begins the 40 days of the sacred season of Lent, culminating with Holy Week and the celebration of the Resurrection on Easter. Lent is most profoundly a time for prayer, fasting, and alms-giving, as described in the Gospel according to Matthew read on Ash Wednesday.

As Jesus Himself journeyed alone in the desert for 40 days and nights, so we too spend some of this Lenten time with Christ alone in the sanctuary of our souls. He was tempted by Satan to sin, but never fell. We also are tempted and fallen at times; but Jesus is always present to lift us up with His Cross. Please encourage all in the community to receive this blessed sign of penance and conversion: the sign of the cross in ashes on your forehead or sprinkled on top of your head.

Lent Regulations

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day.

We will have the blessing of the throats at the 7:30am and the 12:30pm Masses. The Blessing of the Throats is a traditional Christian practice, especially in the Catholic Church protection against throat ailments, stemming from a legend

of St. Blaise saving a choking child. A priest uses crossed candles (often blessed on Candlemas) to touch the neck while reciting a prayer, asking God for deliverance from all illnesses, symbolizing faith in divine healing.



IV DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN MATEO 5, 1-12

En aquel tiempo, cuando Jesús vio a la muchedumbre, subió al monte y se sentó. Entonces se le acercaron sus discípulos. Enseguida comenzó a enseñarles, hablándoles así: "Dichosos los pobres de espíritu, porque de ellos es el Reino de los cielos. Dichosos los que lloran, porque serán consolados. Dichosos los sufridos, porque heredarán la tierra. Dichosos los que tienen hambre y sed de justicia, porque serán saciados. Dichosos los misericordiosos, porque obtendrán misericordia. Dichosos los limpios de corazón, porque verán a Dios. Dichosos los que trabajan por la paz, porque se les llamará hijos de Dios. Dichosos los perseguidos por causa de la justicia, porque de ellos es el Reino de los cielos. Dichosos serán ustedes cuando los injurien, los persigan y digan cosas falsas de ustedes por causa mía. Alégrese y salten de contento, porque su premio será grande en los cielos".



La Buena noticia del Reino es dicha y gozo. Está destinada a todos. Pero, sin embargo, no todos la aceptan. De ahí que tenga unos destinatarios a los que se dirige en primer lugar. Y es que para lograr alcanzar esta bienaventuranza (presente y futura) es preciso conectar con el Dios que revela Jesucristo. Y eso implica transitar por una senda singular. Se trata de la senda por la que avanza el

propio Maestro de Nazaret: la pobreza en todos los sentidos (incluida la humildad), el hambre de justicia y la lucha por la justicia, la paz, la misericordia, la limpieza de corazón... Quienes no aceptan la propuesta, ya hacen su elección. No es que Dios los rechace, ellos prefieren otros caminos de felicidad en los que no hay futuro. Hay una pregunta que atraviesa las lecturas de este domingo: ¿cómo se obtiene la felicidad? La respuesta, según lo comentado, parece coherente: siguiendo a Jesús en su propuesta del Reino de los Cielos. Lo cual significa, entre otras cosas, abrazar la pobreza y la humildad, y así conectar con Dios, para, con su gracia, luchar por la justicia y la paz. Las lecturas de Sofonías y de Pablo ratifican esta respuesta.



La primera lectura, de la profecía de Sofonías, es un llamado urgente al arrepentimiento para los humildes antes del juicio divino y una promesa de refugio y restauración para un remanente fiel, "el resto de Israel", un grupo pequeño, humilde y fiel que confía en Él, en contraste con los soberbios. El texto de Sofonías viene a preparar el mensaje de las bienaventuranzas, que es la clave de la Liturgia de la Palabra de este día.

1 Corintios 1:26-31

EL QUE SE GLORÍA,
GLORÍESE EN EL SEÑOR

La segunda lectura de la Primera Carta de Pablo a los Corintios 1:26-31 destaca que Dios elige lo necio, débil y despreciado del mundo para avergonzar a los sabios y fuertes, demostrando que la salvación es por gracia y no por méritos humanos. Pablo subraya que los creyentes deben glorificarse solo en el Señor, quien se hizo sabiduría, justicia, santificación y redención en Cristo Jesús.

DOMINGO IV DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO DE SÃO MATEUS 5, 1-12

Naquele tempo, ao ver as multidões, Jesus subiu ao monte e sentou-Se. Rodearam-n’O os discípulos e Ele começou a ensiná-los, dizendo:

«Bem-aventurados os pobres em espírito, porque deles é o reino dos Céus. Bem-aventurados os que choram, porque serão consolados. Bem-aventurados os humildes, porque possuirão a terra. Bem-aventurados os que têm fome e sede de justiça, porque serão saciados. Bem-aventurados os misericordiosos, porque alcançarão misericórdia. Bem-aventurados os puros de coração, porque verão a Deus. Bem-aventurados os que promovem a paz, porque serão chamados filhos de Deus. Bem-aventurados os que sofrem perseguição por amor da justiça, porque deles é o reino dos Céus. Bem-aventurados sereis, quando, por minha causa, vos insultarem, vos perseguirem e, mentindo, disserem todo o mal contra vós. Alegrai-vos e exultai, porque é grande nos Céus a vossa recompensa».




As “bem-aventuranças” evangélicas devem ser entendidas no contexto da pregação sobre o Reino de Deus. Jesus proclama “bem-aventurados” os que estão numa situação de debilidade, de pobreza, de aflição (os pobres, os que choram, os que têm fome e sede de justiça, os que sofrem perseguição por causa da justiça), porque Deus está a ponto de instaurar o Reino de Deus e a situação deles vai mudar radicalmente; Jesus proclama “bem-aventurados” aqueles que dão testemunho dos valores de Deus (os mansos, os misericordiosos, os puros de coração, os construtores da paz), porque podem fazer parte da comunidade do Reino de Deus e serão chamados filhos de Deus.

Buscai o SENHOR, vós todos os mansos da terra, que cumpris o seu juízo; buscai a justiça, buscai a mansidão; porventura, lograreis esconder-vos no dia da ira do SENHOR.

Sofonias 2.3

Na primeira leitura, o profeta Sofonias deixa aos seus contemporâneos um convite a viverem como humildes e pobres. Os “pobres” são aqueles que, não possuindo bens materiais nem seguranças humanas, tendem a depositar toda a sua confiança e esperança em Deus; são aqueles que encontram em Deus refúgio, conforto e felicidade. Eles são os preferidos de Deus. Deus cuidará deles e acompanhá-los-á em cada passo do caminho que percorrem.



Na segunda leitura, o apóstolo Paulo pede aos cristãos de Corinto que não apostem na sabedoria humana como caminho para construir uma vida com sentido. Paulo propõe-lhes, em contrapartida, que acolham a “loucura da cruz” e que optem por seguir Jesus incondicionalmente, vivendo ao seu estilo, abraçando os valores que Ele abraçou, percorrendo com Ele o caminho do amor e do dom da vida. É aí que está a verdadeira sabedoria, a sabedoria que conduz à salvação e à vida plena.
