As much as we might enjoy the beauty of blue skies and sunshine on the mountains of white snow surrounding our homes; nevertheless, we all can't wait for Spring to come soon!

Speaking of Spring, that is precisely the meaning of the word "Lent" in our Liturgical Calander. Ash Wednesday arrives on 18 February, with the listing of Masses and Scripture Services to receive ashes throughout the day and evening. Lent is not only a sacred season to renew our personal lives before Jesus who forgives our sins; but also a time for our Church community to be truly transformed into the living Body of Christ. Especially in this our 125th anniversary year as a parish; please invite back those friends/family members who have fallen away from the faith.

One of the casualties of the cold weather was our beloved school building on Searing Avenue. On Monday 26 January, we discovered the entire first floor was flooded with water. A water main pipe underneath our boiler room had cracked in the cold; thus allowing water to flow into the school for two days. Our beautiful new gym floor looked like a wading pool. Fortunately, under the leadership of our parish trustee Joe Basel, several coaches and parents showed up that night to help in the clean up immediately. Most of the damage will be covered by insurance, and we already have the kids back learning in religious classes, and playing basketball on the court.

Finally, I'm sad to say that two consecutive Sunday snowstorms that fell on 18 and 25 January took a big bite out of our normally generous collections because most people couldn't come to Church. Expenses for snow removal can be quite costly. But we are blessed to have several young men from our Spanish community who volunteered to shovel in the darkness of the storms. Ash Wednesday always begins the 40 days of the sacred season of Lent, culminating with Holy Week and the celebration of the Resurrection on Easter. Lent is most profoundly a time for prayer, fasting, and alms-giving, as described in the Gospel according to Matthew read on Ash Wednesday.

As Jesus Himself journeyed alone in the desert for 40 days and nights, so we too spend some of this Lenten time with Christ alone in the sanctuary of our souls. He was tempted by Satan to sin, but never fell. We also are tempted and fallen at times; but Jesus is always present to lift us up with His Cross. Please encourage all in the community to receive this blessed sign of penance and conversion: the sign of the cross in ashes on your forehead or sprinkled on top of your head.

Lent Regulations

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day.

Lent 2026

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

In this Lenten season 2026, we offer our prayer, fasting, and almsgiving for the Light of Christ's peace and justice to heal the many troubled parts of our nation and world.

Amid so many global and national crises, it is essential that we be guided and inspired by the Word of God. This Lent, let us rededicate ourselves to being deeply biblical Catholics on fire with the Word of God.¹

In Saint Paul's Second Letter to Timothy (2:8-10), the Apostle writes: "The Word of God is not bound," or as another translation renders it, "The Word of God cannot be chained."

The Church of Santa Maria in Via Lata in Rome, near to both the Trevi Fountain and the Pantheon, is traditionally taken as the site of Saint Paul's imprisonment in the Eternal City. Beneath this holy church stands an ancient, freestanding granite column that I visited and prayed at on May 17, 2024.

Etched into that ancient column is the Latin phrase for "The Word of God is not bound." The column also has rust marks indicating that a chain – possibly the one discovered archaeologically in an adjacent well – was wrapped around it.

How powerful it was to place my hands on that granite column and to touch with my fingers the words of Saint Paul! In my ecclesial mission as the Successor of the Apostles on Long Island, that memorable day I asked Saint Paul for his intercession that each one of us in the Diocese of Rockville Centre could be as bold and as audacious in proclaiming that the Word of God cannot be chained!

The Word of God cannot be chained in our own lives and in the lives of our families!

The Word of God bursts through our sin, paralyses, and resistances to change, and ignites our own Road to Damascus conversions!

The Word of God breaks down the self-imposed prison doors of addiction, ego, pride, selfishness, and narcissism, and refocuses our lives on Christ and his call to rejoice!

The Word of God cannot be chained by sin, war, terrorism, racism, injustice, poverty,² or disrespect for the sanctity and dignity of human life!


The Word of God cannot be chained by unethical deployments of Artificial Intelligence!³





STATIONS OF THE CROSS

DOMINGO VI DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN MATEO 5, 17-37

En aquel tiempo, dijo Jesús a sus discípulos: «No creáis que he venido a abolir la Ley y los profetas: no he venido a abolir, sino a dar plenitud. En verdad os digo que antes pasarán el cielo y la tierra que deje de cumplirse hasta la última letra o tilde de la ley. El que se salte uno sólo de los preceptos menos importantes, y se lo enseñe así a los hombres será el menos importante en el reino de los cielos. Pero quien los cumpla y enseñe será grande en el reino de los cielos. Porque os digo que si vuestra justicia no es mayor que la de los escribas y fariseos, no entraréis en el reino de los cielos. Habéis oído que se dijo a los antiguos: “No matarás”, y el que mate será reo de juicio. Pero yo os digo: todo el que se deja llevar de la cólera contra su hermano será procesado. Y si uno llama a su hermano “imbécil”, tendrá que comparecer ante el Sanedrín, y si lo llama “necio”, merece la condena de la “gehenna” del fuego. Por tanto, si cuando vas a presentar tu ofrenda sobre el altar, te acuerdas allí mismo de que tu hermano tiene quejas contra ti, deja allí tu ofrenda ante el altar y vete primero a reconciliarte con tu hermano, y entonces vuelve a presentar tu ofrenda. Con el que te pone pleito, procura arreglarte enseguida, mientras vais todavía de camino, no sea que te entregue al juez, y el juez al alguacil, y te metan en la cárcel. En verdad te digo que no saldrás de allí hasta que hayas pagado el último céntimo. Habéis

oído que se dijo: “No cometerás adulterio”. Pero yo os digo: todo el que mira a una mujer deseándola, ya ha cometido adulterio con ella en su corazón. Si tu ojo derecho te induce a pecar, sácatelo y tiraló. Más te vale perder un miembro que ser echado entero en la “gehenna”. Si tu mano derecha te induce a pecar, córtatela y tiralá, porque más te vale perder un miembro que ir a parar entero a la “gehenna”. Se dijo: “El que se repudie a su mujer, que le dé acta de repudio.” Pero yo os digo que si uno repudia a su mujer -no hablo de unión ilegítima- la induce a cometer adulterio, y el que se casa con la repudiada comete adulterio. También habéis oído que se dijo a los antiguos: “No jurarás en falso” y “Cumplirás tus juramentos al Señor”. Pero yo os digo que no juréis en absoluto: ni por el cielo, que es el trono de Dios; ni por la tierra, que es estrado de sus pies; ni por Jerusalén, que es la ciudad del Gran Rey. Ni jures por tu cabeza, pues no puedes volver blanco o negro un solo cabello. Que vuestro hablar sea sí, sí, no, no. Lo que pasa de ahí viene del Maligno».



“Si no sois mejores que los escribas y fariseos, no entraréis en el reino de los cielos”

Estas palabras de Jesús en el Evangelio debieron sorprender y desconcertar a sus oyentes. Jesús les invitaba a ellos, y nos invita a nosotros, a no entender la religión, o sea, la relación con Dios, de forma legalista, como el cumplimiento de una serie de preceptos y, mucho menos, como un cumplimiento de mínimos. La religión no es una cuestión de medidas. Es una manera de ser, de vivir, de amar. Jesús nos invita a ir a lo esencial, a lo que ilumina todo lo demás, a aquello sin lo que lo demás no tiene sentido, o se convierte en esclavitud insoportable y letra que mata. Y lo esencial, como dejó escrito el Papa Francisco es “responder al Dios amante que nos salva, reconociéndolo en los demás y saliendo de nosotros mismos para buscar el bien de todos”.


VI DOMINGO DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO DE SÃO MATEUS 5, 17-37

Naquele tempo, disse Jesus aos seus discípulos: «Não penseis que vim revogar a Lei ou os Profetas; não vim revogar, mas completar. Em verdade vos digo: Antes que passem o céu e a terra, não passará da Lei a mais pequena letra ou o mais pequeno sinal, sem que tudo se cumpra. Portanto, se alguém transgredir um só destes mandamentos, por mais pequenos que sejam, e ensinar assim aos homens, será o menor no reino dos Céus. Mas aquele que os praticar e ensinar será grande no reino dos Céus. Porque Eu vos digo: Se a vossa justiça não superar a dos escribas e fariseus, não entrareis no reino dos Céus. Ouvistes que foi dito aos antigos: ‘Não matarás; quem matar será submetido a julgamento’. Eu, porém, digo-vos: Todo aquele que se irar contra o seu irmão será submetido a julgamento. Quem chamar imbecil a seu irmão será submetido ao Sinédrio, e quem lhe chamar louco será submetido à geena de fogo. Portanto, se fores apresentar a tua oferta sobre o altar e ali te recordares que o teu irmão tem alguma coisa contra ti, deixa lá a tua oferta diante do altar, vai primeiro reconciliar-te com o teu irmão e vem depois apresentar a tua oferta. Reconcilia-te com o teu adversário, enquanto vais com ele a caminho, não seja caso que te entregues ao juiz, o juiz ao guarda, e sejas metido na prisão. Em verdade te digo: Não sairás de lá, enquanto não pagares o último centavo. Ouvistes que foi dito: ‘Não cometerás adultério’. Eu, porém, digo-vos: Todo aquele que olhar para uma mulher desejando-a, já cometeu adultério com ela no seu coração. Se o teu olho é para ti ocasião de pecado,

arranca-o e lança-o para longe de ti, pois é melhor perder-se um dos teus membros do que todo o corpo ser lançado na geena. E se a tua mão direita é para ti ocasião de pecado, corta-a e lança-a para longe de ti, porque é melhor que se perca um dos teus membros, do que todo o corpo ser lançado na geena. Também foi dito: Também foi dito: ‘Quem repudiar sua mulher dê-lhe certidão de repúdio’. Eu, porém, digo-vos: Todo aquele que repudiar sua mulher, salvo em caso de união ilegal, fá-la cometer adultério. Ouvistes que foi dito aos antigos: ‘Não faltarás ao que tiveres jurado, mas cumprirás os teus juramentos para com o Senhor’. Eu, porém, digo-vos que não jureis em caso algum: nem pelo Céu, que é o trono de Deus; nem pela terra, que é o escabelo dos seus pés; nem por Jerusalém, que é a cidade do grande Rei. Também não jures pela tua cabeça, porque não podes fazer branco ou preto um só cabelo. A vossa linguagem deve ser: ‘Sim, sim; não, não’. O que passa disto vem do Maligno».



Jesus diz no Evangelho da missa de hoje que ele não veio destruir a antiga Lei, mas dar-lhe a sua plenitude: ou seja, Jesus restaura, aperfeiçoa e eleva a uma ordem superior os preceitos do Antigo Testamento. O que Jesus quer é que a lei não seja estabelecida somente como princípios meramente externos, ou uma imposição vinda de fora. A Lei de Deus deve corresponder ao ideal de perfeição que, por natureza, está no coração de cada pessoa. Só assim conseguirá atingir o Reino de Deus e seus valores.
