

Liturgical Minister Training- Spring 2026

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance, with a letter from their pastor.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This “BASIC” training is required for **all** Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training. A **Lector Workshop** is available for both new and experienced lectors.

You may only be registered with your Pastor’s nomination. Doors open 30 minutes before the training start time. End time is an estimate, session may end prior to 10 pm, please be prepared.

- **Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion Part B** – presented in conjunction with Catholic Health.

These sessions will run from 7:00 pm – 9:00 pm. Doors open at 6:30 pm.


Please join me in making a gift to this year's Catholic Ministries Appeal, so that we can continue to perform daily acts of compassion and love through our vital diocesan ministries.



IV DOMINGO DE CUARESMA



EVANGELIO DE SAN JUAN 9, 1-41

En aquel tiempo, al pasar, vio Jesús a un hombre ciego de nacimiento. Y sus discípulos le preguntaron: «Maestro, ¿Quién pecó, este o sus padres, para que naciera ciego?». Jesús contestó: «Ni este pecó ni sus padres, sino para que se manifiesten en él las obras de Dios. Mientras es de día tengo que hacer las obras del que me ha enviado; viene la noche y nadie podrá hacerlas. Mientras estoy en el mundo, soy la luz del mundo». Dicho esto, escupió en la tierra, hizo barro con la saliva, se lo untó en los ojos al ciego, y le dijo: «Ve a lavarte a la piscina de Siloé (que significa Enviado)». Él fue, se lavó, y volvió con vista. Y los vecinos y los que antes solían verlo pedir limosna preguntaban: «¿No es ese el que se sentaba a pedir?». Unos decían: «El mismo». Otros decían: «No es él, pero se le parece». Él respondía: «Soy yo». Y le preguntaban: «¿Y cómo se te han abierto los ojos?». Él contestó: «Ese hombre que se llama Jesús hizo barro, me lo untó en los ojos y me dijo que fuese a Siloé y que me lavase. Entonces fui, me lavé, y empecé a ver». Le preguntaron: «¿Dónde está él?». Contestó: «No lo sé». Llevaron ante los fariseos al que había sido ciego. Era sábado el día que Jesús hizo barro y le abrió los ojos. También los fariseos le preguntaban cómo había adquirido la vista. Él les contestó: «Me puso barro en los ojos, me lavé y veo». Algunos de los fariseos comentaban: «Este hombre no viene de Dios, porque no guarda el sábado». Otros replicaban: «¿Cómo puede un pecador hacer semejantes signos?». Y estaban divididos. Y volvieron a preguntarle al ciego: «Y tú, ¿Qué dices del que te ha abierto los ojos?». Él contestó: «Que es un profeta». Pero los judíos no se creyeron que aquel había sido ciego y que había comenzado a ver, hasta que llamaron a sus padres y les preguntaron: «¿Es este su hijo, de quien dicen ustedes que nació ciego? ¿Cómo es que ahora ve?». Sus padres contestaron: «Sabemos que este es nuestro hijo y que nació ciego; pero cómo ve ahora, no lo sabemos; y quién le ha abierto los ojos, nosotros tampoco lo sabemos. Pregúntenselo a él, que es mayor y puede explicarse». Sus padres respondieron así porque tenían miedo a los judíos; porque los judíos ya habían acordado excluir de la


sinagoga a quien reconociera a Jesús por Mesías. Por eso sus padres dijeron: «Ya es mayor, preguntenselo a él». Llamaron por segunda vez al hombre que había sido ciego y le dijeron: «Da gloria a Dios: nosotros sabemos que ese hombre es un pecador». Contestó él: «Si es un pecador, no lo sé; solo sé que yo era ciego y ahora veo». Le preguntan de nuevo: «¿Qué te hizo, cómo te abrió los ojos?». Les contestó: «Se lo he dicho ya, y no me han hecho caso; ¿para qué quieren oírlo otra vez?, ¿también ustedes quieren hacerse discípulos suyos?». Ellos lo llenaron de improperios y le dijeron: «Discípulo de ese lo serás tú; nosotros somos discípulos de Moisés. Nosotros sabemos que a Moisés le habló Dios, pero ese no sabemos de dónde viene». Replicó él: «Pues eso es lo raro: que ustedes no saben de dónde viene, y, sin embargo, me ha abierto los ojos. Sabemos que Dios no escucha a los pecadores, sino al que es piadoso y hace su voluntad. Jamás se oyó decir que nadie le abriera los ojos a un ciego de nacimiento; si este no viniera de Dios, no tendría ningún poder». Le replicaron: «Has nacido completamente en pecado, ¿y nos vas a dar lecciones a nosotros?». Y lo expulsaron. Oyó Jesús que lo habían expulsado, lo encontró y le dijo: «¿Crees tú en el Hijo del hombre?». Él contestó: «¿Y quién es, Señor, para que crea en él?». Jesús le dijo: «Lo estás viendo: el que te está hablando, ese es». Él dijo: «Creo, Señor». Y se postró ante él. Dijo Jesús: «Para un juicio he venido yo a este mundo: para que los que no ven, vean, y los que ven, se queden ciegos». Los fariseos que estaban con él oyeron esto y le preguntaron: «¿También nosotros estamos ciegos?». Jesús les contestó: «Si estuvieran ciegos, no tendrían pecado; pero como dicen "vemos", su pecado permanece».



La curación del ciego de nacimiento en Juan 9,1-41 es un signo de Jesús como "Luz del mundo" (v. 5) que ilumina la ceguera física y espiritual. Jesús rompe con la idea de que la enfermedad es un castigo, mostrando que la gracia busca manifestar la obra de Dios y sanar el corazón del hombre. Los fariseos representan la ceguera espiritual. Aunque ven físicamente, su soberbia, sus prejuicios y su apego a la ley sobre la misericordia (critican que cure en sábado) les impiden ver la verdad. El ciego curado, a pesar de la presión y la expulsión por parte de los líderes, defiende la verdad de lo que Jesús hizo en él. Es un llamado a los cristianos a dar testimonio público de Cristo sin miedo.

DOMINGO IV DA QUARESMA



EVANGELHO DE SÃO JOÃO 9, 1-41

Naquele tempo, Jesus encontrou no seu caminho um cego de nascença. Cuspiu em terra, fez com a saliva um pouco de lodo e ungiu os olhos do cego. Depois disse-lhe: «Vai lavar-te à piscina de Siloé»; Siloé quer dizer «Enviado». Ele foi, lavou-se e ficou a ver. Entretanto, perguntavam os vizinhos e os que antes o viam a mendigar: «Não é este o que costumava estar sentado a pedir esmola?» Uns diziam: «É ele». Outros afirmavam: «Não é. É parecido com ele». Mas ele próprio dizia: «Sou eu». Levaram aos fariseus o que tinha sido cego. Era sábado esse dia em que Jesus fizeram lodo e lhe tinha aberto os olhos. Por isso, os fariseus perguntaram ao homem como tinha recuperado a vista. Ele declarou-lhes: «Jesus pôs-me lodo nos olhos; depois fui lavar-me e agora vejo». Diziam alguns dos fariseus: «Esse homem não vem de Deus, porque não guarda o sábado». Outros observavam: «Como pode um pecador fazer tais milagres?» E havia desacordo entre eles. Perguntaram então novamente ao cego: «Tu que dizias d'Aquele que te deu a vista?» O homem respondeu: «É um profeta». Replicaram-lhe então eles: «Tu nasceste inteiramente em pecado e pretendes ensinar-nos?» E expulsaram-no. Jesus soube que o tinham expulsado e, encontrando-o, disse-lhe: «Tu acreditas no Filho do homem?» Ele respondeu-Lhe: «Senhor, quem é Ele, para que eu acredite?» Disse-lhe Jesus; «Já O viste: é Quem está a falar contigo». O homem prostrou-se diante de Jesus e exclamou: «Eu creio Senhor.



Os “cegos” faziam parte do grupo dos excluídos da sociedade palestina de então. As deficiências físicas eram consideradas – pela teologia oficial – como resultado do pecado (os rabbis da época chegavam a discutir de onde vinha o pecado de alguém que nascia com uma deficiência: se o defeito era o resultado de um pecado dos pais, ou se era o resultado de um pecado cometido pela criança no ventre da mãe). Segundo a concepção da época, Deus castigava de acordo com a gravidade da culpa. A cegueira era considerada o resultado de um pecado especialmente grave: uma doença que impedisse o homem de estudar a Lei era considerada uma maldição de Deus por excelência. Pela sua condição de impureza notória, os cegos eram impedidos de servir de testemunhas no tribunal e de participar nas cerimónias religiosas no Templo.



A primeira leitura do Primeiro Livro de Samuel, Deus envia o profeta Samuel a Belém para ungir um novo rei entre os filhos de Jessé, rejeitando o rei Saul. Samuel inicialmente se impressiona com a aparência de Eliabe, mas Deus diz: "O homem vê a aparência, porém o Senhor olha para o coração". Após sete filhos serem rejeitados, Davi, o mais novo que cuidava das ovelhas, é chamado, ungido e o Espírito do Senhor se apodera dele.

INTENCÕES PARA MISSA DIA 22 DE MARÇO
