

All who have reached their 14th year are bound to abstain totally from meat.

Felipe fue a decírselo a Andrés; Andrés y Felipe se lo dijeron a Jesús y él respondió: "Ha llegado la hora de que el Hijo del hombre sea glorificado. Yo les aseguro que si el grano de trigo, sembrado en la tierra, no muere,, queda infecundo, pero si muere, producirá mucho fruto. El que ama a sí mismo, se pierde; el que se aborrece a sí mismo en ese mundo, se asegura para la vida eterna. El que quiera servirme, que me siga, para que donde vo esté también esté mi servidor. El que me sirve, será honrado por mi Padre. Ahora que tengo miedo, le voy a decir a mi Padre: Padre, librame de esta hora? No, pues precisamente para esta hora he venido. Padre, dale gloria a tu nombre". Se ovó entonces una voz que decía: "Lo he glorificado y volveré a glorificarlo". De entre los que estaban ahí presentes y oyeron aquella voz, unos decían que había sido un trueno; otros, que le había hablado un ángel Pero Jesús le dijo: "Esa voz no ha venido por mí, sino por ustedes. La segunda lectura, de la carta a los Hebreos, nos presenta a Jesucristo, el sumo sacerdote de la nueva Alianza, que se solidariza con los hombres y les señala el camino de la salvación.

# Português domingo v da quaresma




EVANGELHO DE SÃO JOÃO 12.20-33

Naquele tempo, alguns gregos que tinham vindo a Jerusalém para adorar nos dias da festa, foram ter com Filipe, de Betsaida da Galileia, e fizeram-lhe este pedido: "Senhor, nós queríamos ver Jesus". Filipe foi dizê-lo a André, e então André e Filipe foram dizê-lo a Jesus. Jesus respondeu-lhes: "Chegou a hora em que o Filho do homem vai ser glorificado. Em verdade, em verdade vos digo: Se o grão de trigo, lançado à terra não morrer, fica só; mas se morrer, dará muito fruto. Quem ama a sua vida, perde-la-á, e quem despreza a sua vida neste mundo conserva-la-á para a vida eterna. Se alguém me quiser servir, que me siga, e onde eu estiver, ali estará também o meu servo. E se alguém me servir, meu Pai o honrará. Agora a minha alma está perturbada. E que hei-de dizer? Pai, salva-me desta hora? Mas por causa disto é que eu cheguei a esta hora. Pai, glorifica o teu nome". Veio então do Céu uma voz que dizia: Já o glorifiquei e tornarei a glorificá-lo. A multidão que estava presente e ouvira dizia ter sido um trovão. Outro afirmavam: Foi um Anjo que lhe falou. Disse Jesus: "Não foi por minha causa que esta voz se fez ouvir; foi por vossa causa. Chegou a hora em que este mundo vai ser julgado. Chegou a hora em que vai ser expulso o príncipe desse mundo. E quando eu for elevado da terra, atrair é todos a mim. Falava deste modo, para indicar de que morte ia morrer".



O episódio narrado no Evangelho de hoje deu-se poucos dias antes dos acontecimentos da última Páscoa de Jesus. Um grupo de estrangeiros que se tinham convertido à religião judia, tinha ouvido falar de Jesus e queria encontrá-lo. Eles vieram a Jerusalém para adorar a Deus no Templo; mas quiseram ver Jesus. Este ver deve ser entendido como conhecer, encontrar-se com Jesus, tomar contacto com a salvação que ele veio oferecer. Com isto, João sugere que o Templo e o culto antigo já não são mais os lugares onde a pessoa encontra Deus e a salvação. A comparação com o grão de trigo nos ensina que a semente quando é lançada à terra, parece perder-se e morrer, mas, a seguir, despertada pelos raios do sol, reaparece, multiplicada por cem, numa espiga que proclama a vitória da vida.



Na primeira leitura, o profeta Jeremias anuncia que Deus se dispõe fazer conosco uma nova Aliança. Ele vai gravar as suas propostas nos nossos corações, a fim de que os nossos sentimentos, decisões e ações traduzam a vida e os valores de Deus.
