

Easter 2024

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy Easter to you and your families! Thank you for your love for the inspired Word of God. Thank you for your love for the Resurrection appearances of our Lord in this Easter season and the way your lives are set on fire in your meditation and contemplation of these mysteries.

Thank you for your fidelity to the Eucharist and the Sunday Mass and your Catholic spirit of evangelization. Thank you for being instruments of Eucharistic Revival.

In *The Joy of the Gospel*, Pope Francis states: "Christ's resurrection is not an event of the past; it contains a vital power which has permeated the world. Where all seems to be dead, signs of the resurrection suddenly spring up. It is an irresistible force...Each day in our world beauty is born anew, it rises transformed through the storms of history...Such is the power of the resurrection, and all who evangelize are instruments of that power." (276)

We continue to live through "the storms of history" and we rely on the Risen Lord and his glorified wounds to touch the wounds in Ukraine, the Middle East, Nicaragua, Venezuela, Armenia and Azerbaijan, the region of the Sahel, the Horn of Africa and Sudan, as well as Cameroon, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, South Sudan and so many other troubled areas of the world. We ask the Risen Lord and his glorified wounds to touch the wounds experienced in our own country.

In *The Everlasting Man*, G.K. Chesterton captured the power of our Lord's Resurrection experienced in the cycles of history. Christianity has died many times and risen again; for it had a God who knew the way out of the grave."

This Easter and every Easter we celebrate this Everlasting Man who knew his way out of the grave and who invites us and the Catholic Church on Long Island to a great Resurrection.

"At daybreak on the first day of the week, the women took the spices they had prepared, and went to the tomb. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb; but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. While they were puzzling over this, behold, two men in dazzling clothes appeared to them. They were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground. They said to them, 'Why do you seek the living one among the dead? He is not here, but has been raised!'" (The Gospel according to Luke 24:1-6)

Perhaps this early-spring Easter season is a time to look at the "stones" that are blocking us from finding Jesus in our lives. The devoted women-disciples on that first Easter morning, discovered that the stone sealing the tomb of Christ had been mysteriously moved. They entered into emptiness; hoping to anoint and care for the dead body of the Lord. But they departed in wonderment; hearing the angels proclaim that the Living One is not among the dead, but is the Risen One!

This same original Easter faith should inspire us to shatter the stones that stop us from discovering the Living Lord in our hearts and families. Liturgical Minister Training-Spring 2024

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training in Spanish and English for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for **all** Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training. A **Lector Workshop** is available for both new and experienced lectors.



Mary of Magdala was first to go to the tomb and discovered it empty. Jesus was missing — the master who had understood her and cured her, the prophet she had followed faithfully until his death. Her lament to the disciples was: They've taken my Lord from the grave and we don't know where they have put Him. Her lament could express the experience that many Catholics are living through today: What have they done with the Risen Jesus? Where have they put him — the Lord in whom we believe: is it a Christ full of the promise of life or a Jesus whose memory keeps fading little by little in our hearts?

In order to meet the Risen One we need to journey within. If we don't meet him inside ourselves, we won't meet him anywhere. John describes Mary going about looking for information. But when she does see Jesus, she's so blinded by grief and tears that she does not recognize him. Jesus just asks: Woman, why are you weeping? Who are you looking for? Maybe we too need to ask ourselves something similar: Why is our faith so sad and low-key? What are Catholics looking for today? What do we yearn for? When Mary doesn't recognize Jesus, He calls her by her name: Mary!. She turns around quickly and says: Rabbuni! Master!.

Mary meets the Risen One when she feels herself personally called by him. Our faith in the living Christ won't be revived only by the Easter accounts alone. We won't properly meet him if we don't seek a living, personal contact with him. A combination of the love of Jesus known through the Gospel and sought personally in the depths of our hearts, can best lead us to meet the Risen One.

Wishing you a Happy and Blessed Easter! He is Risen! Alleluia!

Español Domingo de pascua



EVANGELIO DE SAN JUAN 20, 1-9

El primer día después del sábado, estando todavía oscuro, fue María Magdalena al sepulcro y vio removida la piedra que lo cerraba. Echó a correr, llegó a la casa donde estaban Simón Pedro y el otros discípulo, a quien Jesús amaba, y les dijo: Se han llevado del sepulcro al Señor y no sabemos dónde lo habrán puesto. Salieron Pedro y el otros discípulo camino del sepulcro. Los dos iban corriendo juntos, pero el otro discípulo corrió más aprisa que Pedro v llegó primero al sepulcro, e inclinándose, miró los lienzos puestos en el suelo, pero no entró. En eso llegó también Simón Pedro, que lo venía siguiendo, y entró en el sepulcro. Contempló los lienzos puestos en el suelo y el sudario, que había estado sobre la cabeza de Jesús, puesto no con los lienzos en el suelo, sino doblado en sitio aparte. Entonces entró también el otros discípulo, el que había llegado primero al sepulcro, y vio y creyó, porque hasta entonces no habían entendido las Escrituras, según las cuales Jesús debía resucitar de entre los muertos.



Hoy la Iglesia celebra el día más grande de la Historia, porque con la resurrección de Jesús se abre una nueva historia, una nueva esperanza para todos

los hombres. El texto de Juan que todos los años se proclama en este día de la Pascua, nos propone acompañar a María Magdalena al sepulcro, que es todo un símbolo de la muerte y de su silencio humano; nos insinúa el asombro y la perplejidad de que el Señor no está en el sepulcro; María Magdalena descubre la resurrección, pero no la puede interpretar todavía. Una delas opciones que nos ofrece la liturgia es el relato de la experiencia de María Magdalena junto a la de Pedro y el discípulo amado. María Magdalena fue la primera en descubrir que el cuerpo del Señor Jesús ya no estaba en la tumba y fue presurosa a anunciar a los demás discípulos: se convierte así en apóstol de los apóstoles. La resurrección de Jesús es la fuerza y el poder que nos hace capaces de ser evangelizadores y testigos de la presencia de Dios en medio de nosotros. La alegría de la Pascua debe ser la fortaleza para todo el año, para cada día.




La primera lectura de este día corresponde al discurso de Pedro ante la familia de Cornelio, una familia pagana. El texto de la lectura es, primeramente, una recapitulación de la vida de Jesús y de la primitiva comunidad con Él, a través de lo que se expone en el Evangelio y en los Hechos. La predicación en Galilea y en Jerusalén, la muerte y la resurrección, así como las experiencias pascuales en las que los discípulos conviven con él.



La segunda lectura es un texto bautismal. Ella saca las consecuencias que para los cristianos tiene el creer y aceptar el misterio pascual: pasar de la muerte a la vida.

PARA TODOS, UNA FELIZ PASCUA

Português domingo de páscoa



EVANGELHO DE SÃO JOÃO 20, 1-9

No primeiro dia da semana, Maria Madalena foi de manhãzinha, ainda escuro, ao sepulcro e viu a pedra retirada do sepulcro. Correu então e foi ter com Simão Padro e com o outro discípulo que Jesus amava e disse-lhes: Levaram o Senhor do sepulcro e não sabemos onde o puseram. Pedro partiu com o outro discípulo e foram ambos ao sepulcro. Corriam os dois juntos, mas o outro discípulo antecipou-se, correndo mais depressa do que Pedro, e chegou primeiro ao sepulcro. Debruçando-se, viu as ligaduras no chão, mas não entrou. Entretanto, chegou também Simão Pedro, que o seguira. Entrou no sepulcro e viu as ligaduras no chão e o sudário que tinha estado sobre a cabeça de Jesus, não com as ligaduras, mas enrolado à parte. Entrou também o outro discípulo que chegara primeiro ao sepulcro; viu e acreditou. Na verdade, ainda não tinham entendido a Escritura, segundo a qual Jesus devia ressuscitar dos mortos.



A ressurreição de Jesus é a resposta de Deus aos que pretenderam, de forma injusta e criminosa, calar Jesus e banir da história o seu projeto do Reino de Deus. Deus não permitiu que o mal vencesse; Deus não permitiu que a violência, a injustiça, a maldade e a morte tivessem a última palavra. Deus não aceitou que o mundo ficasse refém daqueles que queriam continuar a viver na escuridão. Ao ressuscitar Jesus, Deus deu-lhe razão; afirmou que o caminho proposto por Jesus — o do amor que se dá até às últimas consequências, o do serviço simples e humilde aos irmãos, o do perdão sem limites — é o caminho que leva à Vida.



A primeira leitura deste domingo é tirada de um dos discursos de Pedro. Ele falando a um grupo de pagãos, resume em poucas palavras a mensagem cristã. Pedro apresenta-a em quatro pontos: 1) Antes de mais, relembra os momentos principais da vida de Jesus. 2) O segundo ponto fala-nos do que os judeus fizeram a este enviado de Deus: mataram-no, pregando-o numa cruz. 3) Diante desta maldade humana, Deus não podia abandonar o seu Servo fiel nas mãos da morte. Por isso ressuscitou-o. 4) Por fim, fala da missão dos discípulos: eles são testemunhas destes factos.



Ao escrever aos cristãos de Colossos, Paulo recordalhes que no dia do baptismo eles nasceram para uma vida nova; vida que tem a sua plena realização no mundo de Deus.
