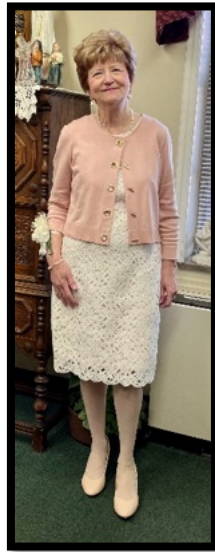

III DOMINGO DE PASCUA



EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 24, 13-35

El mismo día de la resurrección, iban dos de los discípulos hacia un pueblo llamado Emaús, situado a unos once kilómetros de Jerusalén, y comentaban todo lo que había sucedido. Mientras conversaban y discutían, Jesús se les acercó y comenzó a caminar con ellos; pero los ojos de los dos discípulos estaban velados y no lo reconocieron. Él les preguntó: “¿De qué cosas vienen hablando, tan llenos de tristeza?”

Uno de ellos, llamado Cleofás, le respondió: “¿Eres tú el único forastero que no sabe lo que ha sucedido estos días en Jerusalén?” Él les preguntó: “¿Qué cosa?” Ellos le respondieron: “Lo de Jesús el nazareno, que era un profeta poderoso en obras y palabras, ante Dios y ante todo el pueblo. Cómo los sumos sacerdotes y nuestros jefes lo entregaron para que lo condenaran a muerte, y lo crucificaron. Nosotros esperábamos que él sería el libertador de Israel, y sin embargo, han pasado ya tres días desde que estas cosas sucedieron. Es cierto que algunas mujeres de nuestro grupo nos han desconcertado, pues fueron de madrugada al sepulcro, no encontraron el cuerpo y llegaron contando que se les habían aparecido unos ángeles, que les dijeron que estaba vivo. Algunos de nuestros compañeros fueron al sepulcro y hallaron todo como habían dicho las mujeres, pero a él no lo vieron”. Entonces Jesús les dijo: “¿Qué insensatos son ustedes y qué duros de corazón para creer todo lo anunciado por los profetas! ¿Acaso no era necesario que el Mesías padeciera todo esto y así entrara en su gloria?” Y comenzando por Moisés y siguiendo con todos los profetas, les explicó todos los pasajes de la

Escritura que se referían a él. Ya cerca del pueblo a donde se dirigían, él hizo como que iba más lejos; pero ellos le insistieron, diciendo: “Quédate con nosotros, porque ya es tarde y pronto va a oscurecer”. Y entró para quedarse con ellos. Cuando estaban a la mesa, tomó un pan, pronunció la bendición, lo partió y se lo dio. Entonces se les abrieron los ojos y lo reconocieron, pero él se les desapareció. Y ellos se decían el uno al otro: “¿Con razón nuestro corazón ardía, mientras nos hablaba por el camino y nos explicaba las Escrituras!” Se levantaron inmediatamente y regresaron a Jerusalén, donde encontraron reunidos a los Once con sus compañeros, los cuales les dijeron: “De veras ha resucitado el Señor y se le ha aparecido a Simón”. Entonces ellos contaron lo que les había pasado por el camino y cómo lo habían reconocido al partir el pan.



Los discípulos huyen de Jerusalén, el lugar de la cruz, con tristeza y desesperanza. Jesús se acerca en nuestros momentos de pérdida y oscuridad, aunque a menudo nuestra ceguera espiritual nos impide reconocerlo. Jesús les explica las Escrituras, revelando que el sufrimiento era necesario para entrar en la gloria. Esto nos enseña que solo a través de la interpretación de la Biblia a la luz de Cristo podemos entender los sucesos dolorosos de la vida. Al partir el pan, se les abren los ojos. El momento culminante, que es la "liturgia del pan", es cuando reconocen al Resucitado, encontrando en la [Eucaristía el misterio de luz](#) que disipa las dudas. Esta frase de los discípulos es una invitación a la hospitalidad y a la oración, reconociendo que Jesús es la luz en el "atardecer" de la vida. Al reconocerlo, regresan inmediatamente a Jerusalén para compartir la alegría de la resurrección, convirtiéndose en testigos.

DOMINGO III DA PÁSCOA



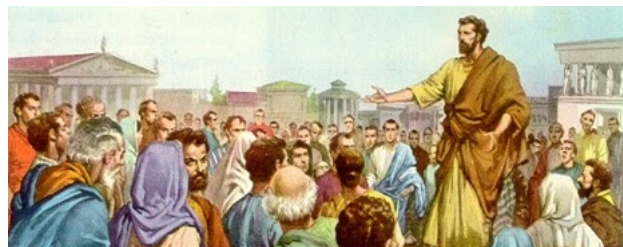
EVANGELHO DE SÃO JOÃO 24, 13-35

Dois dos discípulos de Emaús iam a caminho duma povoação chamada Emaús, que ficava a sessenta estádios de Jerusalém. Conversavam entre si sobre tudo o que tinha sucedido. Enquanto falavam e discutiam, Jesus aproximou-se deles e pôs-se com eles a caminho. Mas os seus olhos estavam impedidos de O reconhecerem. Ele perguntou-lhes: «Que palavras são essas que trocáis entre vós pelo caminho?» Pararam entristecidos. E um deles, chamado Cléofas, respondeu: «Tu és o único habitante de Jerusalém a ignorar o que lá se passou estes dias». E Ele perguntou: «Que foi?» Responderam-lhe: «O que se refere a Jesus de Nazaré, profeta poderoso em obras e palavras diante de Deus e de todo o povo; e como os príncipes dos sacerdotes e os nossos chefes O entregaram para ser condenado à morte e crucificado. Nós esperávamos que fosse Ele quem havia de libertar Israel. Mas, afinal, é já o terceiro dia depois que isto aconteceu. É verdade que algumas mulheres do nosso grupo nos sobressaltaram: foram de madrugada ao sepulcro, não encontraram o corpo de Jesus e vieram dizer que lhes tinham aparecido uns Anjos a anunciar que Ele estava vivo. Mas a Ele não O viram». Então Jesus disse-lhes: «Homens sem inteligência e lentos de espírito para acreditar em tudo o que os profetas anunciaram! Não tinha o Messias de sofrer tudo isso para entrar na Sua glória?» Depois, começando por Moisés e passando por todos os Profetas, explicou-lhes em todas as Escrituras o que Lhe dizia respeito. Ao chegarem perto da povoação para onde iam, Jesus fez menção de ir para diante. Mas eles convenceram-n'O a ficar, dizendo: «Ficai connosco, Senhor, porque o dia está a terminar e vem caindo a noite». Jesus entrou e ficou com eles. E quando se pôs à mesa, tomou o pão, recitou a bênção,

partiu-o e entregou-lho. Nesse momento abriram-se-lhes os olhos e reconheceram-n'O. Mas Ele desapareceu da sua presença. Disseram então um para o outro: «Não ardia cá dentro o nosso coração, quando Ele nos falava pelo caminho e nos explicava as Escrituras?» Partiram imediatamente de regresso a Jerusalém e encontraram reunidos os Onze e os que estavam com ele, que diziam: «Na verdade, o Senhor ressuscitou e apareceu a Simão». E eles contaram o que tinha acontecido no caminho e como O tinham reconhecido ao partir o pão.



Lucas convida-nos a acompanhar dois discípulos que, abalados pela aparente falência do projeto de Jesus, desistem da comunidade cristã e põem-se a caminho de uma outra vida. No entanto Jesus, sem se identificar, acompanha-os no caminho, ajuda-os a encontrar respostas, devolve-lhes a esperança. Eles só reconhecem Jesus quando, à mesa, Ele parte e reparte o pão. O relato é uma maravilhosa parábola sobre os nossos desencontros e encontros com Jesus ressuscitado.



A primeira leitura é um extrato do discurso de Pedro na manhã de Pentecostes. Anuncia aos habitantes de Jerusalém e ao mundo que, aquele Jesus assassinado pelas autoridades judaicas, derrotou a maldade, a injustiça, e a própria morte.
