Pastor's Notes

“See what love the Father has bestowed upon us in letting us be called children of God! Yet that indeed is what we are” (1 John 3:1). Easter Sunday and spring time at Corpus Christi bring out the best of our parish family, as we realize the joy of being adopted sons and daughters of the one true Father, through the Paschal Mystery of His only begotten Son Jesus. Christ living, dying and rising opens all the darkened tombs of our lives, to pour out upon us the light and love of His Spirit in glory. The profound mystery of the Resurrection is so great, that it cannot be contained to simply one Sunday. But the Easter season goes on for the great fifty days; right up to Pentecost celebrating the birth of the Church.

This spring 2023 feels like the first time that I as your Pastor, am not contemplating huge financial costs for construction projects around the parish. In the last six years we have spent in excess of 2.5 million dollars of your money (and insurance coverage) on the parish buildings (exterior roofs on church and school; parking lots; boilers; windows in school; Last Supper window in Sanctuary; ceiling repair in church; lighting and security cameras; gym floor; bathroom repairs; just to mention the necessary major expenditures). As you can see in the accompanying picture, the only construction we are planning for this summer is a wheelchair ramp leading people into the main entrance of the church (estimates under \$20,000; to be paid for by our parish Fall-Fundraiser). Fortunately, Corpus Christi still stands on solid financial footing: because of parishioners' generosity all year long (Easter alone \$55,000); because of some strong and safe portfolio investments; because of some generous wills/bequests; and because of a deeply dedicated finance committee led by chairperson Ann-Marie Ely, trustee Patricia Moyett, and trustee Joe Basel. Thank you one and all, for making my life and job a lot easier!



As Pastor of this blessed parish for nearly seven years now, I thank all of you for making Holy Week and Easter such a powerful experience of profound faith in the Risen Christ. The church office staff members, volunteers, musicians, choirs, lectors, Communion ministers, altar servers, ushers, sacristans, money counters, decorators, boy scouts, fire fighters, florists, linen ladies and all of you as people of prayer in the pews, give so much of yourselves to God through Corpus Christi. On behalf of Bishop Anjay, Father Ngozi, Father Jerome, Deacon Brian, our gratitude goes up to God in heaven, for all your sacrificial giving on earth, to build up the Kingdom of God here in magnificent Mineola.

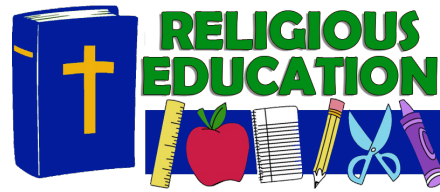

III DOMINGO DE PASCUA



EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 24, 13-35

El Evangelio de hoy nos narra la conocida escena de los discípulos de Emaús. Estos dos discípulos, al igual que sus compañeros, habían depositado sus esperanzas en Jesús, pero su muerte ha caído sobre ellos como una loza. Su vida, sin Jesús, ya no tiene sentido. El desaliento y la decepción los impide recordar que Jesús les había anunciado, que resucitaría al tercer día después de muerto. La tristeza es la primera derrota y huyen debatiendo por el camino los acontecimientos que los perturba. Jesús se les aparece y camina con ellos preguntándoles y escuchándoles para luego confrontarles con las Escrituras a través de una explicación. Los ojos de los discípulos están velados para reconocer al Resucitado. La contestación que dan a Jesús expresa la preocupaciones en las que se debaten. Jesús comienza a explicarles su Pasión empezando por Moisés y siguiendo por los profetas (v.27). Al llegar a la aldea, los discípulos le insisten que se quede con ellos. Puestos a cenar, Jesús tomó el pan y lo bendijo; se les abrieron los ojos a estos fugitivos y le reconocieron, pero Jesús desapareció de su vista y corrieron a Jerusalén a contar a sus compañeros la experiencia con el Resucitado. Hoy como ayer, Jesús sale a nuestro encuentro a través de las Escrituras para dar sentido a nuestra vida y para revelarnos que sólo podemos vivir la novedad de la vida que Él, si escuchamos en su totalidad la Palabra de Dios. La vida cristiana no es auténtica si falta la presencia del Resucitado que transforma nuestras vidas. En la Eucaristía es donde mejor se expresa lo que quiere comunicarnos este texto evangélico. Todas las semanas acudimos a la Eucaristía para confrontar nuestra vida con la palabra de Dios y para alimentarnos con el pan eucarístico, que Jesús bendice y nos reparte, y salimos para testimoniar lo

que hemos vivido en la presencia del Resucitado. Los discípulos se levantan de la mesa y vuelven a la comunidad de Jerusalén a anunciar a sus hermanos la experiencia con el Resucitado.



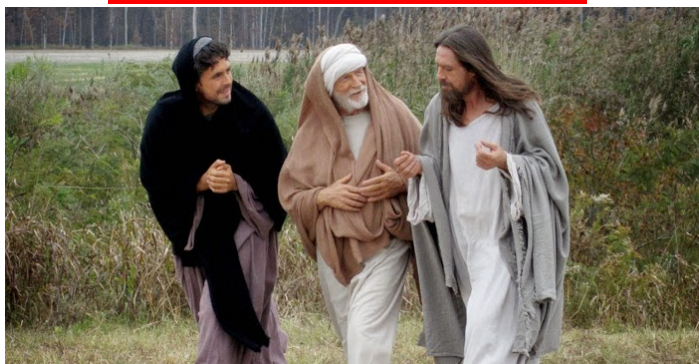
La 1ª Lectura de los Hechos de los Apóstoles, nos sitúa en la mañana del día de Pentecostés, en Jerusalén. La comunidad cristiana transformada por el Espíritu, dejó la seguridad de las paredes del cenáculo y se preparó para dar testimonio de Jesús, en Jerusalén y hasta los confines del mundo. En ese contexto, Lucas pone en boca de Pedro, el portavoz de los Doce, un discurso, que constituyó el primer anuncio de Jesús a los habitantes de la ciudad y a todos los que se encontraban allí para celebrar la fiesta judía de Shvuot (Pentecostés), fiesta celebrada cincuenta días después de Pascua judía, y en la cual se ofrecían a Dios los primeros frutos de la tierra. El discurso de Pedro reproduce la enseñanza de la actividad de Jesús, anuncio de su muerte y de su resurrección y salvación que de ahí brota. Pedro es aquí, el portavoz de esa comunidad que da testimonio de la oferta de salvación que Jesús vino a realizar y que recibió de Él la misión de anunciarla a los hombres de toda la tierra.



La segunda Lectura de la Primera carta de Pedro, nos invita a contemplar con ojos limpios el proyecto salvador de Dios por los hombres. El autor de la Carta exhorta a los creyentes a mantenerse fieles en su fe, a pesar de los sufrimientos.

DOMINGO III DA PÁSCOA



EVANGELHO DE SÃO LUCAS 24, 13-35

No terceiro domingo depois da Páscoa, temos o Evangelho maravilhoso dos Discípulos de Emaús. Somente no Evangelho de São Lucas encontramos essa narrativa. O texto põe-nos a caminhar com dois discípulos de Jesus que, no dia de Páscoa, vão de Jerusalém para a aldeia de Emaús. Estes discípulos partiram para a sua aldeia na manhã de Páscoa sem investigar os rumores de que o túmulo estava vazio e Jesus tinha ressuscitado. O que interessa ao autor é explicar aos cristãos para quem escreve – na década de 80 – como é que podem descobrir que Jesus está vivo e como podem fazer a experiência do encontro com Jesus ressuscitado. Trata-se de uma página de catequese, mais do que a descrição fiel de acontecimentos concretos. Os dois discípulos estão tristes e desanimados, pois os seus sonhos de triunfo e glória ao lado de Jesus ruíram pela base, com a sua morte na cruz. Como todos os outros discípulos, eles esperavam um Messias que iria restaurar o reino de David. Abandonam a comunidade que, doravante, não parece fazer qualquer sentido, e regressam à sua aldeia. Eles não tem olhos para reconhecê-lo porque a desilusão lhes turba o espírito. No sepulcro do Crucificado ficaram sepultadas suas esperanças messiânicas de triunfalismo político. Quando Jesus se põe a caminhar com eles, os discípulos não percebem quem os acompanha. Jesus lhes explica as Escrituras. Eles então percebem que o messias tinha de sofrer para entrar na glória. Quando os três chegam a Emaús os discípulos continuam a não reconhecer Jesus, mas convidam-no a ficar com eles. Ele aceita e sentam-se à mesa. Enquanto comiam, Jesus tomou o pão, recitou a bênção, partiu-o e entregou-o a eles. Neste momento os olhos deles se abriram e o reconheceram. Quando os dois

discípulos quiseram fixar seus olhos em Jesus, ele já havia desaparecido de sua vista. Contudo, aprenderam uma lição fundamental: Cristo ressuscitado continua presente entre eles, no meio da comunidade, de um modo novo e certo, isto é, pela fé que nasce de seu Pão (Eucaristia) e de sua Palavra.



A segunda leitura deste domingo, do Livro dos Actos dos Apóstolos 2, 14. 22-33, faz parte do primeiro dos 8 discursos de Pedro nos Actos dos Apóstolos. Os discursos são importantes, pois refletem a pregação no início da Igreja. Pedro faz a sua primeira pregação depois da Páscoa, dirigida tanto aos judeus presentes quanto a todos os habitantes de Jerusalém. Ele apresenta três aspectos da vida de Jesus, que faz parte do Credo mais antigo do cristianismo: O Jesus histórico, credenciado por Deus com milagres; sua morte na mão das autoridades judias e a sua ressurreição, como demonstração do seu poder para realizar a salvação de toda a humanidade. No final, Pedro termina seu discurso dizendo: “*Nós todos somos testemunhas disso*”.
