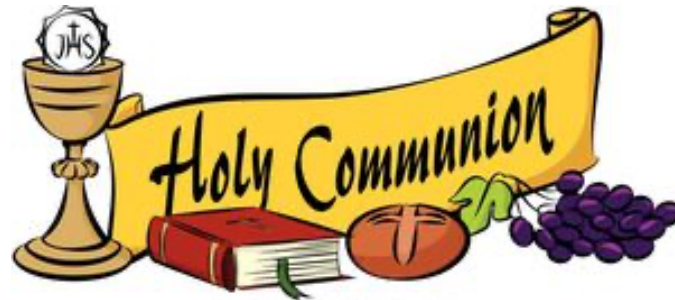

The Corpus Christi's 2021 "Continuing the Educational Mission" Scholarship Award

We are pleased to announce again this year the Corpus Christi "***Continuing the Educational Mission***" **Scholarship** award. Even though our beloved parish school has closed, the mission of educating the young people of our parish continues. It is in this spirit that the scholarship award has been established.

A committee of educators from grammar school, middle school, high school and college as well as members from the financial community was formed and worked on this program for a number of months and developed this scholarship.

Based upon the success from last year, this year we are expanding the scholarship program with the inclusion of an award for a student parishioner attending a Catholic grammar or middle school. Now three young people from our parish, will each be awarded a scholarship toward their Catholic education. A scholarship award of \$4,000 will be given to a student who will be attending starting September 2021 at a local Catholic grammar/middle school in grades 6, 7 or 8th for the academic school year 2021/2022. A scholarship award of \$5,000 will be given to a student who will be attending a local Catholic High School starting September 2021 for the academic school year 2021/2022 and a \$6,000 scholarship will be given to a matriculated college student carrying a course load of a minimum 12 credits/semester who will be attending full time starting September 2021, a 2-4 year college or university for the academic school year 2021/2022. The scholarship will be paid directly to the school, college or university in two equal payments, one half for the fall semester and the second half for the spring semester or if the academic year is divided into trimesters, half will be paid in the first trimester and the second half paid in the third trimester.

The funding for these scholarships will come directly from the investment income earned from the proceeds of the sale of the Searing Avenue properties and **not** from any weekly or special parish collections. The announcement of the scholarship recipients will be made later this summer. The scholarship is for one year.

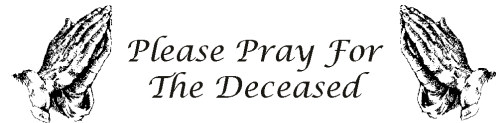

IV DOMINGO DE PASCUA



EVANGELIO SEGÚN SAN JUAN 10, 11-18

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a los fariseos: *“Yo soy el buen pastor. El buen pastor da la vida por sus ovejas. En cambio, el asalariado, el que no es el pastor ni el dueño de las ovejas, cuando ve venir al lobo, abandona las ovejas y huye; el lobo se arroja sobre ellas y las dispersa, porque a un asalariado no le importan las ovejas. Yo soy el buen pastor, porque conosco a mis ovejas y ellas me conocen a mí, así como el Padre me conoce a mí y yo conosco al Padre. Yo doy la vida por mis ovejas. Tengo además otras ovejas que no son de este redil y es necesario que las traiga también a ellas; escucharán mi voz y habrá un solo rebaño y un solo pastor. El Padre me ama porque doy mi vida para volverla a atomar. Nadie me la quita; yo la doy porque quiero. Tengo poder para darla y lo tengo también para volverla a tomar. Este es el mandato que he recibido de mi Padre”.*



Por dos veces se presenta Jesús en el evangelio de hoy como el Buen Pastor. La imagen del pastor es una de las imágenes preferidas en la Biblia para hacer comprender la relación de Dios con su Pueblo; está tomada de la vida diaria de un Pueblo

pastoril como lo era Israel. Esta denominación da nombre al IV Domingo de Pascua: **Domingo del Buen Pastor**. La imagen del Buen Pastor se contrapone a la del asalariado, y sirve para subrayar la profunda relación de Jesús con sus ovejas – que somos cada uno de nosotros –, hasta el punto de entregarse totalmente a sí mismo por nuestra salvación. El buen Pastor entrega su vida, conoce a sus ovejas; y es que a un asalariado no le importan las ovejas; en definitiva, sólo le importa el propio interés. El Buen Pastor conoce sus ovejas. **Jesús-Pastor** conoce nuestras historias, dificultades, defectos y cualidades; nos conoce y nos ama como somos y nos invita a vivir estrechamente unidos a Él.



En la Segunda Lectura de hoy San Juan nos dice que no sólo nos llamamos hijos de Dios, sino que lo somos. Nuestra identidad es que somos Hijos de Dios, pero el versículo nos lo deja muy claro, no por nuestros méritos, no porque hayamos hecho algo especial, o por ser buenos, sino porque el Padre nos ama y mando a su hijo para morir por nosotros en la cruz. El mundo no nos conoce o no cree que seamos hijos de Dios. Y si somos hijos también somos herederos de Dios de la gloria celestial que tiene preparada para sus hijos.



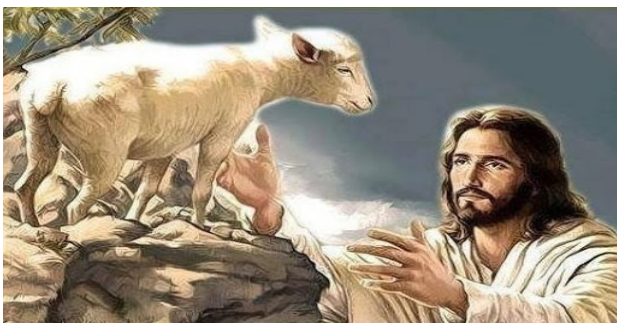

IV DOMINGO DE PÁSCOA



EVANGELHO SEGUNDO SÃO JOÃO 10, 11-18

Naquele tempo, disse Jesus: *“Eu sou o Bom Pastor. O bom pastor dá a vida pelas suas ovelhas. O mercenário, como não é pastor, nem são suas as ovelhas, logo que vê vir o lobo, deixa as ovelhas e foge, enquanto o lobo as arrebatava e dispersa. O mercenário não se preocupa com as ovelhas. Eu sou o Bom Pastor: conheço as minhas ovelhas e as minhas ovelhas reconhecem-me, do mesmo modo que o Pai me conhece e eu conheço o Pai. Eu dou a vida pelas minhas ovelhas. Tenho ainda outras ovelhas que não são deste redil e preciso de as reunir; elas ouvirão a minha voz e haverá um só rebanho e um só Pastor. Por isso o Pai me ama: porque dou a minha vida para poder retomá-la. Ninguém ma tira, sou Eu que a dou espontaneamente. Tenho o poder de a dar e de a retomar: foi este o mandamento que recebi de meu Pai”.*



No quarto domingo da Páscoa lê-se todos os anos o Evangelho do Bom Pastor. Jesus é o pastor bom que conhece suas ovelhas e é por elas conhecido, cuida delas, alimenta-as, defende-as e dá a vida por elas. E também se preocupa com as ovelhas dispersas e, talvez em perigo. Vai à procura delas, para reunir a todas no único rebanho. A Páscoa nos lembra que Jesus fez e continua a fazer isso.

Além de anunciar o Evangelho da vida a todos e de mostrar uma preocupação especial pelos pecadores, enfermos e pobres, ele também entregou sua vida sobre a cruz como prova de amor extremo pela humanidade. Ninguém ficou excluído do seu amor e doação: *“eu vim para que todos tenham vida e a tenham em abundância”.*



A Primeira Leitura deste domingo é tirada dos Actos dos Apóstolos. É uma continuação da leitura do domingo passado. Pedro e João, depois de curarem o coxo de nascimento que pedia esmola na porta do templo, são presos pelas autoridades por estarem pregando o nome de Jesus Cristo. No dia seguinte interrogam os dois sobre a cura e querem saber em nome de quem eles tinham curado o coxo. Então Pedro proclama que foi em nome de Jesus, o Nazareno. E acusam os líderes religiosos de desprezarem a pedra angular, Jesus Cristo. Ele é o fundamento da construção da nossa fé.
