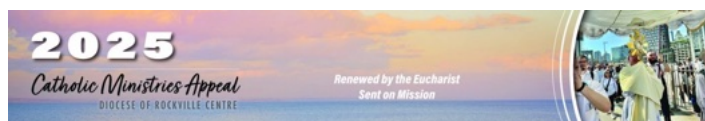

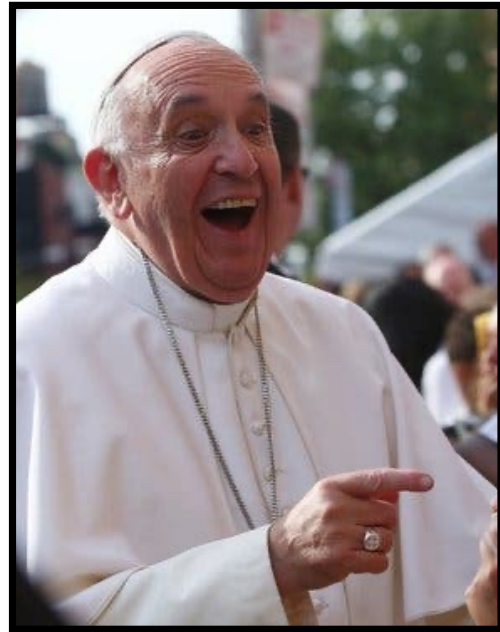

Born in Buenos Aires, Argentina, Jorge Mario Bergoglio, was ordained to Priesthood in 1969, named Cardinal by Pope John Paul II in 2001 and then elected as Pope Francis on March 13, 2023. He was the 226th pope (the first non-European pope) and the first Latin American pontiff. As the leader of the Roman Catholic Church, Pope Francis was very modest and left behind a legacy of service, unity and compassion. He was the symbol of change and hope for the Catholic Church.

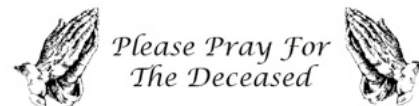

II DOMINGO DE PASCOA



EVANGELIO DE SAN JUAN 20, 19-31

Al anochecer del día de la resurrección, estando cerradas las puertas de la casa donde se hallaban los discípulos, por miedo a los judíos, se presentó Jesús en medio de ellos y les dijo: *“La paz esté con ustedes”*. Dicho esto, les mostró las manos y el costado. Cuando los discípulos vieron al Señor, se llenaron de alegría. De nuevo les dijo Jesús: *“La paz esté con ustedes. Como el Padre me ha enviado, así también los envío yo”*. Después de decir esto, sopló sobre ellos y les dijo: *“Reciban el Espíritu Santo. A los que les perdonen los pecados, les quedarán perdonados; y a los que no se los perdonen, les quedarán sin perdonar”*. Tomás, uno de los Doce, a quien llamaban el Gemelo, no estaba con ellos cuando vino Jesús y los otros discípulos le decían: *“Hemos visto al Señor”*. Pero él les contestó: *“Si no veo en sus manos la señal de los clavos y si no meto mi dedo en los agujeros de los clavos y no meto mi mano en su costado, no creeré”*. Ocho días después, estaban reunidos los discípulos a puerta cerrada y Tomás estaba con ellos. Jesús se presentó de nuevo en medio de ellos y les dijo. *“La paz esté con ustedes”*. Luego le dijo a Tomás: *“Aquí están mis manos; acerca tu dedo. Trae acá tu mano, métela en mi costado y no sigas dudando, sino cree”*. Tomás le respondió: *“¡Señor mío y Dios mío!”* Jesús añadió: *“Tú crees porque me has visto; dichosos los que creen sin haber visto”*. Otras muchas señales milagrosas hizo Jesús en presencia de sus discípulos, pero no están escritas en este libro. Se escribieron éstas para que ustedes crean que Jesús es el Mesías, el Hijo de Dios y para que, creyendo, tengan vida en su nombre.



Dice el refrán popular: fe es creer lo que no se ve. El evangelio de Juan afirma con insistencia que los discípulos vieron a Jesús resucitado y por ello creyeron. Los discípulos de Jesús vivieron auténticas horas de angustia por el hecho de la crucifixión y muerte de Jesús. No les resultaba fácil superar el hecho de sentirse defraudados ante un Mesías que había acabado sus días colgado en una cruz. La aparición de Jesús les da una visión distinta del mismo Jesús. Ellos ven a Jesús, de eso ellos no tienen duda y así lo afirman ante quienes no lo han visto. Su visión es firme y consistente y aclara toda la oscuridad en la que ellos habían quedado sumidos al desaparecer Jesús de su vista. Para Tomás no vale lo que los otros discípulos dicen. Se atreve a desafiar el testimonio de los demás apóstoles, que afirman haber visto al Señor. A Tomás creyente Jesús le hace una pequeña reflexión: *¿Porque me has visto has creído? Dichosos los que creen sin haber visto.*



La Segunda lectura, del Libro de Apocalipsis, es como una liturgia celestial que presencia Juan, el vidente-profeta de Patmos, en el día del Señor, en domingo, cuando se celebra la resurrección. Todas las comunidades del mundo entero, en el día del Señor, nos unimos en ese misterio de vida y resurrección, como las siete iglesias del Apocalipsis.



El 5 de mayo de 2000, cinco días después de la canonización de Sta. Faustina, el Vaticano decretó que el Segundo Domingo de Pascua desde ese momento sería conocido como el Domingo de la Misericordia Divina. En su visión el Diario de Sta. Faustina registra 14 ocasiones cuando Jesús le pidió que se observara la Fiesta de la Misericordia. *“La humanidad no conocerá la paz hasta que no se dirija a la Fuente de Mi misericordia”*.

DOMINGO II DA PÁSCOA



EVANGELHO DE SÃO JOÃO 20, 10-31

Na tarde daquele dia, o primeiro da semana, estando fechadas as portas da casa onde os discípulos se encontravam, com medo dos judeus, veio Jesus, apresentou-se no meio deles e disse-lhes: *“A paz esteja convosco”*. Dito isto, mostrou-lhes as mãos e o lado. Os discípulos ficaram cheios de alegria ao verem o Senhor. Jesus disse-lhes de novo. *“A paz esteja convosco. Assim como o Pai me enviou, também eu vos envio a vós”*. Dito isto, soprou sobre eles e disse-lhes: *“Recebei o Espírito Santo: àqueles a quem perdoardes os pecados ser-lhes-ão perdoados; e àqueles a quem os retiverdes ser-lhe-ão retidos”*. Tomé, um dos Doze, chamado Dídimo, não estava com eles quando veio Jesus. Disseram-lhe os outros discípulos: *“Vimos o Senhor”*. Mas ele respondeu-lhes: *“Se não vir nas suas mãos o sinal dos cravos, se não meter o dedo no lugar dos cravos e a mão no seu lado, não acreditarei”*. Oito dias depois, estavam os discípulos outra vez em casa, e Tomé com eles. Veio Jesus, estando as portas fechadas, apresentou-se no meio deles e disse: *“A paz esteja convosco”*. Depois disse a Tomé: *“Põe aqui o teu dedo e vê as minhas mãos; aproxima a tua mão e mete-a no meu lado; e não seja incrédulo, mas crente”*. Tomé respondeu-lhe: *“Meu Senhor e meu Deus”*! Disse-lhe Jesus: *“Porque me viste acreditaste: felizes os que acreditam sem terem visto”*. Muitos outros milagres fez Jesus na presença dos discípulos, que não estão escritos neste livro. Estes, porém, foram escritos para acreditardes que Jesus é o Messias, o Filho de Deus, e para que, creditando, tenhais a vida em seu nome.



No primeiro dia da semana, no Domingo, o Evangelho de João narra um encontro de Jesus ressuscitado com os discípulos. João começa por descrever a situação em que estavam os discípulos antes de Jesus lhes aparecer: o anoitecer, as portas fechadas, o medo, traduzem a insegurança e o desamparo que eles sentem diante desse mundo hostil que condenou Jesus à morte. Mas de repente o próprio Jesus apresenta-se no meio deles. O crucificado está vivo; a morte não o derrotou. Na aparição a seus discípulos, que nos é narrada pelo Evangelho de hoje, Jesus lhes transmite duas graças próprias de sua Páscoa: A paz e a reconciliação. A paz do mundo é sempre falsa e aparente. Ela se baseia nos medos mútuos, nos equilíbrios de poder, na corrida armamentista. A paz que Jesus transmite está baseada na justiça e na fraternidade reais. Essa paz é também obra da reconciliação. O evangelista João escolhe Tomé como símbolo das dificuldades que todos os discípulos encontram para conseguir acreditar na ressurreição de Jesus.



Na segunda leitura, do Livro do Apocalipse, João, o profeta da ilha de Patmos, na Grécia, apresenta aos cristãos perseguidos a visão do filho do homem. Trata-se de Jesus ressuscitado, o primeiro e o fim de todas as coisas, aquele que derrotou a morte e tudo o que a ela está ligado. Ele está com a sua Igreja e caminha com ela pelos caminhos da história. É nele que a comunidade encontra a força para caminhar e para vencer as forças que se opõem à vida nova de Deus.
