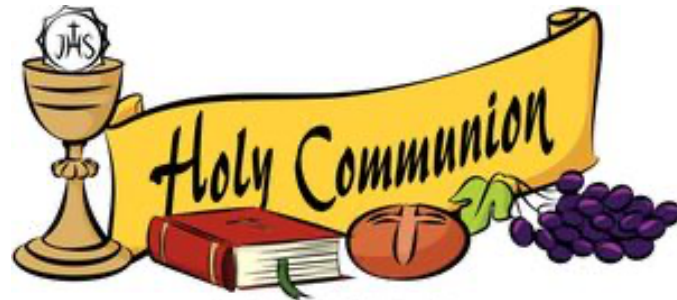

## **The Corpus Christi's 2021 "Continuing the Educational Mission" Scholarship Award**

We are pleased to announce again this year the Corpus Christi "***Continuing the Educational Mission***" **Scholarship** award. Even though our beloved parish school has closed, the mission of educating the young people of our parish continues. It is in this spirit that the scholarship award has been established.

A committee of educators from grammar school, middle school, high school and college as well as members from the financial community was formed and worked on this program for a number of months and developed this scholarship.

Based upon the success from last year, this year we are expanding the scholarship program with the inclusion of an award for a student parishioner attending a Catholic grammar or middle school. Now three young people from our parish, will each be awarded a scholarship toward their Catholic education. A scholarship award of \$4,000 will be given to a student who will be attending starting September 2021 at a local Catholic grammar/middle school in grades 6, 7 or 8<sup>th</sup> for the academic school year 2021/2022. A scholarship award of \$5,000 will be given to a student who will be attending a local Catholic High School starting September 2021 for the academic school year 2021/2022 and a \$6,000 scholarship will be given to a matriculated college student carrying a course load of a minimum 12 credits/semester who will be attending full time starting September 2021, a 2-4 year college or university for the academic school year 2021/2022. The scholarship will be paid directly to the school, college or university in two equal payments, one half for the fall semester and the second half for the spring semester or if the academic year is divided into trimesters, half will be paid in the first trimester and the second half paid in the third trimester.

The funding for these scholarships will come directly from the investment income earned from the proceeds of the sale of the Searing Avenue properties and **not** from any weekly or special parish collections. The announcement of the scholarship recipients will be made later this summer. The scholarship is for one year.

## V DOMINGO DE PASCUA



### EVANGELIO SEGÚN SAN JUAN 15, 1-8

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: Yo soy la verdadera vid y mi Padre es el viñador. Al sarmiento que no da fruto en mí, él lo arranca, y al que da fruto lo poda para que dé más fruto. Ustedes ya están purificados por las palabras que les he dicho. Permanezcan en mí y yo en ustedes. Como el sarmiento no puede dar fruto por sí mismo, si no permanece en la vid, así tampoco ustedes, si no permanecen en mí. Yo soy la vid, ustedes los sarmientos; el que permanece en mí y yo en él, ése da fruto abundante, porque sin mí nada pueden hacer. Al que no permanece en mí se le echa fuera, como al sarmiento, y se sea; luego lo recogen, lo arrojan al fuego y arde. Si permanecen en mí y mis palabras permanecen en ustedes, pidan lo que quieran y se les concederá. La gloria de mi Padre consiste en que den mucho fruto y se manifiesten así como discípulos míos.



La idea que, en el marco de la Última Cena, Jesús quiere transmitir a sus discípulos por medio de esta especie de parábola es de grande sencillez y extraordinaria clarividencia: entre Él y sus discípulos, hay comunión de vida una vida de calidad divina que fluye de Cristo a los discípulos. A la manera como el sarmiento vive y da fruto gracias a su inserción en la vid, así los discípulos sólo pueden dar fruto si permanecen unidos a

Jesús. Esa unión consiste en la mutua permanencia de los discípulos en Jesús y de Jesús en los discípulos. La vid es una planta que da el fruto provechoso de la uva. El Padre favorece la comunión de los discípulos con Jesús podando los sarmientos que llevan fruto pafra que su fruto se acreciente y mejore en calidad; pero se el sarmiento se desconecta de la vid (por su desatención a la palabra de Jesús, su abandono de la oración, su alejamiento de los sacramentos, o en endurecimiento del corazón para los hermanos), termina secándose y el Padre lo corta (no tiene por qué ser inmediatamente, pues la misericordia de Dios no tiene límites). Al igual que el fruto colma la satisfacción del agricultor, así el buen discípulo, llevando una vida semejante a la de Jesús, es la gloria del Padre, que se gloria de que el hombre viva.



El amor que el Espíritu de Dios suscita en el creyente no es, como disse san Juan en su primera carta que leemos este domingo, un amor que se diluye en hermosas declaraciones, sino que se traduce en obras; éste es un amor de verdad, por tanto, los que lo practican son de verdad pues tienen en sí el amor de Dios, que tapa multitud de pecados, pues Dios es mayor que nuestro corazón.



Pablo, después de su conversión en el camino de Damasco, vuelve a Jerusalén, pero todos tenían miedo, porque no creían que se hubiera convertido en discípulo. El ha sido el gran perseguidor de los cristianos, pero ahora es el gran predicador de la Palabra.

### V DOMINGO DE PÁSCOA



#### EVANGELHO DE SÃO JOÃO 15, 1-8

Naquele tempo, disse Jesus aos seus discípulos: *“Eu sou a verdadeira vide e meu Pai é o agricultor. Ele corta todo o ramo que está em mim e não dá fruto e limpa todo aquele que dá fruto, para que dê ainda mais fruto. Vós já estais limpos, por causa da palavra que vos anunciei. Permanecei em mim e eu permanecerei em vós. Como o ramo não pode dar fruto por si mesmo, se não permanecer na videira, assim também vós, se não permanecerdes em mim. Eu sou a videira, vós sois os ramos. Se alguém permanecer em mim e eu nele, esse dá muito fruto, porque sem mim nada podeis fazer. Se alguém não permanece em mim, será lançado fora, como o ramo, e secará. Esses ramos, apanham-nos, lançam-nos ao fogo e eles ardem. Se permanecerdes em mim e as minhas palavras permanecerem em vós, pedireis o que quiserdes e ser-vos-á concedido. A glória de meu Pai é que deis muito fruto. Então vos tornareis meus discípulos”.*



No domingo passado, Jesus se apresentava como o Bom Pastor. Neste domingo ele se apresenta como a Videira Verdadeira. No Antigo Testamento, a imagem da videira indicava o povo de Israel, simbolizando a relação do povo com Deus. O povo

era como uma videira que Deus plantou com muito carinho, mas a videira não correspondeu ao que Deus esperava. Em vez de uvas saborosas deu frutos azedos, amargos. Para que nós sejamos ramos frutíferos precisamos ouvir e guardar bem as palavras da verdadeira videira: Todo o ramo que, estando em mim, não der fruto, ele o corta; e todo o que dá fruto limpa, para que produza mais fruto ainda. Para que mais uvas cresçam, o Senhor poda os ramos, removendo os rebentos inúteis e tudo o que poderia desviar a força vital da produção. A poda é dolorosa, mas necessária. Permanecer em Jesus é essencial para viver e frutificar.



Saulo, um soldado romano, tinha a missão de ir a cidade de Damasco para prender os cristãos. No caminho ele tem um “encontro” com Jesus e, de perseguidor dos cristãos, ele se transforma num discípulo de Cristo e pregador do seu Evangelho, adotando o nome de Paulo.

Meus filhinhos, não amemos de palavra, nem de língua, mas por obra e em verdade.
