## Corpus Christi's 2024 "Continuing the Educational Mission" Scholarship Award

We are pleased to announce again this year the Corpus Christi "***Continuing the Educational Mission***" **Scholarship** award. Even though our beloved parish school has closed, the mission of educating the young people of our parish continues. It is in this spirit that the scholarship award has been established.

A committee of educators from grammar school, middle school, high school and college as well as members from the financial community was formed and worked on this program for several months and developed this scholarship.

Based upon the success from past years, we will continue to offer three scholarships this year:

- One for 2 student parishioners attending a Catholic High School
- One for a student parishioner attending, full time, a college or university.

Now three young people from our parish will each be awarded a scholarship toward their education. A scholarship award of \$5,000 will be given to two students who will be attending a local Catholic High School starting September 2024 for the academic school year 2024/2025.

A scholarship award of \$7,000 will be given to a matriculated college student carrying a full-time course load of a minimum 12 credits/semester who will be attending starting August/September 2024, a 2-4-year college or university for the academic school year 2024/2025.

The scholarship will be paid directly to the school, college or university in two equal payments, one half for the fall semester and the second half for the spring semester or if the academic year is divided into trimesters, half will be paid in the first trimester and the second half paid in the third trimester. The funding for these scholarships will come directly from the investment income earned from the proceeds of the sale of the Searing Avenue properties and **not** from any weekly or special parish collections. The announcement of the scholarship recipients will be made later this summer on or around August 3<sup>rd</sup>. The scholarship is for one year. Applications must be submitted to the rectory by June 21<sup>st</sup>, 2024.

### FEAST OF ST. LOUISE DE MARILLAC May 9

The King will say to those on his right hand, "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry, and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me...I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me."

Louise de Marillac, (1591-1660), married Antoine LeGras and they had a son whom they named Michel, but at the age of 34 she became a widow. Vincent de Paul became her spiritual director and under his guidance she began caring for the poor and visiting the Confraternities of Charity. Vincent and Louise co-founded the Company of the Daughters of Charity, and dedicated them to serve the poor with humility, simplicity and charity.

Louise de Marillac said: "Above all, be very gentle and courteous toward your poor. You know that they are our masters and that we must love them tenderly and respect them deeply. It is not enough for these maxims to be in our minds; we must bear witness to them by our gentle and charitable care.

In 1960, Pope John XXIII proclaimed Louise the patron saint of all Christian social workers. Please think about becoming a Vincentian. Corpus Christi Conference meets right here in the Parish Hall once a month for about one hour. Our Motto is: "Spirituality-Friendship-Service" The poor needs us and we need you! ## VI DOMINGO DE PASCUA



### EVANGELIO DE SAN JUAN 15, 9-17

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: *“Como el Padre me ama, así los amo yo. Permanezcan en mi amor. Si cumplen mis mandamientos, permanecen en mi amor; lo mismo que yo cumplo los mandamiento de mi Padre y permanezco en su amor. Les he dicho esto para que mi alegría esté en ustedes y su alegría sea plena. Este es mi mandamiento: que se amen los unos a los otros como yo los he amado. Nadie tiene amor más grande a sus amigos que el que da la vida por ellos. Ustedes son mis amigos, si hacen lo que yo le mando. Ya no los llamo siervos, porque el siervo no sabe lo que hace su amo; a ustedes los llamo amigos, porque les he dado a conocer todo lo que le he oído a mi Padre. No son ustedes los que me han elegido, soy yo quien los ha elegido y los ha destinado para que vayan y den fruto y su fruto permanezca, de modo que el Padre les conceda cuanto le pidan en mi nombre. Esto es lo que le mando: que se amen los unos a los otros”*.



En este discurso de despedida de Jesús a los discípulos en la Última Cena, Juan nos propone una catequesis donde son presentadas las principales características de ese “camino” que los discípulos deben recorrer, tras la marcha de Jesús en este mundo. Juan se refiere, de forma especial, a la relación de Jesús con los discípulos y a la misión que los discípulos serán llamados a desempeñar en el mundo. La relación del Padre con Jesús es el modelo

de relación de Jesús con los discípulos. El Padre amó a Jesús y le demostró siempre su amor; y Jesús correspondió al amor del Padre, cumpliendo sus mandamientos. De la misma forma, Jesús amó a los discípulos y les demostró siempre su amor; y los discípulos deben corresponder al amor de Jesús, cumpliendo sus mandamientos. El texto del Evangelio termina con una nueva referencia al mandamiento de Jesús: *“amaos los unos a los otros”*. El amor compartido es la condición para estar vinculado a Jesús y dar fruto. Si este mandamiento se cumple, Jesús estará siempre presente al lado de sus discípulos.



La primera lectura de hoy es un resumen de un gran relato que Lucas, el autor de los Hechos, ha colocado en su narrativa un momento difícil en la vida de la primera comunidad. Las primeras comunidades cristianas eran todas de origen judía. El pagano (no judío) era un ser impuro, en casa del cual el buen judío tenía prohibido entrar para no contaminarse. Lucas, el autor de los Hechos de los Apóstoles está interesado en dejar claro que Dios quiere que su propuesta de salvación llegue a todos los hombres. Cada día se hacía más necesario que los discípulos rompieran con las exigencias rituales y legales del judaísmo. Para los primeros cristianos, no era claro que los paganos tuviesen acceso a la salvación y que pudiesen entrar en la Iglesia de Jesús. El Espíritu, como en Pentecostés, quien va a tomar la iniciativa para abrir el cristianismo a otros hombres y a otros pueblos. Cornelio es el primer pagano oficialmente admitido en la comunidad de Jesús.

*Porque de tal manera amó Dios al mundo, que ha dado a su Hijo unigénito, para que todo aquel que en él cree, no se pierda, mas tenga vida eterna.*

## DOMINGO VI DA PÁSCOA



### EVANGELHO DE SÃO JOÃO 15, 9-17

Naquele tempo, disse Jesus aos seus discípulos: *“Assim como o Pai me amou, também eu vos amei. Permanecei no meu amor. Se guardardes os meus mandamentos, permaneceréis no meu amor, assim como eu tenho guardado os mandamentos de meu Pai e permaneço no seu amor. Disse-vos estas coisas, para que a minha alegria esteja em vós e a vossa alegria seja completa. É este o meu mandamento: que vos ameis uns aos outros, como eu vos amei. Ninguém tem maior amor do que aquele que dá a vida pelo amigo. Vós sois meus amigos se fizerdes o que eu vos mando. Já não vos chamo servos, porque o servo não sabe o que faz o seu senhor; mas chamo-vos amigos, porque vos dei a conhecer tudo o que ouvi a meu Pai. Não fostes vós que me escolhestes; fui eu que vos escolhi e destinei, para que vades e deis fruto e o vosso fruto permaneça. E assim, tudo quanto pedirdes ao Pai em meu nome, Ele vo-lo concederá. O que vos mando é que vos ameis uns aos outros”*.

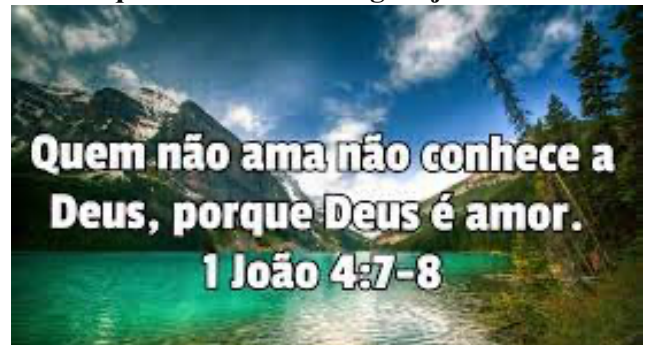


O Evangelho do sexto domingo da Páscoa situa-nos em Jerusalém, na noite antes da celebração da Páscoa judaica. Jesus está à mesa com os seus discípulos, na última ceia, antes da sua morte na cruz. Sobre Jesus e o seu grupo de discípulos paira a sombra da cruz. Nessa noite, após a ceia, Jesus dirige-se ao Getsemani, um jardim situado no sopé

do Monte das Oliveiras, onde estará alguns momentos em oração. Aí será preso pelos soldados do Templo. Na manhã do dia seguinte, depois de a sentença ser confirmada pelo governador romano Pilatos, Jesus será crucificado. Ele está perfeitamente consciente do que o espera nas próximas horas. Ele preocupa-se com os seus discípulos que estão com ele à mesa nessa noite de quinta-feira. Depois da ceia, Jesus fala longamente com os discípulos e deixa-lhes as suas últimas indicações. É nessa noite que Jesus dá aos seus discípulos o mandamento maior, pois é preciso amar a Deus sobre todas as coisas e ao próximo como a si mesmo. No fim da sua vida, Jesus já nem sequer falará de dois, mas dum só mandamento: *ameis uns aos outros como eu vos amei*.



A primeira leitura deste domingo é dos Actos dos Apóstolos. Era rigorosamente proibido a um judeu a entrada em casa dum pagão. Por causa desta disposição, os primeiros cristãos, que eram todos de origem judaica, perguntaram-se durante muito tempo se Deus queria que a salvação fosse levada também aos não judeus, isto é, aos pagãos. A resposta é dada pelo episódio do baptismo de Cornélio, o comandante da guarnição militar romana estacionada na cidade de Cesareia. Diz Pedro: *“Na verdade, eu reconheço que Deus não faz acepção de pessoas, mas, em qualquer nação, aquele que O teme e practica a justiça é-lhe agradável”*. E Pedro baptiza Cornélio e toda a sua família. São os primeiros cristão que não eram de origem judia.
