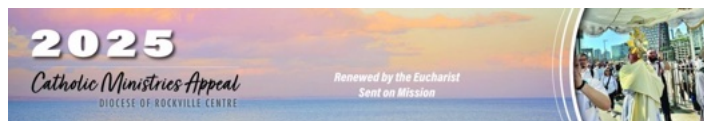

You may run the risk of having your vehicle towed during Mass (God forbid!). Please park properly, so that you can participate peacefully in the Eucharist.





As I write these words, our Catholic cardinals in Rome are gathering for the first day in Conclave, to choose a new Holy Father for our Church. Perhaps as you read these words, we may already have a new Pope to lead the world as the Vicar of Christ. While still mourning the death of our beloved successor to St. Peter in Pope Francis, we nevertheless pray for the Spirit of Jesus Himself to guide the college in the Sistine Chapel; to elect a pontiff who will imitate the love and truth of Christ the Lord, the one and only High Priest!

You may have heard this past week, that our gifted Bishop Anjay Zglejszewski will be leaving Corpus Christi, to become Pastor of St. Joseph in Garden City. He will continue his duties as an Auxiliary Bishop in the Diocese, but now with added responsibilities of shepherding the people of his new parish. Bishop Anjay has truly been a blessing to all of us these past eight years, and we will miss his joyful presence in the rectory among his brother priests. Please pray for him as he begins this new challenge of spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ to his new flock!

All of you know our own Deacon Brian Mannix, who is a lifer here at Corpus Christi. One of the best moves I have made as Pastor, was hiring Brian eight years ago to work in the Parish as a part-time Pastoral Associate. You see him regularly on the Altar doing the sacramental ministries of the Church. But Brian does so much more behind the scenes; in helping so many people, and in assisting the business management of our Parish. On Sunday 1 June 2025 at the 11:30 AM Mass, Brian will be celebrating his 25th anniversary of Ordination to the Diaconate. His friend from past seminary days is Bishop Edward Scharfenberger of the Diocese of Albany, who will be the main celebrant, along with Father Tom Arnao (another long-time friend) who will be the homilist. Please come to pray and rejoice with Deacon Brian and his wife Sue; to thank God for his whole life here in Mineola!

Pope Francis' 2025 Jubilee Year of Hope, along with our American Bishops' Eucharistic Revival, will come together on Sunday 8 June, here in our Diocese. Two "Eucharistic Pilgrimage Processions" (one from Eastern Long Island and the other from the West) will converge at St. Anthony's High School in South Huntington for this joyful celebration with our Bishop John Barres. Part of the western procession will come through Corpus Christi, beginning with Mass celebrated by Bishop Anjay on Wednesday 4 June at 7:30am. Following the morning Mass, we will process with the Blessed Sacrament through the streets of Mineola to Chaminade High School. Please join in this Mass & procession, in part to give thanks for Bishop Anjay's time with us, and in gratitude to God for our Catholic faith in the living Body of Christ at Corpus Christi!

IV DOMINGO DE PASCUA



EVANGELIO DE SAN JUAN 10, 27-30

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a los judíos: “Mis ovejas escuchan mi voz; yo las conozco y ellas me siguen. Yo les doy la vida eterna y no perecerán jamás; nadie las arrebatará de mi mano. Me las ha dado mi Padre, y él es superior a todos, y nadie puede arrebatarlas de la mano del Padre. El Padre y yo somos uno”.



Siempre se ha considerado este domingo el domingo del Buen Pastor a causa del evangelio del día que habla de las ovejas. El evangelista Juan nos describe al pastor como protector de sus ovejas frente a la persecución. Al decir que Jesús es el Buen Pastor, excluimos la condición de aquellos guías contratados que apenas sí cumplen con la tarea que se les ha confiado. El pastor bueno llega hasta identificarse con sus ovejas y éstas a su manera con él. Con esta imagen se habla de una relación personal de Cristo con sus fieles, con sus seguidores. Y no tenemos que extrañarnos de que en todo este lenguaje bíblico sobre el Pastor y las ovejas, se nos ofrezca la paradoja del Cordero que hace de Pastor. Dar la vida por los fieles no es sólo una imagen sino una realidad cruenta que trae consigo derramamiento de sangre. Ya en el libro de Isaías se ofrece esta imagen del Siervo (Pastor y Cordero) que expuso su vida a la muerte y fue llevado al matadero y con su muerte justificó a una muchedumbre inmensa.



La primera lectura del Hecho de los Apóstoles nos presenta Pablo ante un auditorio judío, si bien con la presencia de paganos. Ya se han roto las barreras fundamentales entre cristianismo y judaísmo. Los seguidores de Jesús han recibido un nombre nuevo, el de cristianos, en la gran ciudad de Antioquía de Siria, y esta comunidad ha delegado a Bernabé y Pablo para anunciar el evangelio entre lo paganos. Es una opción muy determinada y determinante de dicha comunidad. Los judíos azuzaron a las mujeres devotas de la alta sociedad y a los ciudadanos principales, provocando una persecución contra Pablo y Bernabé, hasta expulsarlos de su territorio, Antioquía de Pisidia.



La visión de este domingo, del Libro del Apocalipsis, no es elitista, es litúrgica, como corresponde al mundo simbólico, pero se reúnen todos los hombres de toda raza, lengua y lugar: son todos los que han vivido y han luchado por un mundo mejor, como hizo Jesucristo. Los vestidos blancos y la palma en la mano denotan vida tras muerte violenta, como la victoria del mismo Señor resucitado. No habrá más hambre, ni sed y todos beberán de la fuente de agua viva. Es toda una revelación de resurrección. Eso es lo que nos espera tras la muerte, por eso merece la pena luchar aquí por la causa de Jesús.

DOMINGO IV DA PÁSCOA



EVANGELHO DE SÃO 10, 27-30

Naquele tempo, disse Jesus: *“As minhas ovelhas escutam a minha voz. Eu conheço as minhas ovelhas e elas seguem-me. Eu dou-lhes a vida eterna e nunca hão de perecer e ninguém as arrebatará da minha mão. Meu Pai, que mas deu, é mais do que todos e ninguém pode arrebatá-las da mão do Pai. Eu e o Pai somos um só”.*



A terra de Israel em grande parte é montanhosa e apta para a atividade pastoril. Guardas de rebanhos foram Jacó, Moisés, David. Não deve, pois, causar surpresa se na Bíblia aparecem frequentemente imagens da vida pastoril. Deus é chamado de Pastor de Israel: Conduz o seu povo como um rebanho, trata-o com amor e desvelo e o conduz para pastagens abundantes e para fontes de água cristalina (Salmo 23,1; 80,2). No Evangelho de João, Jesus retoma esta imagem do Antigo Testamento e a aplica a si mesmo. O quarto domingo da Páscoa é conhecido como o domingo do Bom Pastor, porque na sua celebração, todos os anos, a Liturgia propõe uma passagem do capítulo décimo de João, no qual Jesus se apresenta como o verdadeiro pastor. Pastor é aquele que está à frente do rebanho para indicar o caminho que conduz às pastagens e às nascentes de água. Jesus é o único verdadeiro pastor e ninguém

pode arrogar-se o direito de ocupar o lugar dele. Hoje a Igreja celebra o Dia Mundial de Oração pelas Vocações Sacerdotais. Peçamos com fervor a Deus pelos sacerdotes, para que ele sejam bons pastores a exemplo de Jesus. Rezemos pelos seminaristas e sua formação no Seminário para serem, um dia, sacerdotes segundo o Coração de Jesus.



A primeira leitura dos Actos dos Apóstolos nos ensina que, para seguir a Cristo é preciso estarmos dispostos a suportar também contrariedades e perseguições. É o que nos mostram com sua própria vida Paulo e Barnabé.



A Segunda leitura, do Livro do Apocalipse, descreve o lugar do descanso para o qual Jesus, pastor e cordeiro imolado, conduz o seu rebanho: o céu. Lá encontraremos a resposta para todos os enigmas da vida.
