Thanks be to God and to our Blessed Mother Mary this month of May, that the devastating effects of the pandemic seems to be weakening, as more and more people are getting vaccinated. By 19 May we will be opening our parishes to 100% capacity, while still maintaining the three-fold disciplines of "masking, purifying, distancing". Gradually, we will come back with all our ministries and meetings; hopefully better than just returning to "normal". While the Catholic Church and our Holy Father Pope Francis strongly recommend that everyone get vaccinated as a moral obligation to each other; nevertheless, we recognize and respect that some people will not receive the vaccine for many personal reasons. We will not be "segregating" parishioners at Mass; no separate sections for the "vaxed" and "non-vaxed". But we will continue to build up the Body of Christ as God's people united in the Spirit of Jesus. "If one member suffers, all the parts suffer; if one member rejoices, all the parts rejoices" (1 Corinthians 12:26).

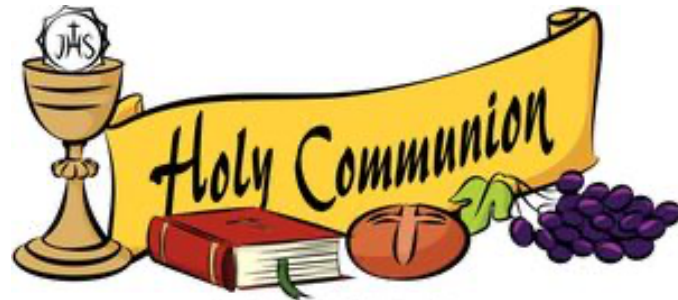
The month of May is also a time to celebrate the children of our parish receiving their First Holy Communion. These Masses always remind me of one reason why I became a priest: to serve with joy for God's little ones; who by their innocence show us the way to the true Kingdom, on earth as it is in heaven. Please enjoy the many pictures we have of our holy youngsters, and pray that they will grow in the grace of the Eucharist every Sunday here at Corpus Christi!

Sunday 23 May is the culmination of the Easter season, with the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost (50 days after the Resurrection), and the birth of our beloved Church. On this day, bishops give pastors and priests permission to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation for adults who already have been Baptized and practicing their faith. Here in our parish we have 12 young adults who have come forward to confirm more deeply their commitment to Catholicism. Some are born right here in our nation; and others come from different countries, cultures, colors and languages. Precisely the same as the Biblical Pentecost 2000 years ago; the Spirit of God unites us all as the Body of Christ ("You Together are My Body") in the face of our differences. The Scriptural images of the Spirit's power (fire and wind) will hopefully bring about the reality of the Spirit's peace (dove and olive branch) to our world, our nation, our families and our souls.

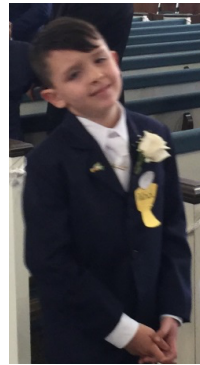

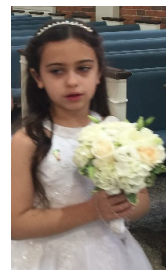
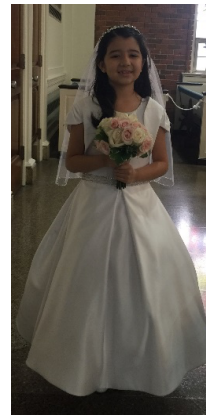

## **Seventh Week of Easter**

The Seventh Sunday of Easter shows the Spirit at work in the Acts of the Apostles as a large group of disciples prays for guidance as they choose an apostle to replace Judas. In John's Gospel Jesus offers a moving prayer for those he loves asking the Father to “keep them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one just as we are one.” In a number of dioceses, Sunday celebrates the Ascension of the Lord.

This is our last week of the Easter Season and of the readings from the Acts of the Apostles. The Apostles carry on the work of Jesus and the future community takes shape with the gift of the Holy Spirit being given to the gentiles.

The “Priestly Prayer” of Jesus which we read in the gospels this week lets us listen in on the prayer of Jesus for his disciples, and for us. He doesn't ask the Father to take us from the world, but we can tell that he is concerned for us. It is tender and feels quite personal. We are the Father's gift to Jesus, entrusted to his care and now he prays that we might all be one, that the world might know it was the Father who sent Jesus.

Friday of this week takes us to the end of the Fourth Gospel and image of Jesus shaping Peter's ministry (and ours). If we love him, then he asks us to feed his sheep. Saturday's gospel brings us back to the Last Supper and the closing verses of John's Gospel, as well as a closing out of the Easter season's weekday readings.

Sunday is the great feast of Pentecost - the birthday of the Church. The frightened Apostles are on fire. Now they can speak clearly, so everyone can understand them. Jesus gives his peace to his disciples and breathes his Spirit upon them, giving them the mission to forgive and sending them to carry out his desire that we all be one.

***Lord, send out your Spirit,  
and renew the face of the earth.***



# Español

## VII DOMINGO DE PASCUA



### EVANGELIO SEGÚN SAN JUAN 17, 11-19

En aquel tiempo, Jesús levantó los ojos al cielo y dijo: *“Padre santo, cuida en tu nombre a los que me has dado, para que sean uno, como nosotros. Cuando estaba con ellos, yo cuidaba en tu nombre a los que me diste; yo velaba por ellos y ninguno de ellos se perdió, excepto el que tenía que perderse, para que se cumpliera la Escritura. Pero ahora voy a ti, y mientras estoy aún en el mundo, digo estas cosas para que mi gozo llegue a su plenitud en ellos. Yo les he entregado tu palabra y el mundo los odia, porque no son del mundo, como yo tampoco soy del mundo. No te pido que los saques del mundo, sino que los libres del mal. Ellos no son del mundo, como tampoco yo soy del mundo. Santifícaos en la verdad. Tu palabra es la verdad. Así como tú me enviaste al mundo, así los envió también al mundo. Yo me santifico a mí mismo por ellos, para que también ellos sean santificados en la verdad”*.



En estos capítulos finales del Evangelio de Juan, Jesús está tratando de resumir de qué se trata su vida y su misión. Habla extensamente del lazo entre él y su Padre, y es desde este lazo de amor

que él es enviado. Este texto del Evangelio de Juan es parte del Evangelio de la Última Cena. Jesús despídese de sus discípulos antes de dar su vida por nosotros. La oración de Jesús es para apartarnos del mundo, es para crear un lugar seguro donde no se nos moleste, sino que se nos proteja del demonio. El Papa destaca que el Espíritu no remueve al demonio con una varita mágica. Por el contrario. Él vierte en nosotros la vitalidad de la vida, la cual no está ausente de problemas; pero también la certeza de ser amado y siempre perdonado por Cristo, quien, por nosotros, ha conquistado el pecado, la muerte y el temor. La realidad del Cristo resucitado es que, de ahora en adelante, nada ni nadie será nunca capaz de separarnos de su amor.



En la segunda lectura de este domingo, el apóstol Juan nos habla del amor de Dios y del amor para con el prójimo. *“A Dios nadie lo ha visto nunca; pero si amamos los unos a los otros, Dios permanece en nosotros y su amor en nosotros es perfecto”*.

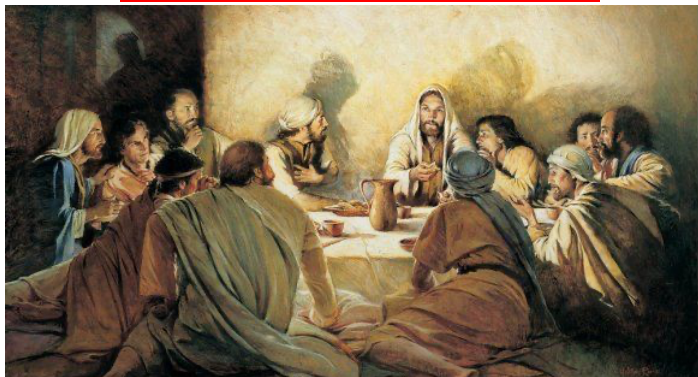


En la primera lectura de hoy, vemos la elección de Matías como apóstol. Después de Judas negar a Jesús y ahorcarse, los once apóstoles reunense para escoger un discípulo para tomar el lugar de Judas. Ese discípulo debe haber vivido con Jesús y ser testigo de su resurrección.

## VII DOMINGO DE PASCOA



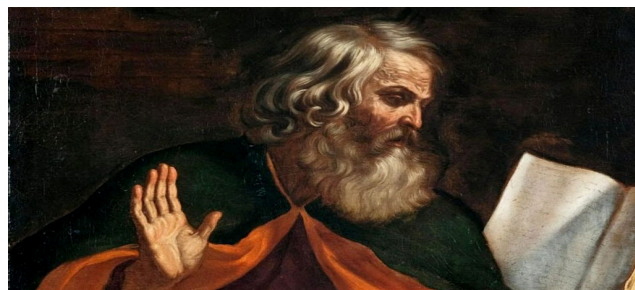
### EVANGELHO SEGUNDO SÃO JOÃO 17, 11-19

Naquele tempo, Jesus ergueu os olhos ao Céu e orou deste modo: *“Pai santo, guarda-os em teu nome, o nome que Me deste, para que sejam um, como nós. Quando eu estava com eles, guardava-os em teu nome, o nome que me deste. Guardei-os e nenhum deles se perdeu, a não ser o filho da perdição; e assim se cumpriu a Escritura. Mas agora vou para ti; e digo isto no mundo, para que eles tenham em si mesmos a plenitude da minha alegria. Dei-lhes a tua palavra e o mundo odiou-os, por não serem do mundo, como eu não sou do mundo. Não peço que os tires do mundo, mas que os livres do mal. Eles não são do mundo, como eu não sou do mundo. Consagra-os na verdade. A tua palavra é a verdade. Assim como tu me enviaste ao mundo, também eu os enviei ao mundo Eu consagro-me por eles, para que também eles sejam consagrados na verdade”*.



No Evangelho deste domingo Jesus ora por nós, pedindo ao Pai por aqueles que iriam crer nele. Essa oração de Jesus é pronunciada durante a Última Ceia. Jesus pede ao Pai que guarde os seus discípulos, que os preserve do mundo e que os consagre na verdade. O Pai os deu a Jesus para que ele cuidasse, que não deixasse que eles se perdessem. O mundo a que se refere Jesus neste

Evangelho significa o conjunto de pessoas que se fecham a Deus e à sua Palavra. Este mundo é dominado pelo Maligno. O discípulo de Jesus vive a sua vida presente inserido nesse mundo hostil a Jesus e à sua Igreja, mas nem por isso deve dele se afastar. Antes pelo contrário, é para anunciar-lhe o Evangelho que o cristão foi consagrado no baptismo. O Espírito Santo é a força do alto que nos impele em direção ao mundo, sem contudo deixar que nos envolvamos com o mundo, pois é ele que nos dá a plena consciência de não pertencermos a mundo.



Depois que Judas traiu Jesus e se enforcou, os apóstolos decidem eleger um discípulo para tomar o lugar de Judas. O discípulo a ser escolhido deveria ter vivido com Jesus desde o seu baptismo no rio Jordão até a sua ascensão ao céu. Deveria dar testemunho da ressurreição de Jesus. E a escolha caiu em Matias, que passa a ser o novo apóstolo.



Na segunda leitura deste domingo, durante a Última Ceia, Jesus despede-se dos seus apóstolos e dá a eles o seu testamento: *“Ninguém jamais viu a Deus. Se amarmos uns aos outros, Deus permanece em nós e o seu amor em nós é perfeito”*. Essa é a essência do Evangelho de Jesus Cristo.
